

NEBRASKA'S FUSION TICKET.

**Democrats Abandon Everything Except
One Office to the Populists and
Silver Republicans.**

LINCOLN, Neb., July 12.—The Democrats, Populists, and Silver Republicans of Nebraska have nominated the following fusion ticket:

Governor—WILLIAM A. POYNTER, Populist.
Lieutenant Governor—E. A. GILBERT, Silver Republican.

Secretary of State—C. V. SOOBODA, Populist.

Treasurer—S. B. HOWARD, Populist.

Attorney General—WILLIS D. OLDHAM, Democrat.

Auditor—H. S. GRIESS, Populist.

Land Commissioner—P. J. CAREY, Populist.

The three State Central Committees, to whom was delegated the selection of Presidential Electors nominated Frank Ranson, J. H. Felder, W. A. Garrett, W. G. Swan, Peter Ebberson, Robert Oberfelder, L. M. Wente, and J. Hughes, and their action was ratified.

The action of the convention came after an all-night wrangle between the Democrats and Populists, which at one time seemed likely to result in a defeat of the fusion project.

Just at a time when the sentiment among the Populists seemed strong for breaking away from all alliances, a motion to take a recess prevailed. The Democrats adjourned at the same time, and the leaders got together for conference, with the result that the Democrats yielded everything, accepting but a single office on the State ticket and dividing with the Populists and Free Silver Republicans the eight Presidential Electors.
