

Fortification

Property Description

Originally the main gate (or Porta Marina) of Fort St Elmo, it acquired the title Porta del Soccorso after the Great Siege when it was used to allow reinforcements to enter the fort during the Turkish investment of the place in May/June 1565. The gateway, which is crowned by three heavily consumed escutcheons, is known to have been altered and perhaps enlarged in the course of the late seventeenth century as part of larger reconstruction works which were undertaken by the Knights. originally the gate way was fronted by a drop ditch and served with a wooden drawbridge. A well-head lies immediately inside the gateway passage.
