<u>Topic:</u>	Youth Court Statistics 2016/2017 Released by Statistics Canada – January 24, 2019
Background:	In Nunavut, there were 139 youth court cases completed during the 2016/2017 fiscal year, an increase of 21.9% or 25 more cases from 2015/2016.

In Canada, the youth court caseload **declined 8.0%** over the same period.

Youth court cases that involve more than one charge are represented by the most serious offence. A completed case is defined as one or more charges against an accused person or company that were processed by the courts at the same time and received a final decision.
