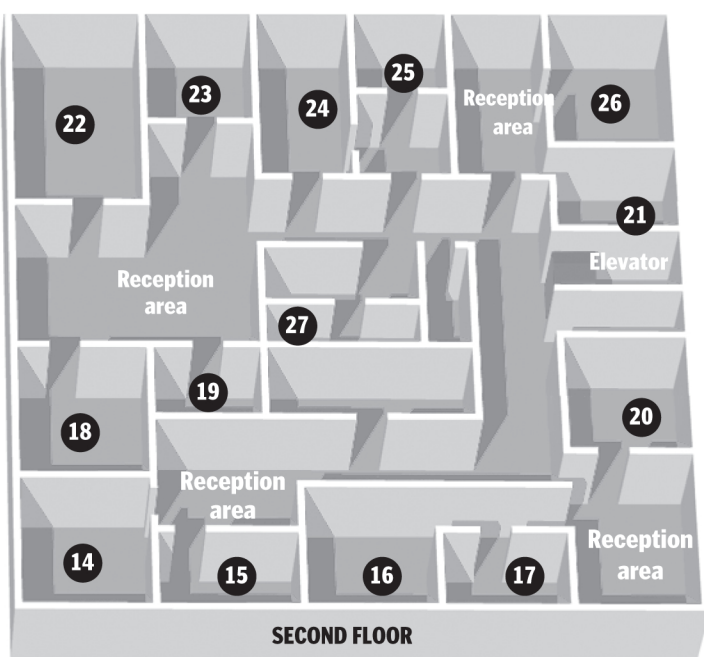
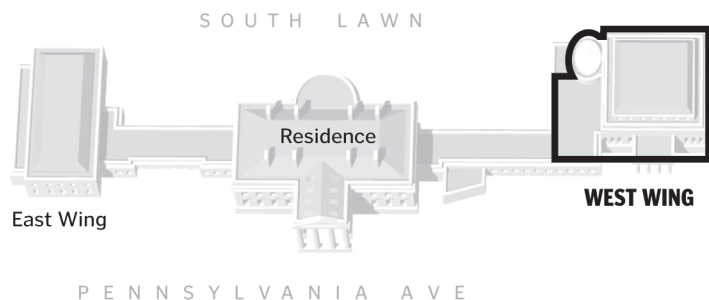


Inside the West Wing

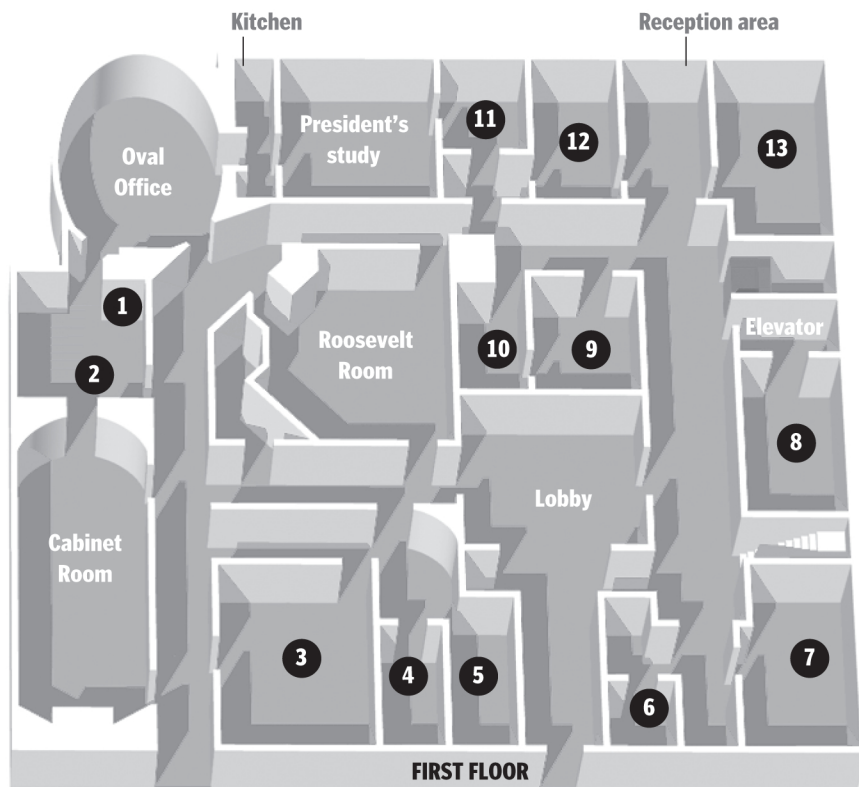
