After four years of data collection, the numbers speak for themselves. They provide a clear picture of who is and isn't being published, which publishers are showing tangible improvements and which publishers are putting out statements that are not backed up by their numbers.

-Dreamspinner Books has been removed from the report due to their nonpayment of authors.


-Ninestar Press is new to the study at their request.

YEAR-OVER-YEAR ANALYSIS OF **BIG FIVE PUBLISHERS**












For every 100 books published by the leading romance publishers in 2019, only 8.3 were written by people of color.

That compares to 7.7% in 2018, 6.2% in 2017 and 7.8% in 2016. An increase of 0.4% industry-wide over four years.

78% of major romance publishers still had LESS THAN 10% of the books they published in 2019 written by people of color.
