Mrs. Emily Huntington Miller, author, and one of the founders of St. Nicholas, a publication for children, died on Monday at her home in St. Paul, Minn. Mrs. Miller was for ten years Dean of Women in Northwestern University. She was born in Brooklyn, Conn., in 1833, was graduated from Oberlin College, Ohio, in 1857, and later became a contributor to leading magazines. She was one of the associate editors of 'The Ladies' Home Journal' and the author of many novels, best known among which are the "Kirkwood Series," "Little Neighbors," "Fighting the Enemy" and "Highway and Hedges." For many years she had made her Summer home in Englewood, N. J. Mrs. Miller is survived by a son, Dr. George A. Miller of Los Angeles, Cal.
