### Highlights of the 2019 General Assembly include:

- Two days of paper sessions by invited speakers and RASC and AAVSO members.
- A half day of workshops for members to discuss various outreach and astronomy activities: Education; Public Outreach; Citizen Science; Light Pollution Abatement; Member Retention; Running a Centre; and more.

- The Ruth Northcott lecture will be given by James Hansen, author of *First Man: The Life of Neil A. Armstrong* (2005). It is a biography of the first man to walk on the Moon. A movie based on the book was released in 2018.
- Longtime RASC member David Levy's autobiography, *A Nightwatchman's Journey*, will be introduced.
- During the weekend, a program will be offered to members of the public. Families will be invited to attend hands-on astronomy activities and introductory lectures as part of a Father's Day Weekend Astronomy Adventure.
- Evening observing at York University's Allan I. Carswell Observatory.
- After the General Assembly, there will be tours to local sites, such as the David Dunlap Observatory.

Recently, two subway stations were opened at the north and south ends of the campus, making York University accessible from all over the city. This also means that downtown Toronto is a short subway ride from the campus.

Accommodation will be available in student residences on campus and at a hotel off-site on the Toronto subway line.

### **RASC Fundraising Forum**

While last year's annual reports and financials are being compiled and assessed, it's timely to review efforts and once again, sincerely thank our donors for their generous support! The 2018 year ended with nearly a tenfold increase over prior year donations and contributions as follows:

\$75,000 Trottier Family Foundation

\$60,000 Donations from Individuals & Members

\$25,000	Member Major Gift
\$25,000	Robert Fidler Bequest
\$8,650	Sponsorship Fees
\$6,720	Canada Summer Jobs Wage Subsidy
\$5,000	Foundation Grants

Fundraising income has allowed the Society to create the important position of Youth Outreach Coordinator to engage young people in astronomy. The Robotic Telescope program development has been supported and vital charitable initiatives such as the Journal and Observer's Handbook (OH) continue to flourish and expand with the introduction of a US version of the OH.

Moving forward this year, one goal is to provide helpful information to the fifteen centres with charitable status. Changes to Canada Revenue Agency's tax receipt requirements have been sent to treasurers and centres have been asked how they thank their donors (letters, plaques, certificates, etc.). Sharing knowledge of best practices will assist in the establishment of national donor recognition benchmarks to be circulated to all centres.

For centres that are not a charity, I encourage you to consider applying for charitable status. Centres may first incorporate as a not for profit (although it's not mandatory). Incorporation fees vary by province but are about \$750. There's no cost to apply for charitable registration.

The primary benefit in becoming a charity is the ability to issue charitable tax receipts. This can appeal to members who wish to financially contribute to centre activities and outreach. Some individuals may choose to arrange a bequest or donate property or equipment. Your centre may also be eligible to apply for grants. Of course, the centre must comply with CRA regulations regarding the issuing of receipts, record keeping and submission of an annual financial report. I can help with those tasks. Don't hesitate to contact me if you wish to explore this option.

Finally, the Society's Fundraising Committee is seeking members who not only have fundraising experience but themselves donate to national or are willing to contribute. Being a donor is a pre-requisite in helping RASC seek support. Cross country participation is being sought. Proposals for papers and posters should include your name, affiliation (if any), title of your paper or poster, an abstract not exceeding 150 words, and any AV requirements. Please submit your proposals to papers@rascga2019.ca, with the subject line "paper proposal RASC GA 2019", or "poster proposal RASC GA 2019", on or before May 4.
