Historical Data

Inglewood Pottery buildings at the South East Gold mine site date back to approximately 1897, and it is 40-50 years since the stables and blacksmith's shop operated.

Mr. Irv Runge who operated the blacksmith's shop there with his father and brothers said that the nails and glass etc date from the 1940s.

Place Assessment

The building is significant to the extent that buildings of that type are becoming rare in Gympie and deserve protection as an illustration of typical workplaces in Gympie's mining industry.

The site and buildings are indicative of the interwar years and of being used for farmer trade purposes. The surrounding buildings are now utilised by Byron Moore, master potter, as Inglewood Hill Pottery
