

2009 was a year of significant change for Netball WA. The sport is continuing its journey into an exciting professional era, which brings many opportunities but also risks that need to be closely managed.

Netball WA achieved a surplus of \$8,783 for the year, in line with the organisations goal to produce a modest annual surplus.

Throughout the period, Netball WA experienced a significant change of personnel. We also defined a new purpose for the organisation: "To provide the competitive environment where members can reach their potential." Our staff and Board are now determined to return Western Australia to the preeminence it once enjoyed throughout Australia.

In addition to personnel changes, Netball WA undertook a review of operations resulting in a restructure of the State and Regional Academy programs. Our grass roots activities remain strong with San Remo NetSetGO! proving a growing success throughout the netball community.

In 2009 Netball WA extended its highly successful partnership with Healthway. Already a major funder of netball programs through the Smarter than Smoking message, Healthway Chair Jenn Morris announced a new sponsorship deal "worth over a million dollars over two years" when Healthway became the Principal Sponsor of West Coast Fever utlising the Drug and Alcohol Office's "Rethink Drink" message.

Netball continues to be the only major sport in Western Australia that does not have a state centre, which is sorely needed to service the sport from grass roots to elite levels. We will continue to work with the state government to ensure that our sport will receive the facility it deserves as soon as possible.

The rapidly expanding ANZ Championship audience is driving a new era of recognition for netball. As we look forward, Netball WA will continue to promote our sport throughout the state, providing aspirational opportunities for our young girls to one day play netball for West Coast Fever and the Australian Netball Diamonds.

Foremost in our minds is netball at associations, and how a professional elite level can enhance our activities at grass roots. Netball WA believes that the future is very bright for our sport, being the leading female sport in Western Australia.

I note that Mick Pember, President for the preceding three years and director for a further year, has not sought reelection at this year's Annual General Meeting. The remaining Directors have asked me to thank Mick for his years of dedicated service to netball and inspirational leadership of the Board. Mick has overseen a major refocus of Netball WA's activities and his gregarious personality will be sorely missed.

#### Lea Newing



# West Coast Fever

The ANZ Championship continued to strengthen in 2009.

One significant change in Australia was the television coverage moving from Fox Sports to Channel 10 and ONE HD. This was a real step forward for netball in Australia, increasing the game's average audience per match from 56,581 in 2008 to 81,703 in 2009.

West Coast Fever has also grown with the competition, taking netball to a whole new level in Western Australia by being one of the most watched teams in the state and providing inspiration to young athletes in the sport.

Fever began the 2009 season as a team packed with young talent; after a Round 5 thriller they proved to be the competition's giant killers, knocking off the defending premiers, the NSW Swifts, in extra time. They improved on their 2008 placing by two rankings, but more importantly they earned respect and admiration from opposition teams and fans alike.

Coach Jane Searle is renowned for developing talented young players and that is exactly what she was able to accomplish in her first year at the helm. Her youthful yet fearless side notched up five wins and came tantalisingly close to reaching a place in the finals.

West Coast Fever increased their public support with 18,038 fans attending the seven matches at Challenge Stadium, a massive 57% increase on 2008 attendance. This included two sell out matches in the final two rounds and memberships increased to 447 from 300 in 2008.

West Coast Fever off court initiatives aimed to create more awareness of the brand by distributing team posters to netball associations and arranging a large membership brochure mail out. The athletes made appearances at schools, clinics, netball associations, and visited Bunbury, which all heightened awareness amongst the younger community. This was complemented by a radio campaign and low level outdoor media and press advertising. Netball supporter Tim Gossage, Network Ten news reporter was announced as West Coast Fever's number one ticket holder.





## West Coast Fever Awards and Achievements

The start of a new competition results in a number of statistics being reset but Netball WA would like to acknowledge the following milestones reached by West Coast Fever athletes in 2009.

At the Netball WA Annual Dinner, Madison Browne was awarded West Coast Fever Player of the Year, Stacey Rosman was awarded the Coach's Award and Susan Fuhrmann was awarded Members' Player of the Year.

# High Performance

#### National Teams

Three Western Australians, Susan Fuhrmann, Caitlin Bassett and Kate Beveridge along with two other West Coast Fever players, Madison Browne and Johannah Curran were named in the 2009 Diamonds line-up. Andrea Gilmore and Shae Bolton were also invited into the 2009 Diamonds squad.

Caitlin Bassett, Andrea Gilmore, Madison Brown and Shae Bolton all represented Australia in the National 21/U Team at the World Youth Cup in the Cook Islands where they were crowned World Youth Netball Champions.

Sarah East was named in the inaugural 19/U Australian Netball Team coached by WAIS coach Michelle Wilkins.

#### Western Australia Institute of Sport (WAIS) Program

The WAIS Netball Program provides the daily training environment and support services to Western Australian athletes giving them the best opportunity of achieving National selection and progressing through the elite pathway. Coached by Michelle Wilkins, WAIS provides world-class coaching, training facilities and support services to improve athlete performance.

### New Idea Australian National League

The New Idea Australian Netball League (ANL) entered its second year of competition in 2009 and saw the introduction of the Singapore National side. The ANL is an amateur, open aged round robin competition consisting of preliminary rounds followed by finals contested by every state and territory. It is a crucial platform for Australia's emerging elite players and an important link to teams in the ANZ Championship, providing a (17/U) and Sally Joynes (19/U). valuable development opportunity for West Coast Fever stars of the future. The WA team built steadily over the competition, narrowly missing out on a place in the finals. As a result of their exceptional performances, two ANL athletes - Sarah Ebbott and Ashleigh Neal - were selected in the 2010 West Coast Fever team.


#### State Teams

The 2009 Underage National Championships were held in Canberra in April. The Western Australian 17/U, 19/U and 21/U State Teams, although determined, were unable to match the stronger states. Netball Australia National selectors attended the Championships and the following athletes were selected in the 17/U and 19/U National Squad to attend a camp at the AIS in July; Ellie Smart A number of Western Australian athletes took part in the camp as invitees; Courtney Bruce (17/U), Sarah East (19/U) and Sarah Tatam (19/U). Sarah East gained selection into the Australian 19/U Team and Michelle Wilkins, WAIS Head Coach, was appointed Head Coach. After an extensive review of the underage State Teams' performance, Netball WA has restructured the Academy program and selection policy and is working hard to create successful teams in the future.









# Development Programs

Western Power committed to support the Regional and State Academy Program again in 2009. The purpose of the Western Power Regional and State Academy Programs is to develop talent identified athletes in a consistent manner throughout Western Australia, providing a pathway for athletes, umpires and officials to reach elite levels.

#### Western Power Academy Program

Throughout 2009, the Western Power Academy Program continued to provide talent based tiered programs for athletes 13 – 17 years of age. The Academies incorporate structured programs for coaches and umpires which are run by Netball WA in conjunction with each of the 11 metropolitan and country netball regions forming a state-wide program.

The Western Power Academy Cup, held in October 2009, provided all 11 regions with the opportunity to compete in a quality state competition as a finale to their involvement in the Academy program during the year. Athletes were given the chance to gain additional development and experience at a state level as well as assisting in their preparation in trialling for future state phases, which progresses into the State Team Programs.

The Western Power Umpire Academy provides a pathway for talented umpires into the Smarter than Smoking Premier and State League Umpire Squad as well as providing the opportunity to develop skills and gain practical experience.

The Western Power Academy Cup
Umpire Development Weekend
exposed invited umpires to practical
umpiring opportunities, theory sessions
and valuable coaching from senior
umpire coaches, members of the
Smarter than Smoking Premier and
State League Umpire Squads as well as
staff from the Netball WA Umpire Unit.

Approximately 50 coaches, 450 athletes and 240 umpires were involved in the Western Power Academy Program in 2009.

#### Department of Sport and Recreation Regional Talent Development Program

The Department of Sport and Recreation (DSR) Regional Talent Development Program (RTDP) is designed to offer talented athletes residing outside the metropolitan area development opportunities and support as they progress through the Netball WA sub-elite programs. The program aims to ensure that these athletes have the opportunity to continue their netball development through the provision of appropriate skills based programs and support. An important component of this

An important component of this program is the future development of local coaches by offering opportunities for mentoring and assistance in advancing in accreditation levels.

The DSR Regional Talent Development Program Network Coach plays an important role in coaching and mentoring as well as guiding the development opportunities for athletes and future coaches in country regions.

Twelve athletes and four coaches were offered full scholarships for the 2008/09 scholarship round, with three athletes awarded part scholarships. There were four athletes from the DSR RTDP who made Netball WA State Netball Teams. Kelsey Timms and Madison Shultz were selected in the 17/U State Team and Kelsey Rounsevell and Stevee Adamini were selected in the 19/U State Team. One DSR RTDP coach completed their Intermediate Coaching Course.

Gaye Teede, former Australian player and coach and former AIS and Perth Orioles coach, has made a significant contribution to this program, bringing a wealth of knowledge and experience.

Netball WA would like to thank DSR for its continued support of the program.







### Indigenous Program, supported by Smarter than Smoking

The Netball WA Indigenous Netball Program focuses on player, coach and umpire development, having a presence in all 11 netball regions within Western Australia.

The main objectives of this program are:

- To create exposure for the sport of netball within Indigenous communities
- Increase participation of Indigenous athletes in netball
- To create player pathways into mainstream competitions, academies and programs
- To develop further opportunities for talent identification and offer development support for Indigenous athletes
- Increase participation in coaching and umpiring capacities
- Up skill and develop coaches and umpires in Indigenous Communities

Netball WA continues to foster and strengthen relations with Indigenous communities and organisations throughout Western Australia, to ensure a successful and sustainable program.

## Coach Education and Development

The Netball Australia Coaching
Accreditation Pathway was
consolidated in 2009 with Netball
WA conducting four of the six
possible accreditation courses
throughout the year; Foundation,
Development, Intermediate and
Advanced. The Elite and High
Performance courses will be
conducted by Netball Australia.

The coaches that attended Foundation and Development Courses in 2009 provided positive feedback on the new resources produced by Netball Australia, which included new coaching manuals and DVDs of all skills being taught.

The newly developed Intermediate Coaching Course has been a great success story for Netball WA, bridging the gap in knowledge and understanding between the Development and Advanced accreditation courses. Since the course's inception in 2004 (previously Level One Gold) it has assisted many coaches in passing their Advanced Accreditation.

Netball Australia rolled out the new Advanced Coaching course in 2009 with Netball WA being one of the first states to run the course with six coaches attending. We look forward to running the course again in 2010 with increased numbers.

The Coaches in the Field courses were once again provided by the Regions and Associations at their own venues. The Associations have been provided with six programs and the Regions with eight programs.

#### Specialist Schools

Netball WA has continued to review the Endorsed Specialist Netball School program throughout 2009 in consultation with the Department of Education and Training, specialist school division.

Aranmore Catholic College, Darling Range Sports College and Warwick Senior High School were the Netball WA Endorsed Specialist Netball Schools for 2009. The primary focus for Specialist Netball Schools is to provide a program that is relevant to the current high performance pathways for athletes, coaches and umpires. Specialist Netball Schools must meet standards and criteria set by the Western Australian Department of Education and Training and Netball WA. They must be able to demonstrate that they provide a program that engages students not only in athlete development but in all aspects of sport programs including coaching, umpiring and administration. The program should be one that includes aspects of a holistic approach to student development.

#### San Remo NetSetGO!

San Remo NetSetGO! is Netball Australia's junior netball program and has been developed to provide children from the age of five to ten years with the best possible learning and playing experience that enables them to enjoy a positive introduction to netball, ensuring enjoyment and continued participation within the sport.

San Remo NetSetGO! incorporates the modified junior program FunNet, comes equipped with a flexible program delivery structure and is suited to run in conjunction with Netta. The program incorporates skill activities, minor games and modified matches and is coordinated by accredited coaches to ensure a quality experience for all participants.

#### Umpiring

A total of 65 National Badges were awarded in WA during 2009; two National A, four National B and 59 National C.

The Smarter than Smoking Premier and State League Umpire Squad achieved many outstanding results again in 2009 with a total of 10 Western Australian umpires selected to Umpire at National Netball Championships including; Schoolgirls, 17/U Nationals, 19/U Nationals and 21/U Nationals. Five squad members were also given the opportunity to umpire during the Australian Netball League. Jacqui Jashari was ranked number two in Australia and reserved the Grand Final of the ANZ Championship and Julie Bennett and Rebecca Dougall were announced in Netball Australia's Class of 2010. A number of squad members were also invited to numerous National and International umpiring events throughout the year.

The 2009 Member Organisation Exchange program, facilitated by Netball Australia and assisted by Department of Sport and Recreation High Performance Officiating Scholarships, saw three umpires given the opportunity to extend their development beyond Premier and State Netball League level and gain valuable umpiring opportunities in Canberra and Adelaide, including attending one of the Australian Diamonds training camps.

#### **Green Shirt Program**

The Green Shirt Program, developed and supported by DSR identifies and Program, involving the Western promotes community awareness of umpires and recognises new officials. The program provides a clear pathway and encourages development for beginner umpires. Umpires within this program were encouraged to complete the Level 1 Umpires Course, Section 1 Theory Exam and Rules in Action Accreditation.

In 2009, Netball WA continued to facilitate the Green Shirt Program in a number of netball associations across the State. 17 associations took part in the program with extremely successful results increasing the acceptance and respect for beginner umpires leading to a reported rise in the number of people umpiring at associations.


#### Country Umpire Advantage Program



## Notes to the Financial Statements

#### Note 1: Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Association's Constitution. The board has determined that the Association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the following Australian Accounting Standards:

ASSB 1031: Materiality

No other Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Interpretations or other authoritative pronouncements of

the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

### (a) Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the Association is exempt from income tax.

#### (b) Plant and equipment

Items of plant and equipment are measured at cost less accumulated depreciation.

When parts of an item of plant and equipment have different useful lives, they are accounted for as separate items.

Gains and losses on disposal of an item of plant and equipment are determined by comparing the proceeds from disposal with the carrying amount of plant and equipment and are recognised net within "other income" in profit or loss.

#### Depreciation

Depreciation is recognised in profit or loss on a straightline and diminishing basis over the estimated useful lives of each part of an item of plant and equipment.

The estimated useful lives for the current and comparative periods are as follows:

#### Note 1: Statement of Significant Accounting Policies (cont'd)

### (c) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. The cost of inventories is based on the firstin firstout principle, and includes expenditure incurred in acquiring the inventories and other costs incurred in bringing them to their existing location and condition.

Net realisable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business, less the estimated costs of completion and selling expenses.

### (d) Employee benefits

Provision is made for the Association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits that are expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled. Employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits.

#### (e) Provisions

A provision is recognised if, as a result of a past event, the Association has a present legal or constructive obligation that can be estimated reliably, and it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation. Provisions are determined by discounting the expected future cash flows that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and the risks specific to the liability.

## (f) Revenue

All revenue is recognised when received and is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

#### (g) Goods and services tax

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of the expense.

Receivables and payables are stated with the amount of GST included. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the Australian Taxation Office is included as a current asset or liability in the balance sheet.

Cash flows are included in the statement of cash flows on a gross basis. The GST components of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities which are recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO are classified as operating cash flows.


