Is The Party Over? Country Gets Serious With A New Wave Of Singles



The first time \mathbf{Craig} \mathbf{Morgan} sang "The Father, My Son and the Holy Ghost" was also supposed to be the last time.

The song details Morgan's difficult emotional journey following the death of son **Jerry Greer**, 19, in a 2016 drowning accident, and it left much of the Grand Ole Opry audience in tears in March 2019. Backstage, Morgan told **Ricky Skaggs** he doubted he was strong enough to perform it again.

Skaggs "put his hands on my shoulder with big tears in his eyes," recalls Morgan. "He said, 'You have to sing that song. The world needs to hear this kind of music.'"

Morgan relented. He sang it again at the Opry in July, started doing it in concerts and issued a recorded version in August. **Blake Shelton** aggressively championed the song on social media, spurring Morgan to sign

with Broken Bow and release it to radio on Sept. 16.

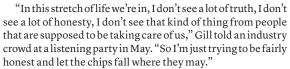
"Not only does 'The Father, My Son and the Holy Ghost' put life in this insane world back in perspective," wrote Shelton, "it could also put country music back in its lane."

Indeed, after several years in which terrestrial country radio leaned hard on party sounds and themes, Morgan is one of several artists creating a wave of deep, meaningful material. During a 24-hour window on Aug. 26 and 27, three themeheavy songs by A-list artists were released to radio through PlayMPE: Eric Church's "Monsters," which examines parenting

a child in a dangerous world; and two songs that face mortality, **Chris Young**'s "Drowning" and **Luke Combs**' "Even Though I'm Leaving."

They're not the only examples. **Justin Moore** topped the Country Airplay chart on Sept. 7 with "The Ones That Didn't Make It Back Home," a song about soldiers who died in battle, accompanied by a video that incorporates first responders

and school shootings. Riley Green's new "I Wish Grandpas Never Died" laments the deaths of people and pets, as well as the decline of the family farm. Tenille Townes' "Jersey on the Wall (I'm Just Asking)" uses the accidental death of a high school athlete to raise unanswerable questions. And Vince Gill's new album, Okie, tackles racial and political division, teen pregnancy, religion and sexual abuse.



Country has usually had a place—as **Brad Paisley** outlined in "This Is Country Music"—for difficult subjects such as death, faith and disease. Those darker songs have often challenged programmers, though the biggest ones—such as "Live Like You Were Dying," "He Stopped Loving Her Today"

or "Will the Circle Be Unbroken" — have become standards in the genre.

"Kenny Rogers told me a hit song makes your toe tap, your heart pound or your mind think," says BMLG Records president/CEO Jimmy Harnen, who worked The Band Perry's weighty "If I Die Young," certified seven-times platinum by the RIAA. "It's good when you feel your heart ache or you feel your heart pound. It's what music does—it moves the society, and it's one of the most powerful forces in the world when we get it right."

The bro-country era, which leaned on party themes and programmed percussion, brought a downturn to serious songs. The genre welcomed a bevy of new, young listeners to the genre, and the industry's decision-makers reacted by flooding the market with light, celebratory material. The new wave of meatier songs does not wipe out candy-coated material, but it brings necessary balance to the menu.

"I'm always looking for songs that strike an emotional chord, and for a long time it was tough to find them," says **KUKN** Longview-Kelso, Wash., GM **John Paul**. "I'm not saying the [party] songs were bad, they were just plastic. They weren't songs that had you go, 'Whoa, that's me' or 'I've been through that,' or make you stop and stare at the radio. These [new] songs do that."

This particular wave is likely a result of multiple influences. As the calendar moves into fall, labels traditionally issue more serious songs. The business also cycles through trends, and after leaning so heavily on surface-level songs, the pendulum is naturally drifting back toward deeper topics. Additionally, a difficult cultural climate — marked by gun violence, racial tension, childish rhetoric, climate change and the threat of a recession — has made many Americans uneasy. Much of the negativity is experienced in isolation on smartphones or in single-commuter auto trips. Music with deeper messages assures the individual that others share their frustration.

"Country has a slew of songs that will evoke an emotion," says Valory president **George Briner**, who oversaw Moore's chart run with "The Ones That Didn't Make It Back Home." "Very few other formats do that as often as country radio has the opportunity to do it."

The more difficult topics can strengthen the bond between artist and fan, sometimes uncomfortably. **Lee Ann Womack** found with "I Hope You Dance" that people at meet-and-greets shared extraordinarily personal and painful information. Young is discovering the same thing with "Drowning."

"People have come up and immediately started sharing their stories," he says. "It's something that honestly humbles you as an artist when you've got a song that people are having such a personal connection with."

That connection is why Skaggs encouraged Morgan to keep singing "The Father, My Son and the Holy Ghost." Regardless of the chart number that it eventually reaches, the song is already making a huge impact on the audience, which is a goal — maybe even a duty — for every artist of substance.

"If you've been blessed with a platform, you should use it to the betterment of the people of the world," says Morgan. "Democrat, Republican, independent, straight, gay, black, white — it don't matter. You should be trying to do what you can do for the betterment of the human race."

Brown's 'The Git Up' Rules Hot Country Songs For A Milestone 10th Week; The Highwomen Take Over Top Country Albums



Blanco Brown's "The Git Up" (Trailer Trap Music/Broken Bow Music Group/BMG/Wheelhouse/Stoney Creek/Broken Bow) tops *Billboard*'s Hot Country Songs chart (dated Sept. 21) for a 10th week, making him the first soloist to reign for double-digit weeks with a debut single since the survey started using multiple metrics in October 2012.

The track first led the July 13 list, aided early on by a viral dance challenge on TikTok and YouTube, with Brown having posted a tutorial in May.

"I grabbed spoons, tambourine, anything I could find that made a nice sound," he recently told *Billboard* of solely writing "Git." "When I got finished, it was so full of joy. I was doing the dance as I was writing it. I said, 'This is going to be a song that makes people dance and brings joy.'"

The 34-year-old Atlanta native previously produced songs for pop and hip-hop acts including **Chris Brown**, **Fergie** and **Pitbull**. Because Brown also produced "Git" himself, the single is the first Hot Country Songs No. 1 written, produced and performed by a single person since the chart adopted its streaming-, airplay- and sales-based methodology seven years ago.

"Git" raked in 19 million U.S. streams (down 7%) and 15,000 downloads sold (down 21%) in the week ending Sept. 12, according to Nielsen Music, and rules Country Streaming Songs and Country Digital Song Sales for a 12th week each. On Country Airplay, it increases by 12% to 1.9 million audience impressions in the week ending Sept. 15 and lifts 48-46.

Brown's smash is the first Hot Country Songs charttopper to lead for at least 10 weeks since **Luke Combs**'

"Beautiful Crazy" ruled for 11 frames beginning March 2. The last such leader before that, pop artist **Bebe Rexha** (in her country debut) and **Florida Georgia Line**'s "Meant to Be," set the record for the most time dominating the tally, having begun its 50-week domination on Dec. 16, 2017.

Brown joins FGL as the only acts since October 2012 to top Hot Country Songs for at least 10 weeks with a career-opening hit: The pair's "Cruise" totaled 24 weeks at No. 1 beginning that December.

"Git" is the debut single from Brown's first full-length, *Honeysuckle & Lightning Bugs*, due Oct. 11.



The Highwomen's name is an homage to **The Highwaymen**, the '80s/'90s assemblage of icons **Johnny Cash**, **Waylon Jennings**, **Kris Kristofferson** and **Willie Nelson**.

The Highwomen is the first Top Country Albums No. 1 for an all-female group since Pistol Annies' Interstate Gospel, which entered atop the Nov. 17, 2018, chart. Pistol Annies (Miranda Lambert, Ashley Monroe and Angaleena Presley) also mark the last all-female group to pace the list with a debut LP until The Highwomen, as their Hell on Heels zoomed in at the peak of the list dated Sept. 10, 2011.

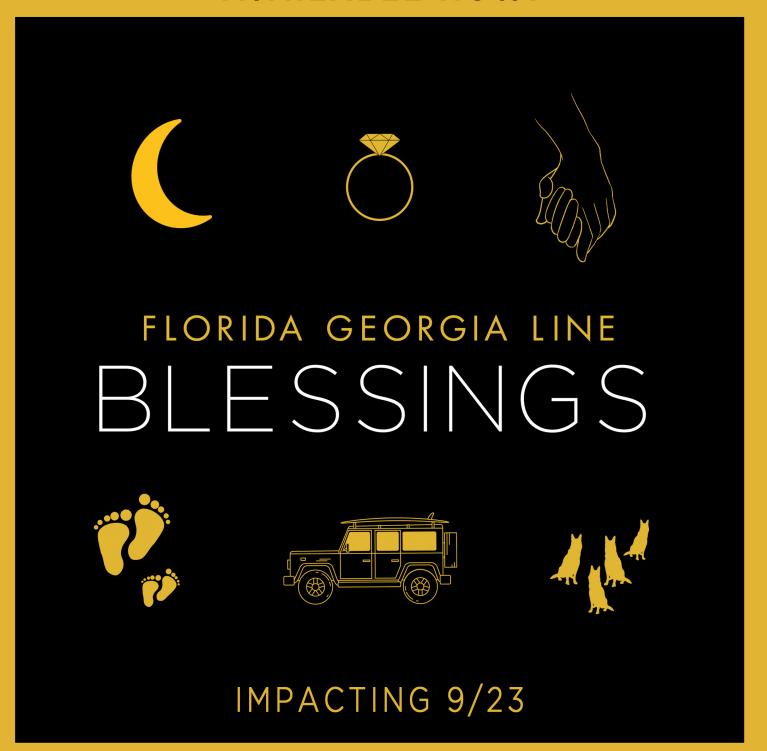
NEW TOP 10s Dierks Bentley notches his 24th Hot Country Songs top 10 as "Living" (Capitol Nashville) lifts 11-8. The track climbs 3-2 on Country Airplay, up

5% to 35.1 million in audience, and gets a 23% hike to 4.6 million U.S. streams. On Country Airplay, Matt Stell's debut single, "Prayed for You" (Wide Open/RECORDS/Good Company/Arista Nashville), hits the top 10 (11-9), gaining by 11% to 20.1 million in radio reach.

MUSIC'S CYCLES IN FOCUS

Friends and family said farewell to Earl Thomas Conley with a star-decked memorial concert on Sept. 10, barely an hour before the BMG Music Group said hello to a new building on Music Row.

Jason Aldean provided a physical through-line for both events—he turned in a stellar version of Conley's challenging midtempo "Nobody Falls Like a Fool" during the memorial at the Country Music Hall of Fame's CMA Theater. He was also on hand to assist in the champagne toast at the new BMG office constructed at 1 Music Circle South, a piece of turf that previously housed the Country Music Association.

The BMG facilities are fresh, with big, open spaces and impressive views of Music Row and its surrounding neighborhoods. The location features multiple conference rooms, an outdoor terrace and seven fourth-floor writing rooms — one can easily envision BMG Nashville executive vp **Kos Weaver** rushing writers up to the fifth floor to share a new song with BMG Nashville executive vp recorded music Jon Loba.

Coming in the aftermath of BMG's purchase of BBR Music Group, the building symbolizes a rebirth for the company in Music City, particularly as the label preps a new Aldean album, celebrates the first CMA nomination for Lindsay Ell and logs 10 chart-topping weeks for Blanco Brown's "The Git Up" on Hot Country Songs.

By contrast, while Conley's music is no longer on the tip of many country fans' tongues, performances by Blake Shelton, Luke Bryan, John Anderson and Neal McCoy, among others, shed new light on the depth of his catalog. Such songs as "Fire and Smoke," "What I'd Say" or "We Believe in Happy Endings" - many of them written by Conley himself - addressed the complications of adult relationships, filling them so skillfully with layers of meaning that the details are likely missed by most casual listeners.

As if the words aren't enough, Conley invariably picked songs with wide ranges and uncomfortable notes.

"These songs are hard," Shelton told an audience that included fellow performers Randy Travis and Eddy Raven. "But they're worth it to try."

Alongside the celebration of Conley's past and the rebirth of BMG, the Sept. 11 Americana Honors & Awards highlighted the maturation of a genre that's now roughly 20 years into its own life cycle, growing into a format full of meaning and long-term value. Artist of the year Brandi Carlile touchingly embraced her off-stage role as a mentor for the next generation in "The Mother," Bonnie Raitt and double-winner John Prine held hands as they concluded a powerful version of "Angel From Montgomery," and Rhiannon Giddens delivered the ominous, spiritual "Wayfaring Stranger" with a clear-voiced fragility.

The juxtaposition of those events provided a subtle reminder that every piece of the music business — the people, the companies and the music itself experiences its own life cycle. The goal, as Conley's legacy reminds us, is to leave the world a better place than you found it.

Give **Eric Church** props for speaking truth to powerful supporters. He served as guest picker on ESPN's *College GameDay* on Sept. 14 and disappointed the hometown fans at Iowa State in Ames when he picked archrival Iowa Hawkeyes for the win. The Hawks indeed beat the Cyclones, 18-17. Also involved in gridiron TV coverage was **Jason Aldean**, whose new single, "We Back," debuted as the CBS theme song for SEC games. The visitors came out on top in that one, too: The Alabama Crimson Tide rolled over the South Carolina Gamecocks, 47-23.



Luke Combs' second full album, What You See Is What You Get, will arrive Nov. 8 as the country business continues to bulk up on autumn releases. Alisan Porter's Pink Cloud, Georgette Jones' Skin, Lainey Wilson's Redneck Hollywood EP and Emily Hackett's By the Moon EP all hit the marketplace on Sept. 13. Rounder artist Logan Ledger serves up the T Bone Burnett-produced I Don't Dream Anymore on Oct. 4, Blanco Brown issues Honeysuckle & Lightning Bugs on Oct. 11, and Cody Jinks drops two albums back to back: After the First arrives Oct. 11, while The Wanting follows Oct. 18. Also of note: Dionne Warwick & the Voices of Christmas is due Oct. 18. It includes an appearance by Eric Paslay on "Frosty the Snowman" and a collaboration with John Rich, The Oak Ridge Boys and Ricky Skaggs on "Jingle Bells."

Woodstock and the moon landing weren't enough — country has found other ways to celebrate 50th anniversaries. Rodney Crowell teamed with Joe Henry during the Sept. 11 Americana Honors & Awards to cover the Bob Dylan/Johnny Cash duet "Girl From the North Country." Additionally, Buddy Jewell plans a Facebook Live performance on Sept. 17 of "The Night They Drove Old Dixie Down," 50 years after it first appeared on The Band's self-titled album.

Garth Brooks, Trisha Yearwood, Brooks & Dunn, Paul Simon, Vince Gill and Zac Brown are set as performers when the Musicians Hall of Fame inducts its new class of members on Oct. 22 at the Schermerhorn Symphony Center in Nashville. Country figures who will be enshrined include Steve Wariner, Alabama, producer Owen Bradley and engineer Billy Sherrill. ●

Luke Combs Gets A Rite Of Passage Right With 'Even Though I'm Leaving'

It's an odd reality that when people hear Luke Combs' "Even Though I'm Leaving," many will be in tears, and yet some of them will want to hear it again.

The three-verse plot is a classic sort of country story song, representing the arc of a father-son relationship from the boy's childhood to the dad's passing, with the son at his father's side as the old man takes his final breaths. It captures both the sad facts of mortality and the quiet joy of knowing that

your mentor was someone who deserves both your love and respect.

"It's almost like a cathartic kind of thing," says Combs of the emotions the song triggers. "It can have a weirdly positive result."

In that way, "Even Though I'm Leaving" fits from the outset alongside some of country's most touching father-son soliloquies, including Conway Twitty's "That's My Job," George Strait's "Love Without End, Amen," Paul Overstreet's "Seein' My Father in Me" and Zac Brown Band's "My Old Man." It captures the cloud of love, grief, separation and influence that continues to bond a man to his departed dad, which is remarkable since none of the song's three writers have yet experienced that sad rite

'We were all getting choked up, and it was weird because all of our fathers are still alive and we hardly knew each other," says Wyatt

Durrette ("Highway 20 Ride," "Chicken Fried"). "Butthat's one of the magical things about songwriting. If you're with the right people and you trust each other, crazy, magic things can happen."

COMBS

Combs and Durrette met up on Feb. 25, 2016, with singer-songwriter Ray Fulcher ("When It Rains It Pours") at a writers' room attached to the studio at Zac Brown's Southern Ground. Durrette was the established pro that day neither Combs nor Fulcher had a recording deal or a publishing contract at the time — and Durrette's desire to write about his son set the tone for the session.

Spurred by a conversation with a friend who had buried a parent, Durrette started talking about the hard truths of one generation leaving the next behind. When Combs located a title he already had logged in his phone ("Even Though I'm Leaving"), the song began to take shape. They started at the top with the phrase "Daddy, I'm afraid," setting up a verse about a little boy who's convinced monsters will emerge from the shadows after his father shuts out the lights. They matched it to a restrained melody and a chord progression that was intentionally unremarkable, keeping the focus on the words and leaving room for the chorus to grow.

"I wanted it to kind of have that contrast a bit where it was softer and more $lyric\text{-}driven in the \, verses, "explains \, Combs. "Then \, the \, chorus \, could \, still \, be \, this$ big singalong thing, but having it in that kind of upper register and giving it a little bit of the raspiness that people have become accustomed to with my stuff."

Dad holds the boy's hand at the end of that first verse and reassures him in the chorus when he's left alone: "Just 'cause I'm leaving it don't mean that/I won't be right by your side."

That sets up the final verse, the surreal moments when Dad transitions to the other side. "Daddy, I'm afraid," the now-grown son says to his aging father. Again, Dad offers his hand and some words of comfort: "Just 'cause I'm leaving it don't mean that/I won't be right by your side."

The middle verse proved to be the trickiest part. They needed another major point of separation and eventually decided on a son preparing to head into the service. It twists a bit as he does his best to act adult - "Daddy, I'm afraid" becomes "Dad, we'll be late." And the father is now just as fearful as the boy, realizing there's no guarantee he'll see his son alive again. Instead of holding his boy's hand, Dad hugs his neck, and "Even though I'm leavin'" becomes "Even though you're leavin'."

The changes are so natural they're not likely to be noticed until listeners try to learn the words verbatim.

'Whether it was by fate or luck or whatever, that second chorus worked

to where you could say all the same things, and you would just invert it a little bit," says Fulcher.

Still, that second verse was stressful because it required sensitivity. Just as none of the writers had ever lost their dad, none of them had ever joined the military either. They certainly did not want to disrespect that career.

"We got hung up a bit on 'How do we make this still have like a powerful thing, but not be too cheesy or corny?" recalls Combs. "We were like, 'Man, how do we say this and say it right without necessarily having experienced that ourselves?' We wanted it to feel genuine."

They knew they had succeeded at the end of the day. They recorded a simple guitar/vocal work tape, and even after they had labored for hours on a project about experiences they had never had, "Even Though I'm Leaving" made them all emotional.

"That was the only time in my whole writing career where there was definitely some misty eyes in the room," remembers Fulcher.

"Right at the end of the work tape," adds Durrette, "Luke finishes singing, and then like two seconds after it, you hear him go, 'Man, that's hard to get through.'"

Combs was well down the road on what would become his debut album, This One's for You, so he held back "Even Though I'm Leaving" for nearly two years before he recorded it in January 2018. Producer Scott Moffatt assembled a fairly spare studio band, picking the pace up just a hair from the demo's speed and overdubbing an angelic mandolin later that aids the song's fragility and provides some movement at the same time. Razor-like guitar effects built tension underneath, and Moffatt added all the backing vocals on his own.

Combs tagged the final phrase one last time at the end of the last chorus, emphasizing the father's final words: "I ain't goin' nowhere." It was a nuance he had added to the song after a handful of public and private performances.

"It just kind of felt like it buttoned it up a little bit," he says.

Combs, Fulcher and Durrette waited more than three-and-a-half years after the date of creation to finally see "Even Though I'm Leavi ng" become a single. It debuted at No. 12 on the Hot Country Songs chart dated June 22 after River House/Columbia Nashville issued his EP The Prequel. The label officially sent the song to terrestrial radio on Aug. 26 via PlayMPE, though it already had earned a fair amount of exposure; it jumps to No. 21 on Country Airplay in its sixth charted week.

"I'm really excited for the world to hear it," says Fulcher. "The reason I got into songwriting was to write songs like this that are going to affect people, that are going to stir up memories in a good way and are going to bring some healing."

Thus, it's a good sign that the near-tears the writers experienced when they wrote "Even Though I'm Leaving" are being reproduced among listeners as they connect with a song that continues the evolution of Combs' creative persona.

"The mandolin to me was a huge win from a production standpoint," he says. "It's kind of unlike anything that we've put out so far and definitely unlike anything we've released to radio. I just hope that it hits people the right way."

RANKINGS

Country Airplay is ranked by total audience impressions for the week ending Sunday based on monitored airplay of 149 stations by Nielsen BDS. Audience totals on the chart are derived, in part, using certain Arbitron Inc. copyrighted Persons 12+ audience estimates (under license © 2019, Arbitron Inc.) Country Indicator is tabulated using reported playlists and Nielsen BDS-monitored airplay at 109 stations, ranked by total plays.

BULLETS

 Awarded on Country Airplay to titles gaining audience or remaining flat from the previous week. A song will also receive a bullet if its percentage loss in audience does not exceed the percentage of monitored station downtime for the format. Titles that decline in audience but increase in detections will also receive a bullet if the total audience erosion for the week does not exceed 3%. Bullets are awarded on Country Indicator to titles gaining plays or remaining flat from the previous week.

TIES

On Country Airplay, if two songs are tied in total audience, the song with the larger increase in audience is placed first. On Country Indicator, if two songs are tied in total plays, the song with the larger increase in plays is placed first.

RECURRENTS

On Country Airplay, descending titles below No. 10 in either audience or detections are moved to recurrent after 20 weeks, provided that they are not still

gaining enough audience points to bullet or if they rank below No. 10 and post a third consecutive week of (non-bulleted) audience decline, regardless of total chart weeks. On Country Indicator, descending, non-bulleted titles below No. 10 are moved to recurrent after 20 weeks or if they post a third consecutive week of decline in plays after 10 weeks.

HOT SHOT DEBUT

Awarded to the highest-ranking new entry on Country Airplay and Country Indicator, respectively.

MOST ADDED

The total number of new adds officially reported to Billboard by each reporting station, or by an automatic-add threshold (seven plays for the first time in a chart tracking week, according to Nielsen BDS) for stations that do not report adds.

MOST INCREASED AUDIENCE/ PLAYS

Most Increased Audience on Country Airplay and Most Increased Plays on Country Indicator list the songs with the greatest week-to-week increases in total audience or plays, respectively.

AIRPOWER

Awarded on Country Airplay to titles ranking inside top 20 in plays and audience rankings for the first time, with increases in both plays and audience.

BREAKER

Awarded on Country Airplay to titles achieving airplay (at least one detection) at 60% of reporting stations for the first time.

45 Years Ago Don Williams Hit No. 1 For The First Time

In 1974, "I Wouldn't Want to Live If You Didn't Love Me" became Williams' first of 17 Hot Country Songs leaders On Sept. 21, 1974, **Don Williams**' "I Wouldn't Want to Live If You Didn't Love Me" rose 2-1 on *Billboard*'s Hot Country Songs chart, marking the legend's first leader on the list.

Penned by **Al Turney**, "Wouldn't" brought Williams to the pinnacle in his seventh chart appearance. Long considered a staple at country radio, Williams collected 56 Hot Country Songs appearances between 1972 and 1992, including 17 No. 1s and 45 top 10s.

With his broad, 6-foot-plus frame and smooth baritone voice, Williams earned the nickname "the Gentle Giant." Inducted into the Country Music Hall of Fame in 2010, he died after a short illness on Sept. 8, 2017, at age 78. Just hours after his death, during a concert stop in Athens, Ohio, **Brothers Osborne** paid tribute with a cover of Williams' 1979 No. 1 hit "Tulsa Time."

On Oct. 31, the Nashville Symphony will present "Don Williams: Music & Memories of the Gentle Giant" at the Schermerhorn Symphony Center, kicking off a three-night showcase of Williams' music curated by **Keith Urban**.
