HISTORY

Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University (FAMU) was founded as the State Normal College for Colored Students on October 3, 1887 beginning classes with fifteen students and two instructors. In 1905, it became an institution of higher education. The name of the college was changed to Florida Agricultural and Mechanical College for Negroes (FAMC) in 1909 and was elevated to university status in 1953. Today, FAMU is highly regarded as one of the nation's top historically black colleges and universities (HBCUs) and is one of the three oldest public universities in the 12-member State University System of Florida. FAMU is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges, receiving its first accreditation in 1935.

OVERVIEW

FAMU is a four-year coeducational, residential, landgrant university offering a broad range of instruction, research, and service programs at the undergraduate, professional and graduate levels. While the University continues its historic mission of educating African Americans, FAMU embraces persons of all races, ethnic origins and nationalities as life-long members of the university community. FAMU offers a variety of academic and professional programs through the fourteen colleges and schools. Degrees are awarded in 54 bachelor's, 29 master's, three professional, and 12 doctoral programs. Through its diverse faculty and staff, the University provides a caring, nurturing, and respectful environment — promoting the University's motto: "Excellence with Caring."


