SITUATION OVERVIEW:

The Typhoon "JEBI" has entered the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) and was named "MAYMAY".

Typhoon "MAYMAY" entered the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) at 2:00 PM this afternoon. The typhoon poses no direct threat in any part of the country. No significant enhancement of the Southwest Monsoon (Habagat) is expected during the Alert period. The typhoon is expected to exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) within the next 12 hours or tomorrow early morning (03 September).

Location of eye/center:	At 3:00 PM today, the eye of Typhoon "MAYMAY" was estimated based on all available data at 1,375 km East Northeast of Basco, Batanes (23.9 °N, 134.8 °E)
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of 190 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 235 kph
Forecast Movement:	Northwest at 25 kph
