Felix Hernandez will be making his 8th consecutive Opening Day start....only CC Sabathia $(9,2006-14)$ has as many consecutive among active pitchers...CC's streak ended last season.

## 9

The Mariners have won their last 9 season openers dating back to 2007 .

Felix Hernandez is $104-65$ with a 2.83 ERA over his last 7 seasons (since 2009), the 3rd-lowest ERA among MLB pitchers during this span (Clayton Kershaw - 2.30 \& Adam Wainwright - 2.80 ).

## VS. TEXAS RANGERS

The Mariners and Rangers meet in the first of 19 games this season...Seattle went 12-7 vs. the Rangers last season, marking the first season series win over TEX since 2007.

TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners open their 40th season with a road game vs. the Texas Rangers at Globe Life Park...today is the first of a three-game series vs. the Rangers, which will be followed by an off day Thursday, and a 6-game homestand against Oakland (3G) and Texas (3 G)...today's game will be televised in the Mariners TV market on ROOT SPORTS NW and broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network.
THE NEW SKIPPER...today is game \#1 for Mariners manager Scott Servais...Servais is the 20th Manager in Mariners history, 17th full-time skipper...Seattle managers are 12-7 in their first game as skipper of the club: Rene Lachemann, Del Crandall, Chuck Cottier, Dick Williams, Jim Snyder (interim), Lou Piniella, Mike Hargrove, Jim Riggleman, Don Wakamatsu, Daren Brown (interim), Eric Wedge and Lloyd McClendon all won their debuts, while Darrell Johnson, Maury Wills, Marty Martinez (interim), Jim Lefebvre, Bill Plummer, Bob Melvin and John McLaren took losses.
ON THE ROAD AGAIN...the Mariners are opening the season on the road for the 7th time in the last 8 seasons (since 2009)...last year's home opener snapped a streak of six straight road openers.. Seattle is opening on the road for the 14th time in club history...between 1991 and 2008, had just two road openers: 1994 at Cleveland and 2003 at Oakland.
ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners open the 2016 season today to begin a 3-game road trip... 12 of first 18 games of the season will be played away from Safeco Field.

- Young \& Old - Joel Peralta is the oldest player on the Mariners roster at 40 years, 12 days...Ketel Marte is the youngest player at 22 years, 175 days.
- First Opening Day - Dae-Ho Lee (INF), Ketel Marte (INF), Mike Montgomery (LHP), Luis Sardiñas (INF), and Tony Zych (RHP) are on their first Opening Day rosters...this is the 11th Opening Day roster for Felix Hernandez and Robinson Canó.
- 2015 Review - Completed the 2015 season 76-86 (.469), finishing 4th in the American League West ( 12.0 games behind division winner Texas)...registered 11 fewer wins than the 87-75 campaign in 2014...compiled a losing record in 5 of last 6 seasons...went 36-45 (.444) at home and 40-41 (.494) on the road...were 41-48 prior to the All-Star break and 35-38 following the break.
KING FELIX MAKING NINTH OPENING DAY START...Felix Hernandez is making his 9th career Opening Day start (2007 vs. OAK, 2009 at MIN, 2010 at OAK, 2011 at OAK, 2012 at OAK-Tokyo, 2013 at OAK, 2014 at LAA, 2015 vs. LAA), and his 8th consecutive...today's start extends his club record for most career Opening Day nods, with the previous record being 5 by Randy Johnson (1992-96)... Felix is 6-0, 1.49 ERA (10 ER, 60.1 IP) with 62 strikeouts in his 8 career Opening Day starts:
- Mariners Record - Felix's 6 career Opening Day wins are the most in Mariners history (R. Johnson - 2) - MLB History - 6 Opening Day wins is T7th all-time in MLB history (a 7th would be T3rd) since 1914. - What's the Record? - The most Opening Day starts all-time is 16 by Tom Seaver...Steve Carlton, Randy Johnson, Walter Johnson, Jack Morris and Cy Young all recorded 14...Morris holds the record with 14 consecutive Opening Day starts (1980-93).
OPENING DAY DATA...the Mariners are 24-15 (.615) in season openers, including a current 9-game Opening Day winning streak...have won 10 of the last 11 season openers, including Opening Day shutouts in 2007 (4-0 vs. OAK) and 2013 (2-0 at OAK)...OPENERS vs. THE RANGERS...the Mariners will open with the Rangers for the 3rd time in club history; others were 1992 and 2008 in Seattle... have never opened the season in the state of Texas...Seattle is $1-1$ vs. the Rangers on Opening Day. OPENERS IN TEXAS...this will be the first Mariners opener in the state of Texas...DAY OPENERS. will be opening the season with a day game for just the 11th time in club history (last: 2015)...are 4-6 in season openers in day games....are playing their 2nd straight daytime opener after having 6 straight night openers from 2009-2014...MONDAY OPENERS...will open on a Monday for the 18th time in club history (most of any day of the week)...Seattle is 10-7 when opening on a Monday.
OPENING DAY WIN STREAK ...the Mariners have won 9 consecutive season openers to extend a club record...Seattle's previous record for consecutive Opening Day wins was 5 straight from 198286...the streak is T2nd-longest Opening Day win streak in history and tied for the longest in the modern era (see sidebar)...it is the longest OD winning streak since the Cincinnati Reds posted 9 straight OD wins from 1983-1991, and tied for the longest American League Opening Day win streak trailing only the St. Louis Browns (9 straight, 1937-45)...the 9 consecutive wins are tied for the 2nd-most all-time. LID LIFTERS...Seattle has opened the season with a win in 24 of 39 seasons for a .615 winning percentage...since the club debuted in 1977, the .615 winning percentage on Opening Day is T3rdbest in the Majors with Chicago-AL and behind New York-NL (29-10/.744) and Baltimore (25-14/.641). CACTUS LEAGUE...completed Cactus League play with an 16-14-3 record (.533)...were 6-2-1 in the final 9 games of the spring, including a 5 -game winning streak March 21-28...ended the spring with by tying once and winning once against the Colorado Rockies in exhibition games...posted a 8-9-1 record in home games and 8-5-2 when the road team...had a 1-4-1 record in night games, compared to a 15-10-2 mark in day games...ranked 4th among A.L. teams and 8th in the Cactus League (T7th overall in MLB) with 117 extra-base hits...recorded 67 doubles (T8th in AL), 15 triples (2nd in AL and 35 home runs (9th in AL)...complete spring recap on pages 7-8 of Opening Day notes package.
AS YOU KNOW...Felix Hernandez is $6-0$ with a 1.49 ERA ( 10 ER, 60.1 IP ) with 62 strikeouts in his 8 career Opening Day starts (2007, 2009-2015)...BUT DID YOU KNOW?...that his Opening Day ERA is 7th-lowest in MLB history (min. 5 GS dating back to 1914) trailing only Rick Mahler (4-0, $0.92,5$ GS), Clayton Kershaw (3-0, 1.14, 5 GS), Bob Feller (4-3, 1.21, 7 GS), Jim Palmer (5-1, 1.40, 6 GS), Hal Newhouser (4-2, 1.41, 6 GS) and Wilbur Wood (2-2, 1.49, 5 GS), and it is ahead of Bob Lemon (3-1, 1.51, 5 GS)?

ABOUT FELIX...29-year-old right-hander is making is making his 1st tart of the season today.

- Is the second pitcher in franchise history to record 300 games started as a Mariner (also: Jamie Moyer, 323 GS w/Seattle 1996-2006).
- Signed a 7-year deal through the 2019 season on Feb. 13, 2013. In 2010 won the AL Cy Young, garnering 21 of 28 first-place votes. joined Randy Johnson (1995) as only Mariners pitcher to win the Cy Young...named Sporting News AL Pitcher of the Year...was 2nd in y Young voting in 2014
ML debut Aug. 4, 2005 at Detroit...Safeco debut vs. MIN Aug. 9, 2005...youngest pitcher since Jose Rijo worked as reliever in '84 (19 years, 54 days (7/6/84 at MIN).
- At 19 years, 118 days old at debut, was the 3rd-youngest player to debut in Mariners history \& 2nd-youngest pitcher.
- Born in Valencia, VZ...signed as 16-year-old non-drafted FA 7/4/02.
- A.L. All-Star: 2009, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014 (starter) \& 2015, most by any Mariner pitcher and 4th most overall behind Ken Griffey Jr. 10), Ichiro Suzuki (10) and Edgar Martinez (7).

ELITE COMPANY...Felix is $6-0$ with a 1.49 ERA ( $10 \mathrm{ER}, 60.1 \mathrm{IP}$ ) and 8 quality starts in 8 career Opening Day starts for the Mariners...dating back to 1914, his 6 -game OD winning streak is current T2nd-longest in MLB history, trailing only a 7-game OD winning streak by Jimmy Key, TOR/NYY/BAL (1987-97)...Felix, Greg Maddux, CHI/ATL (1992-2000), Tom Seaver, NYM/CIN (1971-77) and Wes Ferrell, CLE/BOS/WAS (1931-38) are each tied with a 6-game OD win streak... Felix holds club records for Opening Day starts (8), consecutive starts (7), wins (6) and strikeouts (62)...here is a look at Felix's 8 career Opening Day starts:

KING OF OPENING DAY...Felix is making his 9th career Opening Day start today, most in Mariners history...has started each of the Mariners last 8 Opening Days (since 2009)...with his 9th OD start, Felix will be the only pitcher since 1900 with 8 Opening Day starts as a pitcher before turning 30...Hernandez, who turns 30 on April 8, is currently tied with Dwight Gooden and Bert Blyleven with 8 pre-30 starts apiece.
SPRING RECAP.... went 0-2 with a 4.11 ERA (7 ER, 15.1 IP ) in 4 ST starts...limited opponents to a . $273(18 x 66)$ avg., while walking 3 and strking out $13 .$. .tossed a Spring Training high 6.0 innings on March 25 vs. CWS (6.0,5,0,0,0,3)...Felix also tossed live BP to minor league players on March 4 and appeared in a simulated game on March 9, striking out 5 of the 7 batters he faced, while allowing 1 walk.

30 STARTS...Felix made his 30th start of the season on Sept. 20 vs. TEX, his 10th consecutive season with at least 30 starts... 1 of only 2 players with an active streak of 10 -straight seasons with 30+ starts, joining Dan Haren (11)... 1 of 6 active players to have 10 or more seasons with $30+$ starts.
200.0...Felix tossed 201.2 innings in 2015, his 8 th straight 200.0 IP season, T1st in the Majors since 2008 (J. Shields)...his 8 200.0-inning seasons are most in club history (J. Moyer, 7 \& R. Johnson, 6)

Making his 48th career start vs. the Rangers...overall is 17-21 with a 3.77 ERA (127 ER, 303.1 IP) in 47 GS, including going 7-9 with a 4.13 ERA (59 ER, 128.2 IP) in 21 starts at Globe Life Park...went $5-0$ with a 1.83 ERA (7 ER, 34.1 IP) in 5 starts vs. the Texas in 2015, including limiting the Rangers to a .168 average $(20 \times 119)$ with 13 walks and 34 strikeouts...here is how Hernandez has fared against current Rangers hitters:

## 2,000 STRIKEOUTS

 Felix recorded his 2,000th career strikeout May 10, 2015 vs. OAK (29.032), becoming the 4th-youngest pitcher to reach the 2,000-strikeout mark behind Blyleven (28.097), Sam McDowell (28.228) and Walter Johnson (28.235), and ahead of NoIan Ryan (29.213).Felix is $29-1$ with a 2.17 ERA ( 58 ER, 240.1 IP ) in 34 starts...by contrast, is $4-14,3.51$ ERA ( 77 ER, 197.1 IP) in 31 starts where he received 2 or fewer runs of support.
THE FELIX QUALITY START...since 2009, Felix Hernandez has recorded 54 starts where he has thrown at least 8.0 innings and allowed 1 or fewer runs...that total is most among starting pitchers, ahead of Clayton Kershaw (50) and Cliff Lee (42)...the next closest AL pitchers (all starts in AL) is David Price and Justin Verlander with 28...has 89 GS of 7.0+ IP allowing 1 or fewer runs, most in baseball since 2009 (Kershaw-83).

## 2016 SPRING TRAINING REVIEW

CACTUS LEAGUE...the Mariners completed Cactus League play with an 16-14-3 record (.485)...opened spring training 7-8-1 in first 16 games, but finished 9-6-2 over the final 17 games... went 6-3-1 over their last 10 games...posted a 8-9-1 record in home games and 8-5-2 when the road team...had a 15-10-2 mark in day games, compared to a 1-4-1 record in night games.
FIT FOR A TIE...the Mariners recorded three ties this spring, March 15 at Los Angeles Angels (4-4), March 17 at Oakland (11-11) and April 1 vs. Colorado (1-1)...equals the most Spring Training ties in club history ( $5 x$, 2016, 2014, 2009, 2008, 2005)...marks the eighth time in the last nine springs to record at least one tie...the Mariners now have 33 ties in spring club history (2 in regular season).
HOME AWAY FROM HOME...the Mariners set a single-season Spring Training attendance record by drawing 150,846 fans to Peoria Stadium over 18 games this spring, averaging 8,380 fans per game...the previous record was 145,146 in 2002 (15 games).
THE HITTERS...The Mariners hit 281 ( $327 \times 1163$ ) with 192 runs, 67 doubles, 15 triples, 35 home runs, 184 RBI and a .342 on-base percentage in 33 games this spring...the .281 average ranked 8th in MLB behind Arizona (.322), Los Angeles-AL (.310), Texas (.300), Washington (.288), San Francisco (.287), Cincinnati (.286) and San Diego (.283).

THE PITCHERS ...The Mariners went $16-14$ with a 4.84 ERA (158 ER, 294.0 IP) with 313 hits, 251 strikeouts, 85 walks and a 1.35 WHIP in 33 games this spring...the 1.35 WHIP ranked 9th in MLB behind Toronto (1.17), Minnesota (1.24), Tampa Bay (1.25), New York (1.26), Miami (1.29), Washington (1.31), Philadelphia (1.31) and Los Angeles-AL (1.31).
. 300 HITTERS...Seth Smith (.541/20x37), Robinson Canó (.368/21x57), Ketel Marte (.364/20x55), Luis Sardiñas (.323/21x65) and Kyle Seager (.321/18x56) were all Mariners on the Opening Day roster to hit .300 or better this spring.
EXTRA, EXTRA! ...ranked 4th among Amercan League teams and T7th (also: San Francisco) in MLB with 117 extra-base hits...recorded 67 doubles (T8th in MLB), 15 triples (3rd in MLB) and 35 home runs (15th in MLB).
TRIPLE THREAT ...the Mariners ranked 3rd in MLB with 15 triples this spring... 11 different Mariners hit triples, led by 3 from Daniel Robertson...Here is a breakdown of the Mariners triples in Cactus League play: Daniel Robertson (3), Ketel Marte (2), Seth Smith (2), Robinson Canó (1), Tim Lopes (1), Efren Navarro (1), Shawn O'Malley (1), Luis Sardiñas (1), Kyle Seager (1), Austin Wilson (1) and Mike Zunino (1).
HELLO CANÓ...Robinson Canó led the club in home runs (7) and RBI (17) and ranked T1st (also: Luis Sardiñas) in hits (21) and T5th (also: Norichika Aoki and Kyle Seager) in runs (9)...Canó hit safely in 10 of his last 11 games, batting .441 (15x34), with 7 runs, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 5 home runs, 13 RBI, a . 500 on-base percentage and a 1.029 slugging percentage... at one point this spring, Canó reached base in seven consecutive plate appearances beginning with a double in the ninth inning on $3 / 25$ and ending with a single in the first inning on $3 / 28(2 B, H R, H R, B B, 1 B, H R, 1 B)$.
SWEET-SWINGING SETH SMITH...Seth Smith led the club (min. 5AB) with a . 541 (20x37) batting average...Smith ended Spring Training on a seven-game hitting streak (3/14-4/2), batting . 550 (11x20) with 3 runs scored, 3 doubles, 2 triples, 1 home run and 9 RBI during the streak...Smith recorded 8 multi-hit games this spring and hit safely in 12 of 14 games overall this spring.
READY FOR THE REGULAR SEASON...Nathan Karns went 6.0 innings in each of his last two outings, posting a 3.75 ERA (5 ER, 12 IP), with 13 strikeouts and 2 walks...Karns led Mariners pitchers in innings pitched (28.0), strikeouts (25) and was T1st (also: Dan Altavilla, Hisashi Iwakuma, James Paxton) in wins (2).
GUTI, GUTI, GONE...Franklin Gutierrez hit 4 home runs in just 36 Spring Training at-bats... in 2015, he hit 15 home runs in just 171 Major League at-bats, an average of one home run every 11.40 at-bats...the HR/AB ratio was 2nd-best in the Majors and 5th-best in club history.
MARTE MASHING...Ketel Marte ended the spring on a 10-game hitting streak...during the streak, Marte hit .517 ( $15 \times 29$ ) with 11 runs scored, 4 doubles, 2 triples, 1 home run, 5 RBI, 6 walks and 2 stolen bases.
