## SITUATION OVERVIEW:

Typhoon "MAYMAY" has slightly weakened and is now outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).

The typhoon has no direct effect in any part of the country. However, the Southwest Monsoon (Habagat) enhanced by Typhoon "MAYMAY" will bring scattered light to moderate to at times rains over Metro Manila, Pangasinan, Central Luzon, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Bicol region, Visayas and Zamboanga Peninsula. Residents in these areas, especially those living near river channels, in low-lying areas and in mountainous areas, are advised to take appropriate actions against possible flooding and landslides, coordinate with local disaster risk reduction and management offices and to continue monitoring for updates.

Location of eye/center:	At 4:00 AM today, the eye of Typhoon "MAYMAY" was located based on all available data at 1,340 km East Northeast of Basco, Batanes (OUTSIDE PAR) (25.8 °N, 133.7 °E)
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of <b>180 kph</b> near the center and gustiness of up to <b>220 kph</b>
Forecast Movement:	Moving North Northwest at 20 kph
Forecast Positions:	<ul> <li>24 Hour (Tomorrow morning): 1,500 km Northeast of Basco, Batanes (OUTSIDE PAR) (29.9°N, 132.6°E)</li> </ul>
NO TROPICAL CYCLONE WARNING SIGNAL
