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## PRESENTATION

This is a summary of the literary and journalistic awards given to Canadian authors over the past 51 years. We are publishing a list of the prizes, the winners and their works.<sup>1</sup>

### Background

As early as the end of the nineteenth century, prizes for poetry, the novel and the short story were awarded occasionally, generally by publishing houses or newspapers. The first annual award (established by the Province of Quebec and later known as the *Concours littéraires du Québec* (Quebec Literary Competitions)) appeared in 1923. The same year, the Imperial Order Daughters of the Empire created awards for the short story and one-act play. In the twenties, the Royal Society of Canada began to award medals as literary prizes. Around 1945, there were prizes for the novel, the short story, poetry, drama, research and journalism; these were in the form of medals, trophies, citations or cash.

Some of these prizes no longer exist, and some new ones have been created. On the whole, the number of prizes has increased. They now cover almost all literary genres: poetry, the novel, the short story, humour, drama, history, biography, books for young people and journalism.

In terms of the number of prizes awarded, Canada is now comparable to Great Britain, Austria and Switzerland. However, other countries award many more: Italy and West Germany have around 100 prizes; while the United States has some 400 and France approximately 500. Unfortunately we have no data with which to compare the value of the prizes in the various countries.

The prizes are awarded by various bodies, sometimes acting individually and sometimes with other groups: the federal government, provincial and municipal administrations, associations of writers, librarians and artists, publishing houses, journals, newspapers, universities, theatre groups and industrial and commercial firms, as well as other associations or individuals interested to some extent in literature.

## PRÉSENTATION

Nous recensons ici les prix annuels de littérature et de journalisme qui ont été offerts aux auteurs canadiens au cours des 51 dernières années. Nous publions la liste de ces prix ainsi que celle des lauréats et des œuvres couronnées<sup>1</sup>.

### Historique

Dès la fin du XIX<sup>e</sup> siècle, des prix ayant pour objet la poésie, le roman et la nouvelle, étaient occasionnellement offerts, le plus souvent par des maisons d'édition ou par des journaux. Le premier prix annuel (institué par la Province de Québec et connu plus tard sous le nom de Concours littéraires du Québec) fit son apparition en 1923. La même année, l'*Imperial Order Daughters of the Empire* créait des prix pour la nouvelle et les pièces en un acte. Au cours des années 20, la Société royale du Canada commença, de son côté, à décerner des médailles comme prix de littérature. Vers 1945, le roman, la nouvelle, la poésie, le théâtre, la recherche et le journalisme étaient l'objet de prix annuels, présentés sous forme de médailles, de trophées, de mentions ou de sommes d'argent.

Depuis lors, certains prix ont cessé d'exister; d'autres ont fait leur apparition. Dans l'ensemble, le nombre des prix s'est accru. Ils touchent aujourd'hui à peu près tous les genres littéraires: la poésie, le roman, la nouvelle, le genre comique, le théâtre, l'histoire, la biographie, la littérature pour la jeunesse et le journalisme.

Quant au nombre de ses prix, le Canada se compare actuellement à la Grande-Bretagne, à l'Autriche et à la Suisse. D'autres pays, cependant, en ont beaucoup plus: l'Italie et l'Allemagne de l'Ouest en comptent 100; les États-Unis, environ 400; et la France, environ 500. Nous n'avons malheureusement aucune donnée qui nous permette de comparer la valeur des prix de ces différents pays.

Les prix proviennent de diverses sources, agissant seules ou en collaboration les unes avec les autres: l'État fédéral, les administrations provinciales et municipales, les associations d'écrivains, de bibliothécaires, d'artistes, les maisons d'édition, les revues, les journaux, les universités, les troupes de théâtre, les sociétés industrielles et commerciales, ainsi que d'autres associations ou individus intéressés de près ou de loin à la chose littéraire.

### The Prizes Included in this Survey

Certain criteria had to be established to define the area under study. The criteria can be broken down into four categories: frequency of award, subject matter, nature of the award, and the rules governing the eligibility of candidates.

With respect to frequency, only annual awards have been included. Prizes awarded on an occasional basis have therefore been omitted. Moreover, all current annual awards have been recorded, even those created very recently. Of the prizes that are now defunct, only those that were awarded for at least five years have been considered.

In the area of subject matter, our statistics deal with prizes for literature and journalism. We have therefore eliminated those which, while not completely outside the literary realm, are primarily awarded for other activities. However, when the prizes have special categories for literature, the latter have been included (Theatre Canada's drama festival prize and the prize of the Association of Canadian Television and Radio Artists, for example). On the other hand, non-literary categories of prizes which are largely literary in nature have been eliminated (the Photography section of the National Newspaper Awards, for example), except where their omission would have been detrimental to the content of the text (as is the case for the National Press Club of Canada awards and those of the Canadian Journalism Hall of Fame). In addition, the prizes had to be for completed works, either published or unpublished, in order to be included. Bursaries and grants designed to aid writers to undertake or finish a work have therefore been excluded.

With respect to the nature of the awards, we have recorded only the names of those winners who received material recognition: cash, medals, trophies, and so on; those who simply received citations have been omitted so as not to make the text unduly long.

As for eligibility, our first criterion was that the prizes be awarded to individuals. That is, those given to periodicals, with no mention of the author, do not appear on our list.

In addition, the winners must be adults, not children or adolescents. Nevertheless, we have included the *Prix de l'Actuelle-Jeunesse*, the *Prix Marie-Claire Daveluy*, and the youth category of the Alberta Poetry Contest, because although they are not for adults, these awards are national in scope and the winning works are automatically published.

Prizes restricted to members of an organization or to students of an institution have also been excluded. Two exceptions have been made to this rule,

### Les prix recensés

Un certain nombre de critères ont dû être établis pour délimiter l'univers recensé. Ces critères peuvent être répartis en quatre catégories selon qu'on considère l'élément temps, l'objet du prix, la nature du don, enfin les règles qui gouvernent l'éligibilité des candidats.

Du côté temps, seuls les prix annuels ont été retenus. Ceux qui ont été offerts à titre occasionnel ont donc été omis. De plus, tous les prix annuels qui existent actuellement sont recensés, même s'ils sont de dates très récentes. Quant aux prix aujourd'hui disparus, nous ne les avons retenus que s'ils ont été attribués pendant au moins cinq ans.

Du côté de l'objet, nous recensons les prix de littérature et les prix de journalisme. Nous avons donc éliminé ceux qui, tout en n'excluant pas complètement la littérature, s'adressent surtout à d'autres activités. Cependant, quand ces prix ont des catégories spéciales pour la littérature, celles-ci ont été retenues (*Prix du Festival d'art dramatique Théâtre Canada*, *Prix de l'Association canadienne des artistes de la radio et de la télévision*). Par contre, les catégories non littéraires des prix à caractère principalement littéraire ont été éliminées (par exemple, la section Photographie des *National Newspaper Awards*), sauf quand leur omission aurait nui au contenu du texte (comme c'est le cas pour les prix du *National Press Club of Canada*, et du Temple de la Renommée du Journalisme canadien). De plus, les prix recensés doivent être décernés pour des œuvres terminées, publiées ou inédites. Les bourses et les subventions qui ont pour but d'aider les écrivains à entreprendre ou à compléter une œuvre ont donc été omises.

Du côté de la nature des dons, nous ne rapportons que les noms des lauréats qui ont bénéficié de gratifications matérielles: argent, médailles, trophées... En d'autres termes, nous avons omis les simples mentions pour ne pas prolonger indûment le texte.

Du côté de l'éligibilité des candidats, les prix doivent, premièrement, être destinés à des personnes. C'est dire que ceux qui sont attribués à des périodiques sans faire mention des auteurs, n'apparaissent pas sur nos listes.

Deuxièmement, les lauréats doivent être des adultes et non des enfants ou des adolescents. Cependant, nous avons retenu le *Prix de l'Actuelle-Jeunesse*, le *Prix Marie-Claire Daveluy* et la catégorie juvénile de l'*Alberta Poetry Contest*, parce que ces prix, bien que ne s'adressant pas à des adultes, ont une envergure nationale et parce que les œuvres couronnées sont automatiquement publiées.

Troisièmement, les prix restreints aux membres d'une organisation ou aux étudiants d'une institution n'ont pas été admis. Toutefois, nous avons fait deux

however: the Kenneth R. Wilson Prize and the *Prix de poésie de la Société des Poètes canadiens-français*, because these awards are national in scope.

The municipality is the smallest geographic unit considered in our statistics. Our study therefore includes municipal, regional, provincial, national and even international awards. The only international awards included, however, are those to which a public or private Canadian body contributes.

### Sources of Information

The information was found in literary and journalistic periodicals and in the media in general. Where possible, we contacted the organizations responsible for awarding the prize; we would like to take this opportunity to thank them for their co-operation. It is possible that we may have overlooked some important prizes. If this has happened, we would ask our readers to accept our apologies and to notify us of the omissions.

Despite our efforts, we were unable to establish statistics on 18 awards, because it was impossible to compile the necessary information. They can be broken down as follows:

Quatrièmement, quant au territoire embrassé, la municipalité est la plus petite unité géographique retenue. Nous avons donc recensé des prix municipaux, régionaux, provinciaux, nationaux et même internationaux. Cependant les seuls prix internationaux admis sont ceux auxquels contribue un organisme canadien, public ou privé.

### Sources de l'information

Les renseignements ont été puisés dans les revues de littérature et de journalisme ainsi que dans la grande presse. Quant la chose a été possible, nous avons pris contact avec les organismes responsables. Nous les remercions de leur collaboration. Il se peut que des prix importants aient échappé à notre attention. Si la chose s'est produite, nous nous en excusons auprès de nos lecteurs et nous les prions de nous signaler les omissions et les lacunes.

Malgré nos efforts, 18 prix n'ont pu être recensés parce qu'il nous a été impossible de recueillir l'information nécessaire. Ils se répartissent comme suit:

## A. INTRODUCTION

At present we have a list of 81 literary awards, but we were able to establish statistics on only 69 of them. There are therefore twelve awards for which we could not compile the data necessary to include them in this publication. Of these awards, all are now defunct, with the exception of the *Prix Michèle Lenormand* and the *Edmonton Journal Literary Awards Competition*. The following is a list of these 12 awards:

### Language of the Awards

The 69 literary awards included here are open to Francophones, Anglophones or both.

We used the following rule in determining the language of the prizes: a prize is bilingual if, in the last few years at least, the number of winners who speak the majority language does not exceed 80% of the total. Table 1 gives a breakdown by language of the distribution of prizes. The stability of the French awards is noteworthy, 94% of the original awards are still in existence, in comparison with 82% for the bilingual awards and 73% for the English awards.

### Existing Awards

The first literary awards were established in 1923. Of those still in existence, the oldest is the Lorne Pierce Medal, given by the Royal Society of Canada, which was first awarded in 1926. Table 2 indicates when the 50 existing prizes were first offered.

Table 3 gives a breakdown of prizes by type of literature, and Table 4 shows the various categories of sponsor of the awards. We shall examine these breakdowns more closely when we look at the cash value of the awards.

The competitions set certain restrictions as to the eligibility of candidates. These restrictions may pertain to nationality, age, language, place of residence, membership in groups, and so on. Generally,

Nous avons actuellement en notre possession une liste de 81 prix littéraires, dont 69 seulement ont pu être recensés. Il existe donc 12 prix pour lesquels il a été impossible de recueillir les données nécessaires pour les inclure dans cette publication. Ces derniers sont aujourd'hui tous disparus, sauf le *Prix Michèle Lenormand* et l'*Edmonton Journal Literary Awards Competition*. Voici la liste de ces 12 prix:

### La langue des prix

Les 69 prix littéraires recensés s'adressent soit à des anglophones, soit à des francophones, soit aux deux à la fois.

Pour déterminer la langue des prix, nous nous sommes arrêtés à la règle suivante: un prix est bilingue quand, dans ses dernières années tout au moins, le nombre des lauréats de la langue dominante ne dépasse pas 80 % de l'ensemble. Le tableau 1 distribue les prix quant à la langue. On notera la stabilité des prix français dont 94 % subsistent depuis leur création, en comparaison de 82 % pour les prix bilingues et de 73 % pour les prix anglais.

### Les prix actuels

Les premiers prix littéraires sont apparus en 1923. Parmi ceux qui existent encore à l'heure actuelle, le plus ancien est La Médaille Lorne Pierce de La Société royale du Canada, qui date de 1926. On peut se faire une idée de la date d'apparition des 55 prix actuels en consultant le tableau 2.

Le tableau 3 distribue les prix actuels selon les genres littéraires; et le tableau 4, selon la provenance. Nous regarderons de plus près ces distributions au moment où nous examinerons la valeur monétaire des prix.

Les concours imposent certaines restrictions quant à l'éligibilité des candidats. Ces restrictions peuvent toucher la nationalité, l'âge, la langue, le lieu de résidence, l'appartenance à certains groupes, etc. Le plus souvent les

candidates must be Canadian citizens or landed immigrants. The distribution of existing awards in accordance with the other categories listed is shown in Table 5, which gives a breakdown of international, national, provincial, regional and municipal prizes, as well as those restricted to particular groups. These groups are the *Association des Poètes canadiens-français* (No. 46)<sup>1</sup> and young people under 21 (No. 37 and No. 65).<sup>1</sup> The 15 prizes restricted to residents of a particular province can be broken down as follows:

#### Cash Value of Awards

Eighty-five per cent of the existing prizes are cash awards. More specifically, 100% of the French prizes, 77% of the English prizes and 89% of the bilingual prizes are of this type.

candidats doivent être citoyens canadiens ou immigrants reçus. D'autre part, si on distribue les prix actuels selon les autres catégories énumérées, on obtient le tableau 5, qui distingue les prix internationaux, nationaux, provinciaux, régionaux ou municipaux, ainsi que ceux qui sont restreints à certains groupes. Ces groupes sont l'*Association des Poètes canadiens-français* (n° 46)<sup>1</sup> et les jeunes de moins de 21 ans (n° 37, n° 65)<sup>1</sup>. Quant aux 15 prix restreints aux habitants d'une seule province, ils se distribuent comme suit:

#### Valeur monétaire des prix

Quatre-vingt-cinq pourcent des prix actuels sont des prix en argent. Plus précisément, 100 % des prix français, 77 % des prix anglais et 89 % des prix bilingues sont de cette nature.

Du point de vue monétaire, les prix les plus importants, ceux dont la valeur est d'au moins \$5,000, sont les suivants:

The largest award is therefore the Molson Prizes, which was been in existence since 1963.

Table 6 gives a comprehensive view of the cash value of present and past prizes. Of course, all these prizes did not exist at the same time: at no time was a grand total of \$126,374 given out. The current total value of the awards is \$93,449, of which 37% is for English writers, 20% for French writers and 43% for authors writing in either language.

Table 7 gives a breakdown of the cash value of the prizes by category of sponsor. It shows that the most important sources are the provinces (29.5%), the federal government (25.7%) and the books and periodicals industry (8.1%).

Table 8 gives a breakdown of the cash value of current prizes by literary genres. On the whole, the groups entitled All categories (57%) and Drama (21%) receive most of the awards. This situation changes, however, if we examine the awards by language. Among bilingual awards, the accent is on All categories (80%) and Translation (13%). On the English side, Drama far exceeds the other groups (55%). On the French side, the All categories group (79%) and Novels and short stories (17%) are predominant.

Le prix le plus élevé est donc le Prix Molson qui est en existence depuis 1963.

Le tableau 6 offre une vue d'ensemble de la valeur monétaire des prix présents et passés. On comprend que tous ces prix n'ont pas existé simultanément: à aucun moment, un grand total de \$126,374 n'a été distribué. Aujourd'hui, la somme totale des prix est de \$93,449 dont 37 % est destiné aux écrivains anglophones; 20 % aux écrivains francophones; et 43 % aux auteurs de l'une et l'autre langue.

Le tableau 7 distingue la valeur monétaire des prix actuels selon la provenance. Il révèle que les sources les plus importantes sont les provinces (29.5 %), l'État fédéral (25.7 %), et l'industrie du livre et des périodiques (8.1 %).

Le tableau 8 distribue la valeur monétaire des prix actuels selon les divers genres littéraires. Dans l'ensemble, les groupes Toutes catégories (57 %) et Théâtre (21 %) sont les mieux dotés. Si on examine la langue, cependant, les points forts se déplacent. Car, du côté bilingue, l'accent est mis sur les groupes Toutes catégories (80 %) et Traduction (13 %). Du côté anglais, le Théâtre prend nettement la vedette (55 %). Et, du côté français, ce sont les secteurs Toutes catégories (79 %) et Romans et nouvelles (17 %) qui dominent.

The Quebec Literary Competition was founded and sponsored by the Province of Quebec, with two objectives; stimulating literature and scientific research, and helping writers and researchers publish their work. The categories, the amounts awarded and the number of winners varied. Latterly, a total of \$20,000 was distributed equally among eight categories. Any Canadian citizen could submit entries in French, but authors of works in English had to have been living in Quebec for at least five years.

Since 1926, The Royal Society of Canada has awarded a gold medal for some achievement in the field of imaginative or critical literature in English or French. Literary criticism dealing with Canadian subjects receives prior consideration over works lacking a Canadian theme. The medal was named for Dr. Lorne Pierce of Ryerson Press, who was for many years active in the promotion of Canadian literature. Since 1966, a sum of \$1,000 accompanies the gold medal. The award is presented biennially.

Depuis 1926, la Société royale du Canada décerne une médaille d'or, qui commémore l'œuvre de l'éditeur Lorne Pierce de la maison *Ryerson Press*, grand promoteur de la littérature canadienne. Ce prix est décerné pour souligner une contribution importante dans le domaine de la littérature d'imagination ou de la critique en français ou en anglais. Bien que tous les genres littéraires soient admis, préférence est donnée aux ouvrages de critique littéraire portant sur des œuvres canadiennes. La médaille, accompagnée d'une somme de \$1,000 depuis 1966, est maintenant décernée tous les deux ans.

The Governor General's Literary Awards were instituted in 1936 by the Canadian Authors' Association, which assumed the expense and administered the awards for the first seven years. In 1944, the Canadian Authors' Association created the Governor General's Awards Board which, under the Association's direction, supervised the selection and briefing of judges. By 1954, the Board had become an autonomous, self-perpetuating body of five members, nominated by the chairman and approved by the Governor General. Until this time, English language writers only were eligible, but in 1959, when the Canada Council assumed responsibility for the awards, a French-language section was added. There have always been three basic categories: fiction, non-fiction and, poetry and drama. Between 1942 and 1958, two awards were given in the non-fiction category, and between 1949 and 1958 there was also a juvenile book award. Since 1959 two awards, one English and one French, have been given in each of the three basic categories. Initially, the winners received a medal. After the Canada Council took over in 1959, the winners received \$1,000 as well. Later, the medal was changed to a specially bound copy of the author's winning book, and in 1965 the cash prize was increased to \$2,500.

Le Prix du Gouverneur général fut fondé en 1936 par *The Canadian Authors' Association*, qui en garda la direction jusqu'en 1944. À ce moment, un conseil d'administration fut créé pour administrer le prix sous l'autorité de l'Association. En 1954, le conseil d'administration devint autonome, ses membres étant nommés par le président avec l'approbation du Gouverneur général. Jusque là, le prix ne s'adressait qu'aux auteurs de langue anglaise. En 1959, il passa sous la juridiction du Conseil des Arts du Canada, qui lui adjoignit une section de langue française. Le Prix a toujours comporté trois catégories: poésie et théâtre; romans et nouvelles; autres œuvres littéraires. Cependant, de 1942 à 1958, on subdivisa la dernière catégorie en littérature et recherche; et de 1949 à 1958, on ajouta une catégorie de livres pour la jeunesse. Depuis 1959 on en est revenu aux trois catégories initiales. Au début, les lauréats recevaient une médaille, mais celle-ci fut remplacée plus tard par un exemplaire spécialement relié de l'œuvre primée. Depuis l'entrée en scène du Conseil des Arts en 1959, une somme de \$1,000 (portée à \$2,500 en 1965) est aussi attribuée aux lauréats.

These medals have been awarded annually since 1951 for the best works submitted to the competition in four categories: single poem, short story, general article and scholarly article (first presented in 1953). The award was established to complement the Governor General's Literary Awards by granting recognition to periodical publications. To be eligible, work must have been written by a Canadian citizen or resident, and must have been published in Canada. Since 1967, each medal has been accompanied by \$100. A special medal was posthumously awarded to poet Anne Wilkinson (1910-1961) in 1962.

Any theme or form may be used. All residents of Canada may submit poems in English. Winning entries are published in the Alberta Poetry Yearbook.

For ten years after its founding in 1936 by the Canadian Authors' Association, the Canadian Poetry Magazine offered prizes of \$15, \$10 and \$5 for the best poems in each issue. In 1938, seven cash awards per issue were made. In 1946, the Donald G. French Award for Poetry (\$25) was instituted under the auspices of the magazine. It is not known when this award ceased to be offered. Some other prizes were given just once. The Seranus Memorial prize of \$25 was presented in 1937, the Tweedsmuir Award (a medal from the Governor General) was given in 1938 and the Centennial Prize of \$25 was awarded in 1967.

De 1936 à 1946, le *Canadian Poetry Magazine* (fondé par *The Canadian Authors' Association*) offrit trois prix de poésie (\$25, \$10 et \$5) pour les meilleurs poèmes de chacune des livraisons de la revue. ## 43. O'Leary Newfoundland Poetry Awards

The O'Leary Newfoundland Poetry Awards were instituted in 1944 to foster Newfoundland literature, particularly in the field of poetry. The idea was originally conceived by Michael Harrington, compiler and broadcaster of a daily radio program devoted to Newfoundland matters. All Newfoundlanders could submit original, unpublished poems in English. First prize was \$100, with \$25 for each honorable mention.

The Dominion Drama Festival, now known as Theatre Canada, was inaugurated in 1932 and, except for the war years, has been an annual event. In 1970, the Festival became non-competitive. Although most awards were given for achievement in dramatic fields other than writing, there were several prizes intended specifically for playwrights. From 1934 to 1959, the Festival Committee Prize of \$100 was awarded to the author of the best play written by a person domiciled in Canada and presented at any of the regional festivals. This prize was discontinued in 1960 and replaced by the Massey Medal which was given to the best Canadian playwright in the final Festival. The medal was donated by the governors of the Festival to honour The Right Honourable Vincent Massey, the Festival's first chairman and later its honorary president. In 1960, special awards were made by the Canada Council to encourage the writing and production of full-length Canadian plays. The playwright was awarded \$100, and an additional \$500 if his play should win the Final Festival Trophy. These awards were made only in 1960. The Canadian Association of Broadcasters, in 1967 and 1968, donated a \$1,000 prize, known as the Howard Caine Memorial Award, to be given to the author of the best new Canadian play.

Le Festival d'art dramatique, aujourd'hui Théâtre Canada, ne désigne pas un prix littéraire, mais un festival d'art dramatique. Sauf durant la guerre (1940-1947), ce festival a eu lieu tous les ans depuis 1933. Un certain nombre de prix lui sont associés. Nous groupons ici ceux qui ont un caractère proprement littéraire — par opposition aux prix décernés aux acteurs, réalisateurs, metteurs en scène, etc. Le Prix du Comité du festival (\$100) fut attribué, de 1934 à 1959, à l'auteur de la meilleure pièce présentée aux festivals régionaux. Pour être élu, l'auteur devait habiter au Canada. En 1960 seulement, le Conseil des Arts du Canada offrit huit prix de \$100 aux auteurs des meilleures pièces de chacune des huit régions du festival. De plus, l'auteur qui remporta le Trophée du Festival, cette année-là, reçut une somme supplémentaire de \$500. De 1960 à 1969, le prix du festival fut la Médaille Vincent Massey, ainsi nommée en honneur du Gouverneur général, premier président du festival. En outre, en 1967 et 1968, le Prix Howard Caine (\$1,000) de l'Association canadienne des radio-diffuseurs fut décerné au meilleur auteur canadien d'une nouvelle pièce.

Winners receive a cash award of \$1,649 which commemorates the date of the original Sainte-Marie's destruction. Persons of any nationality residing anywhere in the world and writing in English or French may enter the competition. Submissions of at least 20,000 words are accepted from a wide range of disciplines including anthropology, archaeology, economics, geology, history, natural history and sociology.

## A. INTRODUCTION

Of the 20 prizes included here, two are no longer in existence: No. 73. Bowater Award for Journalism and No. 84. Travel Writing Award. Both were restricted to Anglophone journalists.

### Existing Prizes

We applied the same rule regarding language that we used for the literary awards. Table 9 gives a breakdown by language of the 18 existing prizes and shows the cash value of 15 of them.

The oldest award (No. 65. Media Club of Canada Memorial Award) was established in 1936. Generally speaking, prizes in the field of journalism are a recent phenomenon: most of the current prizes came into existence in the last 20 years.

### Prix actuels

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Tables 10, 11 and 12 give a breakdown of the cash value of existing prizes by: type of publication, the source of the prizes and some conditions of eligibility. We used four types of publication: the general group, business, sports and travel, and miscellaneous. There are also four sources of the prizes: journalism clubs, associations, business firms, and other sources, including different donors acting jointly (an association and a business firm, for example). The conditions of eligibility included four categories: national prizes, for journalists who published anywhere in Canada; provincial prizes, for articles published in a particular province (this applies to British Columbia alone); regional or municipal prizes, for articles published in a certain region (namely southwestern Ontario) or in a city (namely Toronto). There is also a special group, with only one prize (No. 82. Kenneth R. Wilson Memorial Awards), which is restricted to the regular members of the editorial staffs of the periodicals which belong to Canadian Business Press.

These awards, known until 1973 as the Canadian Women's Press Club Memorial Awards, were established in 1935. At that time, the winner received a gold medal and \$25 for a piece of writing relating to the specific category which had been chosen for that year. Over the years the medal was changed, monetary awards increased, and categories, which expanded to permit more than one winner, varied from one presentation to the next. In particular, from 1954 to 1961, in conjunction with the Canadian Women's Press Club, Elizabeth Arden presented awards for articles on beauty and fashion styling. First prize was \$300; second, \$200. Currently, there are five categories in which prizes are offered. The top prize in each is \$100 and a sterling silver medal. Second place winners receive \$50, and a certificate; those accorded honorable mention, a certificate. The competition was open to Canadian women only until 1973 when the rules were changed to allow men to enter.

Créé en 1935, ce prix du *Media Club of Canada* fut connu jusqu'en 1973 sous le nom de *Canadian Women's Press Club Memorial Awards*. Il fut d'abord réservé aux femmes journalistes, mais il a été étendu aux hommes en 1973. Au début, le prix (une médaille d'or et une somme de \$25) était destiné à une catégorie d'articles qui variait d'année en année. Par la suite, la médaille a changé, les sommes ont variées, et les catégories se sont multipliées. De 1954 à 1961, en particulier, deux prix de \$300 et \$200 furent offerts par Elizabeth Arden pour des articles portant sur la beauté et la mode féminine. À l'heure actuelle, le prix comporte cinq catégories. Dans chacune d'elles, le premier lauréat reçoit une médaille d'argent et une somme de \$100; le second, \$50 et un certificat, et le troisième un certificat d'honneur.

73. Bowater Award for Journalism

English — Anglais	(\$3,000)	1955-1962
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From 1955 to 1962, the Bowater Award was given to Canadian journalists for a series of editorials or feature articles on a single theme which appeared in Canadian newspapers and ran for at least a week. The series must have been in the public interest insofar as it was likely to have a beneficial influence on the issue in question. Initially, awards were presented for works in two categories: social-political-cultural and economics-business. In 1959, a third category, Commonwealth and International Affairs, was added. The winner in each category received \$1,000. Submissions were accepted from Canadian newspaper staff members resident in Canada or working as foreign correspondents. The award was under the custodianship of the Parliamentary Press Gallery in Ottawa.

Ce prix, offert par la *Bowater Corporation* et administré par la Galerie de la presse du Parlement d'Ottawa, fut décerné pendant huit ans, de 1955 à 1962, pour une série d'articles sur un même thème, de nature à influencer l'opinion et ayant paru dans un journal canadien pendant au moins une semaine.
