

## **Stump Removal Guidelines/Process**

For

Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority (GBRA) Hydroelectric Lake Dunlap, located in Comal and Guadalupe Counties, Lakes McQueeney, Placid, Nolte located in Guadalupe County, and Lake Gonzales (H-4) and Lake Wood (H-5) located in Gonzales County, Texas.

- 1. Coordinate with the GBRA at offices located at 933 E. Court St., Seguin, Texas.
- 2. Complete a construction application detailing the scope of the project, method of removal, method of disposal, mitigation measures to ensure no adverse impacts to water quality/aquatic species. Fee structure under assessment. An interim fee is set at \$50 and the inspection must be scheduled a minimum of forty-eight (48) hours in advance.
- 3. Additional approvals may be required from the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, or the Texas Parks and Wildlife. Issuance/approval of a GBRA construction application to remove stumps/trees does not relieve the requestor from any liabilities or permit requirements from other state or federal agencies.

## 4. General Guidance:

- a. Removal is generally limited to areas immediately in the vicinity of the requestors onwater facility (i.e. dock). GBRA may allow consideration for removal of certain stumps at the request of a lake-wide or homeowners association on the respective lake and in good standing.
- b. Request for stump/tree removal will be considered on a case-by-case basis considering potential impacts to water quality, aquatic species, and best management practices.
- c. Removal is generally limited to individual stumps/trees that are considered a navigational hazard or obstruction or those that pose an imminent danger to health, safety, and welfare.
- d. Trigger for a U.S. Army Corp of Engineer Section 404 permit is the discharge of dredged or fill material into a waters of the United States. Contact GBRA for guidance documents.

- e. Habitat restoration/mitigation measures to be considered include:
  - i. February 1 through May 31 (fish spawning) no dredging; no removal of substrate.

- ii. Consider fish habitat replacement/restoration; positioning brush or rip/rap to promote improved habitat for fishing.
- 5. Violations of these regulations is a Class C Misdemeanor and is punishable by a fine of \$25 to \$500.
