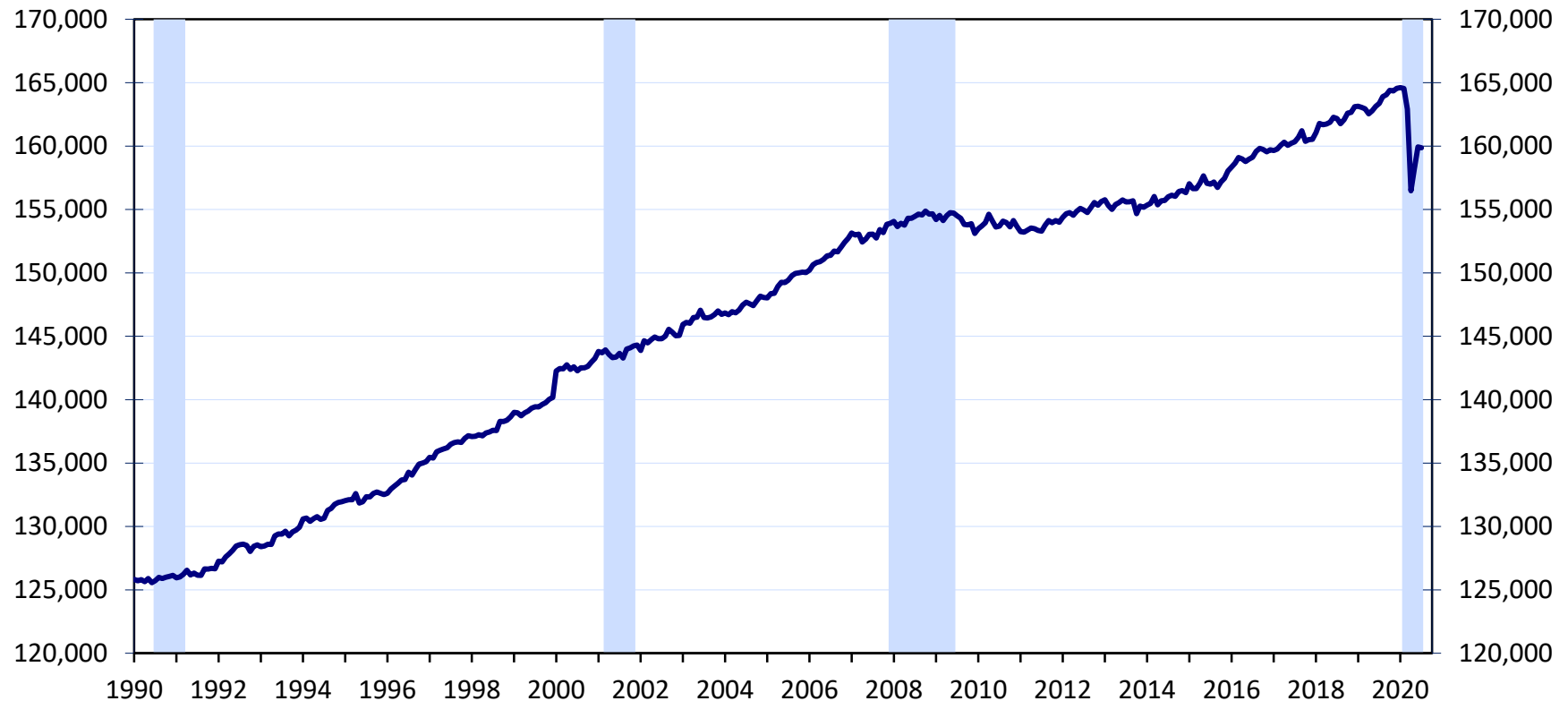

Numbers in thousands



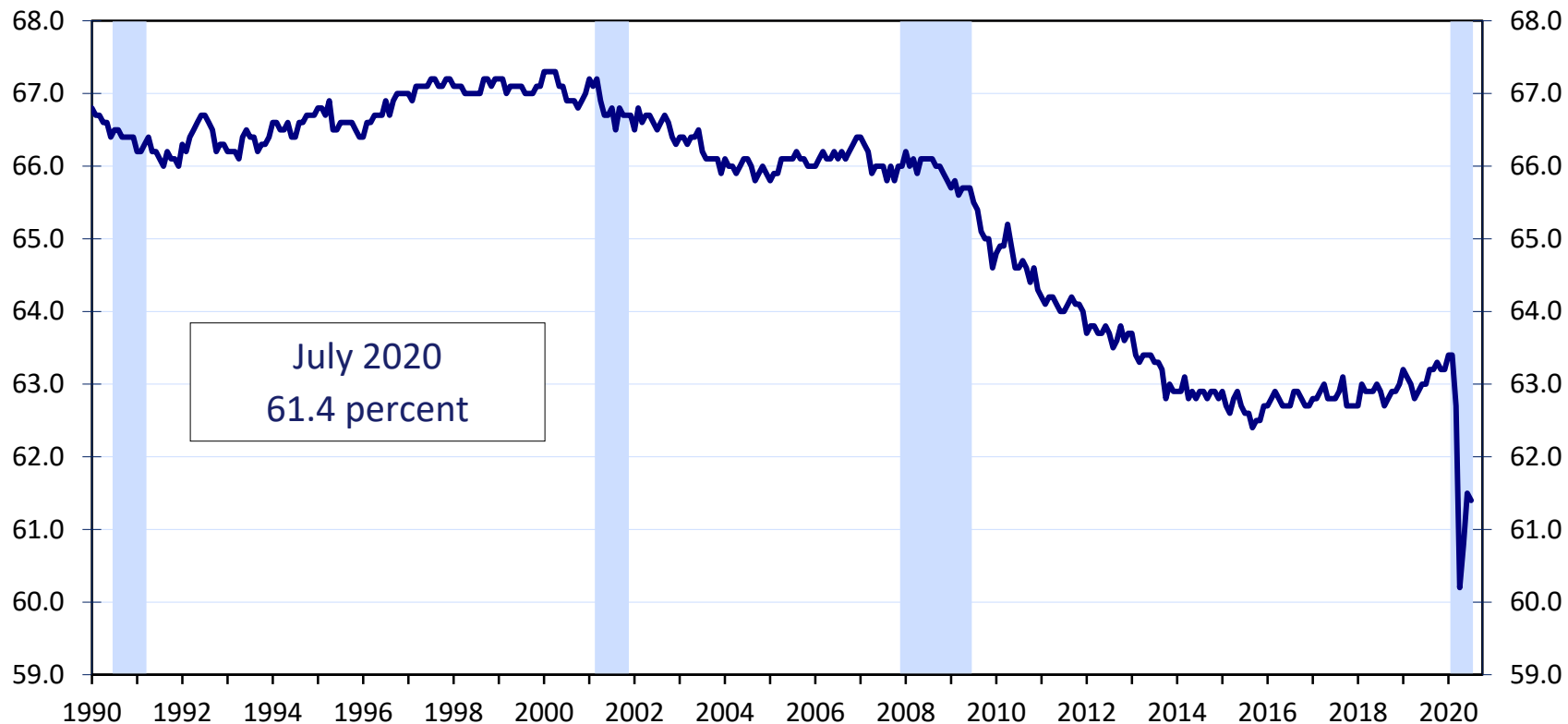

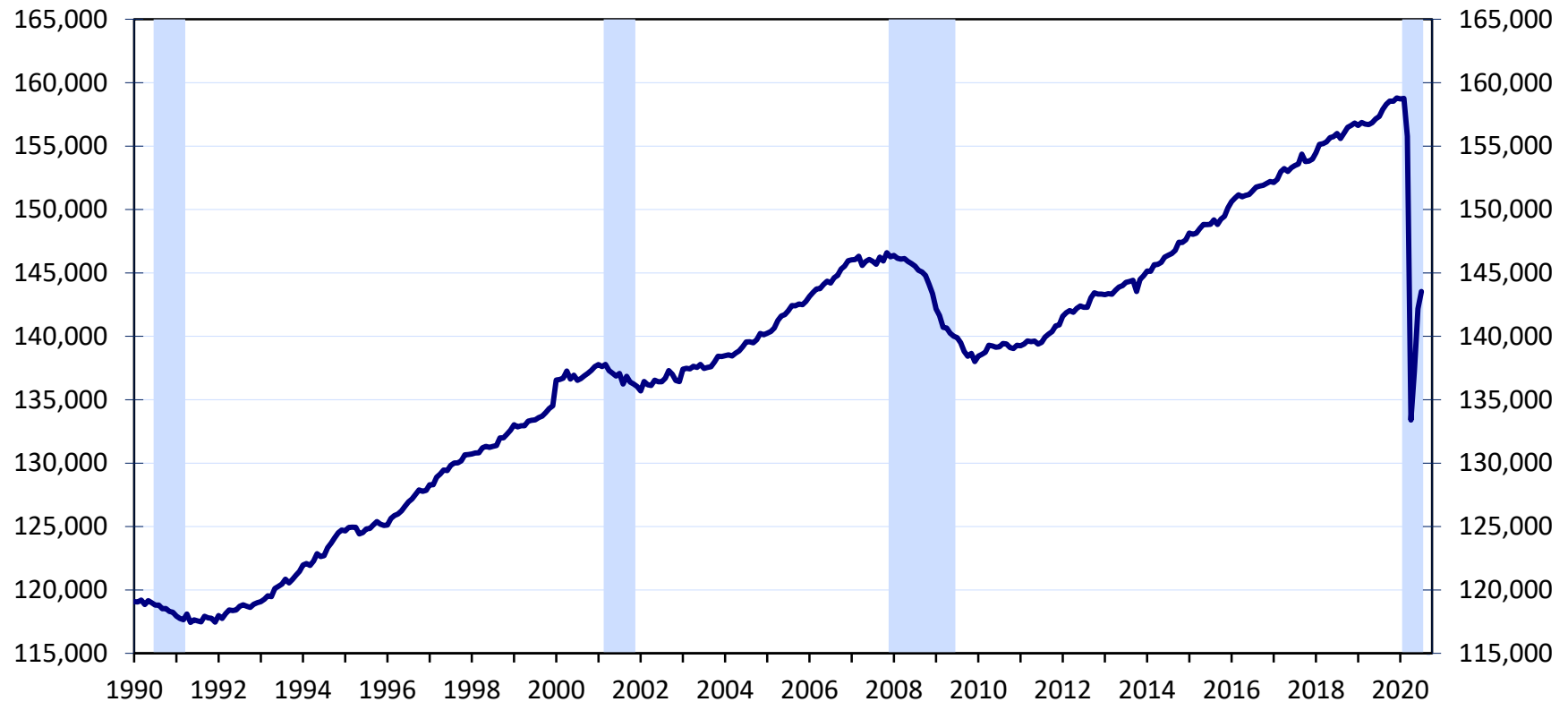

Numbers in thousands



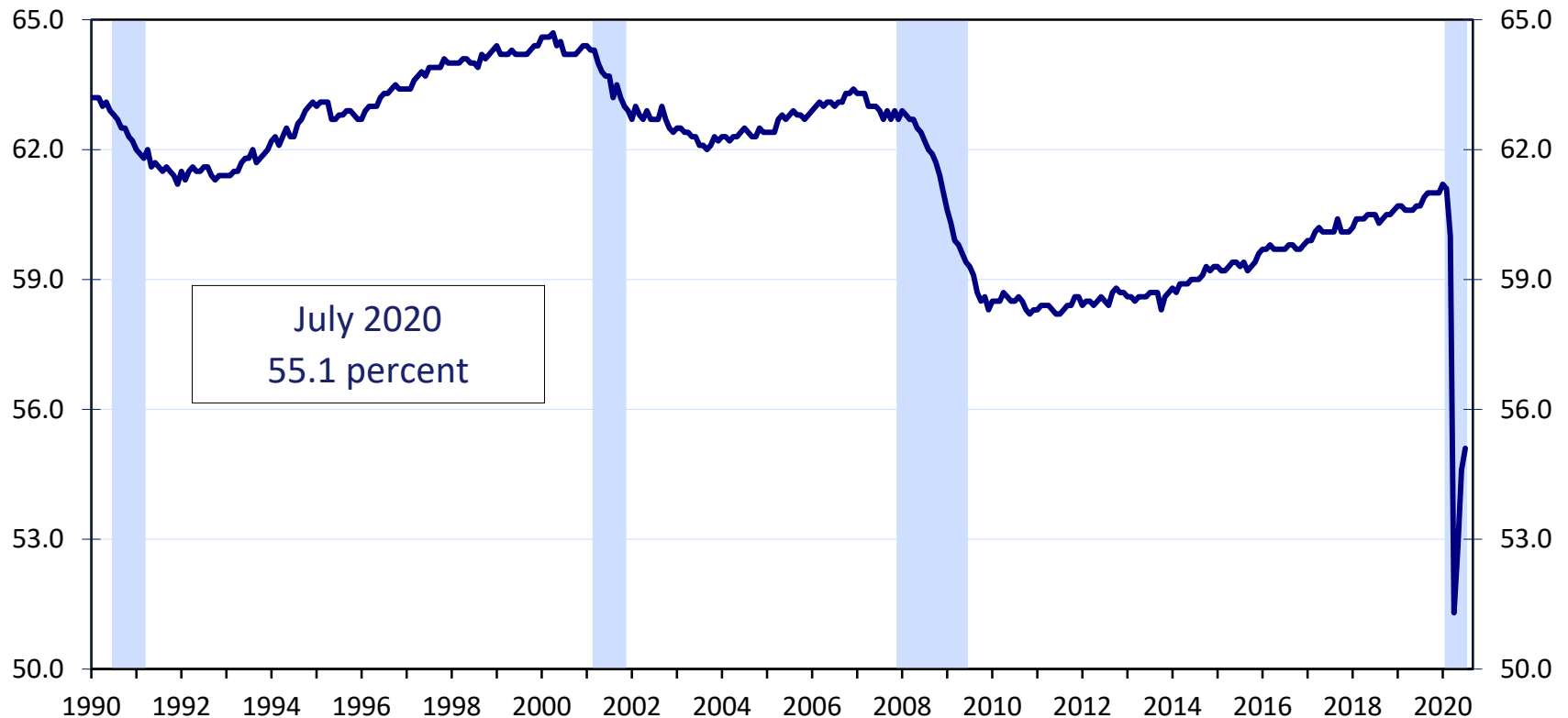

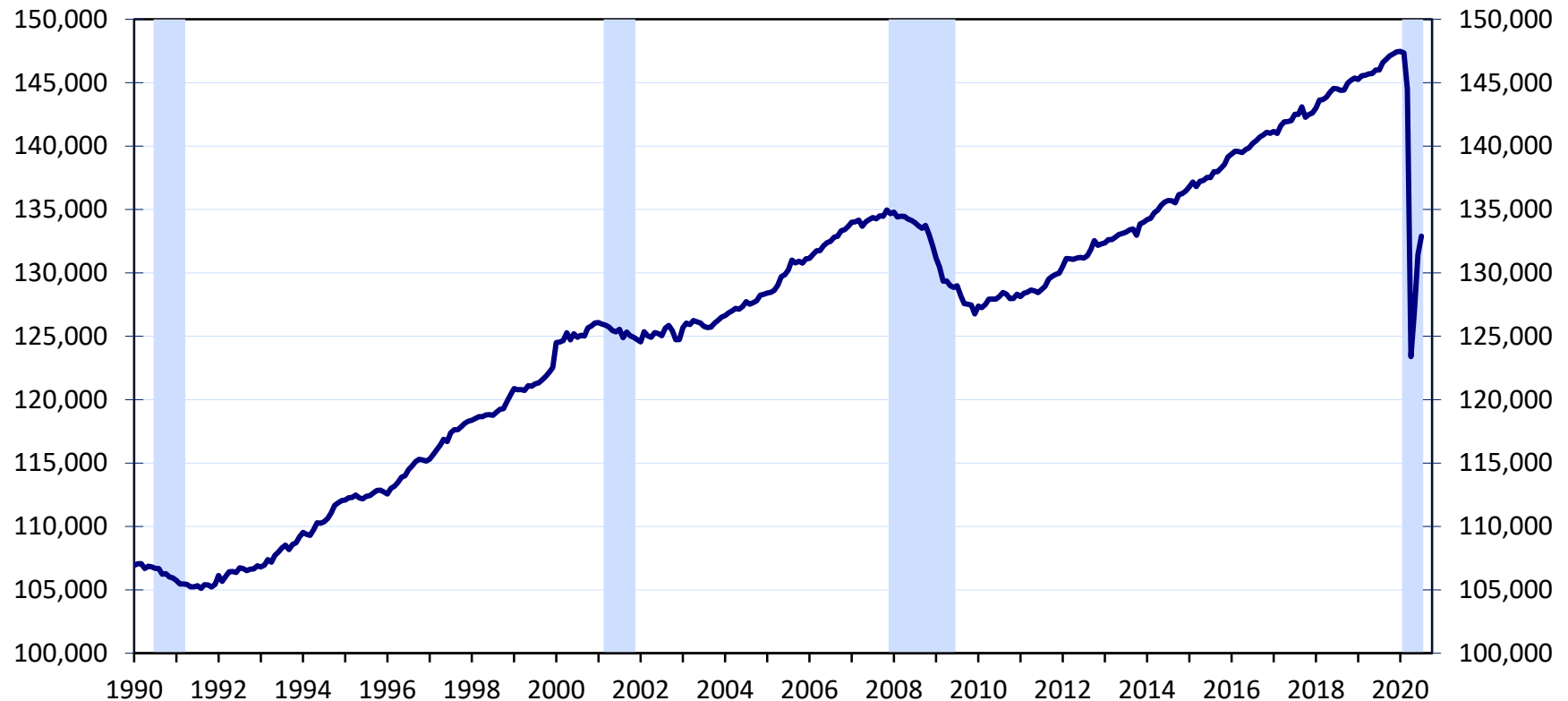

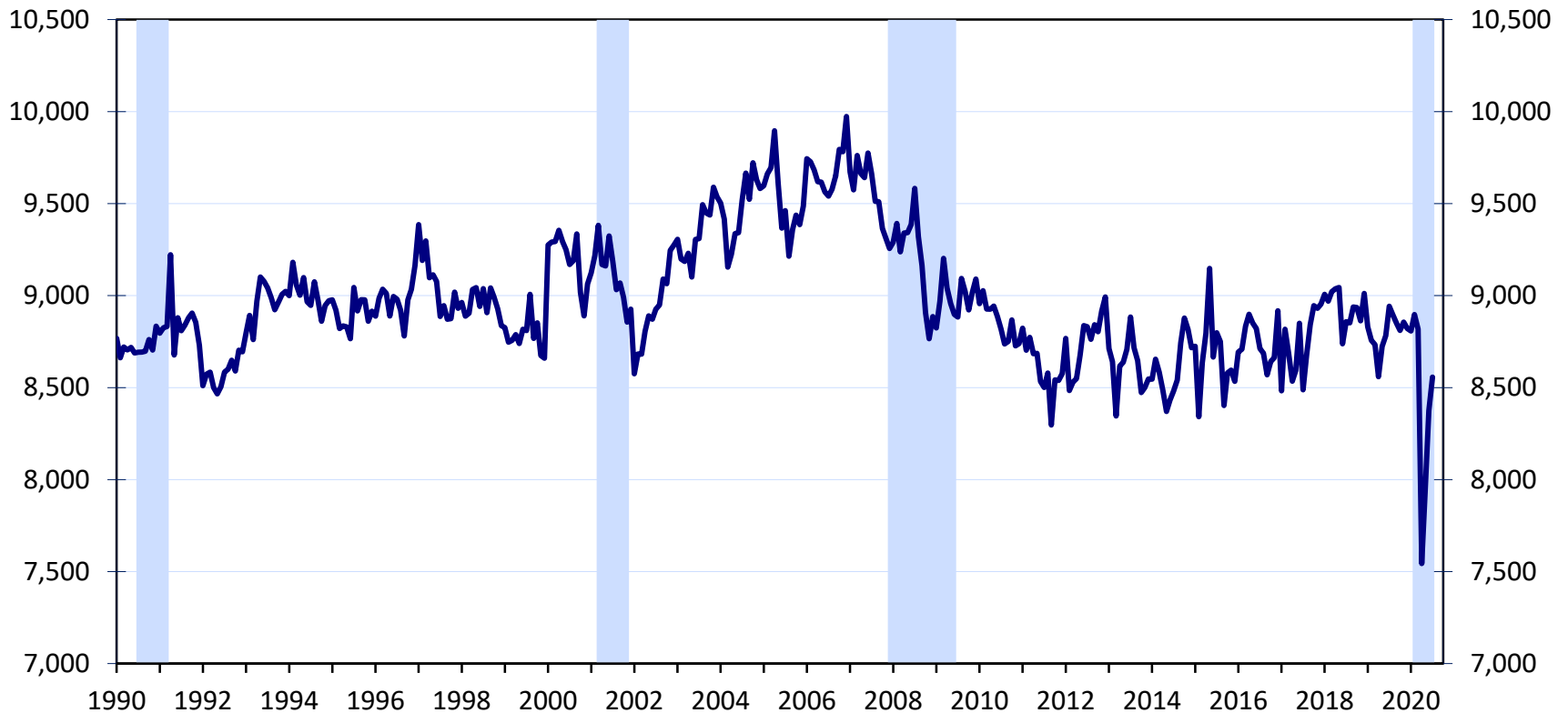




# Chart 6. Nonagricultural self-employed, unincorporated

Numbers in thousands



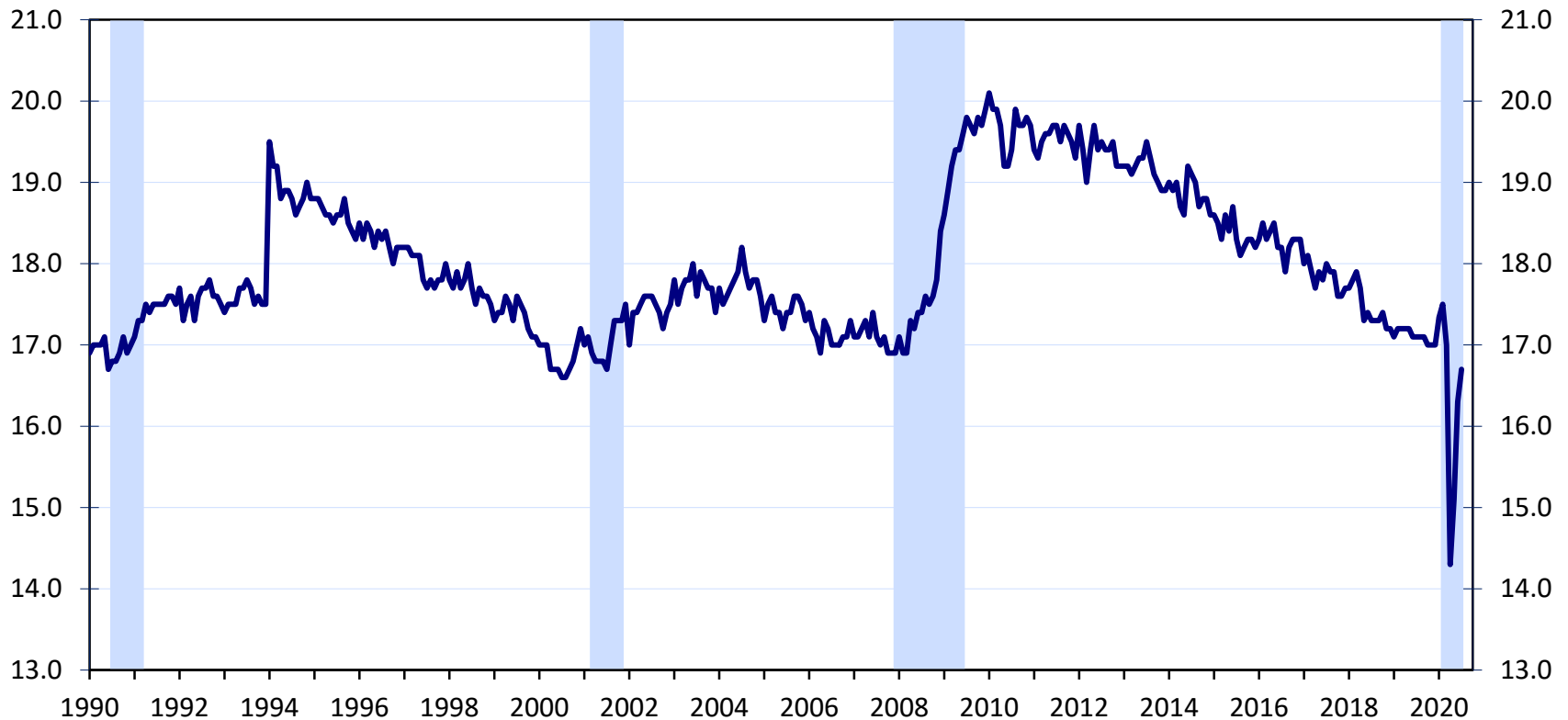

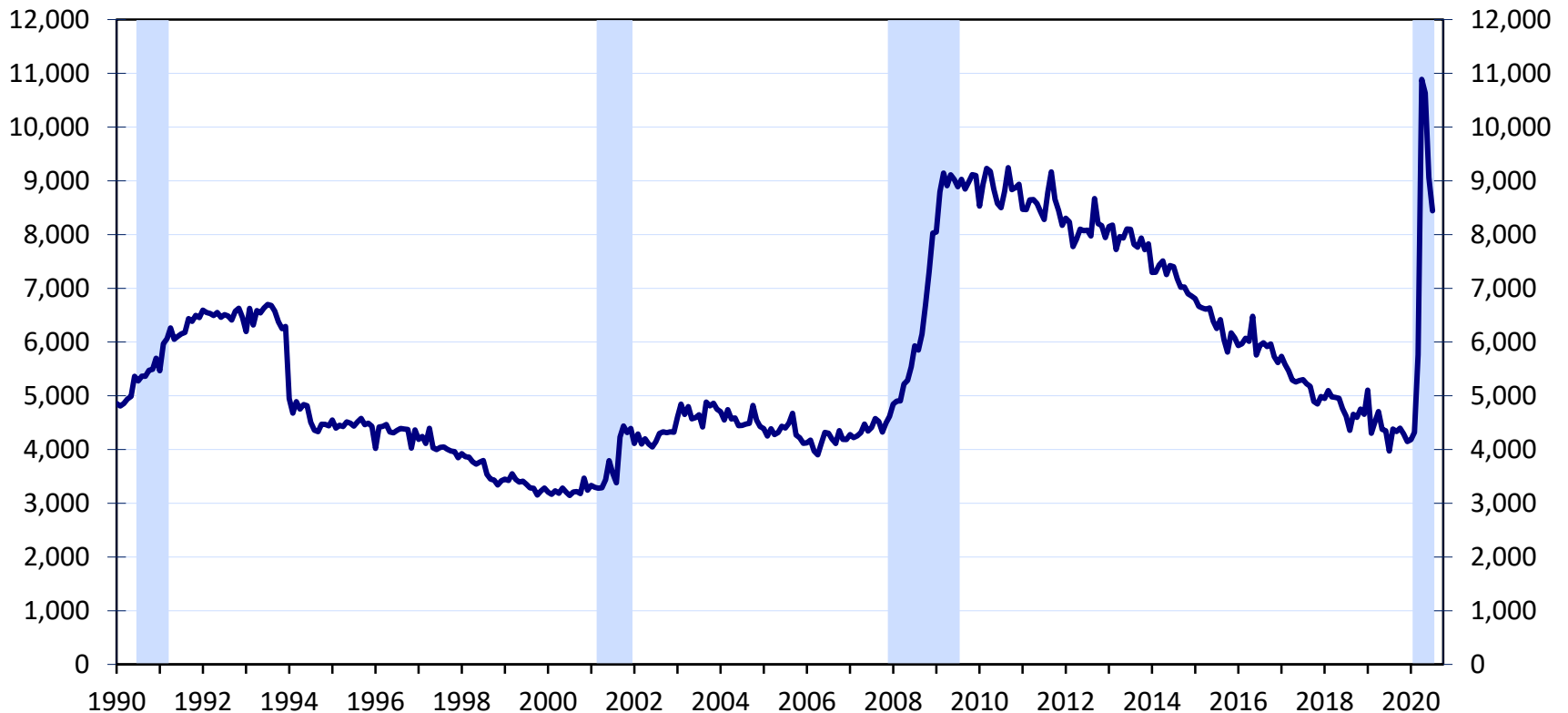

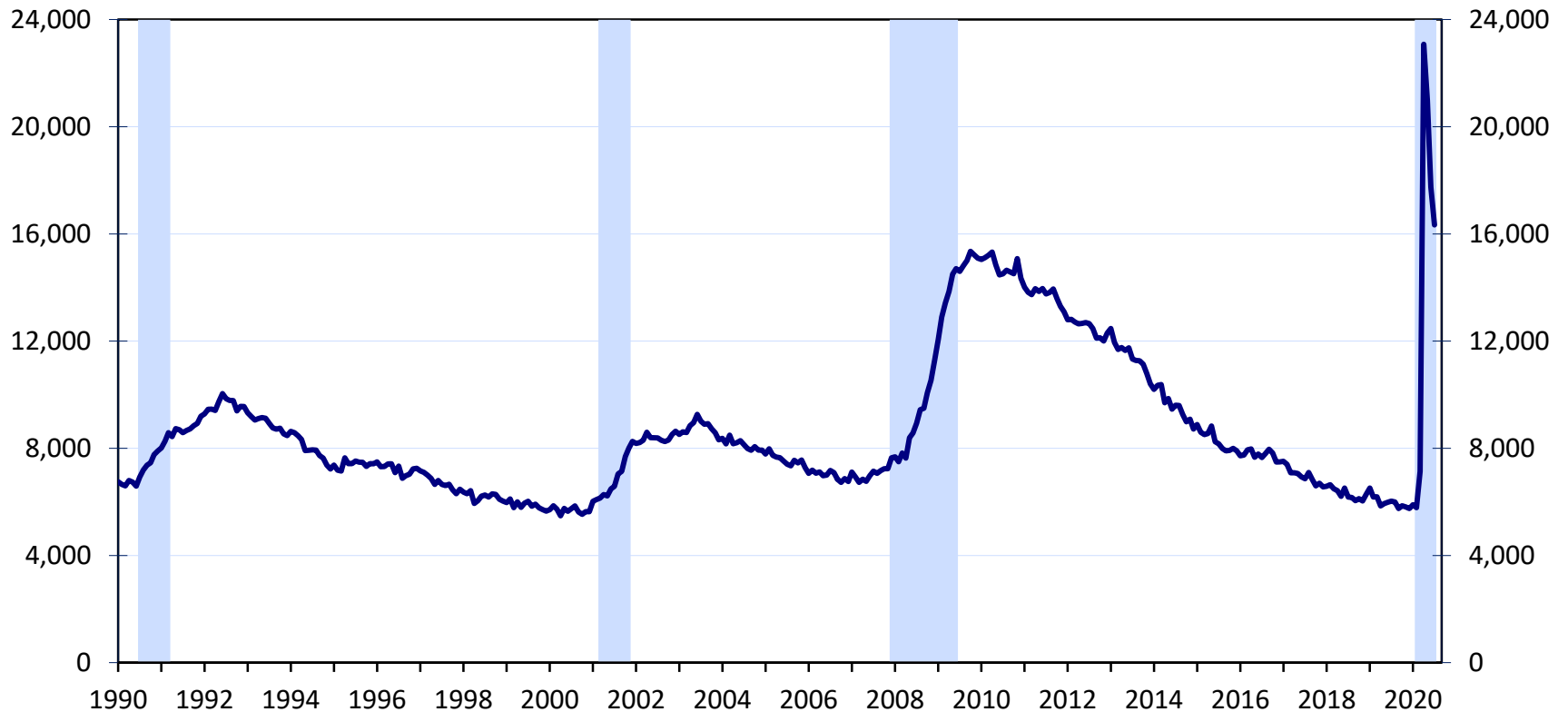

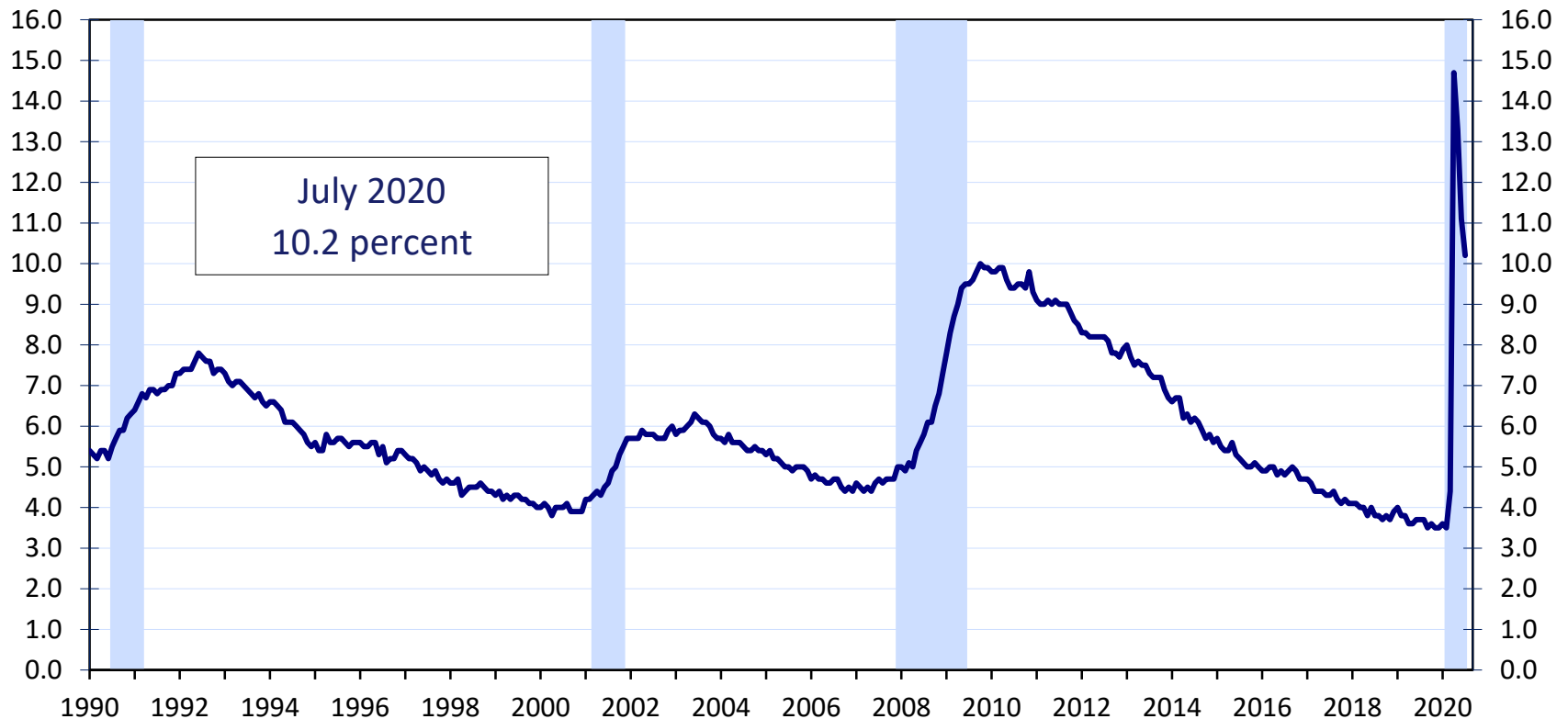

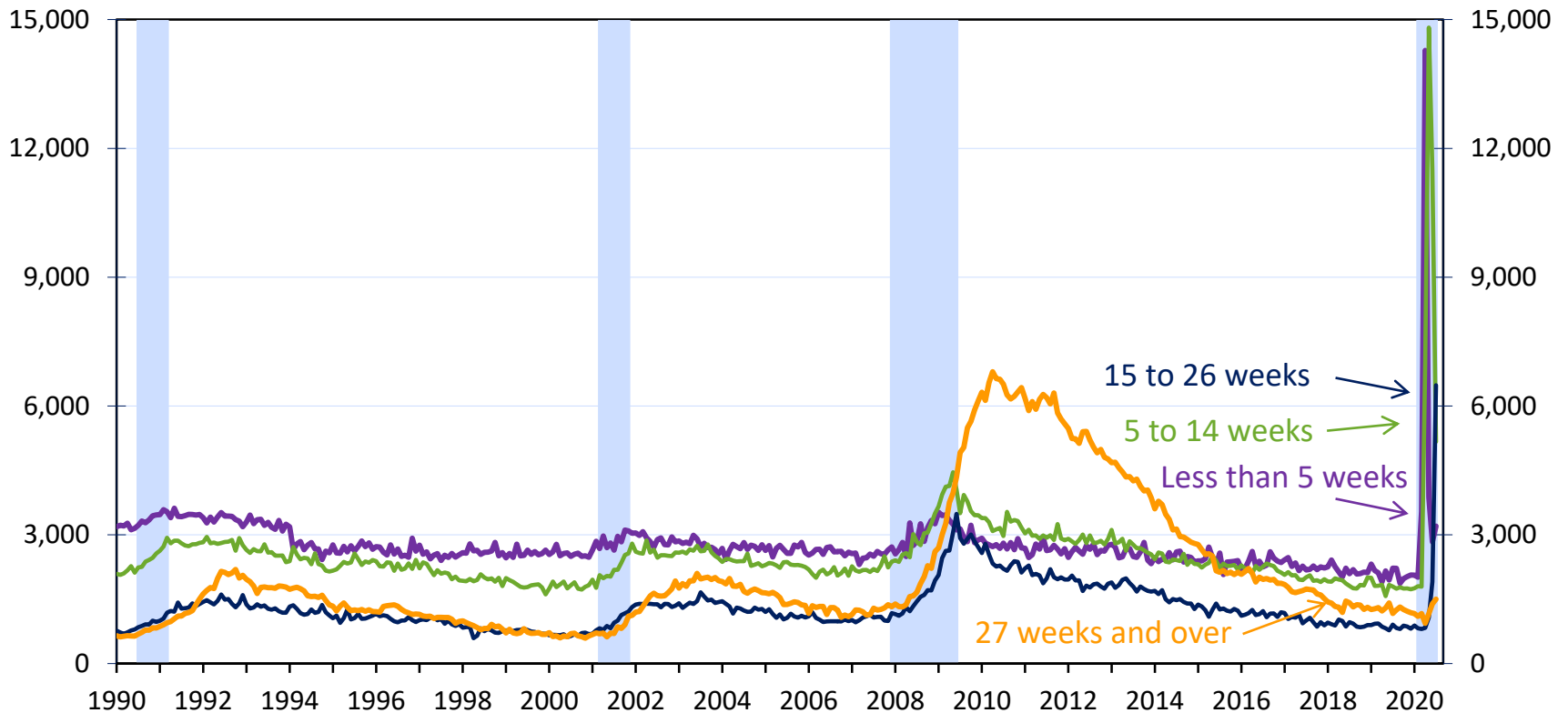

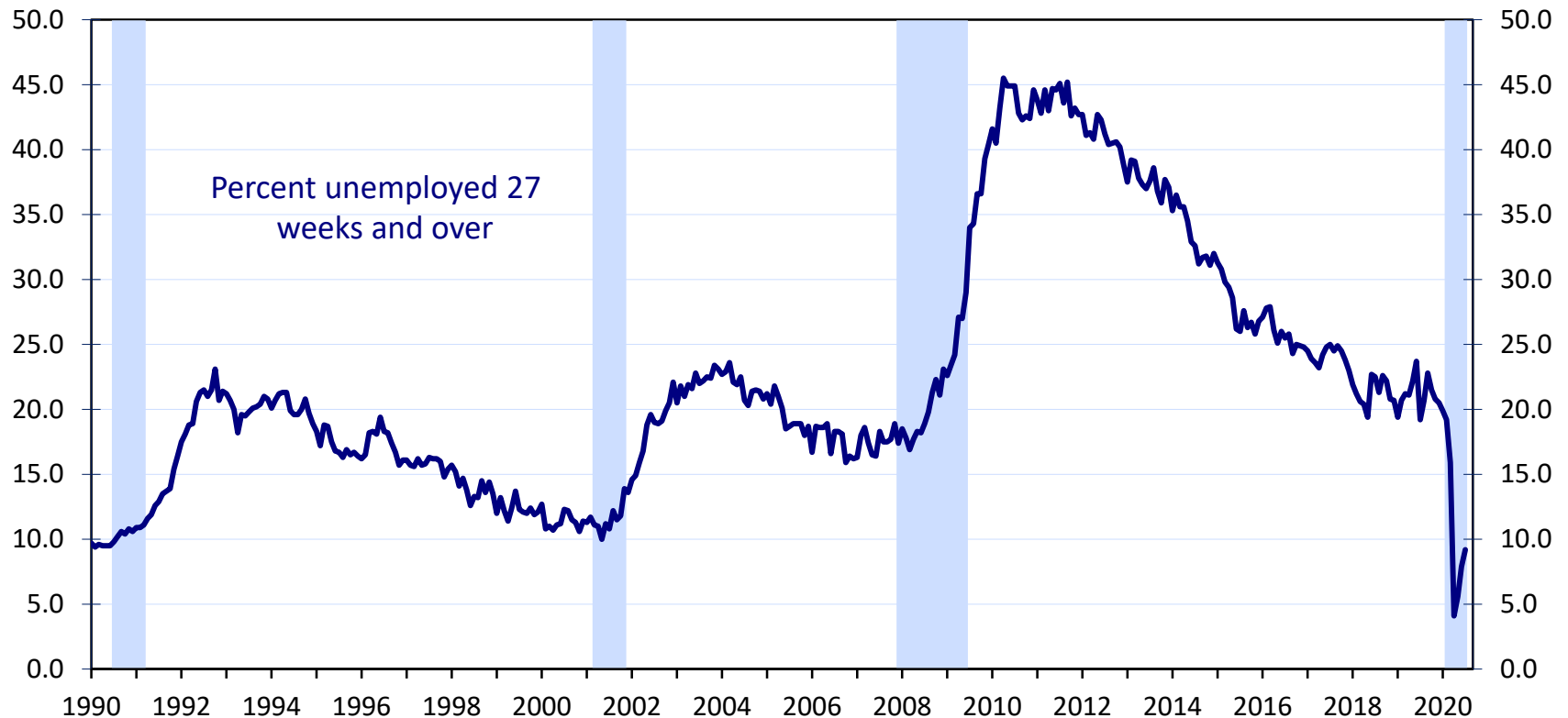

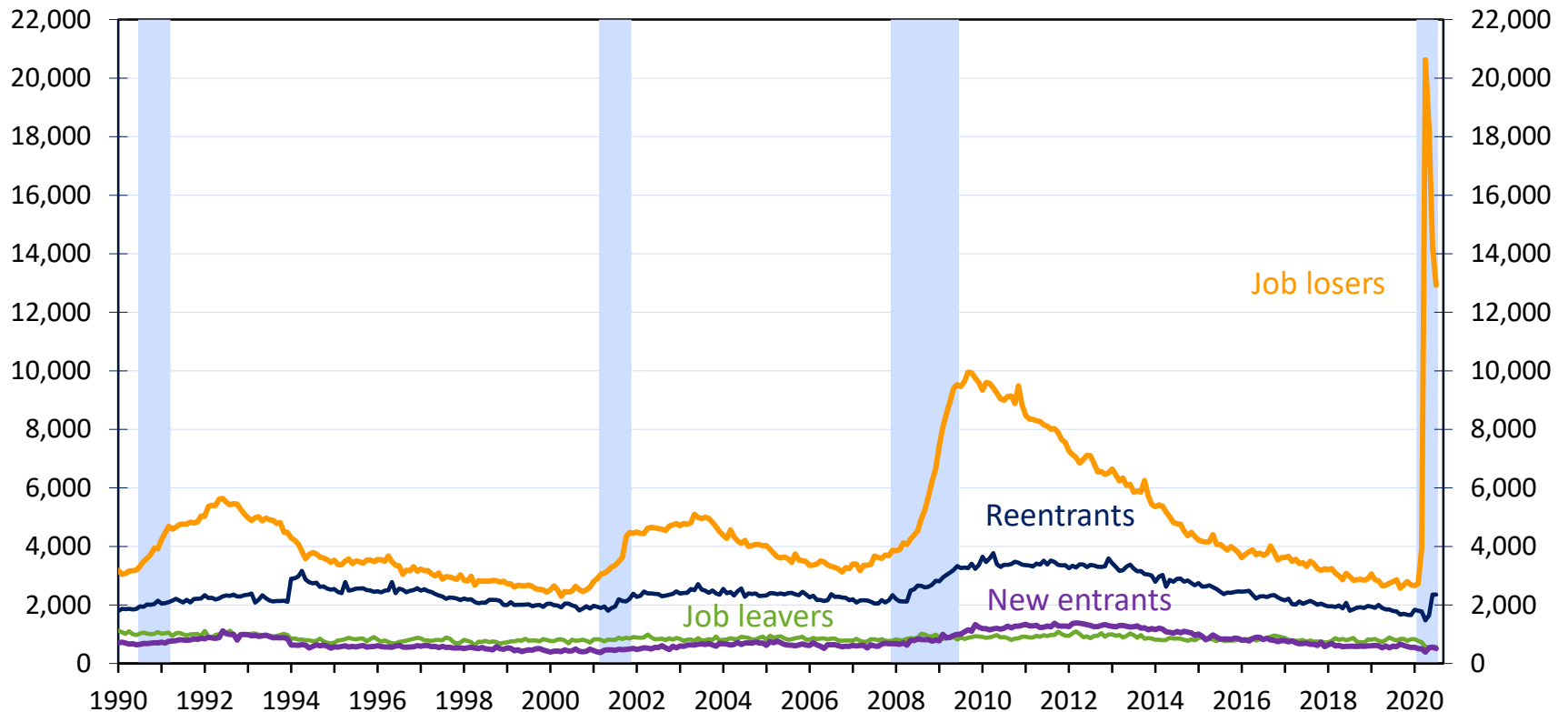

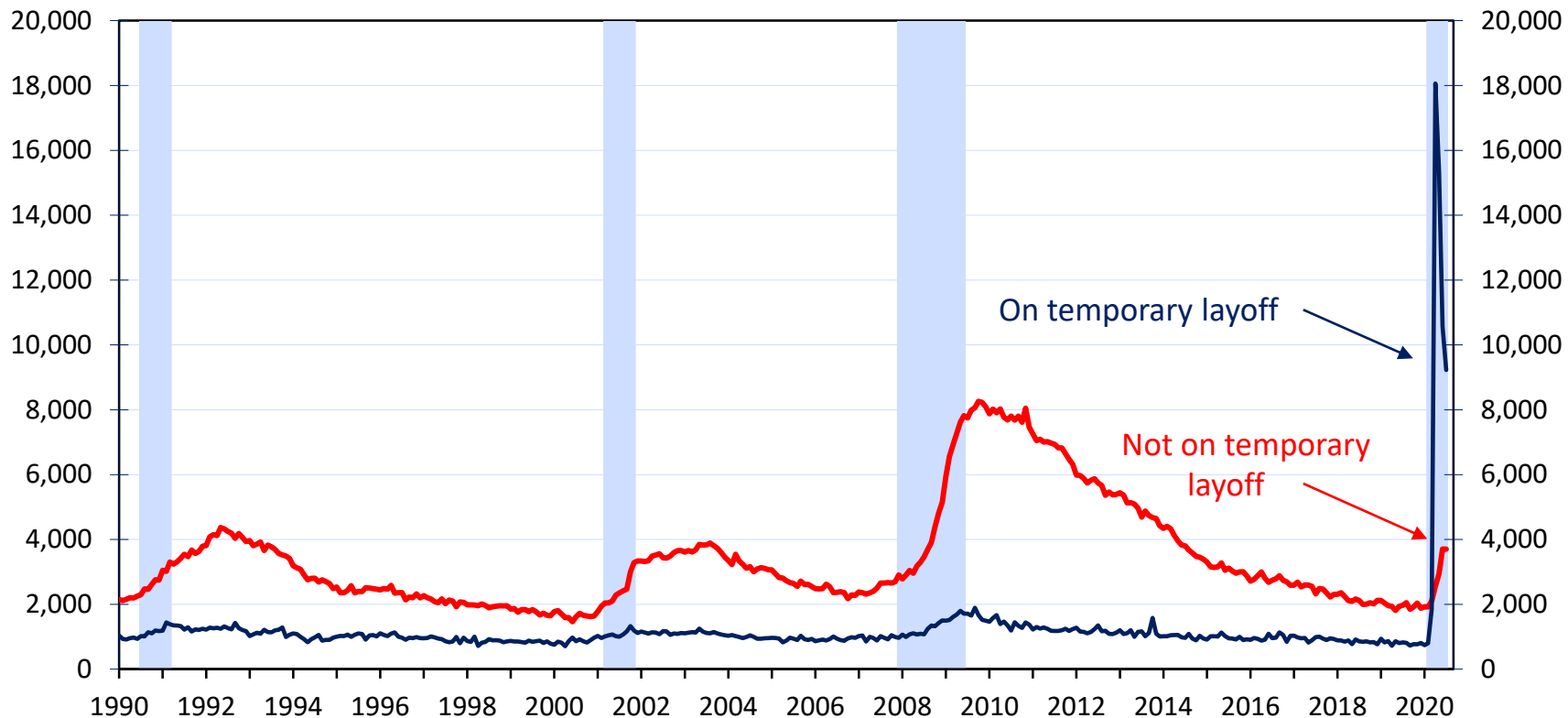




# Chart 14. Job losers by layoff status

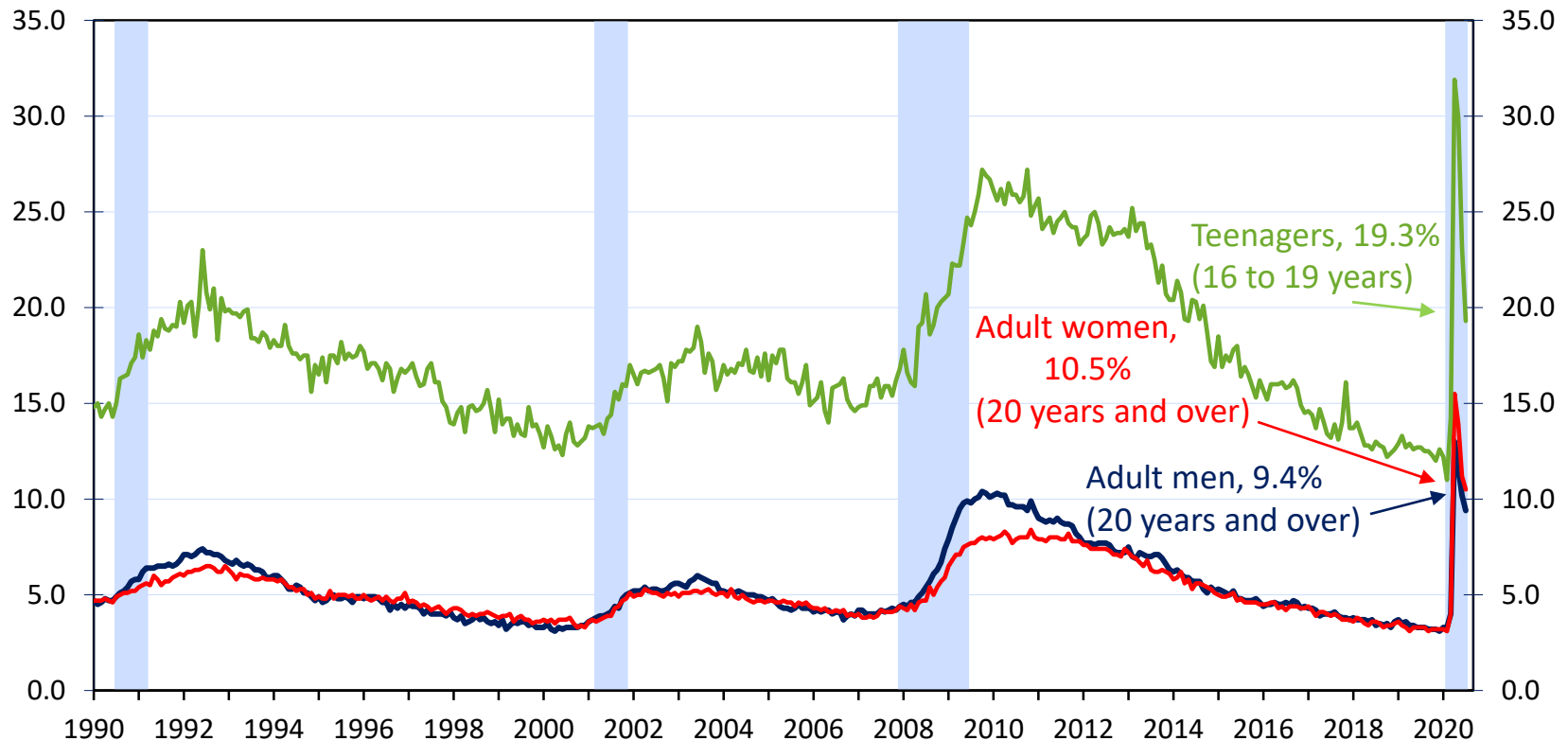

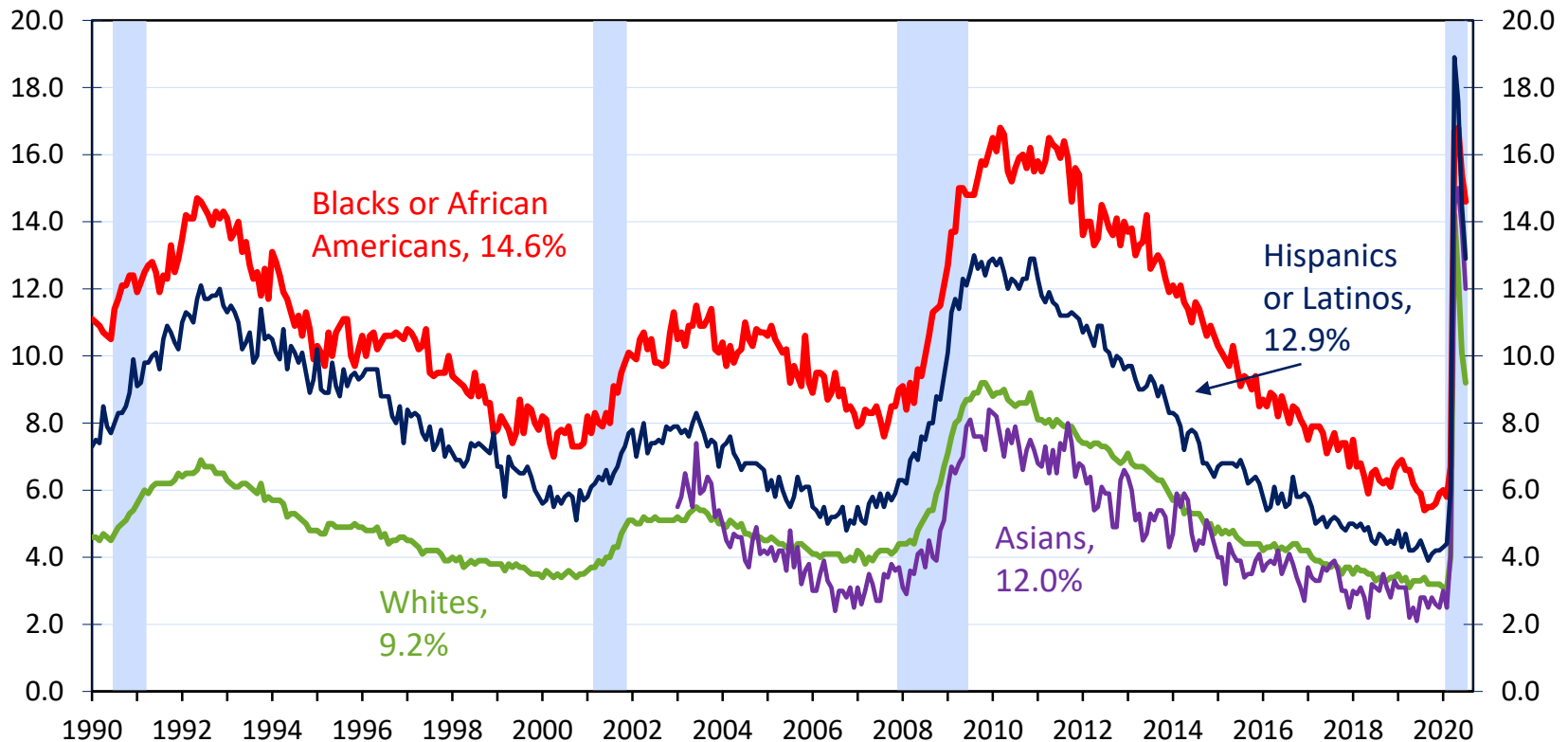

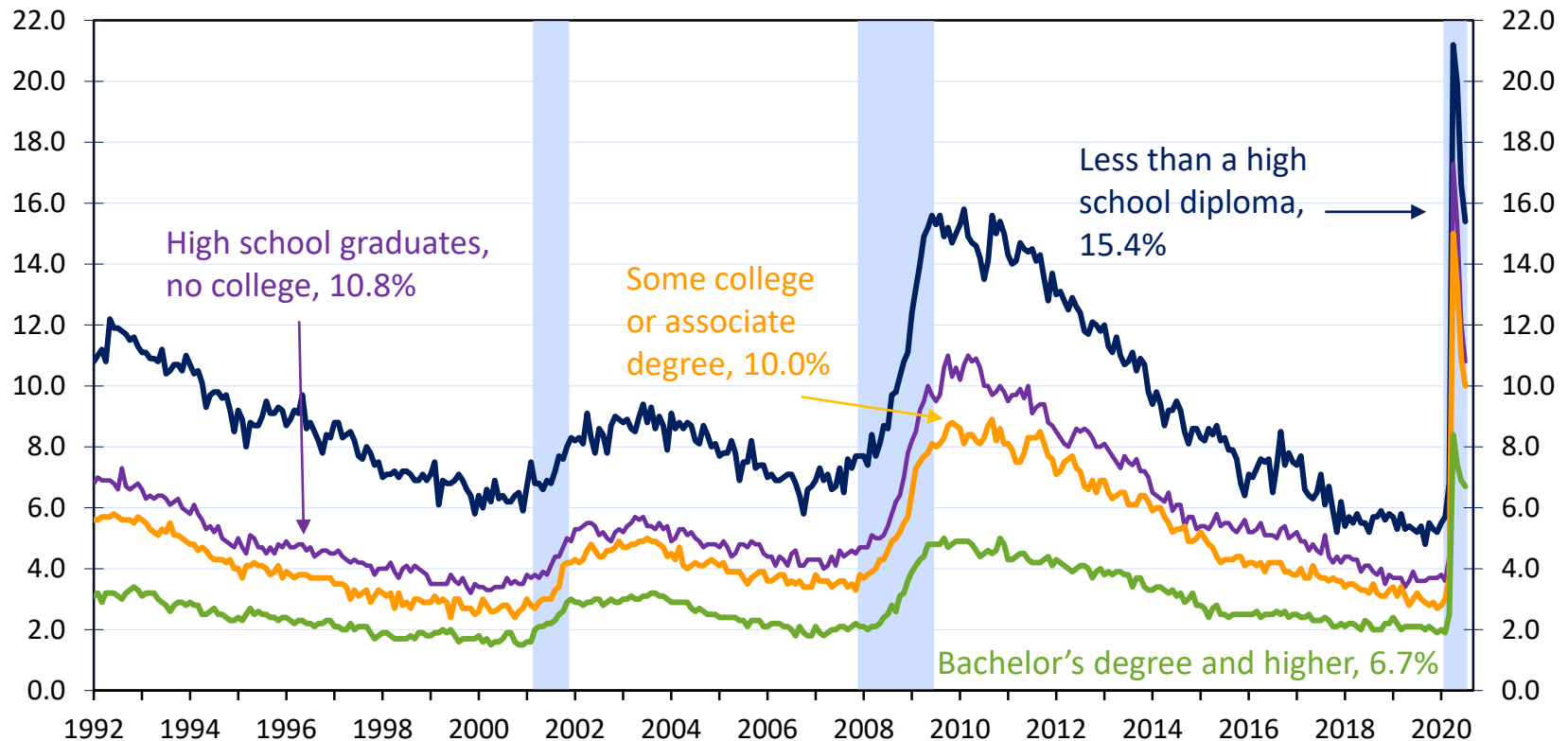

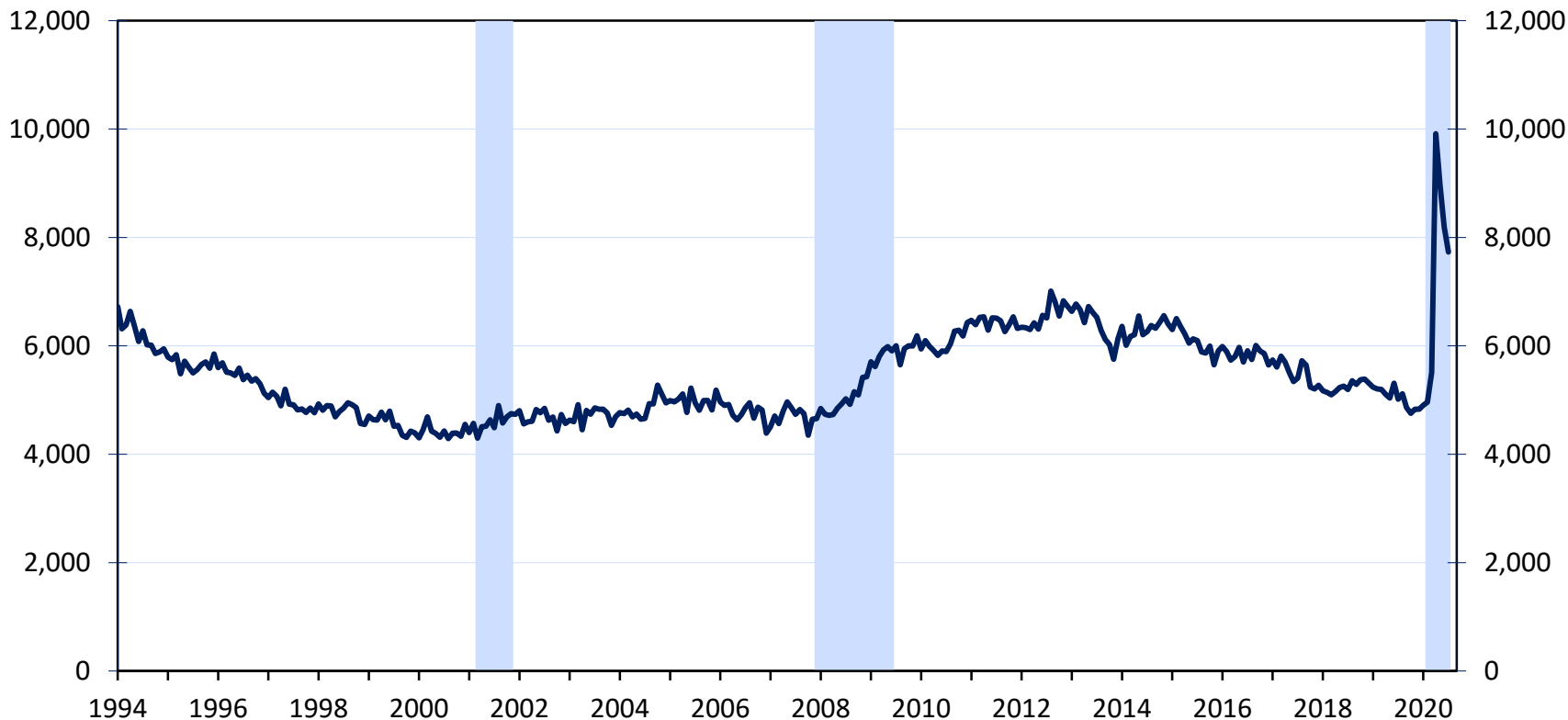

Numbers in thousands



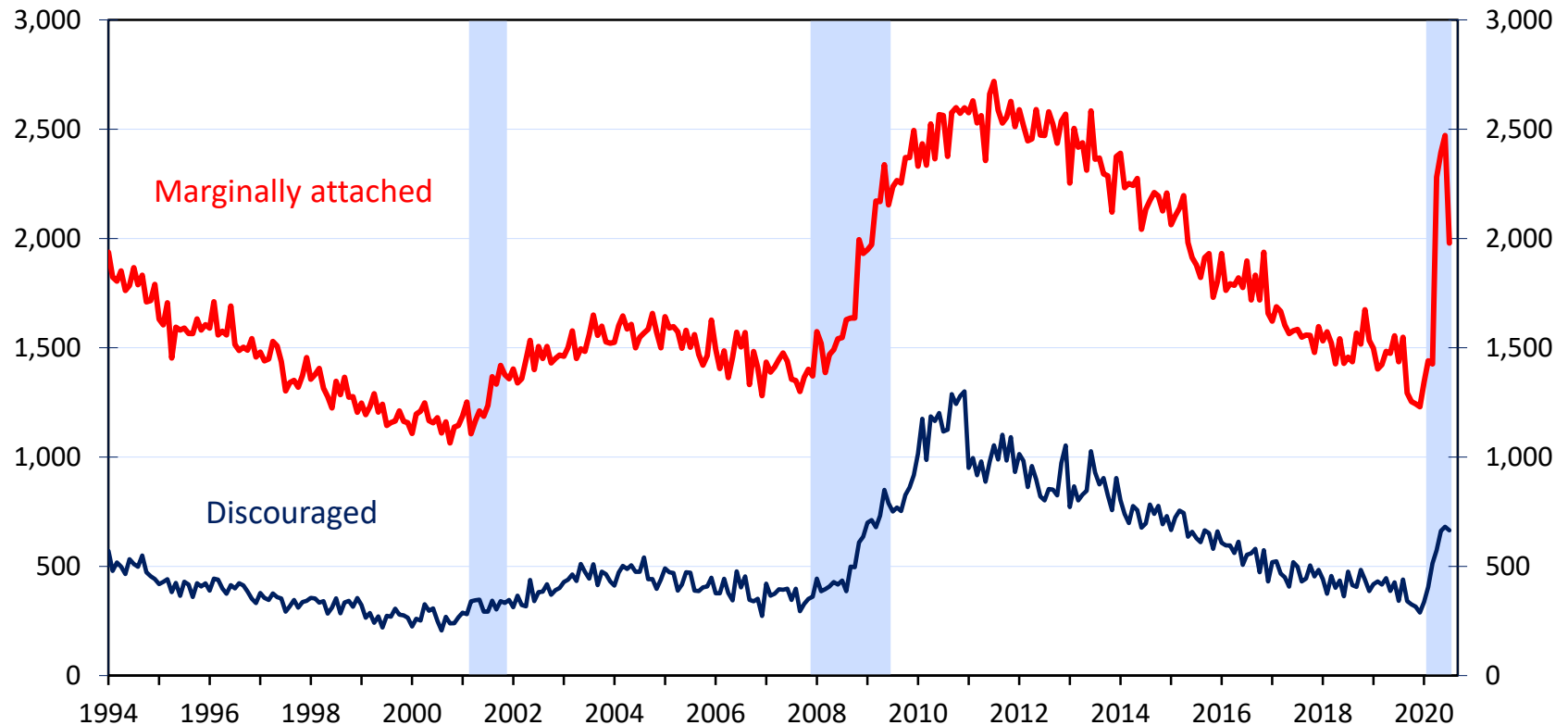

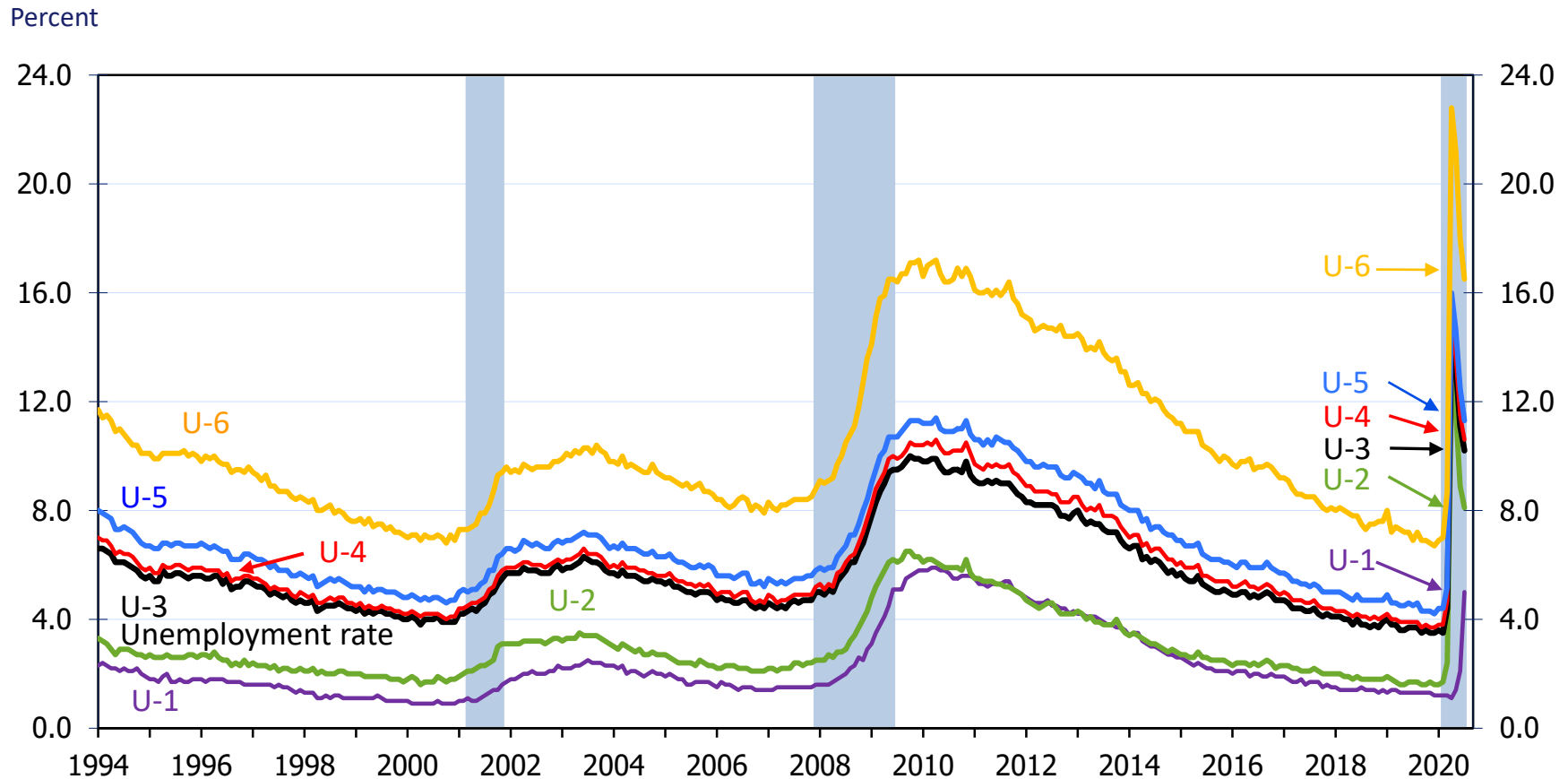
