Outline Description	Chapel dedicated to St Nicholas and St Lucy			
Property Description	The chapel was built in 1706, and replaced an earlier chapel, which had in turn replaced two medieval chapels dedicated to Saint Nicholas, and St Lucy respectively. The chapel is reached through a small narrow pathway. The façade is characterised by a rectangular doorway, framed by a masonry moulding and headed by a cornice above which is a round window. The chapel is embellished with a slightly slanting roof, with a small centrally placed cross. At rooftop level, on the left side is a small belfry.
