From The Chief Coordinator

Since along period of time a group of politicians, scholars, writers, journalists, academic professionals, Afghan refugees representatives living in Pakistan specially in Peshawar started research on how to find the easy and direct way to establish peace and stability in the country because peace and stability in our country is more important.

Until there is no peace and stability, the concept of reconstruction, national sovereignty, role of law, the principals of democracy in society and the safeguard of rights and freedom of members of society can be removed from society and the movement for peace and stability can be stopped. The condition of the country persuaded us to establish a center through which we can make the thoughts of the Afghans ready and aware to leave fighting, killings, looting and all sorts of illegal actions, which seemed very different at the time.

The 11th Sep 2001 event brought up unbelievable military and political changes, which caused collapse of the Govt of Taliban. And regarding the Boon processes the new government or administration of Afghanistan come to existence after which the issue of Afghanistan converted to an international issue. The presence of ISAF forces and American forces has changed the mechanism of the local, external or neighboring countries interest. A large number of intellectuals, educationalists and other professionals have shown interest to return to the country or have returned to the country in order to take part in reconstruction and rehabilitation of the country and to take active part in making the last decision concerning to the future of Afghanistan.

In presence of all these changes we observe that still the concept of power by the force of gun is common among people. Such process means that these wars and conflicts

have been used in order to get personal benefits. The advisory board working in Peshawar concluded that however the international community provides assistance to Afghans, but those Afghans who have no awareness about how to use this assistance in rehabilitation of the country. At the result all these assistances have been used for personal benefits.

Hence after discussions the decision come to being that there should be a center in Peshawar Pakistan in regard of moral awareness for a large number of Afghan refugees. On 1st July 2002 Naab Action Foundation was established in collaboration with Actionaid UK, which has branches in 43 countries, and the coordination of AAPK.

Naab Action Foundation started its activities by two workers and in order to run the program planned for implementation we put forward some targets.

- **Peace & Stability**

Afghans need peace and stability more than any other thing. Without peace and stability the human rights can be trampled, the women rights and their freedom can be an unasked question; the process of education and health care cannot be implemented. So therefore before making any kind of efforts in any other field we have to make efforts for establishment of peace and stability.

- **Democracy**

The only way to solve the problem of Afghanistan at the present is the culture of gun. This is the only common culture in Afghanistan. This culture should be changed and there should be a serious fight

against this culture. To reach the political power the elections should be chosen as the proper and positive way. The culture of democracy should be customized. Our organization has put forward a program, which mainly aims to custom build the culture of democracy.

- **Human Rights**

The last 25 years of war, which has been, destroyed the infrastructure of the country; the discriminations of human rights began in the country and are still continuing. In our point of view the constrictors of human rights must be uncovered and a proper fight must be organized against them. First of all the trampling of human rights should be uncovered. Than the people of Afghanistan must be sensitized about human rights.

- **Women Rights & Child Care**

In fact women are the half of the society. But more than 90% women are under the great burden of men made problems, almost all hard works are done by women. Women are not equal in rights with men even in fundamental laws. Before all, the constitution must guarantee the rights of women. The issue of women rights is not specific to women; it is the issue of the society in whole. Fight for rights of women must be an exhaustible fight for betterment of the society. Paying attention to the rights and life to children is one of the most important elements of our targets. Children must be given the rights to get education. This right should be for all. The government must announce compulsory education for children. Children must not be hired for work. The children must be let to join schools and get education.

- **Rule of Law**

Since along period of time there has been no rule of law in Afghanistan. In fact the law of jungle was spread all over the country. The Afghan society need rule of law in all spheres of life, the Afghans need establishment of such laws that help in

decreasing the injustices in society. Hence the members of society must be aware of law and order and that of activities done in the society must be according law and order. We in frame of our programs give superiority to rule of law.

- **National Unity**

According the opinions of Afghans and through out the research we have done during the last so many years of war we have reached to conclude that the national unity in Afghanistan have faced a mass destruction. To reconstruct this moral destruction, organizing some programs is our aim. In our point of view after drafting the new constitution, social justice and equity will be promoted at the result of which the prestige of national unity will increase to high levels through out the country.

- **Anti Narcotics**

The biggest factor that deprived our country from the rest of the world was the high level of production of narcotics in last so many years of war. The evil of drugs caused stress not only for the international community but also addicted a large number of Afghans the increase in number of which is predicted for the future as well. Fight against narcotics and its production is the most important part of our program.

- **Anti Terrorism**

During the last 25 years of war in both sides the fear of terrorism was believed one of the most important and honorable training. Thousands of Afghans and foreigners without paying attention to the result of such action have been trained and thousands of them have been scarified of this terror. This process become not only an internal process but also changed to an international risky process. We according our program are willing to create awareness among Afghans in order to make them

aware about the negative results of terrorism in country and that through terrorism we cannot achieve our targets.

The Afghan intellectuals had the right to predict the political situation of Afghanistan and establish a center through which criticize the political sanitation of the country. While the commission of international relief to Afghanistan have accepted 2 billion American dollars for reconstruction of Afghanistan in a conference in Tokyo Japan. But will this relief be used for the national interest of the country or not?

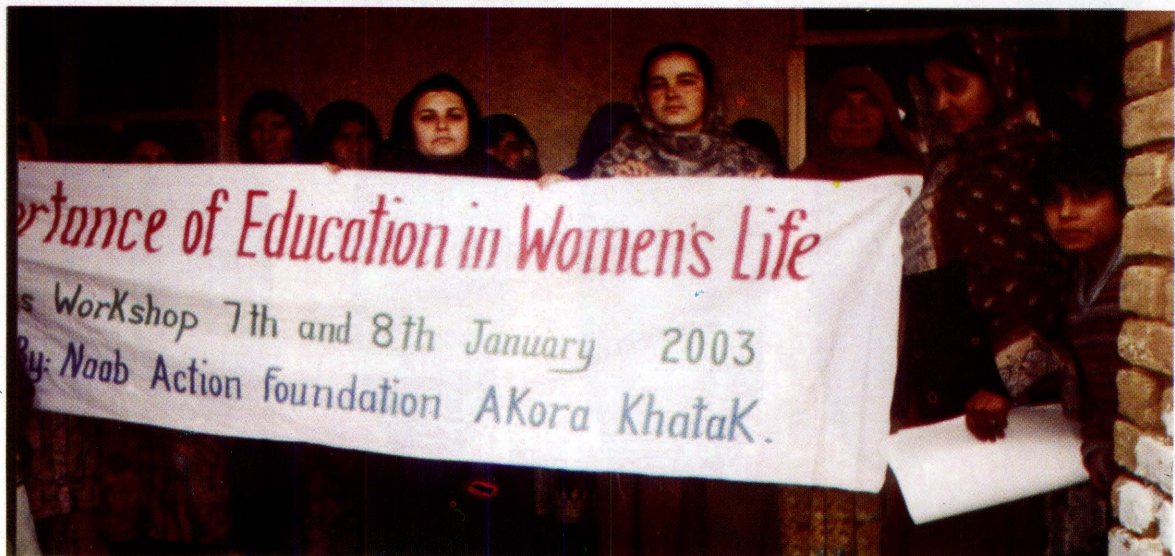
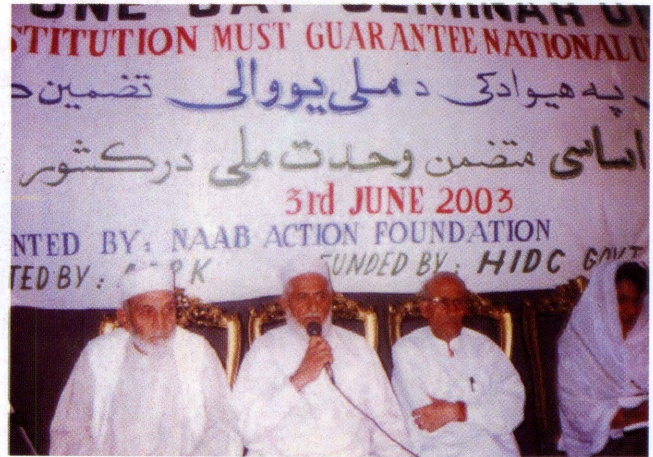

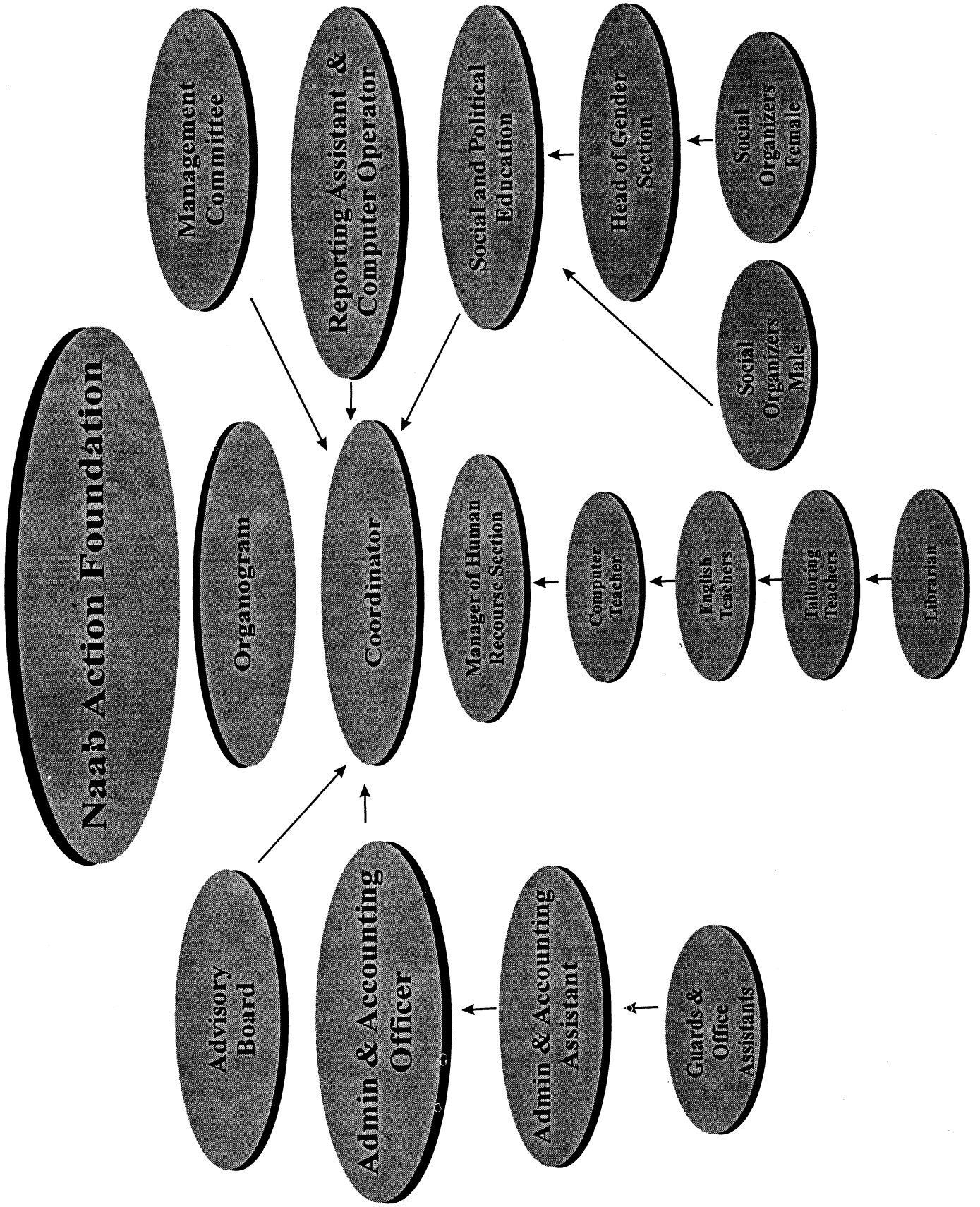

Introduction

Following the 11th Sep 2001 event, which caused a stunning change all over the world, on the other hand it distorted the circumstances in Afghanistan too. Meanwhile the people of this war-shattered country, who have endured continuous war, necessitated intellectual support as well. Therefore Naab Action Foundation came to existence on 1st July 2002 in Peshawar Pakistan.

Background

Naab Action Foundation is a non-governmental, non-profitable and politically non-partisan Foundation, which works among Afghan refugees in Pakistan in order to create social and political awareness among Afghan refugees and to assist the people of Afghanistan intellectually.

Aims

- To assist the people of Afghanistan intellectually and to generate the thoughts of patriotism and the audacity to make the last decision concerning to the future of Afghanistan.
- To create awareness about fundamental rights of social and political among common people
- To provide the people of Afghanistan the opportunity to learn and develop their skills.
- To provide the people of Afghanistan approach to free health care.

Objectives

Promoting the people of Afghanistan in fields of education, health, social and political awareness such as peace and stability, democracy, rule of law, elections, national unity, human rights, women rights, anti child and women trafficking, child care, elimination of weapons, anti narcotics, anti extremism and terrorism in Afghanistan.

July 2002 ⇒ Naab Action Foundation comes to existence with the plan for a number of positive activities in order to assist the deprived people of Afghanistan to access their basic rights in all spheres of life.

July 2002 ⇒ Naab Action Foundation starts political awareness program in order to create political awareness among Afghan refugees living in NWFP Pakistan. This program mainly focuses on the current situation in Afghanistan.

This program is designed for those war-torn Afghan refugees who have very less or no approach to discuss the main issues of their country.

January 2003 ⇒ Naab Action Foundation starts its Human Resource Development Program for Afghan refugees living in Peshawar Pakistan.

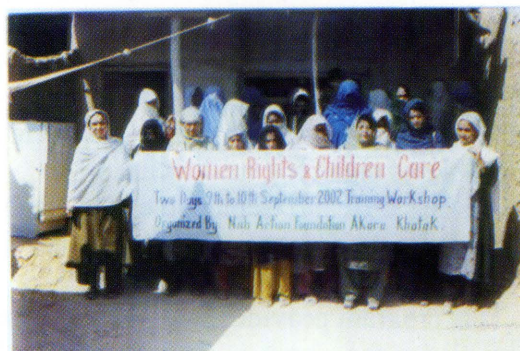
This program creates opportunities for those Afghans who regarding the long period of war had and have no opportunity to get advantages of the up to date progresses and developments.

March 2003 ⇒ Naab Action Foundation establishes Mahmud Tarzi Cultural & Training Center for skill development of 400 Afghan youths containing:

- **Computer Center**
- **Language Center**
- **Research Center (Library)**

in fact skill development of the young generation of Afghanistan which is already a war-shattered country is a vital step towards progress in the country.

March 2003 ⇒ Naab Action Foundation establishes two centers according Vocational Training Program for 200 Afghan needy women in order to enable them to begin a contented life and develop their skills.



This program will enable the Afghan needy women to stand by their own power.

May 2003⇒ Naab Action Foundation starts Basic Health Program in order to assist Afghan refugees and troubleshoot their problems regarding health care.

The Basic Health Center so called Naab Basic Health Center is established according this program.

This program provides free of charge treatment and medicine for a large number of Afghan Refugees living in Peshawar.



May 2003⇒ Naab Action Foundation formally Inaugurates Mahmud Tarzi Cultural & Training Center according Cultural and Training Program. This center as key project of Naab Action Foundation which, assists a large number of Afghan youths in fields of computer, language and Cultural activities.



May 2003⇒ Naab Action Foundation takes another step towards assisting the Afghans and making a new path towards development and progress. The Foundation starts Adult Education Program for educating some 300 male and female Afghan refugees living in Peshawar Pakistan. This program is initiated for those Afghan refugees who due to lack of opportunities could not start getting education in their home land or due to presence of a long-term war. This program will enable them to put the first step in the door of education and by passage of time this opportunity will get wider and wider and the people will be able to begin a new life dressed with jewel of education.

June 2003⇒ Mahmud Tarzi Cultural & Training Center in respect of its service made to the Afghan refugee youths in Peshawar hold first graduation ceremony of computer section of the Mahmud Tarzi Cultural & Training center.

June 2003⇒ Naab Action Foundation starts a Six months emergency relief program for 300 Afghan refugee families in different areas of NWFP. This program is in close links with the Adult Education Program.

We would like to sincerely acknowledge vital contributions from the following donor and partner whose generous contributions and support have enabled us achieve to a great extent our objectives set for the year 2002-2003.

POLITICAL AWARENESS PROGRAM

Aim

Our aim in implementing political awareness program is to make the people aware about their fundamental social and political rights.

Why we create political awareness?

Afghanistan needs peace. The people of Afghanistan are not only tired of war but also abhor the war. It is the time to change concepts of war. It is the duty of sensitive Afghans to bring the spirit of peace in to live. This is the time to make people to leave machinegun and take pen and hoe and rebuild their homeland, stand behind

Workshops:

Our purpose to organize workshops is to educate political activists in order to create political awareness among Afghan refugees. Without having such personal, we cannot conform the process of our social programs in regard of Political Awareness Program.

Naab Action Foundation from the beginning of its formation had a certain aim to assist Afghan people, especially Afghan refugees in Pakistan. This foundation believes that creating political awareness among people will create a movement and hope to words peace and stability among people of Afghanistan. Therefore Naab Action Foundation decided to held workshops on different subjects and issues of Afghanistan. In this contest this foundation planned to held workshops in two categories: Training workshops and Advocacy workshops.

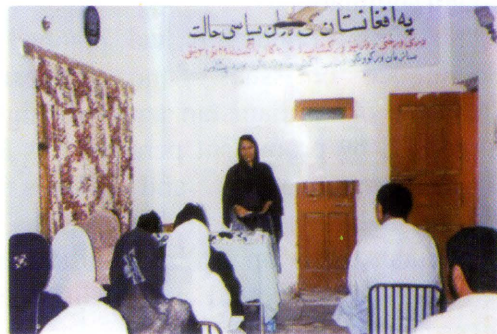
the machine and establish the new technology in the country. Our country needs rehabilitation and reconstruction.

Is it possible to rehabilitate the country at the presence of war same and unsafe situation? No it is not possible. Hence the need for such program is more than any other program.

How to create political awareness?

Naab Action Foundation in collaboration with its partners is one of the organizations working for creating political awareness among Afghan refugees in Pakistan. This foundation has initiated a complete plan for how to create political awareness in following step-by-step procedure.

The need for such classification appeared because we believe that we have two categories of people living in Pakistan:



- Those who live in Pakistan and have interest in fundamental affairs of their country.
- Those who live in refugee camps and have no opportunities of getting even education.

The foundation decided to held Training workshops for the first category of people and Advocacy workshops for the second category of people. Very well known personalities and professionals have facilitated all of these workshops.

Seminars:

Seminar basically consists of small groups of people who meet with professionals to research or discuss a specific topic in history, literature politics or some other academic fields. Participants in a seminar usually prepare scholarly research papers and critique one another's work.

One of the objectives of Naab Action Foundation is creating political awareness. Meanwhile when this foundation held workshops on different issues, it also held a number of seminars on different issues. The purpose of holding seminars is also creating political awareness among Afghan refugees in Pakistan in a large number. We provide the opportunity for discussions and exchanging of ideas. We can provide such facilities for large number of people through seminars.

Naab Action Foundation had planned to held seminars on issues of most interest of the people of Afghanistan and was highly appreciated by prominent personalities and working organizations and offices in Pakistan and Afghanistan. The reports on all seminars held on different issues had been send to interested personalities and offices.

Annual Report

Naab Action Foundation started its efforts on 1st July 2002 and could held a number of workshops. These workshops were held inside Peshawar and outside Peshawar in Afghan refugee camps in Mansihra, Abbott Abad, Jaloza, Shamshato, Khurasan, Khazana, Pabo, Khesko, Zakhail camps and other Afghan refugee camps.

In light of these efforts Naab Action Foundation could arrange a number of workshops on very vital issues of Afghanistan.



Round Table Meetings

Naab Action Foundation believes that not having a strategy or plan can bring problems in work process. In this regard and in order to have a collaboration with other organizations, individuals and intellectuals in creating political awareness among Afghan refugees in Pakistan and to have a mutual strategy with all of the organizations working in Pakistan, decided to held round table meetings. The purpose of these round table meetings was to speak out on the problems of Afghan refugees in Pakistan and to find out positive and workable solutions. In this regard Naab Action Foundation could facilitate a number of round table meetings for discussing different issues, which were appreciated by the participants.

Radio Talks

To convey message to the people, the support of media both electronic media and print media is needed. Both medias have close links with members of a society. But the electronic media has very affective role, because the approach of newspapers and publications to all parts of a country is not possible but the approach of electronic media is wide and can reach to all parts. In order to convey its message to the people and take another active step towards creating political awareness among people this foundation had a number of interviews or radio talks in the collaboration of different national and international radio stations.



News Paper Articles

Naab Action Foundation in order to act on its plans prepared for a specific term and in order to convey its message to people of all spheres decided to have some articles in local and national news papers. In this contest we have received the service of Daily Sahaar and Daily Wahdat and so on other newspapers.

Cultural & Training Program

By passage of time Naab Action Foundation extends its activities day by day and thinks of making a new effort in order to create facilities for empowerment of Afghan culture and after endless efforts of Naab AF staff members the Mahmud Tarzi Cultural and Training Center (M.T.C.T.C) established on 1st March 2003. The M.T.C.T.C contains English language center, computer center and library.

Vision:

This Center is called Mahmud Tarzi Cultural and Training Center, which is one of the key projects of Naab Action Foundation that includes English Language Programs, Computer Programs and a Public Library for Research and Students' use.

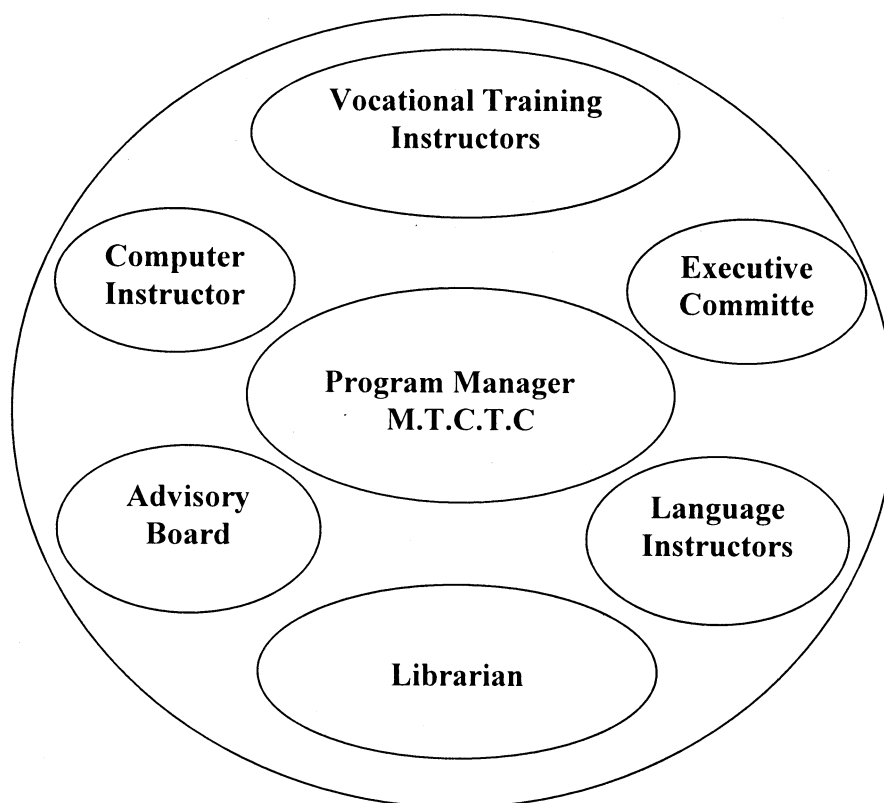
Objectives:

To provide free education for those needy Afghans who are not able to pay for their further education.

Mission:

To train young generation of Afghanistan in fields of language and computer by professional and talented teachers.

To provide facilities for improvement of general knowledge of Afghan youth.



Language Program:

Naab Action Foundation in order to develop the degree of knowledge of Afghan youths and to give a positive response to the immense demand for learning English language initiated Language Center in frame of Mahmud Tarzi Cultural and Training Center. This center during the period of activities has earned an outstanding reputation for providing quality linguistic education to tens and hundreds of Afghan refugee students. The students attend daily classes for 2 hours in two terms of day. 40 male and 40 female students in a total number of 6 classes. The exact period for running this program is for 6 months.

One male and one female experienced and talented instructor teach these classes. The admission in this course is free of any kind of charge and is devoted only to Afghan refugee young generation. The course runs by the generous support of the HIDC Govt of Greece.

Computer Program:

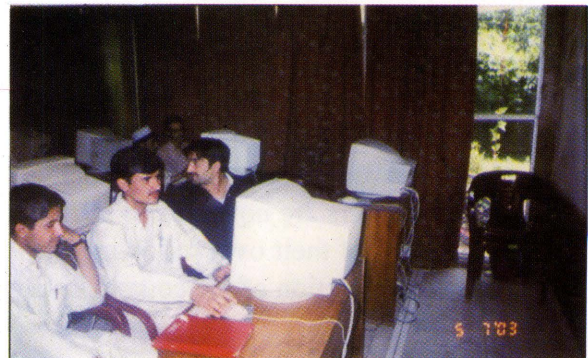
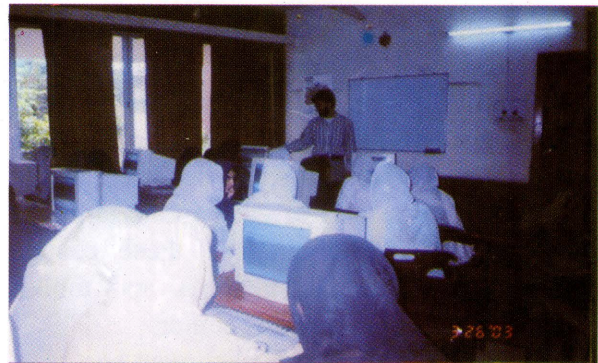
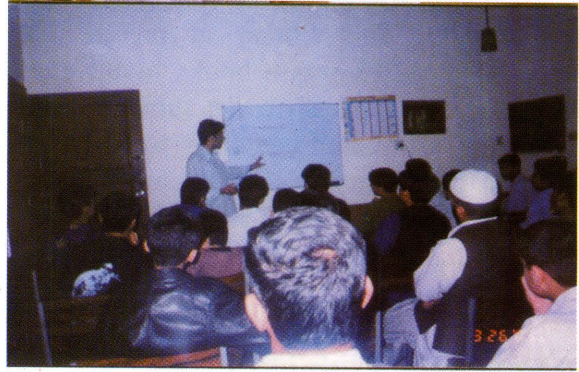
Naab Action Foundation inaugurated computer course in frame of Mahmud Tarzi Cultural & Training Center. The chief aim of establishment of this course was upgrading the knowledge and skills of Afghan refugees youth in operating the latest computer programs.

This lucrative initiative has come in to effect by financial support of HIDC Govt of Greece in collaboration with AAPK. Thanks to their generous support.

Proficient instructor leads this course and the course is equipped with networking system, Pentium III computer sets, colored and simple printers.

Along side training computer programs the course has planned to facilitate the students in Internet and typing programs.

This course facilitates 35 male and 35 females in two terms of day for a period of 3 months. In fact the exact term for running this program is only six months. The demand is outstanding for getting admission in these classes.



Library (research center)

Mahmud Tarzi Cultural and Training center contains a library, which is established in order to provide a positive relaxation to Afghan youths. A number of Students and individuals are taking advantage of this opportunity. This library at present has more than 800 volume books in different languages and on different subjects. This library is a research center as well. At the present the library has the membership of 50 members from inside the center and outsiders. The library is daily in service of its members.

Vocational Training Program

Naab Action Foundation beside other activities and implementing projects for Afghan refugees established two vocational centers for Afghan refugee women in Peshawar Pakistan. These vocational centers are equipped with all necessary requirements and two skilled instructors facilitate the students. These vocational centers have mobile system and are established to address the socio-economic problems and skill development of Afghan women. This facility is provided without any payment for 60 Afghan women for a term of 2 months each time for three rounds. At the end of each round/term the students or participants of these centers receive certificates, machines and toolkit after graduation from this center.

This center since its establishment has proved that it really could assist the vulnerable and needy Afghan women and empower them in order to make a living for themselves.

Up to moment the vocational centers have graduated some 120 Afghan refugee women. The women have been graduated from these centers are now able to start a small business of their own following the successful completion of the course. In fact

this program was designed to help make an effort to solve some of the most basic socio-economic problems of the most vulnerable Afghan refugee women.



Adult Education Program

Naab Action Foundation in order to promote Afghan refugees and decrease in percentage of illiteracy among Afghan people has started Adult Education Program.

This program has mobile system and is started on 1st May 2003 in 10 different areas of NWFP. Each center has 30 students male or female. They receive free of cost education. Due to increase in percentage of illiteracy among women Naab Action Foundation decided to facilitate 77% female and 23% male in order to decrease the percentage of illiteracy among female. Therefore 240 female students get education in 8 centers and 60 male students get education in 2 centers. Each center receives a quantity of food goods as emergency relief program per month. Which we believe is a support in regard of decreasing their problems. The program is implemented in different areas of NWFP. This program has directly benefited 300 male and female.

The local communities have allocated space for some of the centers but some of the centers pay an amount of money for space.

10 experienced community teachers have been employed for running these centers, which are facilitated, by a supervisor and a manager.

The project implementation has enabled the students to take a good care of their society, behave courteously towards their family, friends and communities. The students beside course books receive information about peace and stability during which the students are given examples of Afghanistan and its situation. This process helps the students to have full information about their own country as well.

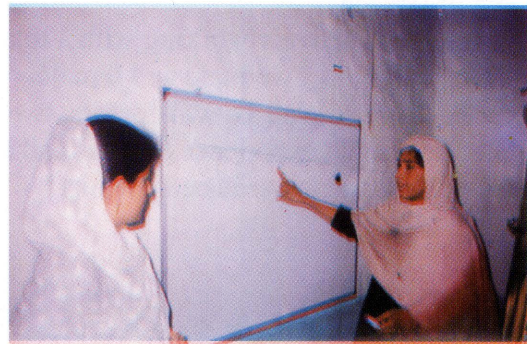
In brief the project has proved to be triumphant signpost towards encouraging the people of Afghanistan to accept education as one of their basic

requirements. Most importantly one of our centers is located in an area where there have been no assistance taken place. this course is established in FATA, Khyber agency where a large number of Afghan refugees live with a large number of problems. There have never been done any assistance through any NGO or any organization working for Afghan refugees.

Basic Health Center

Introduction

After the collapse of the Taliban Government and the establishment of the new government in Afghanistan, the majority of Afghan refugees have returned to Afghanistan, However, more than 1 million Afghan refugees are still living in Pakistan, they are still in need of education, health care, water supply and so on. Otherwise most of the NGOs went to Kabul, For that reason, Naab Action Foundation initiated a health care clinic so called Naab Basic Health Center for Afghan refugees in NWFP based in Peshawar. The clinic is organized by Actionaid PK and funded through HIDC Govt of Greece.

This center is actively working with a total staff members of Two male and female experienced and well known doctors, two male and female experienced nurses and a hard worker and experienced chemist.



Background

Naab Action Foundation is a non-governmental, non-profitable and politically non-partisan foundation, which works for the welfare of Afghan people. The purpose of this foundation is to create political awareness among Afghan refugees in Pakistan.

Objective

Providing Basic treatment for women, men and children in city and camps, and the provision of free medication.

Implementation

Naab basic health center is established on 1st May 2003 in Peshawar.

A maximum of 100 and minimum of 120 patients are treated daily in the outpatient department (OPD) and provide them free medicine.

The drug store of this clinic is providing free of charge medicine to the checked patients. Each month more than 2500 patients get advantages of this center and according the survey and reputation we received the clinic is running successfully.

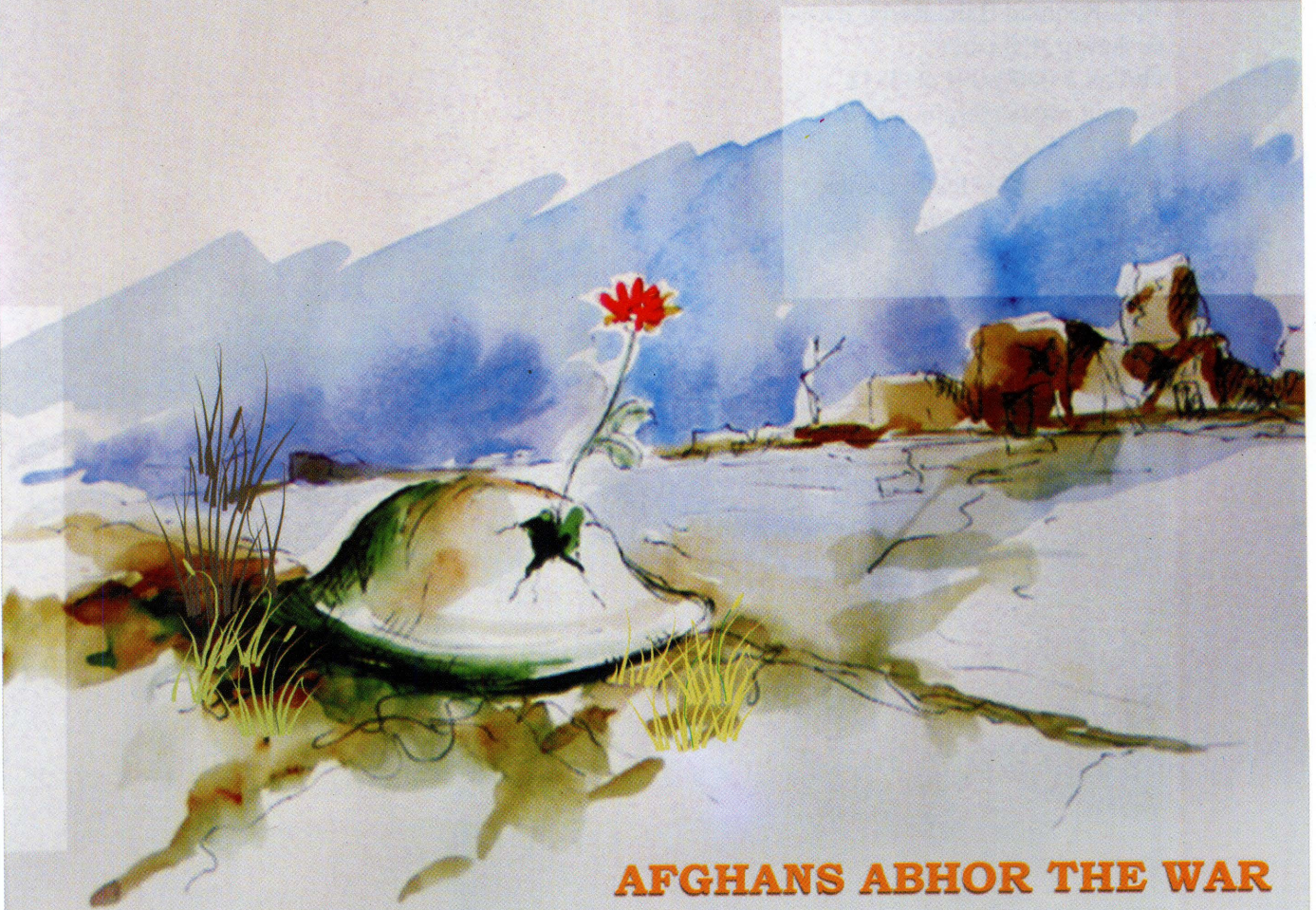

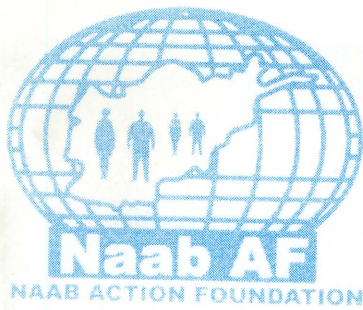
