EDITORIAL

Local Body Amalgamation

The golden paddocks and hills to the east tell us that this is shaping up to be a hot summer, although there is the occasional cool night to give us some relief from the heat. This is more than can be said for the discussion of the local Government reform which is also generating a bit of heat, and not without cause. In short we are fearful that we will be pulled into something in which we feel we have little or no representation.

There seems to be two main choices. Option one is a single Wairarapa Council, where the three existing councils become one. This choice gives us the elected positions of a mayor of the Wairarapa, twelve councillors, and five community boards. There seem also to be (unelected) iwi and rural advisors. The second main choice would make the Wairarapa part of a Wellington super city, which would be an amalgamation of nine councils and institute a mayor, a greater Wellington Council and six community boards.

According to last weeks Wairarapa News, a Colmar Brunton Poll showed that 80% of people in the Wairarapa favoured the first idea, that of a Wairarapa Mayor, Council and Community Boards. Only 8% thought the Greater Wellington Council idea any good. Without going into the arguments of assets and current regional legislation and disbursements, it doesn't make any sense that a city based body could make good decisions for rural towns. There is also a huge psychological barrier in the form of the Rimutakas. I know that many people from here go to work in Wellington everyday. However, if I go to Wellington for a meeting, Wellingtonians, it is twice as far from Wellington to Carterton as it is from Carterton to Wellington.

his old mathematics teacher, Peter Spooner, who went on to join the Correspondence School.

"I've seen a few big changes since I was employed by the then Principal Joye Halford: Brain Lochore being appointed as Kuranui Commissioner, David McGibbon, who originally taught me Physics, acting as Principal. Grey Tuck's years as Principal and now Geoff Shepherd at the helm. But the biggest change has been in the use of technology and the construction of the new buildings," he stated.

"Over the years, I've enjoyed being involved in Matharapa and of course I've seen some winning teams. Back in the days in the early 90's, Gareth Kiernan topped the Australian Maths Competition. He got flown to Australia to get his medal. He's now an economist. He was one of a group of boys from Martinborough who really stood out. They were doing Seventh form maths in fifth form. Of course there are standouts every year but most recently Emily Jamieson and her younger sister Anna, and also Toyah Churton have been outstanding.

"In my early years I coached a Kuranui College Colts Rugby team, they would have been the equivalent of a Third XV team. From then on I was involved as a manager/school contact for coaches for Kuranui's junior rugby teams for many years. More recently I acted as manager for the 1st X1 Cricket team, but in the last year or two I have become a spectator," he admitted.

"The Kuranui mathematics department is now under the leadership of Liz Crow and Lee Austin who have both successfully moved mathematics forward in a very positive way at the college. The college is in great heart; all my kids went there and were very happy. I look forward to watching from the sidelines," he stated.

So will Chris remain on the sidelines? "I would like to think that I can earn a little of that holiday money by doing some relief teaching, so you may see me back now and again and I may not be teaching math's," he concluded.

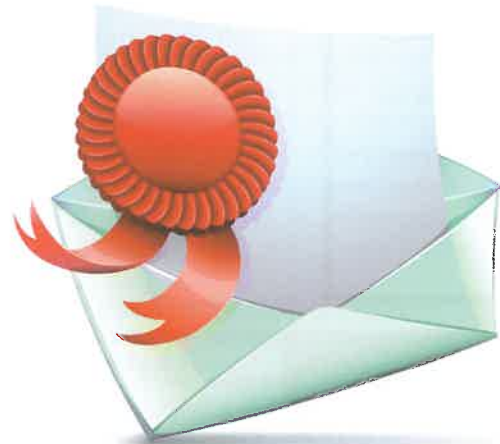

two very large elephant tusks which he bought back from one trip. I have a copy of the diaries he wrote while on one trip. Sir Herbert and Lady Minnie's son Eudo and his wife May were very close friends of my parents and we visited them often. We children called them "Aunty May and Uncle Eudo" which of course they were not. Their farm was on the hill just past the Ponatahi School. As a 5 or 6 year old I felt uneasy in their house because fastened on the lounge wall was a large dangerous looking African spear which I didn't like the look of, and on the lounge floor was a very large cured lion's skin used as a mat. The skin still had the lion's head attached to it. I just could not trust the thing and there was no way I could get close to it or sit on it, and as a result got teased mercilessly about it (perhaps you could say it was the precursor to my being "thick skinned"!).

However, I digress - After the Colonel was gassed in France, he was sent back to England for special nursing care. Because he was so very sick his wife Minnie was sent for to help with his recovery. Minnie had two young children at the time and her sisters took them in and looked after them. Minnie was able to join a ship for England and soon became the Colonel's special care giver in England. At this time, the ladies of Carterton organised an afternoon party as a farewell for Minnie and the following is a summary of a report published in the local newspaper at the time.

About 100 ladies came to St Andrews Presbyterian church hall which was beautifully decorated with flowers and foliage. Songs were sung by Miss Berrill, Miss Cole and Miss Dudson and also by Mrs Omeara and Mrs Dudson. Miss Moncrief played a pianoforte and Miss Cross accompanied the singers. Mr T S Arcus spoke on behalf of the ladies expressing everyone's wish that Mrs Hart would enjoy the voyage and have a happy meeting with the Colonel. He handed Mrs Hart a gift from the ladies of a handsome fully equipped dressing case as a mark of their esteem and good wishes. Mr Roydhouse replied for Mrs Hart and thanked Mr Arcus for his kind and supporting words. They sang "For she's a jolly good fellow" and then "For Auld Lang Syne". Mrs Hart promised to visit any local soldiers who were sick or hospitalised in the area she was to be visiting provided she was given their names and numbers.
