# A. Congressional Plan


#### Follows major objective criteria:

- Population equality
  - All districts within 0.01% of ideal district population
- Keeps communities together
  - Reduces number of cities split from 23 to 3
  - Only 2 counties smaller than CD are split
- Geographical compactness
  - Under <u>Kilbury</u> standard, proposal is more compact than current boundaries


## More Highlights

- 1<sup>st</sup> Majority/Minority District (open seat)
  - 51.08% persons of color
- 10<sup>th</sup> Entirely outside Metro Seattle (open seat)
  - Largely rural district
- Geographical Equality
  - Metro Seattle (King, Pierce, Snohomish, Kitsap) population supports 5 ½ districts; plan gives six districts with majority of pop. from area (CD 1,2,6,7,8,9)
  - Rest of state's population supports 4 ½ districts; plan gives four districts with majority of pop. from non-Metro Seattle (CD 3,4,5,10)
- Every incumbent's district, except Larsen (2<sup>nd</sup>), is comprised primarily of present constituents
- Propose more rational numbering (West to East)

## Summary of Cong. Districts

- 1<sup>st</sup> S. Seattle & East King County (Majority/Minority)
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Everett (Urban Snohomish/NE King County)
- 3<sup>rd</sup> Vancouver (95% of population currently in 3<sup>rd</sup>)
- 4<sup>th</sup> Yakima/Tri-Cities (98% of population currently in 4<sup>th</sup>)
- 5<sup>th</sup> Spokane (100% of population currently in 5<sup>th</sup>)

- 6<sup>th</sup> Tacoma, Kitsap, & Coast (82% currently in 6<sup>th</sup>)
- 7<sup>th</sup> N. Seattle / S. Snohomish (72% currently in 7<sup>th</sup>)
- 8<sup>th</sup> Rural King/Pierce (76% currently in 8<sup>th</sup>)
- 9<sup>th</sup> Thurston & Ex-Urban
   Pierce (55% currently in 9<sup>th</sup>)
- 10<sup>th</sup> Northern Washington

#### **B.** Legislative Plan

#### Follows major objective criteria:


- Population equality
  - All districts within 0.1% of ideal population, which is smaller maximum deviation than 2001 plan
- Keeps communities together
  - Reduces by nearly 2/3<sup>rd</sup> the number of cities smaller than a district that are split (from 49 currently to 17)
    - Examples: Renton Unified, currently in 5 LD Everett – Unified, currently in 4 LD
- Geographical compactness
  - Nearly equivalent to current boundary compactness


 Legislative District Continuity – Statewide, 76% of population remains in current district


- Creates 1<sup>st</sup> Majority Hispanic Legislative District
  - 15<sup>th</sup> LD -- 50.22% Hispanic


