Arcadia supports charities and scholarly institutions that preserve cultural heritage and the environment. We also give grants that promote open access.

In 2014 Arcadia awarded \$34,694,000 in total: \$31,044,000 directly, and a further \$3,650,000 through our three re-granting schemes, the Endangered Archives Programme at the British Library, the Endangered Languages Documentation Programme at the School of Oriental and African Studies, and the Cambridge Conservation Initiative Collaborative Fund at the University of Cambridge.
