

# ACTRESS CARRIE TURNER DEAD.

**She Passes Away at the Dansville Sanitarium After a Long Career on the Stage.**

ALBANY, Oct. 12.—Carrie Turner, the well-known actress, and the wife of John Mack of this city, died at the sanitarium at Dansville to-day. She was born in Albany, and made her first public appearance here.

Carrie Turner was for years a favorite in New York. She was a member of Daniel Frohman's Madison Square Theatre Company, and appeared as leading lady in several of the most successful plays produced by it. While yet on the stage she was married to Albert J. His, a Swiss. After her retirement she went to Switzerland to live with him, but the marriage was not a happy one, and she returned to this country, bringing her child with her. She obtained a divorce here, which the Swiss courts refused to recognize, and as the husband continued to demand possession of the child, there was for a time an international question, over which there was some diplomatic correspondence. A compromise was finally made.

Miss Turner returned to the American stage, and, with Steele Mackaye, played in "Paul Kauvar." Later she appeared here and elsewhere in Charles Frohman's "Sporting Duchess" company.
