Daytona Sandown Park - Alternate Circuit - Heats

The final round of the 2013 Championships took place at Daytona Sandown Park on Sunday 17th November. Cloudy, cold but dry conditions greeted the drivers as they arrived to settle the Champs standings for the year.

Heats

Heavy Heat 1

Michael McKeegan led the field through the opening corners and was followed by Rob Bennett, Iain McMillan and Charles Graham. Bennett took over at the front, passing McKeegan at the end of the main straight with the lead trio of Bennett, McKeegan and McMillan pulling away from the battle behind which was now headed by Jack Dutfield with Graham and Stuart Foster close behind. Bennett and McKeegan began to gradually edge away from McMillan but as Bennett began to defend, the gap closed back up. Dutfield had managed to escape the battle for 5th which was still headed by Graham as Foster climbed all over his rear bumper in search of a gap. Bennett started the final lap with McKeegan just 0.322 seconds behind him. Bennett held on to take the win from McKeegan, McMillan, Foster and Dutfield.

Light Heat 1

Ben Leslie and Jonny Spencer headed into turn 1 side-by-side with Spencer having to settle for 2nd. Dominic Tucker was into 3rd by the end of lap 1 and was being hounded by James Baldwin. Baldwin took 3rd at the final corner on lap 2 and set after Spencer who was beginning to fall back from Leslie. Kamran Moussa-Zadeh was into 4th with Phillip Williams and Tucker behind him. Baldwin passed Spencer for 2nd and was closing in on Leslie and right behind him at the end of lap 5, attempting a pass at the end of the main straight. The move didn't stick however, but a lap later at the final corner, Baldwin slipped past to take the lead with a lap to go. Baldwin took the win by 0.702 seconds from Leslie with Spencer taking 3rd. Moussa-Zadeh took 4th with Williams taking 5th.

Jonathan Bowers was hassling Anthony Ford for 3rd as McKeegan began to disappear up the road, leaving Patrick, Anthony and Bowers to fight over 2nd. McKeegan took the win from Patrick Ford, Neven Kirkpatrick, Bowers and Alec Tucker after Bowers and Anthony Ford came together at the end of the straight on the final lap which was deemed to be a racing incident.

David Vincent took the lead at the start and was followed by Peter Gillett and Jack Dutfield at the end of lap 1. Vincent opened up a lead of 3.3 seconds after lap 2 as Dutfield, Gary Patterson and Gillett fought over 2nd. Gary Patterson took 2nd from Dutfield at turn 2 as lan Dutfield and Stuart Foster were running in 4th and 5th respectively, with Foster getting the better of Dutfield on the final lap. Vincent took a very convincing win from Patterson by 4.010 seconds with Jack Dutfield taking 3rd ahead of Foster and Ian Dutfield.

Light Heat 2

Ben Stephenson got a good start to take the lead and was soon joined by James Baldwin. Rick Parfitt was into 3rd by lap 2 but the leading duo of Stephenson and Baldwin had begun to get away, opening a gap of 2 seconds. Stephenson was being forced to defend by Baldwin, but Baldwin went for a brave move around the outside of turn 1 on lap 3 to set himself up for turn 2, giving him the lead. This fighting allowed Miguel Faisca, Parfitt and Ben Leslie to take some time out of their lead. Faisca worked his way past Parfitt with Leslie passing the pair of them to take 3rd and chase down Stephenson. Baldwin was getting away at the head of the field and took the win by 3.594 seconds from Leslie, Stephenson, Faisca and Parfitt.

Stuart McKay led from pole as the race got underway, with the full course yellow being shown after the drivers left turn 2 to recover some karts that got caught up in an incident at turn 2. McKay had a healthy lead over Patrick Ford and Filip Igov when the green flags were waved. Ford was getting away from the battle for 3rd which was now headed by Johnathan Bowers with Igov and Neven Kirkpatrick close behind. Ford was catching McKay but with a lead of 2.272 seconds and just 2 laps remaining, it was going to be a tough ask for Ford. McKay took the win from Ford with Bowers taking 3rd. Kirkpatrick and James Pratt rounded out the top 5.

Heavy Heat 3

Andrew Jeffers ran wide at turn 1, allowing George Dutfield to grab the lead from 3rd and pull out a lead of 2.370 seconds after lap 1. Malcolm Clark and Ian Brooks were into 2nd and 3rd with Brooks quickly taking over from Clark and leaving him to hold off David Vincent and Gary Patterson. Dutfield was extending his lead over Brooks at the front and Vincent began to reel in Brooks, leaving Patterson to hold off Rob Bennett. With a lap and a half remaining, Vincent was edging ever closer to Brooks and Bennett attempted a pass on Patterson at the end of the straight, but ran wide. Whilst this was going on, Dutfield was getting further and further away, eventually taking a comfortable win from Brooks, Vincent, Bennett and Patterson.

James Baldwin was unchallenged into turn 1, but was closely followed by Chris Hackworth and Richard Lacey. Jonny Spencer was a few kart lengths further back in 4th as Baldwin and Hackworth began to break away from Lacey. Ben Leslie was in 5th, a second behind Spencer and was being caught by Rick Parfitt. Baldwin and Hackworth were separated by 0.7 seconds as they entered the final stages with Baldwin taking the win from Hackworth by 1.078 seconds. Lacey took 3rd with Spencer and Leslie completing the top 5.

Joe Ellis headed the back as the field completed lap 1, followed by James Pratt and Alec Tucker. These three quickly broke away from the rest of the pack which was headed by Allan Curtis and Tim McKeegan. Pratt hit the front on lap 3 as Tucker began to drop back from the leading pair, but as Curtis was holding off McKeegan, 3rd looked secure at the halfway stage. Curtis and McKeegan were joined by Neven Kirkpatrick with 3 laps remaining to make it a three-way scrap for 4th, but out in front, Pratt was getting away, opening up a lead over Ellis in 2nd. Pratt took the win from Ellis, with Tucker taking 3rd, Curtis 4th and Kirkpatrick 5th.

Finals

Heavy

David Vincent led the pack through the first few corners and was joined by Rob Bennett by the time they screamed down the main straight. Then there was a small gap back to George Dutfield, Iain McMillan and Jack Dutfield. Jack got passed McMillan on lap 3 and went for a move on George at the end of the main straight, but misjudged, made slight contact and slowed them both down coming out of the corner. Vincent was getting away at the front leaving Bennett in 'no-mans-land' as he was 3.767 seconds ahead of the battle for third between George and Jack Dutfield and McMillan. These three were then joined by Stuart Foster and Gary Patterson to form a train of 5 karts in the fight for the final step on the podium. Vincent was putting in a series of fastest laps to extend his lead to 5.7 seconds by the time the chequered flag went out. Despite his best efforts, the title still went to Chris Carter who had decided to sit out the final round having accumulated enough points already. Bennett took 2nd from George Dutfield, Jack Dutfield and McMillan.

Light

James Baldwin led from Jonny Spencer and Ben Leslie through the first two corners with the three of them opening up a couple of kart lengths over Chris Hackworth in 4th on the opening lap. Spencer took over at the front before the first lap was completed as Hackworth tagged onto the back of this group to make it a quartet. Richard Lacey was a 1.8 seconds adrift in 5th as Spencer looked to be edging away from pole-sitter Baldwin. Hackworth grabbed 3rd from Leslie on lap 4, out-braking him at the end of the main straight and set after championship rival, Baldwin. Spencer continued to get away at the front, but Baldwin seemed to have just enough in hand to keep Hackworth far enough behind him to hold onto 2nd. Spencer took the win by 1.411 seconds from Baldwin, with Hackworth completing the podium. Leslie took 4th and Lacey took 5th. Baldwin's heat wins and 2nd in the Final was enough to secure the 2013 title from Hackworth.

Patrick Ford led James Pratt into turn 1 with the two enjoying a few kart lengths over the rest of the field by the time the field reached Vale. Neven Kirkpatrick was in 3rd with Tim McKeegan right behind him in 4th and these two closed the gap to the leaders to make it a four way scrap for the lead. Pratt took over from Ford at the front on lap 3, with McKeegan taking Kirkpatrick for 3rd. As the pack approached the end of the main straight, contact occurred between Ford and McKeegan, resulting in Ford spinning and an animated Ford getting out of his kart, leading to a red flag. The race was restarted under full course yellows with the green flag being shown a lap later to get the racing back underway. McKeegan was given a black flag for the contact meaning the order was Pratt, Kirkpatrick, Stuart McKay,







Joe Ellis and Alec Tucker. Pratt escaped the fight behind him leaving the pack behind him which was now headed by McKay, Kirkpatrick and Ellis. Allan Curtis and Tucker were also in this fight in the dying stages, right behind Kirkpatrick but it was Pratt that took the chequered flag. McKay took 2nd from Ellis, Kirkpatrick and Tucker. Despite the win, Joe Holmes did enough before Round 10 to secure the 2013 title.
