

# BASEBALL PLAYERS ENJOINED.

## Rogers of National League Club Gets Injunction Against Lajoie—Other Clubs Act.

PHILADELPHIA, April 23.—Following up the decision of the Pennsylvania Supreme Court against Napoleon Lajoie of the Philadelphia American League Baseball Club, John I. Rogers of the Philadelphia National League Club to-day secured a temporary injunction restraining the second baseman from playing with any other organization than the Philadelphia National League Club. The injunction, which was granted by Common Pleas Court No. 5, the same tribunal which dismissed the application for an injunction last year, and which was reversed by the Supreme Court on Monday, also restrained the local American League Club from employing Lajoie. On motion of the American League's counsel to dissolve the injunction against Lajoie the case will come up on Monday.

ST. LOUIS, April 23.—Proceedings were brought in the Circuit Court to-day by attorneys representing President Frank De Haas Robison of the St. Louis National League Baseball Club to restrain Harper, Wallace, and Heidrick from playing with the American League St. Louis team.

WASHINGTON, April 23.—The Supreme Court of the District of Columbia to-day issued a restraining order, returnable May 3, against the National League estopping that organization from interfering with four of the players of the Washington Club of the American League. These players are Delehanty, Wolverton, Orth, and Townsend. This action was taken on proceedings instituted by counsel for the Washington American League Club.
