#### KAYAH CULTURAL COMMUNITY TOUR

Panpet Village (Kayan ethnic), Hta Nee La Leh Village (Kayan ethnic) and Htay Kho village (Kayaw ethnic) offer community based cultural tours which give the visitor fascinating in sights into local life and the culture of the Kayah community. The cultural and nature trail allows the visitor the chance to explore the panoramic views of the surrounding mountains, a monument which honours the village clan, the Ker Kwang- a Bird Totem and a guardian spirit cave, the 'Kayah toebo' hall and shrines.

#### DAW TA MA GYI (KAYAH VILLAGE) Known for its old long wooden thatched houses, this Kayah village also has many animist shrines dedicated to various

Most of the mining in Kayah is in Hpasaung, near Mawchi. Communities often have more diversified livelihoods, selling their labour to complement subsistence agriculture.

# BAWLAKHE

The Than Lwin River flows through the township. The township benefits from a number of mines and considerable timber resource. Farmers in Bawlakhe also cultivate sesames as a cash crop



# **DEMAWSOE**

Benefits from its closeness to Loikaw and is the state's second most populous township. With highland and lowland agriculture, Demawsoe benefited from irrigation schemes with plans to develop tourism near Seven Ponds Lake. Eastern parts of Demawsoe (Daw Phu) remain relatively remote.



# LAW PI TA HYDROPOWER PLANT & WATERFALL

Of historic and strategic importance as Myanmar's first and largest run-of-river plant, Law Pi Ta Hydropower Plant, was commenced in 1950 and supplies over 20% of Myanmar's total electrical power. There is also stunning scenery of cascading blue water at Law Pi Ta Waterfall.



# **ELEPHANT MOUNTAIN (SING TAUNG)**

A beautiful drive from Loikaw, Elephant Mountain gets its name from the white statue of an elephant in the pagoda. It also affords eastern and western views of the surrounding townships Demawsoe and Nam Ma



# THE SEVEN LAKES

Legend has it that these picturesque lakes were used by seven fairy sisters as their swimming pools. Each has its own Kayah name and men may not swim in the one known as Rhremo (Lady). If they do, local legend says that the lake's guardian lady spirit likes to eat their flesh.

# HTEE SE KHA WATERFALL

This natural waterfall which flows from Nant Tan Creek, on the border of Shan and Kayah State is a popular local attraction. Visitors should wear shorts and T-shirts to swim, rather than bathing costumes.



# THREE MOUNTAIN PAGODA

Just a short drive from Loikaw, visitors will pass through villages, cornfields and farms to reach this pagoda. A serene location, it offers one of the most spectacular views of the city and has a small cave filled with many small Buddhist statues and figures all brightly lit up.

# NGWE DAUNG DAM

Just a short drive from Loikaw, this is a beautiful spot to take pictures against the background of the Golden, Silver and Ruby Mountains. The dam was built in 1962 and provides the main source of water for irrigation in the Demawsoe area.

# PAN PET (KAYAN VILLAGE)

Known for its 'long-necked' women, Pan Pet is a Kayan village with a strong tradition of Animism mixed with Buddhism and Christianity. Tours are offered, including a visit to an artisan houses, a short trek to a nearby mountain and authentic meals for guests.

# HANDICRAFTS

Handicrafts play an important role in domestic, artistic and spiritual life. Bamboo is a basic raw material for local communities and several unusual musical instruments are crafted from bamboo and other woods. Villagers are skilled at weaving traditional fabrics on the loom. Visit the local workshops to see how indigenous products are made and purchase
