

PL243 and PL244

BassGas Raw Gas and Sales Gas Pipelines



Asset description

Beach Energy owns and operates a buried high-pressure natural gas pipeline which is located within an easement on your property. This pipeline plays a vital role in helping to supply gas to Victorian households and businesses.

The BassGas Raw Gas Pipeline (PL243) carries raw gas and condensate from the offshore Yolla-A Platform in Bass Strait to the Lang Lang Gas Plant, located south-east of Lang Lang. The onshore section of the PL243 pipeline is a 350 mm diameter, welded-steel pipe which commences north of the Bass Highway, south-east of Kilcunda, and runs 32.4 km underground from the shore crossing to the Lang Lang Gas Plant.

The BassGas Sales Pipeline (PL244) is a 35.1 km long, 250 mm diameter welded-steel wall pipeline. The PL244 pipeline is buried at a minimum depth of 900 mm. The majority of the pipeline route passes through cleared farmland and only emerges above ground at its delivery point near the plant.

Surveillance and Maintenance Activities

Use of DBYD on-call system

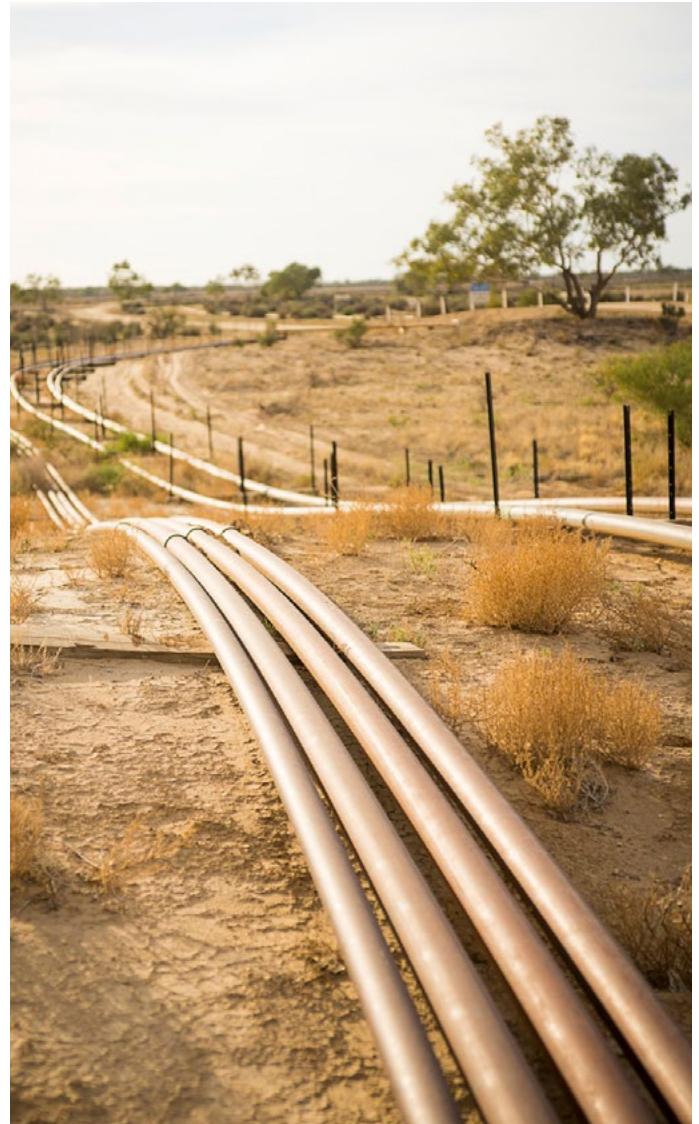
Beach Energy has registered and maintains the information about the pipeline assets with 'Dial Before You Dig' or 'One Call' services. These services provide information to third parties who are intending to work near the pipeline prior to the work activity.

NOTE: Third parties excavating in areas for which 'Dial Before You Dig' or 'One Call' services are available are encouraged to seek advice from that service at least five business days prior to excavating.

Placement of material on or near the pipeline

The greatest risk to a buried pipeline is damage by people who undertake unsupervised or unauthorised works on or near the pipeline. Severe statutory penalties can be imposed upon persons who endanger the safe operation of the pipeline and the lives of themselves and others, by interfering with or damaging the pipeline or facilities. Landholders will also have obligations under the terms of their respective easements that must be complied with.
