Property Description	Started to be built c 1740 by Mons Domenico Sceberras, and was completed in 1744			
Troperty Description	by his sister Donna Margherita Muscati. The palace continued to be inherited by the			
	Muscati family, until it passed on to Anna Muscati who married Don Domenico			
	Parisio, thus being given its present name. The structure consists of three blocks built			
	round a central courtyard. The severe façade is the only symmetrical feature of this palace. It consists of an elaborated doorway flanked by a two free-standing columns			
	which in turn support the closed wooden balcony with a broken segmental-headed			
	portal which is mostly covered. The doorway is flanked by three moulded			
	rectangular windows on each side, each topped with a rounded cornice. The corners of the ground floor level are heavily rusticated, unlike those on the first and second			
	floor. The rectangular windows in the first floor have decorative surrounds, while			
	those at the second floor are rather small, rectangular with a round top, and each sill			
	is supported by a pair of protruding scrolls. The third storey was completed after WWII to be used as an office.
