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LEWIS ASKS HARLAN COUNTY COAL PROBE

Says Chandler's Action Motiviai ed by Revenge Against C.I.O.; Lewis Waxes Angry and Berates Kentucky's Governor

Philadelphia, May 15,-John L. Lewis threw down the gauntlet again tonigh to Kentucky soft coal operators and declared he believed "there's an obligation on the part of the federal government to ascertain" what is going on in Harlan county.

Addressing a national convention of the United Textele Workers of America, the CIO and UWMA chieftain declared:

"I said in New York that sold'ers and guns and trops will not mine coal in Americaand that the time has gone by when men could be shot in the back into te mines.

"If this madman in Kentucky does not restrain his lust for vengeance then I think there should be some authority in this country that will restrain him."

#### Nazis Drink More Despite Hitler

Berlin, May 15.—Germans drank 23,900,000 bottles of German champagne-type wine last year, 20 per cent more than in 1937 despite Nazi stress on teetotalism as practiced by Hitler.

The year the Nazis came to power, 1933 only 5,500,000 bottles were sold. It costs 4.50 marks, or about \$1.80, a bottle at the official exchange rate.
