REMEMBERING THE MURRAY BROTHERS


On this Armistice Day, it is fitting to remember two brothers, Arthur and Herbert Murray, who had connections with both Queen's Park and Arbroath and who served in the armed forces in the Great War. One brother survived the conflict but the other sadly lost his life.

Arthur Murray, the older of the two brothers, was born in Aberdeen in 1880. He studied at Aberdeen University, where he obtained a first class degree in Classics, before becoming a school teacher. Arthur was a centre half who played for Victoria United (Aberdeen) before spending two years with Arbroath. In 1903, he won the Scottish Qualifying Cup with the 'Maroons", as Arbroath were known at the time. He moved to Forfar Athletic and was a member of the Forfar side that won the Forfarshire Cup in season 1905/06. Arthur was then invited to join Queen's Park and secured employment as a teacher at Allan Glen's School in Glasgow. He made his Queen's debut at Airdrie in March 1906 and went on to feature for the Spiders in 159 competitive matches, scoring six goals. He played his final competitive first eleven game against Hearts in December 2011 but was still registered as a player in season 1912/13. Thereafter, he remained a member of the club.

In June 1916, Arthur enlisted as a Private in the Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders. He was commissioned as a Lieutenant in the Gordon Highlanders in January 1917 and was captured by the Germans during the Spring Offensive of March 1918. He was released at the end of the war and discharged from the army in January 1919. He became a member of the Queen's Park Committee and was Club President from 1921 to 1923. By this time, Arthur was deputy headmaster of Allan Glen's School. In 1924, he left Glasgow to take up the post of Rector of Banff Academy. Arthur died in 1930 at the age of only 50.



Younger brother Herbert, known as Bert, was born in Newhills in Aberdeenshire in 1886. He followed in the footsteps of Arthur and attended Aberdeen University before becoming a school teacher. As a footballer, Bert was best known as an Aberdeen player but played for Arbroath in season 1904/05 and Queen's Park in 1910/11. In his short spell at Hampden, he made 12 competitive appearances for the Spiders' first eleven between August 1910 and January 1911. Seven of these appearances were on the right wing, two on the left wing and three at inside left. In addition to Aberdeen, Arbroath and Queen's Park, Bert also played for East Stirlingshire, Clyde and Johnstone.

Early in 1915, Bert enlisted in the Gordon Highlanders and received his commission in August of that year. He was severely injured and was sent back to the UK, where he served as a musketry instructor. He returned to the front in April 1917 and was awarded the Military Cross for bravery in the field during the Spring Offensive in March 1918. Bert held the rank of Captain when he was killed at the age of 32 in the Bois de Courton on 20 July 1918 in the Second Battle of the Marne. He is buried in Marfaux Military Cemetery.

The Murray brothers are but two of the very many fine men who have worn the jerseys of Arbroath and Queen's Park over the years and it is important that such men are not forgotten.
