THIS IS THE WCHA

MARKING ITS 22ND SEASON COMPETITION IN 2020-21, THE WESTERN COLLEGIATE HOCKEY ASSOCIATION IS HOME TO A RECORD 17 WOMEN'S NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP TEAMS SINCE 1999. IT HAS ALSO PRODUCED SEVEN PATTY KAZMAIER MEMORIAL AWARD WINNERS, 105 ALL-AMERICANS AND 174 OLYMPIANS. WOMEN'S COLLEGIATE HOCKEY'S MOST SUCCESSFUL CONFERENCE, THE WCHA BOASTS SEVEN OF THE TOP PROGRAMS IN THE SPORT.

The Women's League of the Western Collegiate Hockey Association, the top league in all of women's collegiate hockey, proudly celebrates its 22nd season of competition in 20-21, its second under the leadership of Commissioner Jennifer Flowers.

Founded in 1999, the WCHA has been at the forefront of growing and raising the profile of women's hockey nationwide as the league continues to churn out national champions, Patty Kazmaier winners, Olympians and professional players. The league consists of seven premier institutions that offer the best in both educational and athletic environments.

The seven current member of the WCHA are Bemidji State University (Beavers), University of Minnesota (Gophers), University of Minnesota Duluth (Bulldogs), Minnesota State University (Mavericks), The Ohio State University (Buckeyes), St. Cloud State University (Huskies) and University of Wisconsin (Badgers).

That number will grow by one in 2021-22 as the WCHA will welcome its sixth Minnesota-based member when the University of St. Thomas (Tommies) joins the league.

No women's hockey conference can top the impressive list of national accomplishments of the WCHA. Since 1998, member teams have earned a record 17 NCAA and AWCHA national championships while finishing as the national runner-up seven times. Since the inception of the NCAA women's ice hockey championship in 2001, the WCHA has won 16 titles, landed at least one team in every Frozen Four and iced two or more teams in 14 Frozen Fours.

The league has also produced seven Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award winners as well as an additional 19 student-athletes who were among the Top-3 finalists for the award.

Eighty-three WCHA student-athletes have made 174 appearances in the Olympic Games, with 27 earning Gold medals, since women's ice hockey made its first appearance in the Games in 2002 in Salt Lake City.

Since 2002, every team to medal at the Olympics has had at least one player with WCHA ties on its roster.

At the 2018 Winter Olympics in Pyeongchang South Korea, 37 current or former WCHA players competed. The group included Gold medal winners Hannah Brandt, Dani Cameranesi, Brianna Decker, Megan Duggan, Amanda Kessel, Hilary Knight, Jocelyne Lamoureux-Davidson, Monique Lamoureux-Morando, Gigi Marvin, Sidney Morin, Kelly Pannek, Alex Rigby, Maddie Rooney and Lee Stecklein of the United States.

The Silver medal-winning Canadian team featured WCHA stars Emily Clark, Ann-Renee Desbiens, Haley Irwin, Brigette Lacquette, Jocelyne Larocque, Meaghan Mikkelson, Sara Nurse, Natalie Spooner and Blayne Turnbull. Bronze medalist Finland boasted a roster that included WCHA players Mira Jalosuo, Michelle Karvinen, Emma Nuutinen, Noora Rätty and Eveliina Suonpaa.

WCHA players have been recognized as All-Americans 105 times in league history, including three-time selections Hannah Brandt, Natalie Darwitz, Brianna Decker, Jincy Dunne, Hilary Knight, Monique Lamoureux, Annie Pankowski, Noora Rätty, Maria Rooth, Lee Stecklein and Krissy Wendell.

THIS IS THE WCHA

When it comes to coaching, WCHA teams and players have benefited from the expertise of some of the best minds in the game. Current bench bosses Mark Johnson (Wisconsin) and Brad Frost (Minnesota) are the nation's winningest active coaches and their respective career winning percentages rank among the top five in NCAA history. Johnson became the first coach in NCAA women's hockey to reach the 500-win plateau a season ago.

WCHA coaches have won 11 of the 23 AHCA Women's Division I National Coach of the Year awards presented since the honor's inception in 1998.

Crowds at WCHA games are always among the most enthusiastic in all of hockey. The Top-10 most-attended women's ice hockey games in NCAA history, including a record 15,359 fans who turned out for the Wisconsin-St. Cloud State game on Jan. 14, 2017 at the Kohl Center in Madison, Wis., featured WCHA teams.

In January 2020, a pair of WCHA schools - Ohio State and Minnesota State - met outdoors at Parade Stadium in Minneapolis as part of the annual Hockey Day Minnesota festivities in the Land of 10,000 Lakes.

The WCHA provides fans the opportunity to watch league action throughout the season. Every game hosted by WCHA member institutions, along with the WCHA Final Faceoff, will be streamed live and on demand exclusively on FloHockey.tv.

With seven high-quality institutions producing leaders and champions on and off the ice, and playing in front of the sport's best fans, this much is certain: The WCHA - like it has for two decades - will remain elite on the ice, while growing the game by providing an exemplary student-athlete and fan experience.

COMMISSIONER JENNIFER FLOWERS

Jennifer Flowers returns for her second season as the Western Collegiate Hockey Association's Vice President and Women's League Commissioner in 2020-21.

Her first season with the league saw another successful WCHA Final Faceoff that culminated with a thrilling overtime win by Ohio State in the championship game. The tournament received rave reviews for the increased branding presence of the league throughout the venue as well as the increased engagement of youth hockey players, implementation of a more robust in-arena game presentation and the addition of in-game host on the WCHA's social media platforms.

The season also saw 12 WCHA games appear on television through agreements with Fox Sports North and Fox Sports Wisconsin, including a Hockey Day Minnesota appearance for Minnesota and Ohio State as the two teams met on the outdoor ice at Parade Stadium in Minneapolis in January and the WCHA Final Faceoff Championship Game between the Buckeyes and Wisconsin in March. The postseason saw four players earn CCM/AHCA All-America honors and Wisconsin senior Abby Roque pickup USCHO and USA Hockey Player of the Year honors. Five WCHA alumni were also selected in the NWHL draft in April.

Flowers' first year was capped off with the announcement that the University of St. Thomas will join the WCHA 2021. The move will return the WCHA to eight member institutions in 2021-22. The league was an eight-team circuit from 2004-05 through 2016-17. Flowers hit the ground running during the run-up to the 2019-20 season, visiting all seven WCHA campuses prior to the start of the

campaign to introduce herself to coaches, student-athletes and staff at each institution.

She has continued to engage with the league's many stakeholders throughout her first season, with a special focus on WCHA student-athletes. That engagement has given league players a stronger voice in on- and off-ice issues.

Flowers, who was introduced as the WCHA's fourth Women's

League Commissioner on June 3, 2019, joined the WCHA from the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference, where she served as that league's Assistant Commissioner for Membership Services from 2016-19.

At the NSIC, Flowers focused on the internal service of the membership and league stakeholders. She served as the office liaison in support of the NSIC senior women's administrators, faculty athletic representatives, Student-Athlete Advisory Committees and officials coordinators. Flowers was responsible for assisting with strategic plan implementation with a commitment to academics and life skills, athletics operations and compliance, diversity and inclusion, game day, championships, membership and positioning. She had championship oversight of volleyball, swimming & diving, basketball and softball. The Manson, Iowa, native was also closely involved in sponsorship and corporate partner initiatives during her time with the NSIC.

Flowers served on the NCAA Women's Volleyball Rules Committee, is the Co-Chair of the Minnesota Coalition for Women in Athletic Leadership and continues to serve as a mentor in the Women Leaders in College Sports mentoring program.

Flowers led an NSIC committee that created the league's first transgender student-athlete participation guidelines and coordinated the launch of the league's SAAC Cup, which was designed to encourage engagement of campus Student-Athlete Advisory Councils. She developed and implemented the NSIC Women's Coaches Symposium in 2017, which has since been rebranded the NSIC Women's Leadership Symposium. Flowers also oversaw the creation of the NSIC Elite 18 Award, which recognizes the student-

athlete with the top GPA in each of the league's sponsored sports.

Prior to her time at the NSIC, Flowers worked at Winona State University as the associate athletic director and senior woman administrator from 2012 to December of 2015. She also had a stint at WSU from 2006-09. Flowers oversaw internal aspects of the department, including compliance and budget coordination along with athletic department scheduling. She was the department's liaison to the Winona State Student-Athlete Advisory Committee as well.

Flowers was an assistant women's basketball and volleyball coach at Simpson College during the 2005-06 season. She helped guide Simpson's women's basketball team to the Iowa Conference regular season and tournament championships while equaling the program's record for wins in a season. Flowers helped coach three players to all-conference honors. She also helped guide the volleyball program to a 21-14 record and a second-place finish at the conference tournament.

She spent the 2004-05 academic year at the University of Minnesota where she was the assistant to the associate athletic director. At Minnesota she was the assistant championship manager for four NCAA Championships and one WCHA Championship. She also was the assistant game director for Minnesota's Music City Bowl appearance in 2004.

Flowers and her husband, Jonte, reside in Burnsville with their two children – Ayanna and Kellen.

Flowers is the fourth commissioner in the 20-year history of the WCHA Women's League, following Sara Martin (1999-2014), Aaron Kemp (2014-16) and Katie Million (2016-19).



THE WCHA REGULAR SEASON CHAMPIONSHIP

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association women's regular season championship, as has proven time and time again over the past two decades, has traditionally been one of the toughest titles to win in collegiate sports.

Minnesota leads all WCHA programs with 10 regular season outright or shared (*) titles (2001, 2002, 2004, 2005, 2009, 2010*, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2018) since the league's founding in 1999, while Wisconsin has captured eight league crowns (2006, 2007, 2011, 2012, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2020) and Minnesota Duluth claims four championships (2000, 2003, 2006, 2010*).

Wisconsin captured the most-recent WCHA regular season championship in 2019-20, finishing league play with a 17-4-3-2 (.771) record. Minnesota was a close second at 17-5-2-1 (.750).

The conference regular season title includes the awarding of the Julianne Bye Cup to the team champion.

THE JULIANNE BYE CUP

The home of a record 17 national championships, the Women's League of the Western Collegiate Hockey Association presented a new regular season championship trophy named in honor of longtime women's hockey advocate Julianne Bye for the first time in 2018-19.

"For 20 years I have watched the highly skilled and competitive teams of the WCHA Women's Hockey League," Bye said at the time of the trophy's announcement. "In my opinion, the WCHA is the premier women's college hockey league. Winning the regular season championship should be celebrated with joy and pride. The perpetual trophy recognizes this amazing accomplishment."

Julianne Bye's love for the game of hockey began as a child watching the 1960 Winter Olympics and she has been a

strong advocate for the women's game ever since.

She was instrumental in the launch of the women's hockey program at the University of Minnesota and has been one of the WCHA's biggest boosters since the Women's League was founded in 1999.

The Julianne Bye Cup is a custom-made perpetual traveling trophy that will be presented to the winner of the WCHA regular season championship each year. The trophy travels from champion to champion at the conclusion of each regular season.

The Cup rests on a three-tier base that includes the trophy name and the Julianne Bye story on the first tier and engraved plates with each championship school's name.

In addition to featuring the names of every team to win the WCHA regular season title, the Julianne Bye Cup contains the following inscription on its base:

The Julianne Bye Cup

WCHA FINAL FACEOFF

Annually pitting the nation's top programs and players, the WCHA Postseason Tournament – capped by the four-team, two-day WCHA Final Faceoff – is the premier conference tournament in women's collegiate ice hockey.

This year, the top four teams in the final regular season standings will qualify directly to the Final Faceoff, March 5-6 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis.

The winner of the 2021 WCHA Final Faceoff will receive an automatic bid to the NCAA Women's Ice Hockey Championship.

History

The first WCHA Playoff Championship was held March 2-4, 2000 at the Bloomington (Minn.) Ice Gardens and culminated with Minnesota Duluth taking the tournament title with a 2-0 win over Minnesota.

Since that inaugural event, the tournament has been held in Rochester, Minn. (2001), Blaine, Minn. (2002), Grand Forks, N.D. (2003, 2015), Minneapolis, Minn. (2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2013, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020), Duluth, Minn. (2008, 2012) and Bemidji, Minn. (2014).

Wisconsin leads all WCHA teams with eight postseason titles (2006, 2007, 2009, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2019), followed by Minnesota with seven (2002, 2004, 2005, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2018), Minnesota Duluth with five (2000, 2001, 2003, 2008, 2010) and Ohio State with one (2020).

The Trophy

The home of a record 17 national championships, the WCHA now has the league postseason hardware to match its standing as the country's premier women's college hockey conference, thanks to the generosity and support of John Buccigross, the longtime ESPN anchor and renowned benefactor of hockey at all levels.

Through his #bucciovertimechallenge and #cawledgehawkey initiative, Buccigross provided the funds for a custom-designed, perpetual WCHA Final Faceoff Championship Trophy, which debuted in 2018 and is awarded annually to the winner of the League's postseason tournament.

WCHA PLAYER OF THE YEAR

ABBY ROQUE, SR., WISCONSIN (SAULT STE. MARIE, MICH.)



The Women's League of the Western Collegiate Hockey Association recognized Wisconsin senior forward **Abby Roque** as its 2019-20 WCHA Player of the Year, presented by Sterling Trophy.

Roque, who was also named the WCHA Offensive Player of the Year this season, was chosen for the top overall honor by league head coaches and assistant coaches from among a group of candidates that included WCHA Defensive Player of the Year **Jincy Dunne** of Ohio State, WCHA Goaltender of the Year **Sydney Scobee**

of Minnesota and WCHA Rookie of the Year **Madeline Wethington** of Minnesota.

Roque is the seventh Badger to earn the honor, joining **Sara Bauer** (2005-06, 2006-07), **Hilary Knight** (2008-09), **Meghan Duggan** (2010-11), **Brianna Decker** (2011-12), **Ann-Renée Desbiens** (2015-16) and **Annie Pankowski** (2018-19).

A top-three finalist for the Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award, Roque registered 58 points on 26 goals and 32 assists for the Badgers this season. Her totals were good for seventh nationally in scoring and fourth in the WCHA. The Sault Ste. Marie, Mich., native led the NCAA in faceoff wins with 523 and finished second in faceoff win percentage at .656 (523-of-797).

She headlined a Badgers offense that led the country in goals (160), assists (264), points (424), goals per game (4.57) and power-play percentage (.359). Roque led the WCHA in power play goals with nine and tallied five game-winning goals for the Badgers.

Roque was named the WCHA Forward of the Week twice this season as well as the WCHA Forward of the Month in December. Roque's national honors this season included two NCAA Star of the Week nods (First Star- Nov. 19; Third Star- Dec. 10), CCM/AHCA First Team All-America honors and USCHO Player of the Year.

An accomplished athlete who helped lead the Tigers to the Ivy League Championship in three consecutive seasons (1981-84).

Patty Kazmaier-Sandt died on Feb. 15, 1990, at the age of 28 following a long struggle with a rare blood disease.
