HOT TAKES:

- Miami is a perfect 4-0 this season when holding opponents to under 40 percent from the field.
- January marks as the month that Miami faces the most opponents that made the 2020 Playoffs with 12 of Miami's 16 matches coming against teams that made the playoffs last season.
- Miami scored 47 points in the first quarter on 1/9 at WAS, marking the most first quarter points in team history.
- The HEAT have used 11 different starting line-ups in their 15 games this season, as 13 of Miami's 17 players have started at least one game, with only Haslem, Nunn, Silva and Strus yet to record a start.

BAM WITH 40: Bam Adebayo recorded a career-high 41 points on 1/23 at BKN. He becomes the second-youngest player in franchise history to post a 40-point game (23 years, 189 days), only Dwyane Wade was younger when he scored 48 points on 4/14/05 at PHI (23 years, 87 days). Additionally, Adebayo's 41-point game marks as the fourth-most points by a center in team history with Alonzo Mourning holding the top three spots (50 on 3/29/96 vs. WAS, 45 on 2/3/96 vs. BOS & 43 on 2/23/00 vs. NJ).

K-NUNN HEATING UP: Kendrick Nunn posted back-to-back 20-point games, all off the bench, after recording 28 points on 1/20 and then adding 22 on 1/22. Over Nunn's last three games, he is averaging 22.7 points, 5.7 rebounds, 4.3 assists and 1.67 steals while shooting 57.1 percent from the field, 43.5 percent from three-point range and 83.3 percent from the foul line.

HEAT LIFER: Head Coach Erik Spoelstra has recorded 658 career wins (573 regular season & 85 postseason) with the HEAT, and according to the Associated Press, the 658 total wins are the sixth-most by a head coach with a single franchise in NBA history. Next on the list is Red Holzman (Knicks) with 667 victories, followed by Phil Jackson (Lakers), Red Auerbach (Celtics), Jerry Sloan (Jazz) and Gregg Popovich (Spurs).

GOOD START: Precious Achiuwa has posted a double-double in each of his two starts this season, becoming just the second rookie in HEAT franchise history to record a double-double in his first two starts, joining Kurt Thomas who also did so in his first two starts on 12/10/95 and then 12/12/95. No HEAT rookie has accomplished the feat in their first three starts.

ALL-TIME OFF THE BENCH: Goran Dragić scored 21 points, all off the bench, at WAS on 1/9. He now has totaled 21 20-point games off the bench as a member of the HEAT, the second-most all-time in team history. Dragić is now just one short from tying the all-time record. Below are the most overall 20-point games by a reserve in franchise history.

100: Duncan Robinson played in his 100th career NBA game on 1/18 vs. DET while connecting on his 326th career three-point field goal, the most through any player's first 100 career NBA games in league history, eclipsing the previous mark by 76 treys. MR. ROBINSON: Duncan Robinson connected on his 300th career made three-point field goal on 1/6 vs. BOS in just his 95th career game, becoming the fastest player in NBA history to connect on their 300th career three-pointer, and did so in a lot fewer games. Below are the fastest players to achieve the feat.

FROM THE FIELD: Bam Adebayo shot 9-of-10 from the field vs. OKC on 1/4, finishing with a game-high 20 points while adding eight rebounds and four assists. According to the Associated Press, Adebayo became just the fourth player in team history to have multiple games shooting at least 9-of-10 or better, joining Hassan Whiteside (five), Alonzo Mourning (four) and Udonis Haslem (three). Additionally, the previous instance Bam accomplished the feat was last season on 1/5/20 vs. POR after also going 9-of-10 from the field.

THIEF IN THE NIGHT: Jimmy Butler recorded a career-high seven steals in Miami's Opening Night Game at ORL on 12/23. His seven steals also marked the most in a season-opener in HEAT franchise history, surpassing the previous record of five held by Mario Chalmers on 10/29/13 vs. CHI.

QUITE A TURNAROUND: Miami held the Bucks to 36 less points on the second night of their back-to-back set after giving up 144 on 12/29 and then 108 on 12/30. The -36 point differential ranks as the fifth-highest since the NBA-ABA merger (1976) against the same team on consecutive nights. Below are the largest such point differentials since the NBA-ABA merger.

SPO ON CHRISTMAS: HEAT Head Coach Erik Spoelstra improved to a perfect 8-0 record on Christmas Day after defeating the Pelicans, 111-98, and has now recorded the best Christmas Day record in NBA history (minimum five games). Additionally, the HEAT have won their last eight consecutive Christmas Day games and are currently 11-2 (.846) on the holiday, including a perfect 6-0 at home. Below are the best Christmas Day records by a head coach among the four major American sports leagues (NBA, NFL, NHL, MLB).

A CHRISTMAS MIRACLE: Duncan Robinson connected on seven three-point field goals on 12/25 vs. NOP, tying the NBA all-time Christmas record for three's made in a single game. Robinson hit six of those in the first half, the most ever on Christmas in a half by any player, as Miami totaled 13 in the same half, the most ever on Christmas in a half by any team.

HEAT LIFER: Udonis Haslem, who made his NBA debut with the HEAT during the 2003-04 season, enters his 18th season with Miami. He is the longest tenured HEAT player in franchise history and holds the longest streak by any active player with only one team in the NBA. He is the only undrafted player in NBA history to lead a franchise in total rebounds and has served as captain in each of the past 13 seasons, the longest tenure in team history.

SELLING OUT: Miami sold out every home game last season and has now sold out 451-straight overall games, which includes both the regular season and playoffs, the sixth-longest sellout streak in NBA history. Additionally, 265 of those 451 overall sellouts have been at over capacity, where fans have purchased Standing Room Only tickets in the Upper 400 Level. NBA FINALS: The HEAT made their sixth NBA Finals last season, becoming the first No. 5 seed to reach the Finals in league history. Since Miami's first Finals in 2006, no other team has made more over that span. The NBA Finals has been represented by either Miami or HEAT player Andre Iguodala over the last 10-straight seasons. Additionally, with Miami's 2020 Eastern Conference Finals series win over Boston, the HEAT have now won their last six consecutive Eastern Conference Finals appearances, tying the longest such streak by an East team since the Chicago Bulls in the 90's (1991, 1992, 1993, 1996, 1997, 1998). Below are the most NBA Finals appearances since the HEAT made their first in 2006.

E REID FOR THREE: HEAT Television Play-by-Play announcer, Eric Reid, was recently named the 2020 Florida Sportscaster of the Year. This marks his third time winning the award after also being honored in 2017 and 2018. Reid, the lone remaining original member of the Miami HEAT broadcasting team, is currently in his 33rd season of calling HEAT basketball.

SEASON OF GIVING: After a tough year of unprecedented times, the Miami HEAT gave back and spread some holiday cheer including the 'Spoelstra Family Season of Giving' event in which coach and his wife, Nikki, hosted gift card giveaways while matching with a financial donation to the Miami Learning School and donating toys, gift cards and funds to Health in the Hood. Bam Adebayo held a gift donation drive that included toys and bicycles for the Samuel K. Johnson Youth Center in Liberty City and also provided a single mother a year's worth of rent to avoid eviction from her home. Moe Harkless hosted a holiday toy and food drive through for littles from the Big Brothers Big Sisters of Miami program. Udonis Haslem hosted 'Christmas for the Community' that included a drive through toy giveaway. Tyler Herro surprised families with a holiday Zoom party and gift cards. Meyers Leonard hosted a holiday gift distribution for the women's veterans clinic. Meyers and his wife, Elle, also donated approximately \$20,000 to the Armed Forces program for the American Red Cross. 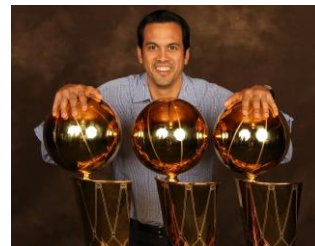

ERIK SPOELSTRA (Portland)

Regular Season Coaching Record: 573-401, currently in 13th Season

Postseason Coaching Record: 85-54, nine postseason appearances

Erik Spoelstra enters his 13th season as head coach of the HEAT and his 26th as a member of the organization. He was elevated to his current position on April 28, 2008. Spoelstra has rewarded the faith that HEAT President Pat Riley showed in him by garnering nine postseason appearances, seven division titles, five conference championships and guiding the franchise to back-to-back NBA titles in 2012 and 2013.



In his previous 12 seasons at the helm, Spoelstra has already made his mark on the HEAT record book as the winningest coach in franchise history. Entering this season, he holds team records in wins, winning percentage and games coached. He has also been honored as the NBA's Eastern Conference Coach of the Month a franchise-record eight times. Last season he took a No. 5 seeded team to the NBA Finals as Miami became the first No. 5 seed to reach the Finals in league history.

When Spoelstra first took over the head coaching duties in 2008, he was given the task of improving a young team that had been ravaged by injuries the previous season and had won just 15 games. He then recorded 43 wins in his first season, the most by a first year HEAT coach in team history, while on his way to a postseason berth. Miami became just the second team in NBA history to make the playoffs after winning 15-or-fewer games the previous season. The only other team to do so was the 1968-69 San Diego Rockets, in which HEAT President Pat Riley was a member of.

From 2010-14, Spoelstra took one of the most scrutinized teams and guided them to consecutive NBA Championships, four-straight Conference Championships and four consecutive NBA Finals appearances, becoming just the third franchise in NBA history to make four consecutive NBA Finals appearances, joining the Celtics and Lakers. It also made them just one of 10 franchises in the four major North American sports leagues to make four consecutive trips to the league championship. Individually, Spoelstra became just the fourth head coach in NBA history to lead his team to four-straight Finals appearances joining Red Auerbach, K.C. Jones and Pat Riley. Spoelstra also joined a very elite fraternity when he led the HEAT to a seven-game series win over the San Antonio Spurs in the 2013 NBA Finals. Upon capturing the 2013 NBA Championship he became one of just 13 head coaches in NBA history to have won multiple championships and only the eighth to win a championship in consecutive seasons.

The 2012 championship culminated a compressed 2011-12 season in which Miami went 46-20 and captured its second consecutive Southeast Division title. The regular season was highlighted by a nine-game win streak (Feb. 10-Mar. 1) with each victory a double-digit win. During that streak the HEAT became the first team to win road games on three consecutive nights (Feb. 12-14) since December of 1979 and the first to win each of those contests by double-digits since the 1970-71 season.

Before taking over as the sixth head coach in HEAT history, Spoelstra had served Miami in a number of roles in his first 13 years. He was originally hired as video coordinator and over the years was promoted to assistant coach/video coordinator, assistant coach/advance scout and assistant coach/director of scouting, a title he held during Miami's 2006 NBA Championship, before ascending to head coach. He made a name for himself around the league with his game preparation and superb attention to detail. In his seven seasons as the HEAT's assistant coach/director of scouting, he had the primary role of developing game plans for upcoming opponents. To that end, he coordinated the video staff and advance scouts while overseeing the development of scouting reports and videos.

In 1992, he graduated from the University of Portland with a degree in communications. While attending Portland, Spoelstra was the starting point guard for four years and was named the West Coast Conference Freshman of the Year in 1989. Upon graduating he spent two years as a player/coach for Tus Herten, a team in the professional sports league of Germany.

He has returned to his native Philippines to host clinics and promote education, health and wellness to thousands of at-risk youth through grassroots programs and events. The 9-day program in Manila in the summer of 2011 was the largest NBA FIT event ever hosted in Southeast Asia under the NBA Cares umbrella. In the summer of 2012, Coach Spoelstra expanded his reach into other Southeast Asia nations by conducting coaches clinics and other FIT activities in Singapore.

Raised in Portland, OR, Spoelstra, who was inducted into the Jesuit High School Athletic Hall of Fame in September 2009, is the first Asian/Filipino-American head coach in any of the major North American sports leagues.

Spoelstra is the son of Jon Spoelstra, a long-time NBA executive who has guided the Portland Trail Blazers, Denver Nuggets, Buffalo Braves and New Jersey Nets. His grandfather, Watson, was a Detroit Tigers beat writer for many years. He and his wife, Nikki, who were married in the summer of 2016, reside in Coral Gables, with their sons Santiago and Dante.

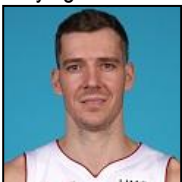

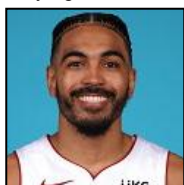
