> Began Operations: April 17, 1973. On its first night of operations, Federal Express delivered 186

packages to 25 U.S. cities using fourteen small aircraft.

➤ Workforce: More than 15,000 FedEx Express employees

Facilities: Approximately 500 acres at Memphis International Airport.

Operations: 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year

➤ Volume: More than 5,000 flights pass through the Memphis Super Hub each month,

providing connectivity to every market served by FedEx. Five sorts per day bring

an average of 1.5 million packages through the facility daily.
