Property Description	The existing chapel, which is reached through a small rectangular parvis, was built			
	in 1684, and had replaced an older medieval chapel. The façade of this chapel is rather austere and plain, with a slightly slanting roof and a small centrally placed			
	bell-cot headed by a triangular pediment which is a misfit with the style of the			
	facade. The façade is characterised by a rectangular doorway, which is headed by a protruding plain cornice. A small centrally placed oculus is set beneath the belfry.			
	Set on the right hand side of the doorway is a plaque inscribed with 'Non Gode			
	l'Immunita Ecclesiae'. The small chapel is flanked on either side by a small			
	rectangular wing, which are clearly a recent offensive addition to the building.
