#### It isn't easy being green.

But a little naivete can be a good thing, particularly in the music business, where most new artists have no idea how big the obstacles are until they actually find themselves in the middle of their career course. Thus, a debut is a big deal, and several talents — including current Country Airplay chart acts **Ingrid** Andress, Gone West, Gabby Barrett and Caylee Hammack

"Then a month later, we'd get denied by a couple of other people, and then we'd get to write with [someone else]. There's been a long list of people that believed in us at the beginning, but there's been ups and downs."

Here's a look at 11 country artists tentatively expecting "ups" with the release of their first album or EP before June 30:



While new acts are considered the lifeblood of the industry, it's always

a risk for labels to back first-timers. And in an era when women are considered a particularly risky investment, it's noteworthy that three of those charting new faces are solo females, while the other, Gone West, is a gender-balanced quartet.

Gone West is the least green of those acts, since all four members have a solo history. But that also means the band has enough experience to recognize the positive signs—every time it got discouraged, a songwriter with the heft of **Tom Douglas** ("The House That Built Me") or **Liz Rose** ("Girl Crush") offered an unsolicited pep talk or booked an unexpected co-write.

"That would fuel us," group member **Colbie Caillat** recalls.




• Ingrid Andress (Atlantic) — She vacillates amongvulnerable, confessional and brash, making Andress a bit of a signpost for modern female complexity. Her first terrestrial single, "More

Hearts Than Mine," occupies a top 15 slot on the Country Airplay chart, setting her up as a smart musical documentarian and creating anticipation for her debut album in March.

• Gabby Barrett (Warner Music Nashville)—With her kiss-off single "I Hope" taking an acerbic ride in Country Airplay's top 30, Barrett is building nicely on her *American Idol* introduction. Her tone mixes a slight nasal whine with pure power for an authoritative effect. She issued an independent EP in 2019, but graduates to a major-label album in the coming months.

• Adam Doleac (Arista Nashville) — As an infielder for Southern Mississippi, Doleac earned base hits in the College

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World Series before he refocused on country hits. A smoky texture and modern production made him a SiriusXM Highway Find as an indie act, and he steps to the plate for his major-label EP in February after signing with Arista last fall.

• Gone West (Triple Tigers) — The quartet's first single, "What Could've Been," is an established Country Airplay chart resident, introducing listeners to an accomplished harmonic weave. Former pop singer Caillat provides an instant storyline, though the act is focused — much like **Little Big Town** — on balance rather than a single lead voice. Its debut album likely arrives in May.

• Caylee Hammack (Capitol Nashville) —Lead single "Family Tree" draws on Hammack's small-town roots and dramatic tendencies while mixing country, pop and gospel textures. It's a great opening chapter for the Georgia native who has overcome tragedies (a brush with cancer, two house fires) that make music-industry hurdles seem inconsequential. Her first album will expand on that personal picture.

• Trea Landon (Warner Music Nashville) — Southern Georgia roots gave Landon a connection to songwriter **Dallas Davidson** ("What Makes You Country"), who offered a publishing deal when Landon arrived in Nashville. There's an occasional hitch in his voice that lends an air of believability. Landon issued an EP on his own, but has a major-label debut in the works.

• Johnny McGuire (Stoney Creek) — his duo Walker McGuire broke up in February, tackles country with a scrappy attitude and a mix of Southern-rock influence and redneck snarl. A journalism major in college, his background shows through in his blend of specific imagery in rhythmically focused melodic cadences. Expect a debut album in June.

• Teddy Robb (Monument) — With a neighborly, centrist country tone that occasionally resembles **Dustin Lynch**, Robb was inspired to take up music by **George Strait**'s recording of "Troubadour." He left his native Ohio to hone his skills in touristy Vail, Colo., before tackling Nashville. Signed to **Shane McAnally**'s SMACKSongs, his debut album is targeting a late-spring arrival.

• Noah Schnacky (Big Machine) — Schnacky made a high-profile appearance at 2019's Country Radio Seminar, impressing with relentless optimism, pop-influenced melodies and preternatural confidence. Combined with a fresh-scrubbed countenance, he could become country's answer to Shawn Mendes. His music is produced by Dann Huff (Keith Urban, Rascal Flatts); "I'll Be the One," from his forthcoming first EP, is prepping its chart debut.

• Dan Smalley (Big Machine) — After getting his honky-tonk education in the clubs and dance halls of Louisiana and Texas, Smalley knows what to do with a steel guitar and a two-step groove. But he's got a swampy side, too, and it's evident in his first EP, on the way with guidance from producer Keith Stegall (Alan Jackson, Zac Brown Band).

• Lainey Wilson (Broken Bow) — Teamed with producer Jay Joyce (Eric Church, Miranda Lambert), Wilson's Louisiana drawl is framed by a variety of sounds, including burning Southern rock, buzzing alt-rock and authentic backwoods country. Her first terrestrial radio single, "Dirty Looks," exemplifies the playful personal and rural life experience at the heart of her songwriting. A full album is expected in May.





## Dustin Lynch 'Ridin' Roads' To No. 1 On Country Airplay; Garth Brooks Extends Longevity On Hot Country Songs



**Dustin Lynch**'s "Ridin' Roads" (Broken Bow) ascends 2-1 on *Billboard*'s Country Airplay chart (dated Jan. 11), increasing by 23% to 36.5 million audience impressions in the week ending Jan. 5, according to Nielsen Music.

"I can't think of a better and stronger way to kick off 2020," he tells *Billboard* of his seventh Country Airplay leader. "A shout-out to everyone who's been ridin' roads while cranking this one up. A No. 1 song is life-changing ... what a blessing. It feels like we are just getting started, too. We've been hard at work on our new tour and are ready to hit the road."

"Roads" is Lynch's second Country Airplay No. 1 as a writer; he co-authored it with Zach Crowell and Ashley Gorley. It follows "Good Girl," a track Lynch penned with Andy Albert and Justin Ebach that led the list dated Jan. 19, 2019.

The songs are the first two singles from Lynch's fourth full-length, *Tullahoma*, which is named for the Tennessee town where he grew up. Crowell and Lynch co-produced the album (due Jan. 17).


Lynch's additional five Country Airplay No. 1s: are "Small Town Boy," which led for four weeks starting in September 2017; "Seein' Red" (one week, February 2017); "Mind Reader" (one, June 2016); "Hell of a Night" (one, September 2015); and "Where It's At (Yep, Yep)" (two weeks, September-October 2014).

Lynch attained his first of eight Country Airplay top 10s with his debut hit, the No. 2-peaking "Cowboys and Angels," in 2012.

With "Roads" reaching the Country Airplay penthouse in its 41st week on the chart, Lynch completes his second-longest trip to No. 1. "Hell of a Night" ruled in its 44th frame.

On the airplay-, streaming- and sales-fueled Hot Country Songs chart, "Roads" rises 7-6 in its 43rd week, pulling in 5.6 million U.S. streams (up 22%) and 3,000 downloads sold (up 1%) in the week ending Jan. 2.

Lynch will kick off his headlining Stay Country Tour on Jan. 30 in Detroit, with **Travis Denning** set to open most dates. Other cities on the 15-stop outing that have been announced include Boston; Kansas City, Mo.; and Pittsburgh.



**BROOKS RAISES THE 'BAR'** As we enter a new decade, **Garth Brooks** becomes the first artist to have appeared on Hot Country Songs in the '80s, '90s, '00s, '10s – and, now, the '20s – as "Dive Bar," with **Blake Shelton** (Pearl), pushes 24-21 for a new high.

The superstar first appeared on the chart with "Much Too Young (To Feel This Damn Old)" on March 25, 1989, at No. 94 (when the ranking ran 100 positions deep). The track peaked at No. 8 that July, becoming his first of 36 top 10s. He has posted 89 appearances overall, including 19 No. 1s.

Brooks joins other icons in appearing on Hot Country Songs — which launched as an all-encompassing genre songs chart in 1958 — in at least five distinct decades; just since 2018, **Willie Nelson** and **Dolly Parton** each have graced the list, extending their run of charted titles to six decades apiece (1960s-2010s), with Parton <u>having</u> <u>made history</u> with at least one top 20 hit in each of those decades. Plus, **George Jones** charted in 2011, expanding his streak of entries to seven decades, starting in the '50s.

**2,184 HOURS AT No. 1 Dan + Shay** and **Justin Bieber**'s "10,000 Hours" (Warner Music Nashville/WAR) leads Hot Country Songs for a 13th week. It also tops Country Streaming Songs for an eighth week (13.3 million streams, up 1%), dips to No. 2 after four weeks atop Country Digital Song Sales (13,000, down 1%) and drops 3-4 on Country Airplay, although with a 21% gain

to 36.1 million in radio reach.

With the track, Dan + Shay equal the total weeks that the duo's other two Hot Country Songs No. 1s ruled the chart: "Speechless" and "Tequila" led for nine and four weeks, respectively.

## **COUNTRY AIRPLAY CHART LEGEND**

#### RANKINGS

Country Airplay is ranked by total audience impressions for the week ending Sunday based on monitored airplay of 148 stations by Nielsen Music. Audience totals on the chart are derived, in part, using certain Nielsen Audiocopyrighted Persons 12+ audience estimates (under license © 2020, Nielsen Audio). The list of all Country Airplay chart reporters can be viewed on Nielsen Music's platforms.

#### **BULLETS**

• Awarded on Country Airplay to titles gaining audience or remaining flat from the previous week. A song will also receive a bullet if its percentage loss in audience does not exceed the percentage of monitored station downtime for the format. Titles that decline in audience but increase in detections will also receive a bullet if the total audience erosion for the week does not exceed 3%.

#### TIES

On Country Airplay, if two songs are tied in total audience, the song with the larger increase in audience is placed first.

#### RECURRENTS

On Country Airplay, descending titles below No. 10 in either audience or detections are moved to recurrent after 20 weeks, provided that they are not still gaining enough audience points to bullet or if they rank below No. 10 and post a third consecutive week of (non-bulleted) audience decline, regardless of total chart weeks.

#### **HOT SHOT DEBUT**

Awarded to the highest-ranking new entry on Country Airplay.

#### **MOST ADDED**

The total number of new adds officially reported to Billboard by each reporting station, or by an automatic-add threshold (seven plays for the first time in a chart tracking week, according to Nielsen Music) for stations that do not report adds.

#### **MOST INCREASED AUDIENCE**

Most Increased Audience on Country Airplay lists the songs with the greatest week-to-week increases in total audience.

#### AIRPOWER

Awarded on Country Airplay to titles ranking inside top 20 in plays and audience rankings for the first time, with increases in both plays and audience.

### BREAKER


Awarded on Country Airplay to titles achieving airplay (at least one detection) at 60% of reporting stations for the first time.

Country graduates from TV music contests hit the gridiron with a handful of performances in college bowls and NFL games. Jake Hoot delivered the national anthem at the Carolina Panthers' season finale in Charlotte, N.C., on Dec. 29 after winning NBC's The Voice. Chevel Shepherd, who won that competition a year ago, sang "The Star-Spangled Banner" on Dec. 21 for the New Mexico Bowl in Albuquerque. Reigning American Idol victor Laine Hardy did the honors on Jan. 5 when the New Orleans Saints lost an NFL playoff game to the Minnesota Vikings. Guthrie wrote "This Land Is Your Land" at Hanover House at 43rd Street and Sixth Avenue in New York on Feb. 23, 1940, and the anniversary will be celebrated with a concert on Feb. 23 at Town Hall, a half-block from the song's point of creation. **Wilco**'s **Jeff Tweedy** is the best-known participant, and all of the verses from the original — including passages that made it a protest song — will be performed. Proceeds benefit the Woody Guthrie Center in Oklahoma.

The third annual For Pete's Sake benefit, named for late guitarist **Pete Huttinger**, will take place Jan. 19 at Nashville's City Winery with proceeds earmarked for a cardiac fund associated with Vanderbilt University Medical Center. The bill includes John Oates, mandolinist Sam Bush, guitarist Bryan Sutton and several prominent songwriters: Pat Alger ("Unanswered Prayers"), Jon Vezner ("Where've You Been") and Don Henry ("All Kinds of Kinds").

## Morgan Evans' 'Diamonds' Mines Four Short Chords For A Long-Term Goal

"Diamonds are a funny thing," says **Morgan Evans**, noting their symbolism in a marriage. "You don't really know anything about them, and then you have to go buy one, and then it has to sit on her finger for a long time."

In that way, a diamond's qualities aptly reflect the characteristics of a long-lasting relationship or a classic song. The partner or the music is seemingly nonexistent until they enter someone's awareness. In a short period —

sometimes instantly — they transform into an essential, permanent part of that person's life. Evans is optimistic that his wife, fellow artist **Kelsea Ballerini**, will have that always-andforever role in his world, and is likewise hopeful that his latest single, "Diamonds" — which was inspired by her presence — has an undeniable, long-term relationship with the country audience.

"You can sweat over a chorus for like four hours, or you can write it in five minutes," says Evans. "It's funny — the five-minute ones are usually better than the four-hour ones, and that was the perfect example."

"Diamonds" is loaded with shiny facets: a twisty Dobro-and-vocal signature riff, a syncopated chord progression, plenty of counter-melodies and a lyrical hook — "I love you like a diamond/ And diamonds are forever" — that film buffs will link to a James Bond movie. And while its genesis

mostly came in a burst, there was a slow lead-up to its creation in Nashville and some last-minute polishing in Australia before it became a finished jewel.

Evans actually had been toying with the signature riff for quite some time, but didn't really have a place to use it. Last Valentine's Day, his work calendar fell apart, and he reached out to songwriter-producer **Chris DeStefano** ("Something in the Water," "Kick the Dust Up") to see if he could slide into a co-writing session. As it turned out, Los Angeles-based writer **Evan Bogart** ("Halo," "Tonight Tonight") was on DeStefano's schedule; Evans and DeStefano started building around that riff before Bogart arrived, and Evans mumbled the "Ilove you like a diamond" hook, which had popped into his brain during the commute.

DeStefano greenlighted that lyrical idea and started building a track in the key of D, using a progression – E-minor, D, A, D, A, G – that could, like a diamond, go on forever.

"The second chord in the progression is the one chord, but it's weird because it never really lands on the one, I think because of where the phrase falls," notes DeStefano. "I always think back to the incredible song 'Teenage Dream,' where it just never hits the one. I mean, it's basically just tension the entire song. We certainly weren't thinking that in this scenario, but we were thinking it just felt right."

When Bogart arrived, they all chatted for about 20 minutes, and then the other two unveiled what they already had started. Bogart felt like he had hit the jackpot, and they wrapped the chorus first.

"We wanted it to feel really fresh and really catchy, something that felt like it could be timeless but also nothing that you've heard before," he says. "We wanted to approach the lyric and the melody in a way that felt like it was both progressive and timeless at the same time."

When they turned their attention to the verses, Bogart threw out the opening line — "I was under pressure" — subtly pulling together the science of diamonds with the humanity of the relationship at the heart of the song.

"[It was] figuring out ways to relate everything about diamonds, from the pressure that creates them to the shine of it all, and then make that personal," he explains.



Complicating matters, that core descending chord progression was busy. The melody, they intuited, needed to come in small chunks, fitting neatly between the chords' short bursts.

"The chord movement is a hook in itself, so it was like, 'How do we support that but then also create a melody and a pocket that's completely complementary?" reflects Bogart. And, he adds, it was imperative to "keep within the wheelhouse of being country."

Before it was over, they fashioned a bridge by stopping the chordal flow and emphasizing the "unbreakable" nature of a diamond and of a great relationship. DeStefano turned it all into a convincing demo. Contrary to Evans' first album, where he and his producer played all the instruments, they put together a studio band to work on "Diamonds" during a session at Southern Ground.

"It was important for me to just start from scratch on this one," says Evans. "We certainly sat in the control room and played them the demo, and I remember a couple of the guys are like, 'Well, that sounds like you've got a record there. What do you want us to do?' That kind of set the challenge maybe for them, and they just killed it."

Guitarist **Tom Bukovac** developed a countermelody in the chorus (it's mixed with vocals to

create a shiny effect in the final version), and **Jedd Hughes** fitted faint, gurgling baritone guitar lines into spaces in the pre-chorus and chorus. And the whole crew readdressed the bridge, slicing it to focus specifically on the "unbreakable" motif at the heart of it all.

Evans finished the lead vocal later, with the range of "Diamonds" showing off different features in his resonance. The verses have a raspy conversational tone, while the chorus reaches a brighter segment of his sound and a brief falsetto section lends additional vulnerability.

"You never want to hear a vocalist sound like they're struggling," says DeStefano. "He just makes it sound easy."

Warner Music Nashville was enthusiastic about "Diamonds," but when Evans and DeStefano went to Australia for a tour in late October, the two decided they could make the production a little more country. DeStefano reached out to steel guitarist **Russ Pahl** and multi-instrumentalist **Ilya Toshinsky** back in Nashville, using Skype to craft a few changes. Toshinsky, in particular, threaded the Dobro element into the intro, working in tandem with a banjo part he had contributed during the tracking session. All of that occurred during the final 24 hours of a production deadline, with DeStefano catching a brief two-hour rest around 3 a.m. in Melbourne before finishing the version he sent to the mixing engineer.

"I woke up at 5 a.m., timing parts out to get it to **Jeff Juliano**, who mixed it, to get this country version out," recalls DeStefano. "I was wide awake, just 'cause I was super amped up about it."

WMN sent it to country radio via PlayMPE on Nov. 8, just before the Country Music Association Awards and the holiday season. Evans already had fans singing along when he played it live for the first time at The Troubadour in Los Angeles on Nov. 21, and it debuts at No. 60 on the Jan. 11 Country Airplay chart.

Time alone will tell if "Diamonds" has the same sort of longevity as the gem it references. It certainly stands out.

"There's only four chords, but it is a six-chord progression, and the order that they're in, it makes a huge difference," says Evans. "It just doesn't sound like anything that I've done before."

## *37 Years Ago* **Reba McEntire Scored Her** First No. 1 Song

"Can't Even Get the Blues" began the legend's string of 24 Hot Country Songs leaders

On Jan. 8, 1983, Reba McEntire's "Can't Even Get the Blues" became her first Hot Country Songs No. 1. Penned by Rick Carnes and Tom Damphier, the song marked her 16th entry on the chart.

McEntire, 64, was born in McAlester, Okla. Her father, Clark, and grandfather **John** were both rodeo champions. Red Steagall was in attendance when McEntire sang the national anthem at the National Rodeo Finals in Oklahoma City in 1974, and he convinced her to move to Nashville.

To date, McEntire has tallied 24 Hot Country Songs No. 1s among 59 top 10s. The only woman who boasts more leaders is Dolly Parton, with 25.

McEntire, who also has achieved star status in film and TV and on Broadway, has won numerous major accolades, including entertainer of the year at the 1986 Country Music Association Awards. She was inducted into the Country Music Hall of Fame in 2011.

At the 62nd annual Grammy Awards on Jan. 26, McEntire will compete for best country album with 2019's Stronger Than the Truth. It's her first nomination in the category in 25 years. -JIM ASKER
