P R E F A C E

This is the third in the series of Source Books about the politics and government of Southern Rhodesia, published by the Department of Government at the University College of Rhodesia and Nyasaland. The first, entitled *Source Book of Parliamentary Elections and Referenda in Southern Rhodesia, 1898-1962*, was published in 1963. The second, a *Catalogue of the Parliamentary Papers of Southern Rhodesia, 1899-1953*, was produced for the University College by the Rhodesia Government Printer in 1965. This third volume, like the others, is the result of work financed by the Rockefeller Foundation, to whom the University College is most grateful. The warm thanks of the compilers are also due to the Director and staff of the National Archives for assistance so willingly given.

NOTES AND DEFINITIONS

The Council, 1894-1898

The Matabeleland Order in Council of 1894 made provision for the government of the territory to be in the hands of an Administrator, assisted by a Council over which he presided, and which consisted of the Judge (*ex officio*) and three members appointed by the British South Africa Company, with the approval of the Secretary of State. The Council had both executive and legislative powers.

The Executive Council and the Legislative Council, 1898-1923

The Southern Rhodesia Order in Council of 1898 provided for the former Administrator's Council to be replaced by two bodies, an Executive Council and a Legislative Council. The Executive Council consisted of the Administrator or Administrators (there were two between 1898 and 1901), the Resident Commissioner, and four members appointed by the Company with the approval of the Secretary of State. The Resident Commissioner, who was appointed to supervise the administration and report to the High Commissioner at the Cape, could take part in deliberations but had no vote.

The Legislative Council consisted of *ex officio* members, members nominated by the Company, and members elected by the settlers. The number of elected members rose from four in 1898 to fifteen by the time responsible government was granted in 1923.

The Legislative Assembly and the Ministry, 1923-1964

The Southern Rhodesia (Constitution) Letters Patent of 1923, granted the Colony the right to responsible government with a Legislative Assembly of thirty members. Provision was made for the Legislative Assembly to set up a second chamber in the form of a Legislative Council, but this has not been done and in effect the Legislative Assembly has been the legislature of the country.

The 1923 Constitution empowered the Governor to appoint up to six Ministers and assign to them the leadership of such departments as he deemed fit. This number was increased to seven in 1948.

The Constitution of 1961 altered the size of the Legislative Assembly to sixty-five members, and provided for a Ministry of up to eleven members in addition to the Prime Minister. (Provision had been made in terms of the Constitution Amendment Act of 1960, for the House to be increased to fifty members but this was not put into effect. Before the next General Election took place in 1962 the new Constitution was introduced.)

Appointments to Office

In the days of Chartered Company rule, appointments to the Executive Council and its predecessor, the Council, were not made to specific office comparable to a Ministerial portfolio in the Cabinet of later years. Apart from the Administrator, who was *ex officio* President, members were simply appointed to general office on the Council. They were selected from among officials who held senior position in the British South Africa Company—the Treasurer, the Chief Secretary, the Legal Adviser, the Surveyor General and others. The selection does not appear to have been in strict accordance with position, although the Treasurer, Attorney General and Secretary for Mines and Works were long-standing members. The choice seems to have rested to some extent on personal factors—Sir Ernest Montagu, who was Secretary for Mines and Works, taking the place of H. H. Castens, the Chief Secretary; Sir Andrew Fleming, Medical Director, succeeding Sir Ernest Montagu, and so on. Thus the analyses of appointments to specific office given in Parts III and IV are confined to office holders in the Ministry, only, from 1923 onwards.

Mr. Dupont, however, retained responsibility for the functions of the Information Service, Broadcasting and Television. With the transfer of the Ministry of Justice from Mr. Dupont to Mr. Lardner-Burke, Mr. van der Byl, therefore, ceased to be Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of Justice and became Parliamentary Secretary to Mr. Dupont.
