MIC is your school

Music Industry College (MIC) is an accredited independent non-state school that caters for students in Year 11 and 12. The College is a division of Music Industry Community Services Limited, a not-for-profit organisation.

Enrolment is open to young people who have a passion for music or those who wish to pursue a career in the music industry.

MIC was established in 2010 with our first intake of 27 students. MIC plans to expand our current campus to cater for 80 students by 2016.

MIC operates a Queensland Studies
Authority based curriculum that is
contextualised to the music industry.
Students learn in small classes with
content delivered by qualified
teachers who are also current industry
professionals.

Teacher Participation in Professional Development

MIC encourages all staff to seek out and attend relevant professional development to enhance their personal and professional skills, which benefit the College and its students.

Teachers have attended a variety of seminars and training days throughout 2013. \$13235 was spent on teacher professional development in 2013.

Staff Retention Rates

Average attendance for full-time and part-time staff was 99% for 2013. Staff retention rate for 2013 was 70%. Three teachers resigned at the end of 2013; one to focus on 1-2-1 instrumental teaching; and the other two to pursue other career options.
