<sup>\*</sup> Korea qualified for the Olympics at the 2014 Asian Games — the Asian Continental Champions. Korea finished in the top three at Antwerp, meaning that highest-ranked fourth-placed team in either of the two Semi-Finals (Valencia or Antwerp) has qualified for the Olympics.

<sup>\*\*</sup> Chance to qualify: If the Continental Champion has already qualified by achieving a top three finish from either of the Semi-Finals then the next highest placed team from SF1 and SF2 qualifies. In cases where teams are equally placed,
FIH ranking at the end of SF2 will determine which team qualifies. Argentina and New Zealand finished fourth in the HWL Semi-Final events, with Argentina being higher-ranked and therefore taking the ticket to Rio.

<sup>&</sup>quot;Host Nation — The Host Nation did not satisfy the criteria established by IOC and FIH. The qualification place went to the next highest ranked placed team at the HWL SF which was New Zealand.
