

# CLARKSON N. POTTER'S SUMMER RESIDENCE.

Considerable local interest was taken in Newport in one of the clauses of the will of the late Clarkson N. Potter, of New-York, from the fact that in it he bequeathed "my summer residence, The Rocks, at Newport, R. I., to my brother, Gen. Robert B. Potter," notwithstanding the fact that the fee was always in the name of the General. It is learned that Mr. Clarkson N. Potter loaned his brother, the General, the money with which to purchase a house here and in Washington, and to prevent any misunderstanding as to whether the General held the property in trust or not, Mr. Potter bequeathed "The Rocks" to his brother.
