

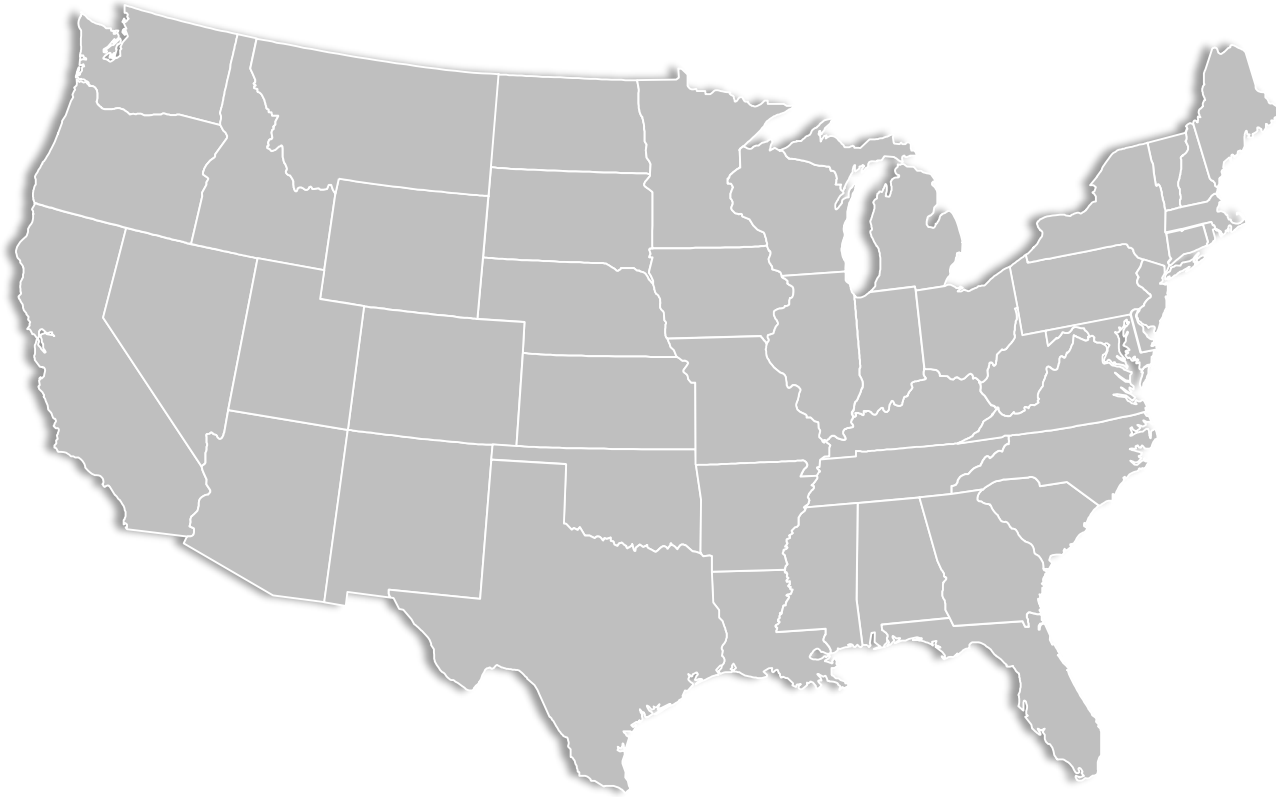

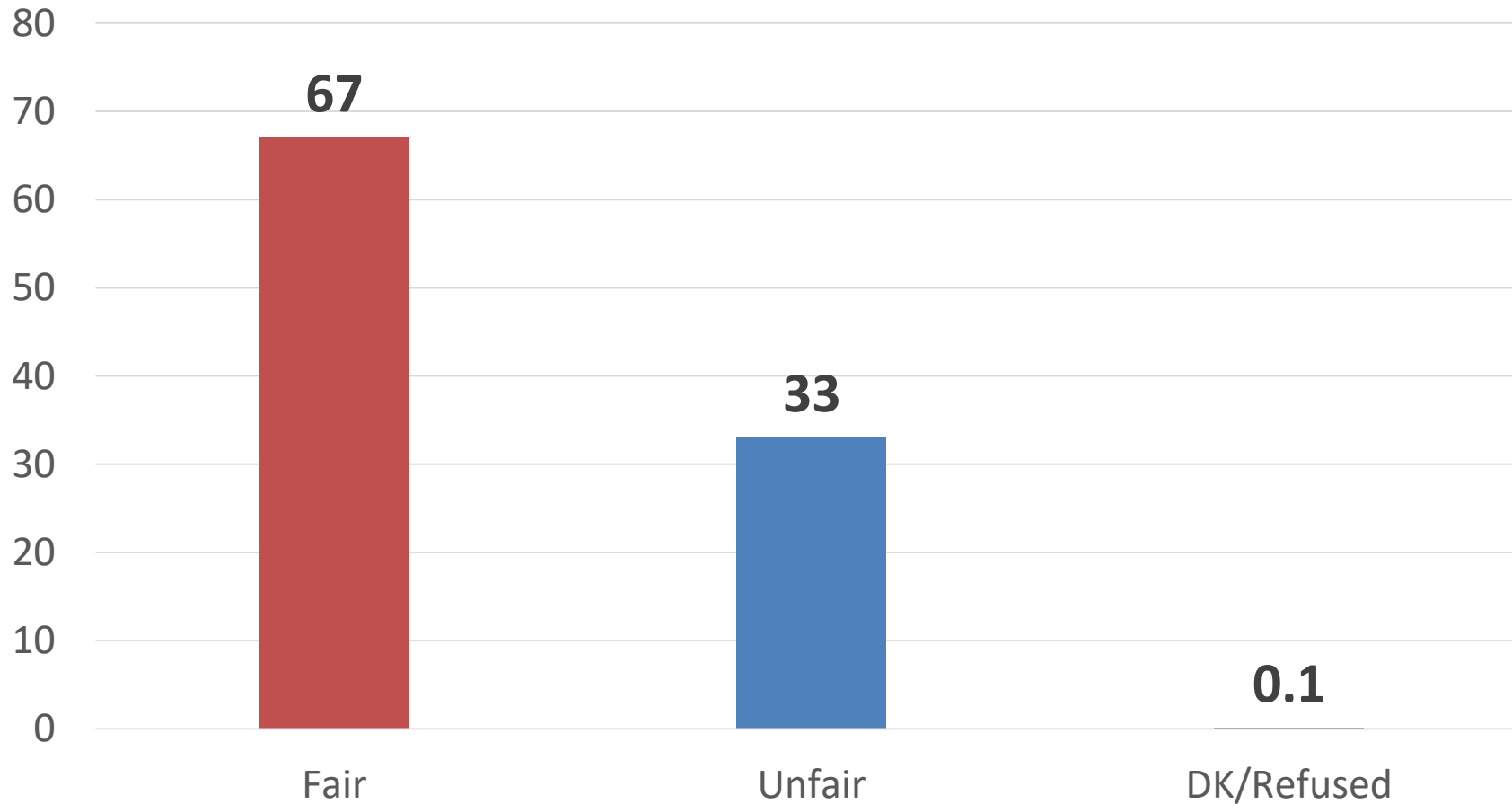

Methodology



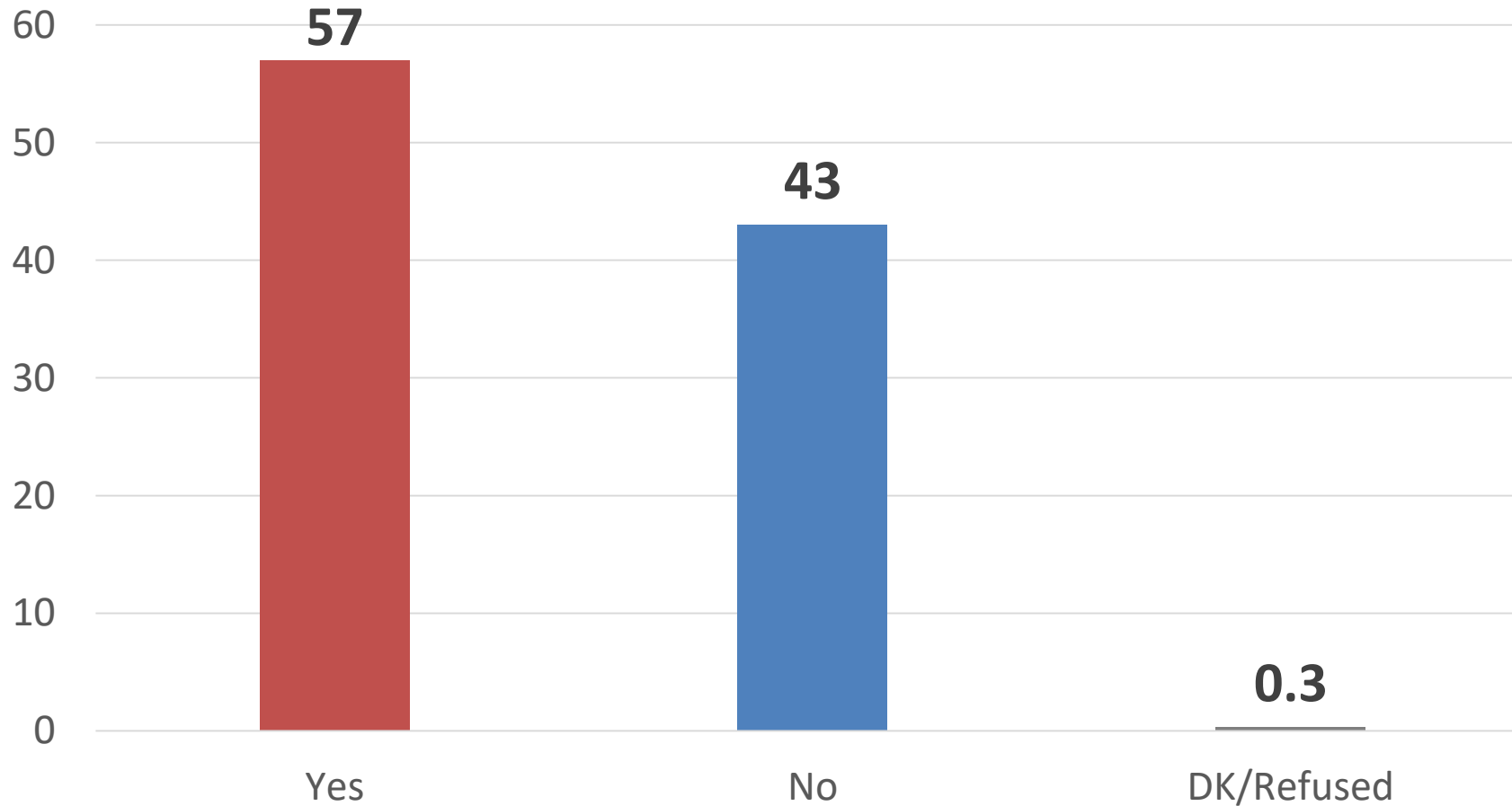
This national survey was conducted among 1,000 likely general election voters. All interviews were conducted between November 21 and 23, 2020. All interviews were conducted online and survey invitations were distributed randomly within predetermined geographic units. These units were structured to correlate with actual voter turnout nationwide in a general election. The sample of 1,000 likely general election voters has an accuracy of +/- 3.1% at a 95% confidence interval. The numbers in this presentation have been rounded and may not equal 100%.

Regardless of who you voted for in the presidential election, do you believe it is fair or unfair for President Trump to ask for a recount in states where the ballot for president was as close as 1% or even closer?



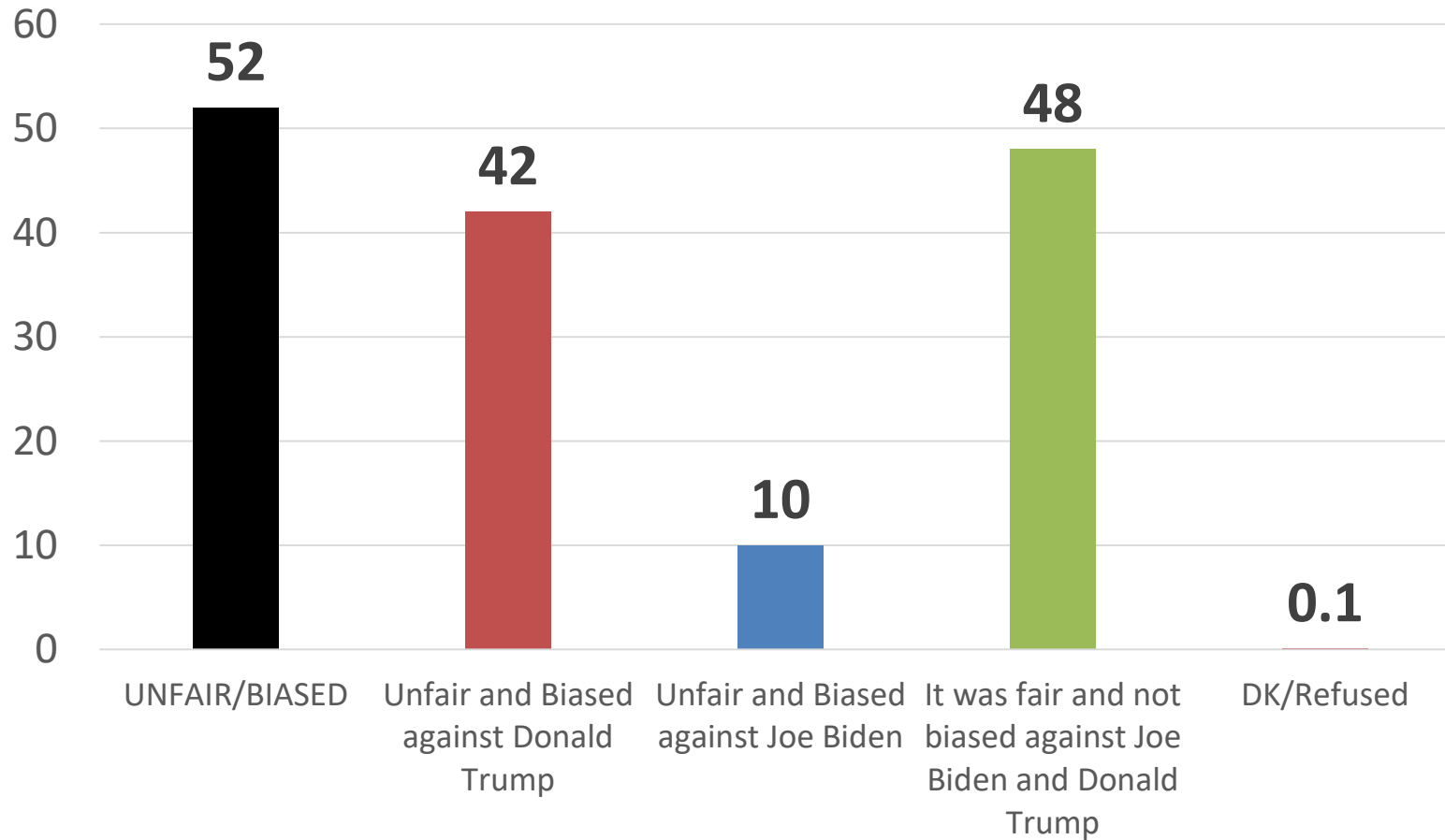

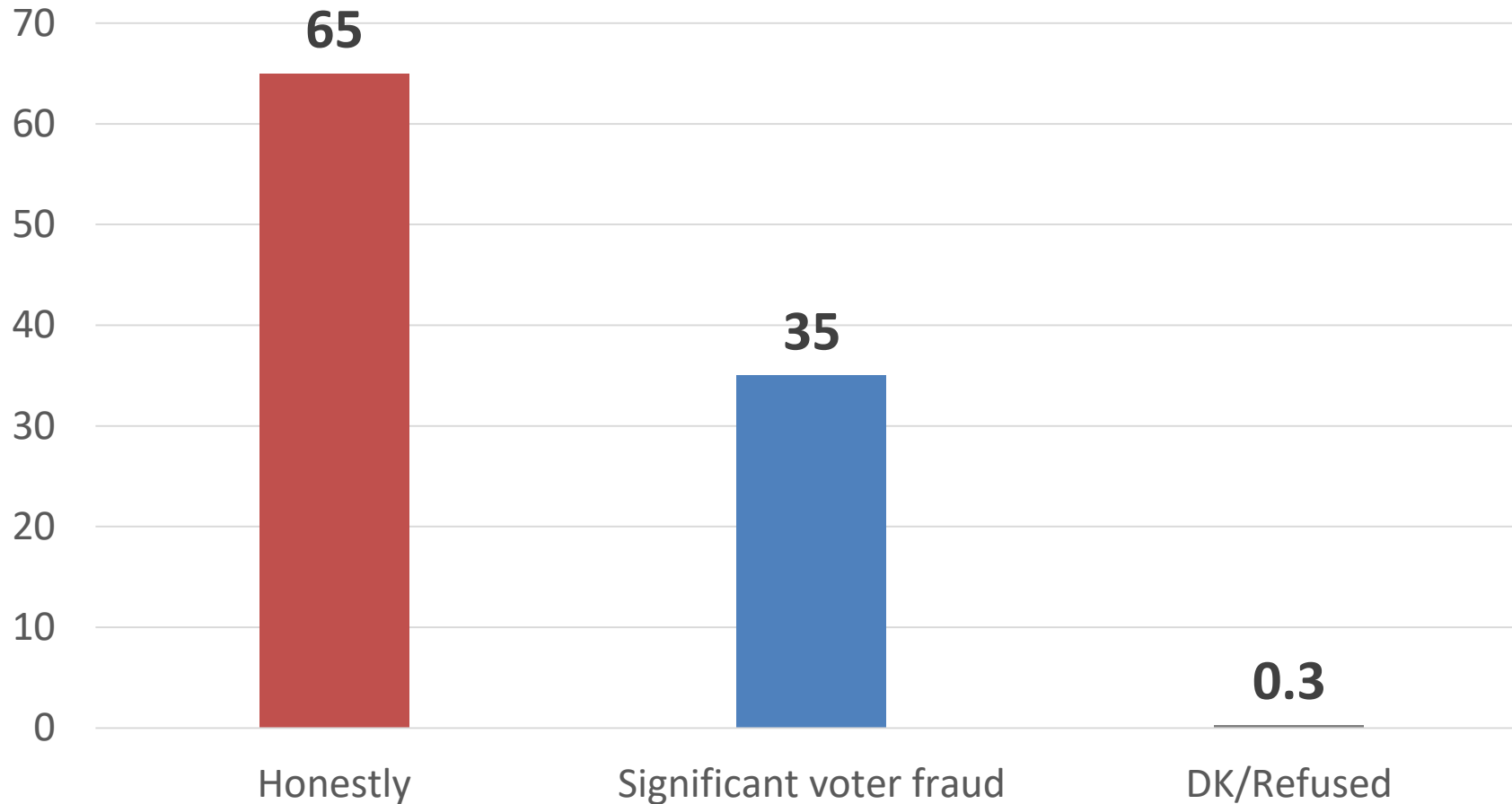

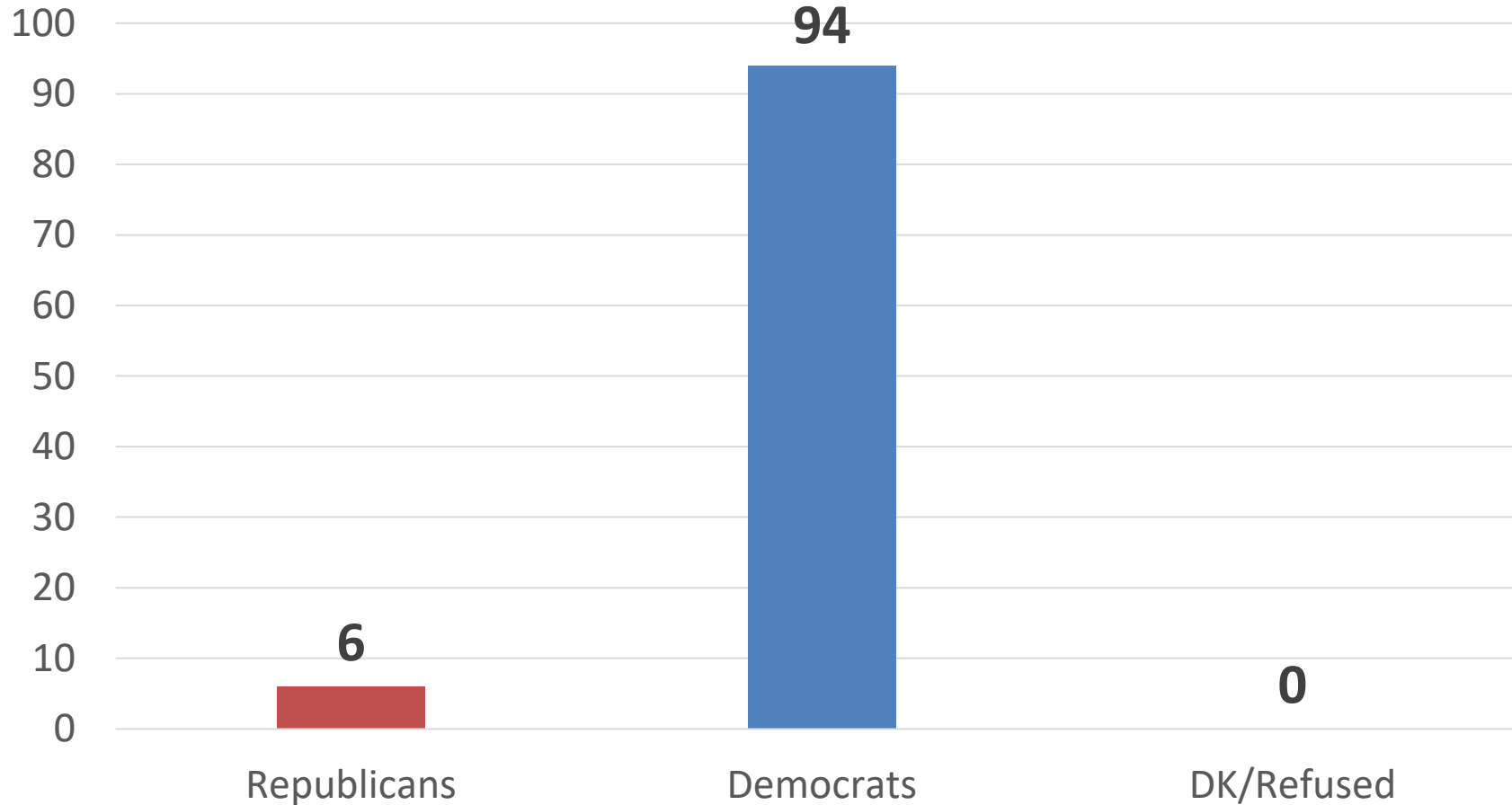
Do you think that the election will be decided honestly, or do you think that there was significant voter fraud in the election?

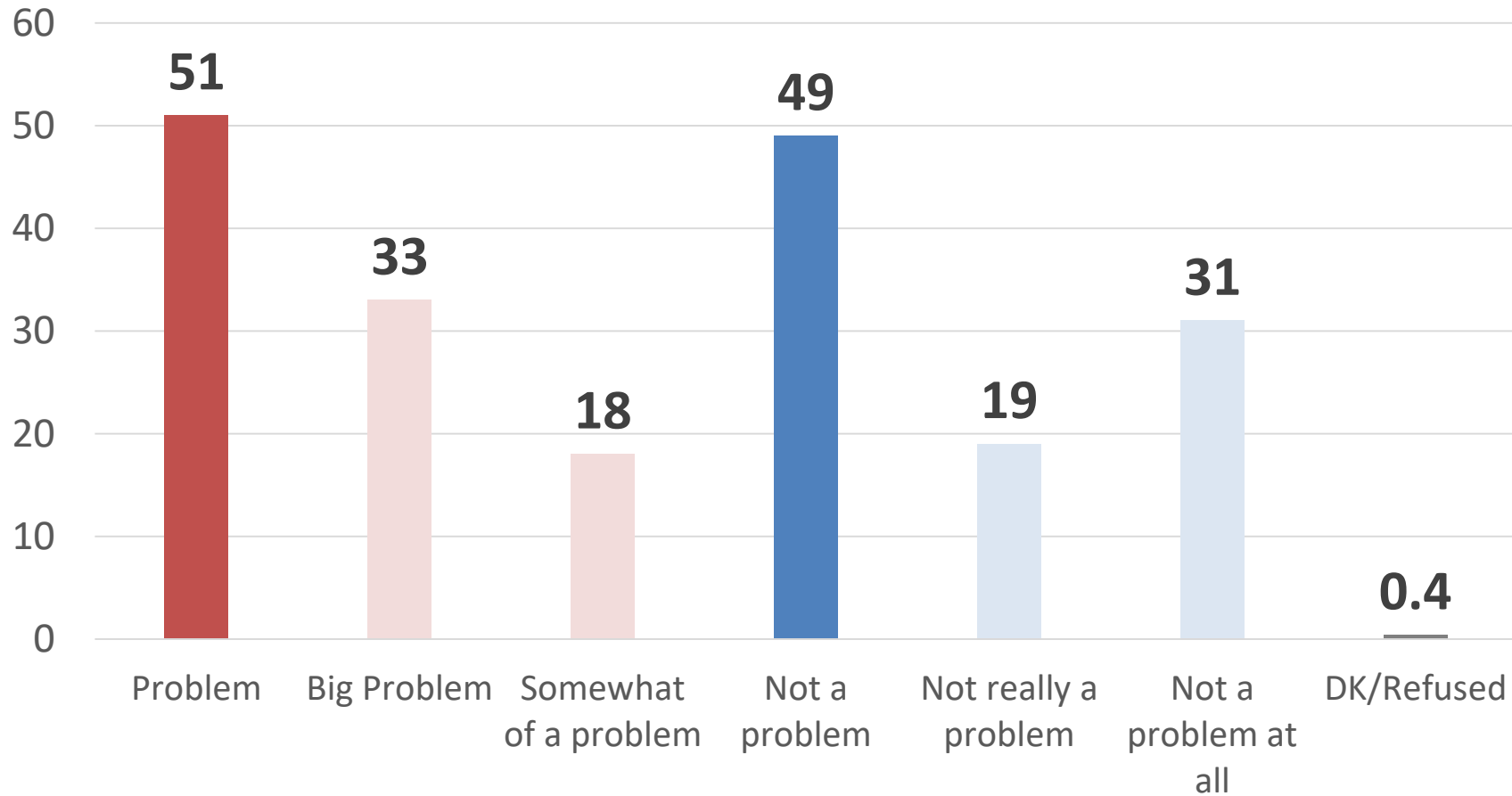
Who do you blame MOST for the voter fraud in the recent election?

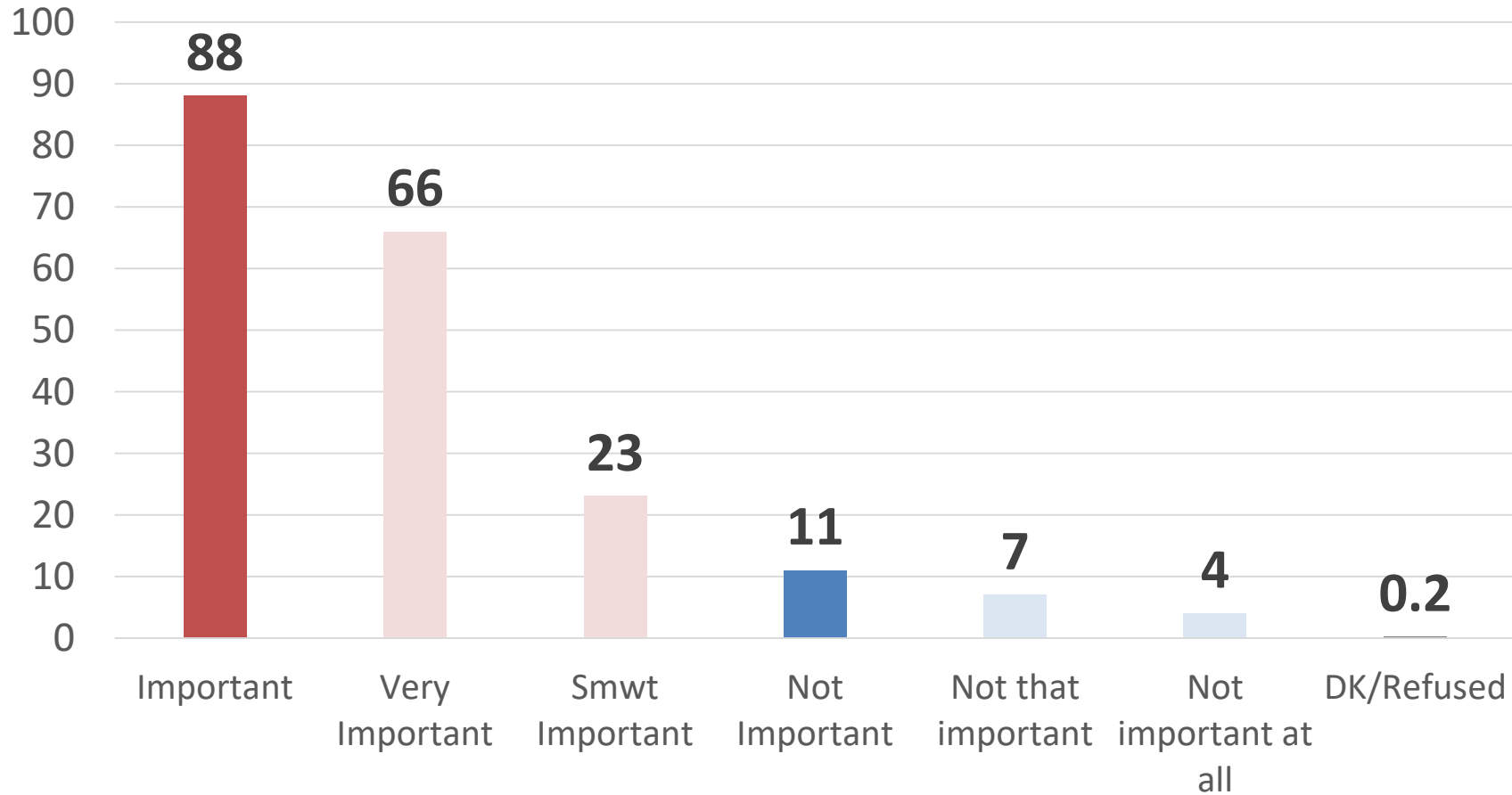

How much of a problem is voter fraud in big Democratic cities?



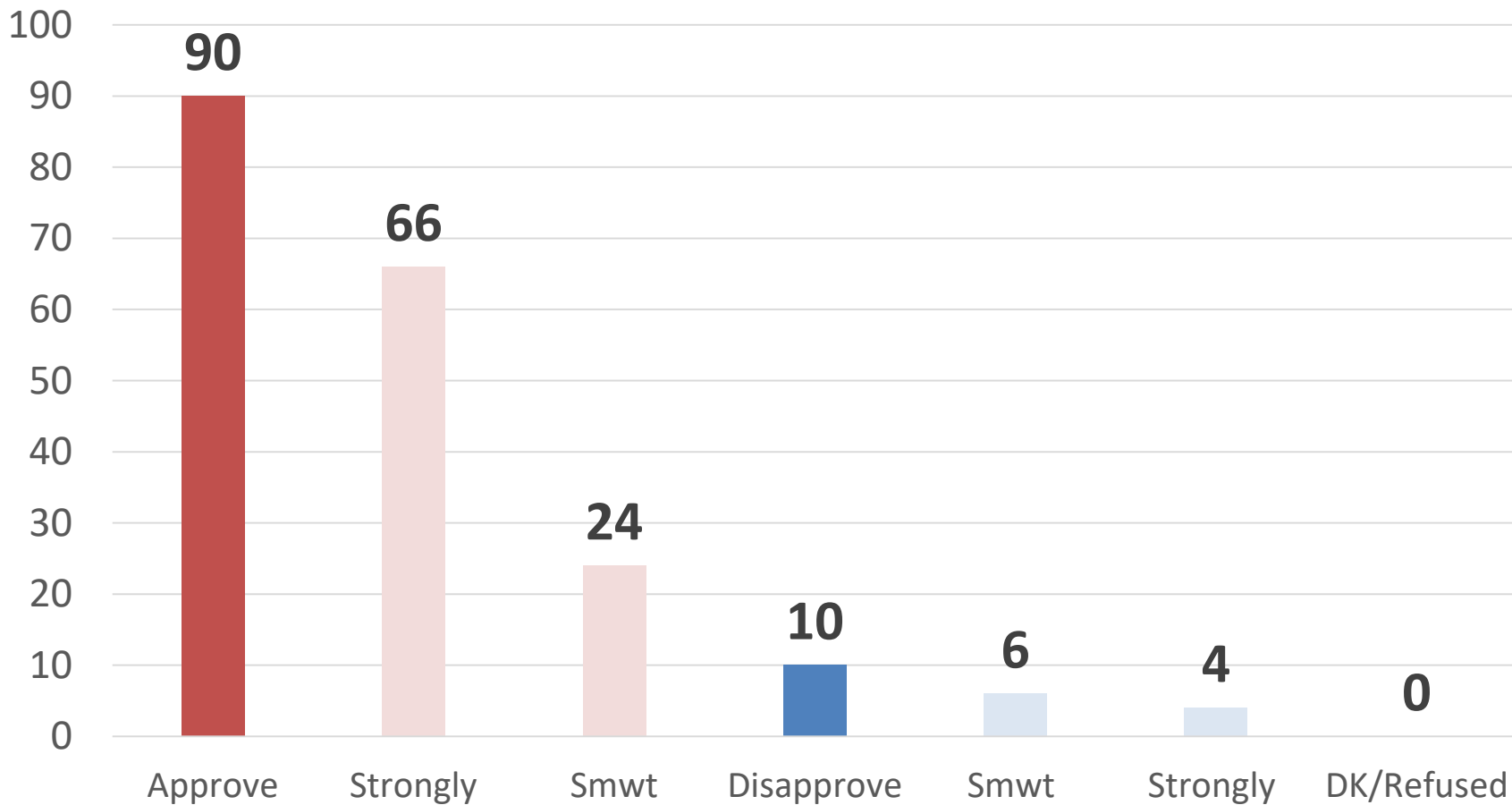

How important do you think it is for your state and local government to continue to provide in-person voting for elections?



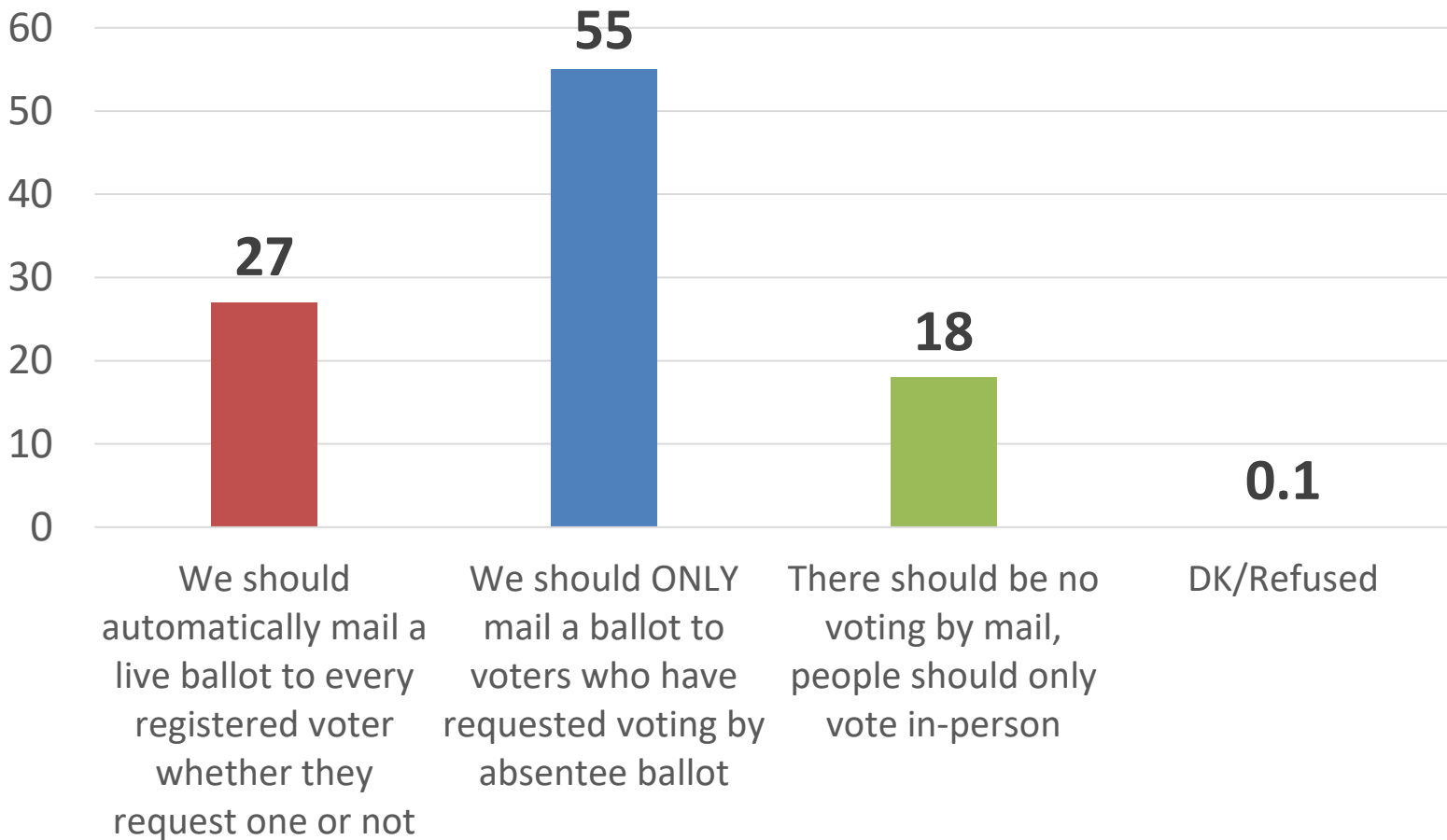

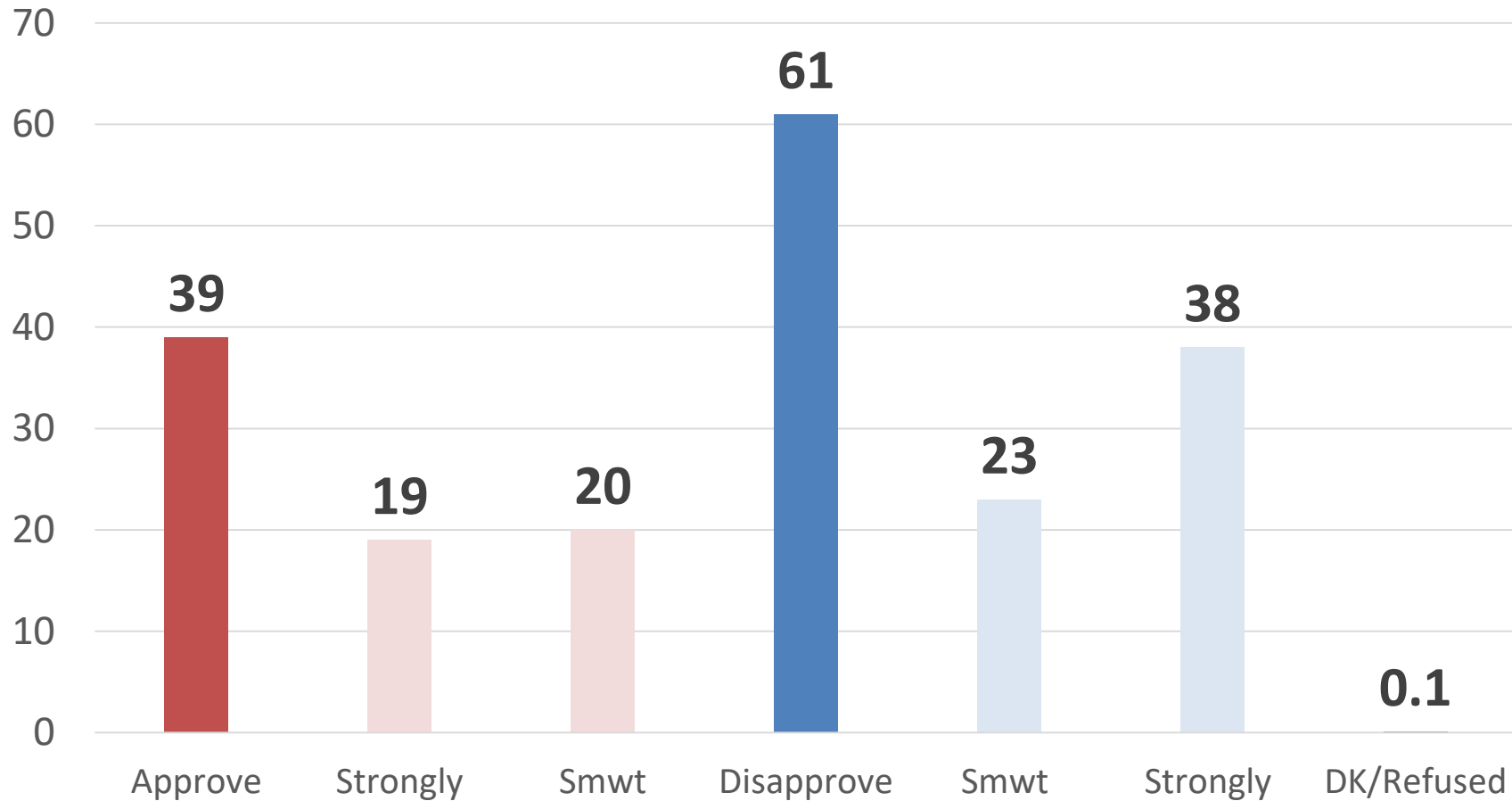

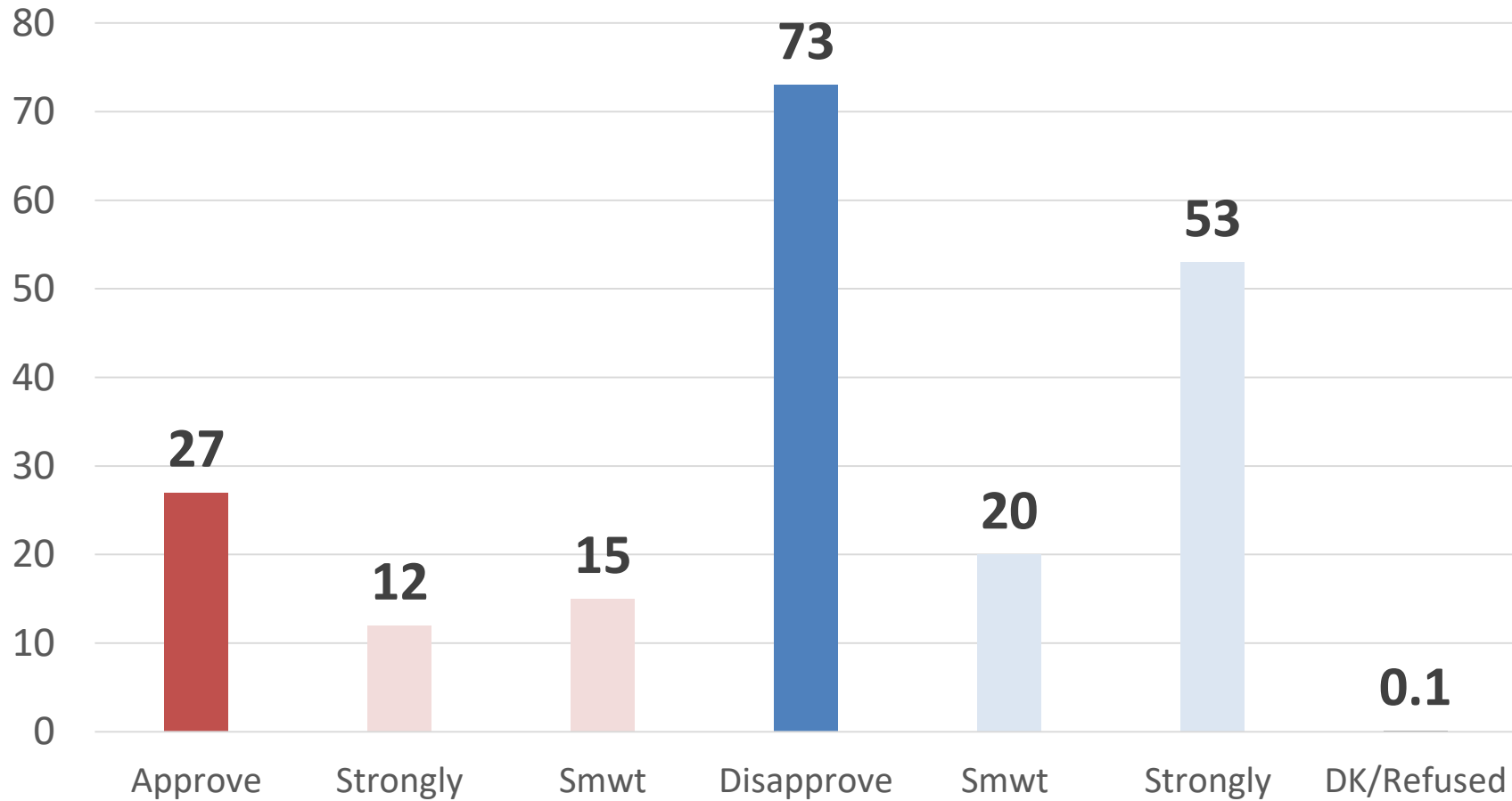

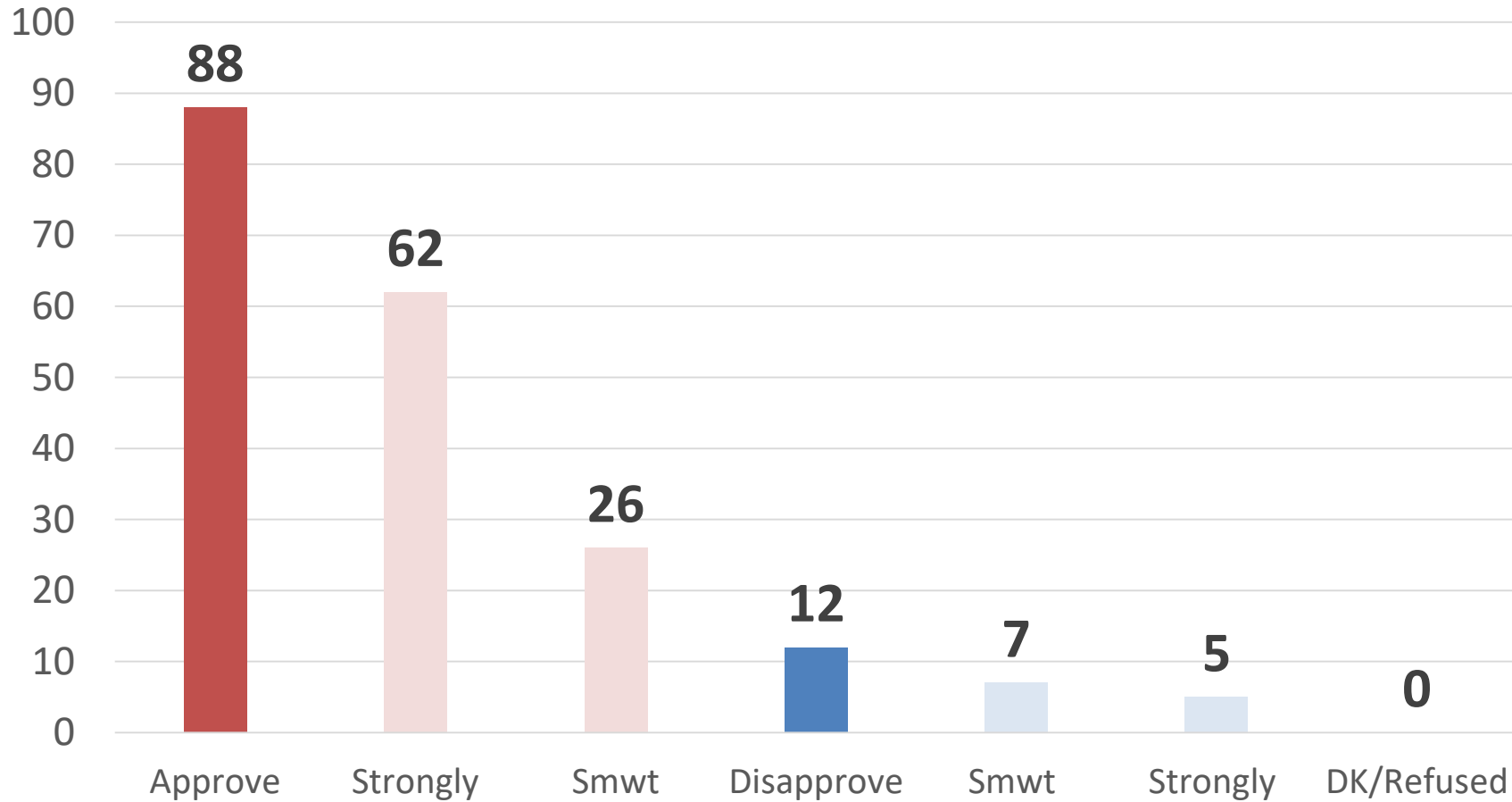

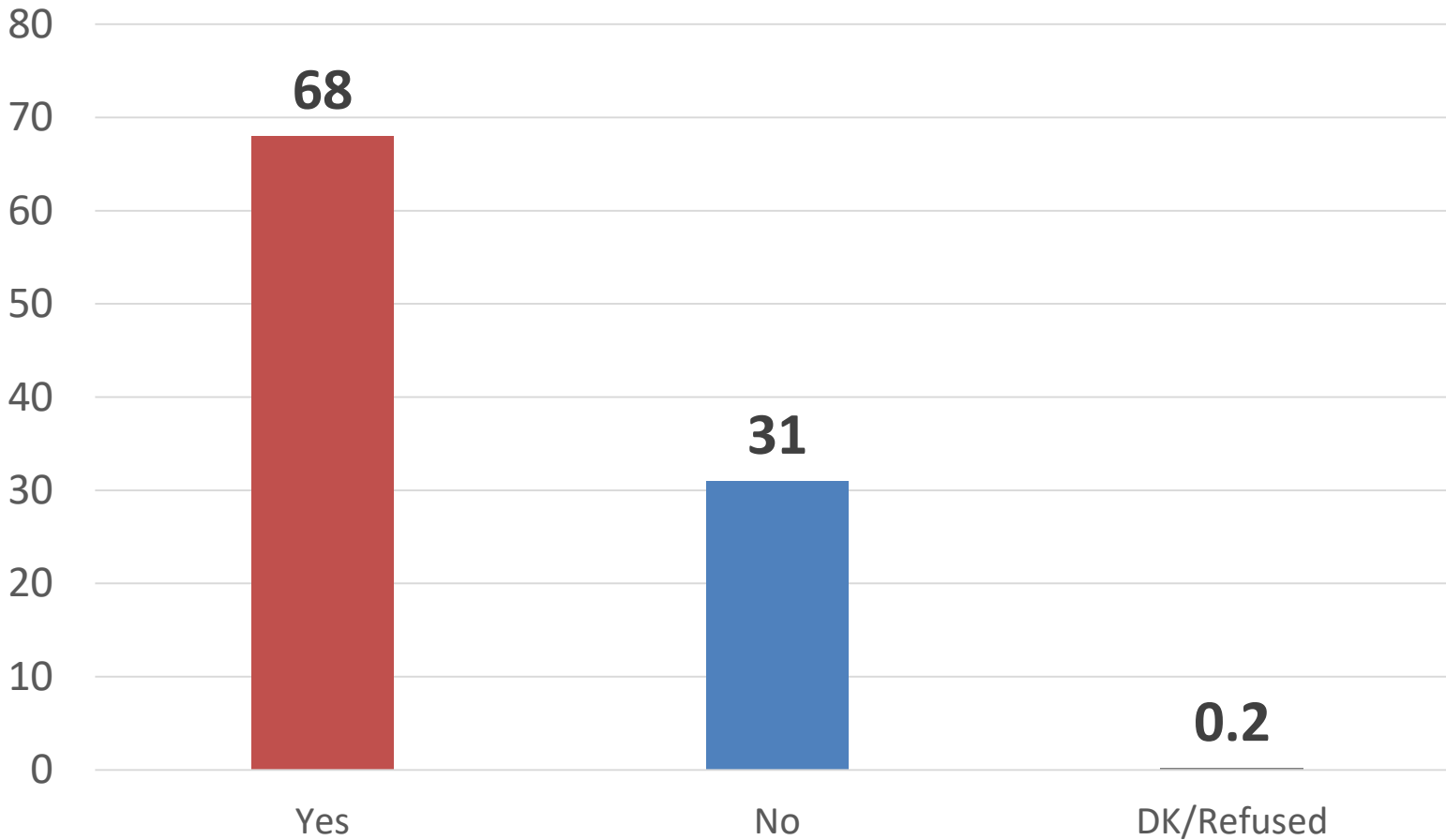
Do you approve or disapprove states requiring that all mail-in ballots have a matching signature with the person's voter registration?

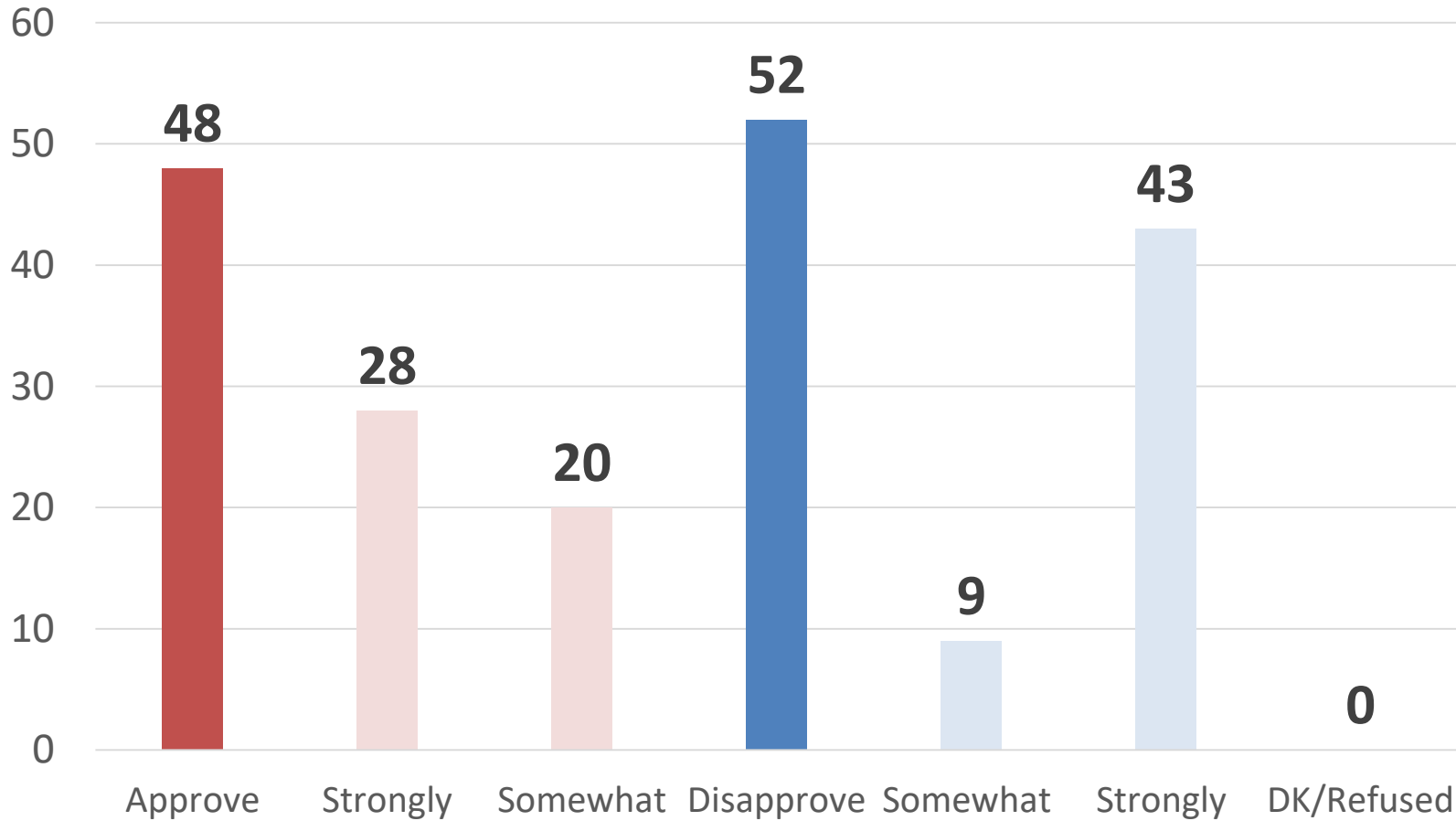

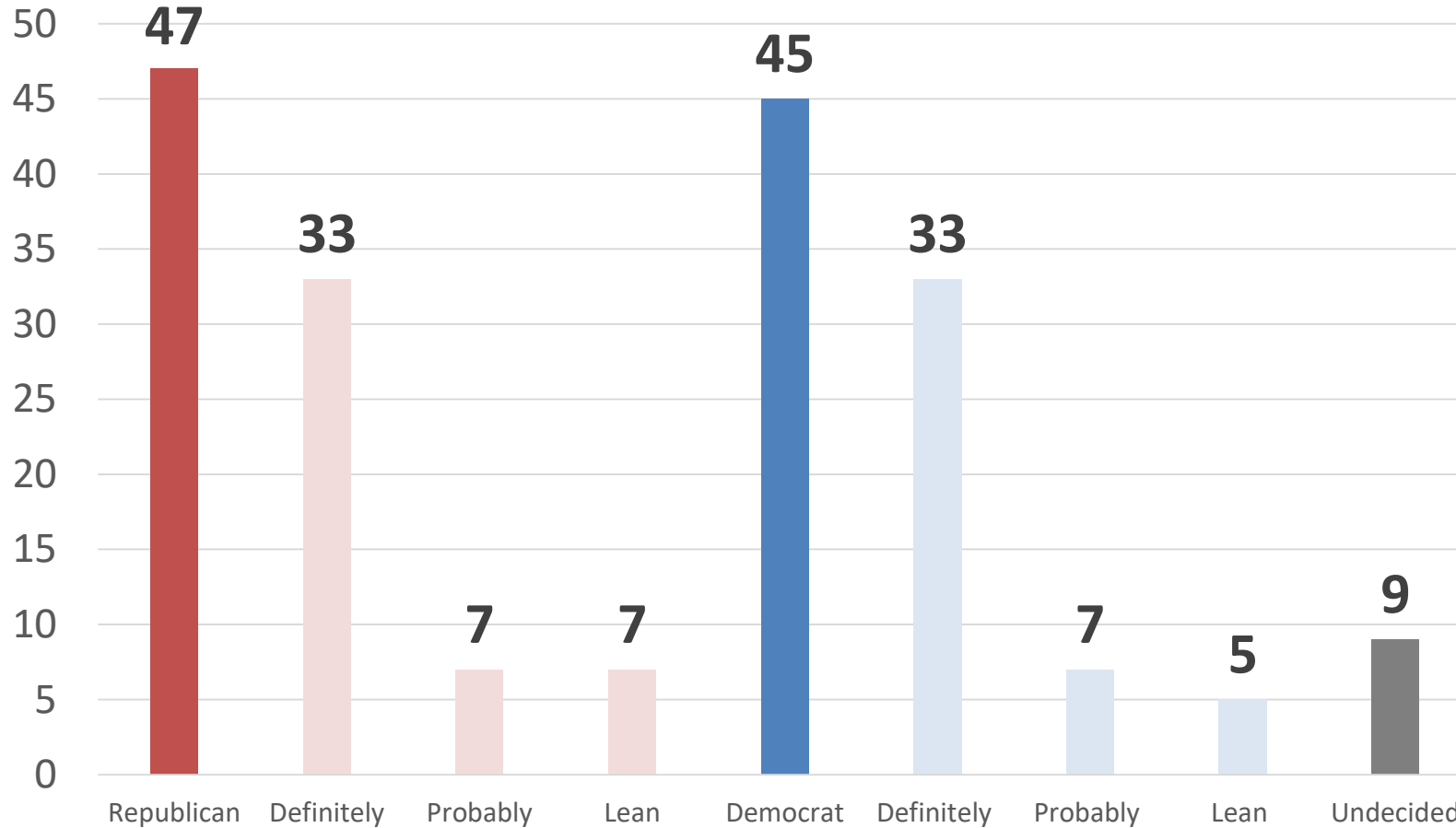

President Trump: Job Approval



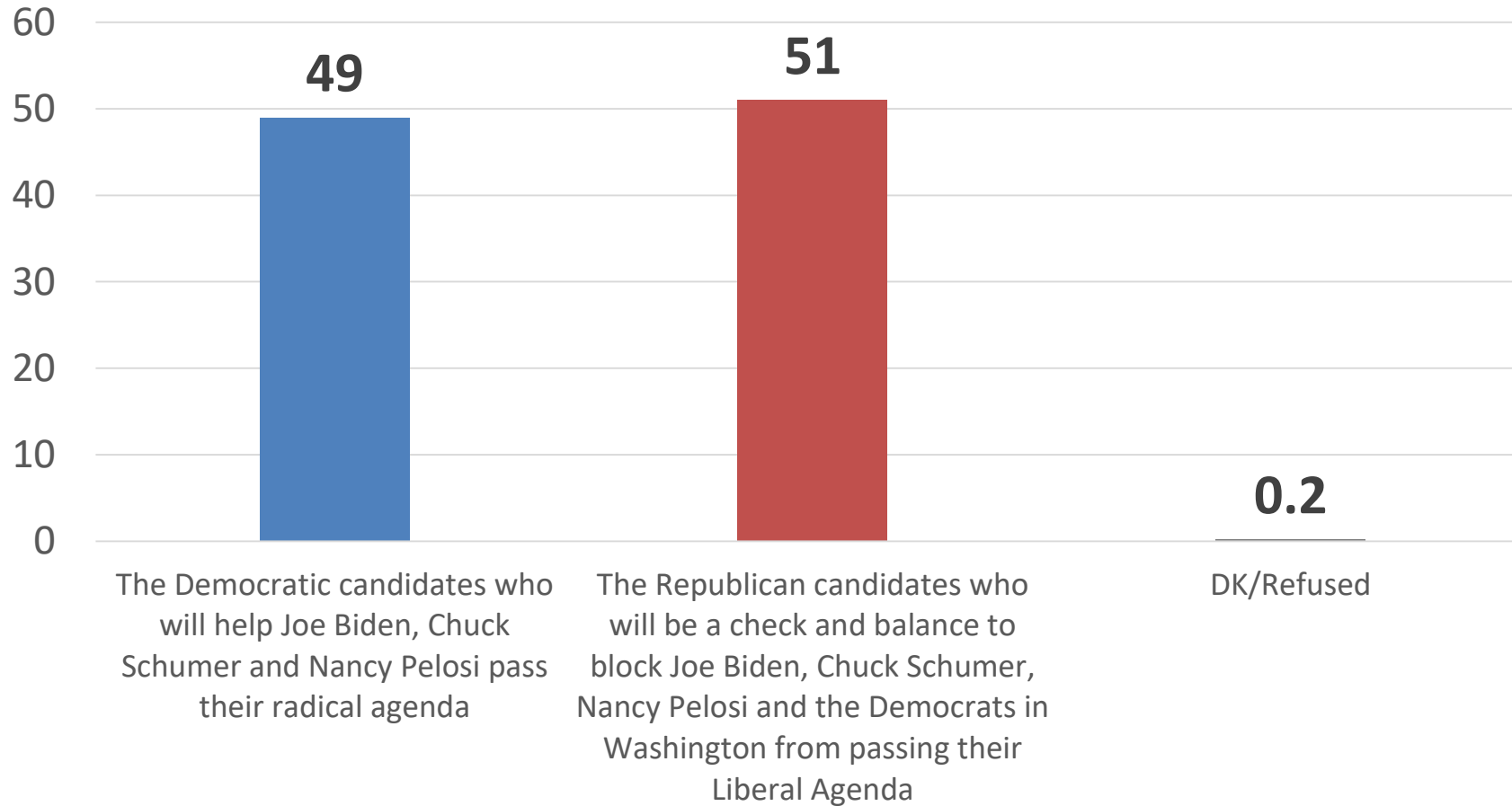

Generic Ballot for U.S. Congress



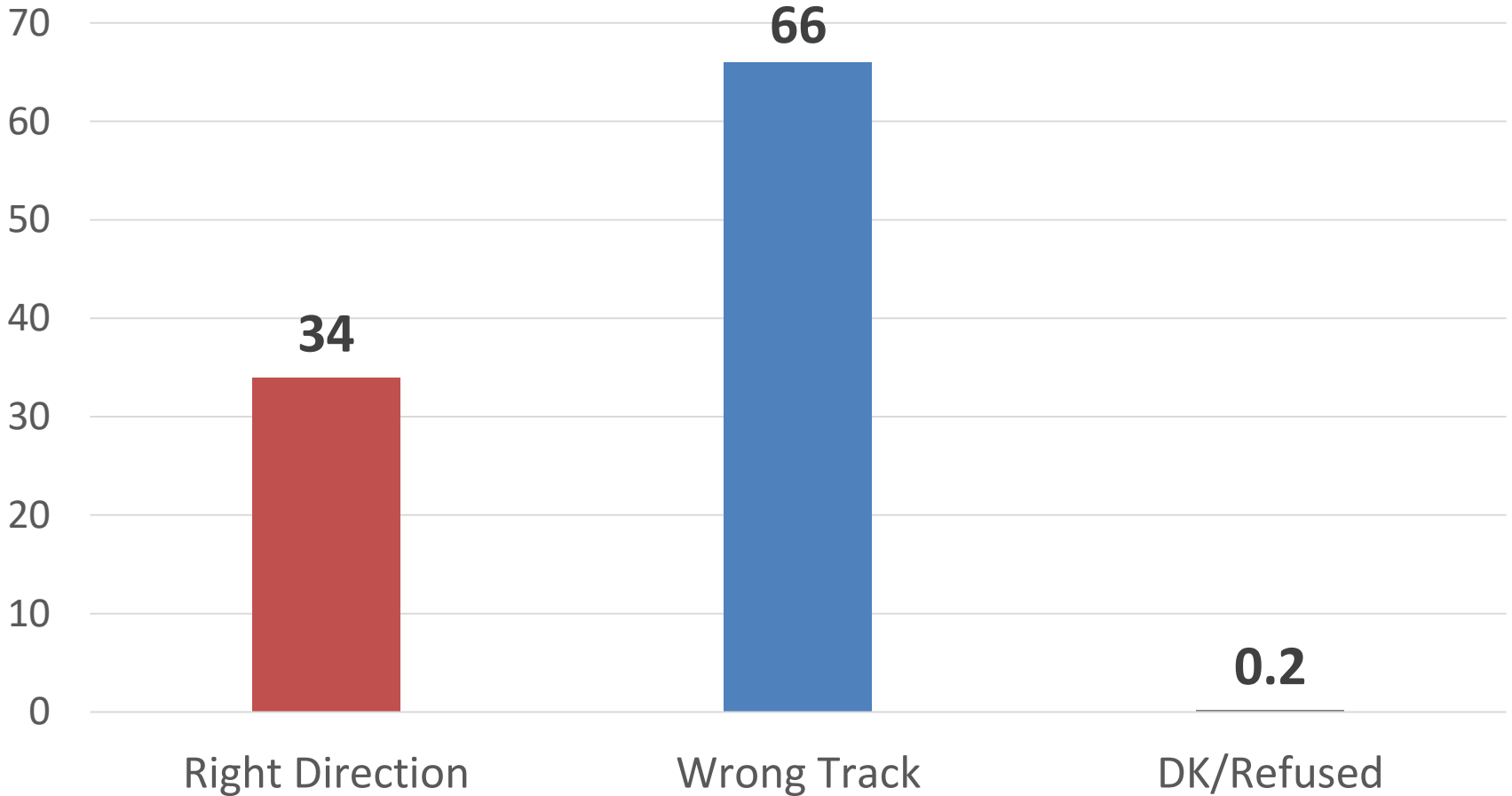

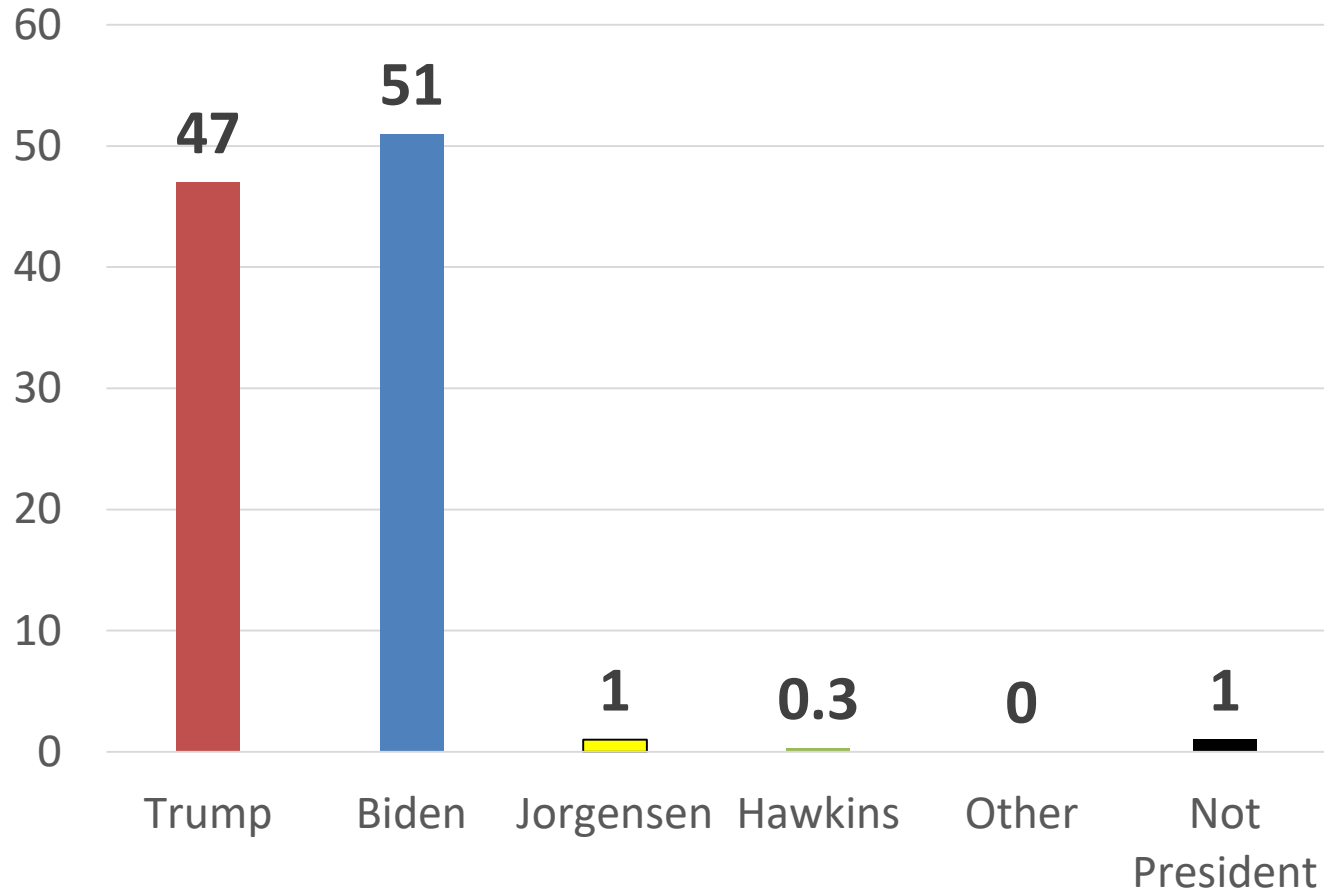
