THE DOCTOR

This [bronze sculpture](#) by [Dr David Fenwick](#) symbolises the past and future of the AMA.

The first European trained doctor to practice in the colony was probably [John Woodforde](#), surgeon on the [Rapid](#) with Colonel William Light in August 1836. [Dr Edward Wright](#) arrived a month later. The first Colonial Surgeon was [Thomas Young Cotter](#). Many ships' surgeons who visited the colony earlier treated patients but were regarded as transients. These links are taken from the booklet by [Dr J B Cleland](#).

[Indigenous healers](#) have continued to care for their people.

The [First Register of Medical Practitioners](#) appeared in late December 1844. The first woman to graduate, in 1891 was [Laura Hope nee Fowler](#)

The cloak/shawl was usually made from possum skins and [not limited to healers](#). The headband was woven from human hair and [sedge](#) fibre. The woven spiral is a traditional pattern in [Ngarrindjeri weaving](#). The shells show she is of a salt water clan.



Puthari Kornii: 'the man healer'

He is also wearing a traditional cloak, but it is covered by his magnificent beard. The ingredients of the medicines carried by both would be held in woven containers and freshly mixed as required.

RETIREMENT OF SIR CLARENCE RIEGER

The Hamilton Brothers

James Hamilton was one of thirteen children of his father **Rev Robert Hamilton** of County Tyrone, in Northern Ireland - a man who had eight sons and five daughters. Four of the sons graduated in medicine in Dublin, and all four ultimately practised in Adelaide.

The eldest three were specialists - each of whom was on the honorary staff of the Adelaide Hospital, while the youngest, and much younger, brother was a general practitioner (**RH** Reginald Heber aka 'Rusty' (1866-1945). He practised in Unley, and later on North Terrace. But there was another man, with the surname of Hamilton, on the honorary staff of the Adelaide Hospital, as an honorary assistant physician at the same time. To identify these five Hamiltons, each from the others, it was the practice of the day to refer to them by their initials. So **TK** was the Honorary Ophthalmologist, Adelaide Hospital; **JAG** (referred to as Jag) was Honorary Gynaecologist, Adelaide Hospital; **CW** was Honorary Assistant Ophthalmologist, Adelaide Hospital; and **AA** (not related to the three brothers) was Honorary Assistant Physician, Adelaide Hospital. **JAG** Hamilton had gained diplomas in both Dublin and Edinburgh where he concentrated on surgery. He came to South Australia in 1876 and spent fourteen years in country practice before coming to the city. He was a tall man, reportedly of magnificent physique and pleasing, cheerful personality who spoke with a rich Irish brogue. Like his brothers he had a great affection for horses, and regularly entered his animals in the annual shows.

The Symbolism of the Sculpture

The figure is dressed in an academic gown to indicate the qualities of Learning, Teaching and the development of Wisdom upon which the current practice of evidence based medicine is founded.

Surrounding books contain the fundamentals of Knowledge. In his right hand he holds an open volume which shows the AMA [motto](#) (1) and the [Hippocratic dictum](#) (2) In his left he holds a [Pinard](#) (3) stethoscope which stresses the great need for obstetric knowledge in early colonial days and the ready acceptance by the AMA of new ideas, if they are of benefit.

The vertical book (4) has a representation of the AMA logo above a set of scales to indicate the advocacy role of the AMA plays on behalf of its Members and their patients. The figure has his right foot placed on a well worn sea chest (5) to indicate that our early doctors came by sea.

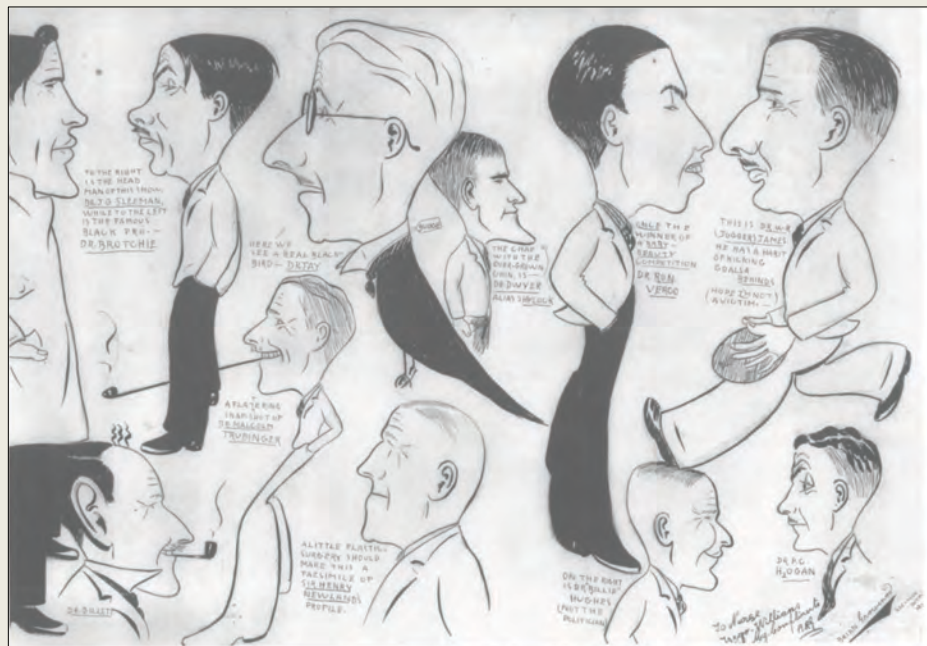

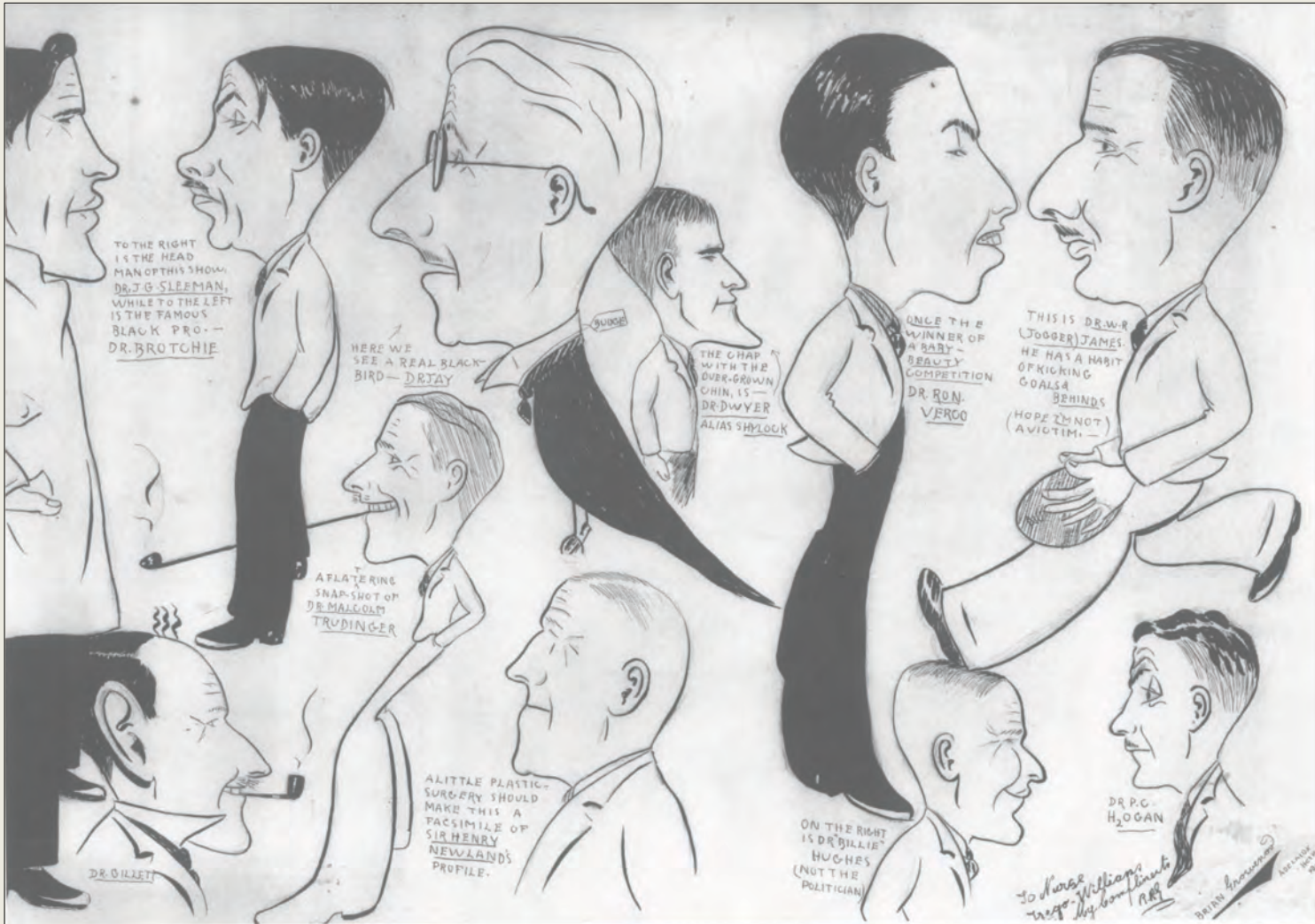
