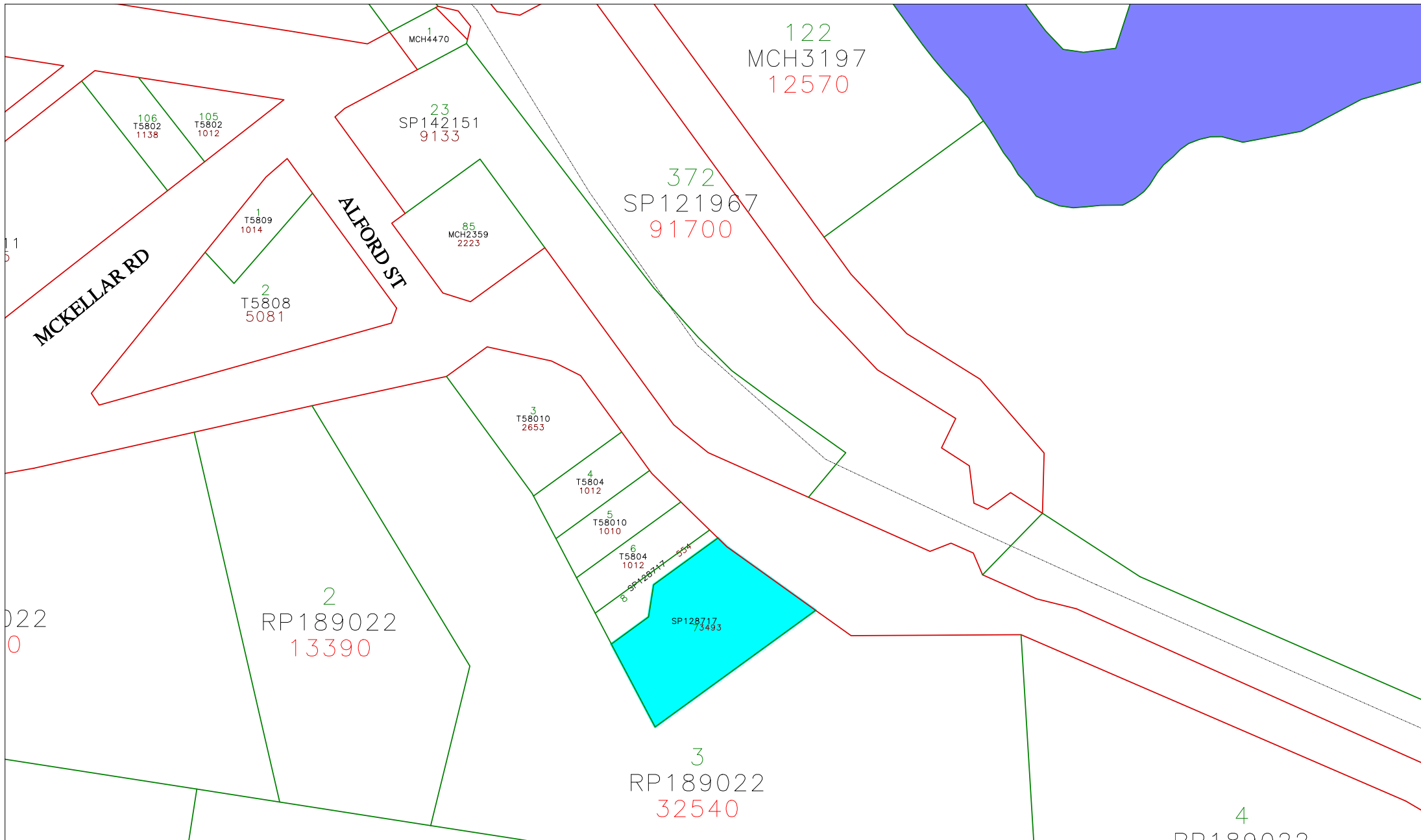

The Traveston Hall was erected in 1898 as a powder magazine for the Gympie Mines. The building was sited at Traveston for safety purposes.

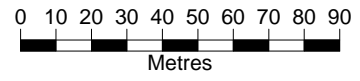
