**Inorganic Collections** will start up again in the New Year near the end of February. The booking tool (open from January 19) can be found at: <a href="https://inorganiccollections.aucklandcouncil.govt.nz/Inorganic">https://inorganiccollections.aucklandcouncil.govt.nz/Inorganic</a>

As usual, there will be leaflets dropped to all properties a couple of weeks before collections take place to prompt households to make a booking. Council encourages households to make their bookings as early as possible so that they don't miss out. In January 2019 Council will also be sending an email prompt to all properties that have previously booked an inorganic collection in 2017 or 2018 to tell them the booking tool is open.

# Celebrating our labour

Labour Day was first celebrated on 28 October 1890. In fact New Zealand was one of the first countries in the world to establish an 8 hour working day – as a result of the action led by carpenter Samuel Parnell in Wellington in 1840.

There is an interesting connection between faith and economics, when it comes to talking about the value we place on labour. The rise of capitalism has long been associated with the so called Protestant Work Ethic - a view that places high value (and a Biblical justification) on a combination of hard work, frugality and discipline. Think of the countries that enjoy a mid-day 2 hour siesta versus the ones where a 'working lunch' is the norm, and you get something of a map of the parts of the world where this work ethic has had the most significant influence.

The treatment of those who work, the importance of having some time to rest, and

concerns for economic justice, are significant topics in our scriptures – and remain so today.

So this Labour weekend it may be fitting to pause and give thanks for those who, long ago, did much to benefit those who worked - especially in some of the lowest paid and most physically demanding jobs. Let's give thanks too for the fulfilment that can be found in work and those whose work benefits our lives and community.



#### **Early Clevedon families: the Wilsons**



Born in Banffshire, ninth in a family of 12 children, James left Scotland in February 1852 on an assisted passage to Australia. After almost a year in Geelong, he crossed the Tasman in May 1853. By November he had already put in a claim for land in the Wairoa, waiting for the anticipated Ngäi Tai agreement. He was therefore among the very earliest applicants. He was completely on his own and still only 20 years old.

A diary documents his departure from Scotland up to his marriage in September 1859. Like the Thorps' diaries, his is an invaluable record, although in less detail, of the very beginnings of settler life in the Wairoa. By July 1854, he had bought land from Joseph Craig, and leased a further block. With the purchase came 'about ½ ton potatoes, 8 bushels seed oats, 2 kits maize, 1 dinghy, 1 Fern scythe & hook, 1 Fencing Auger and chisel, 1 spade and hoe' — an essential set-up kit, including a dinghy for river and coastal transport, seed oats for a horse-reliant economy, and the means to construct fences.

His diary shows his determination and unremitting work — as he rather ruefully put it in August 1855, 'making a brush fence, cutting rails, and clearing bush, all at the same time "killing three dogs with one stone".' He was felling trees, transporting goods by river, learning elementary Mäori with a hopeful goal of trading along the coast, building with Ngäi Tai help his first nikau house in 1855 and 'plastering it inside with clay'. On Christmas Day 1856 he noted: 'Cutting hay with the hook for seed among the stumps of late.' Haymaking among stumps was not straightforward.

His entrepreneurial spirit saw him taking up the contract in October 1855 to construct the original Black Bridge (Ryburn's Bridge) across the Taitaia. His diary entry for 13 October 1855 shows him 'Superintending the building of a bridge on the road to Auckland, creek a mile off.' Hampton Thorp's diary has him working alongside: 'Wilson and the two Nova Scotian chaps making a bridge.'

James was finally acquiring stock and building permanent fences. On 2 October 1857, he wrote: 'Had a young cow calved – the first belonging to me. I milch her myself and hand fee[d] the calf.' This is a touchingly proud entry of his first step into dairying, and has modern echoes, because until a few years ago the original Wilson farm has been one of the last surviving dairy properties in Clevedon.

The last entry in James's diary is simple: 'Married Sept 15th 1859.' His wife was Ann (Annie) Matheson, who had arrived the previous year with her widowed father John and her sister Lillias to join their brother James in the Wairoa. Ann was born in 1833 in the Parish of Avoch in Ross-shire, so she and her husband were the same age. They would have seven children, four daughters and three sons. In 1862 her father, John Matheson, described in a letter to another daughter in Australia how 'Mr and Mrs Wilson and their daughter are well. They are busy making cheese. They sent you a cheese of last year's making ... We are very busy here just now between cheese making and house building.'

Annie's brother James would soon be married, so the Wilson children would grow up with Matheson aunts, uncles and cousins around them. And in later years with more Wilson family too, as several of James's nephews, sons of a much older brother, also came to New Zealand and two would live nearby.

Fast-forward to 1893: a young adult Wilson family; their parents involved in community and church activities; James soon to be one of the directors of the new Clevedon Steam Navigation Company Limited; and, significantly, James and Ann also at the forefront of the temperance movement. The Good Templars and Band of Hope organisations had a strong membership in Wairoa South for a time and 'Jas. S. Wilson, Hon. Sect.' is the signature on a brightly coloured 1887 Band of Hope card. The temperance movement was a strong promoter of women's suffrage, and this surely explains why we can thank the Wilson family for organising the collection of signatures for the successful Women's Suffrage Petition of 1893. With the name 'Wilson' annotated on the back, Sheet No 370 for 'Clevedon Wairoa South' was sent, crammed full with signatures (56 women and one man), to join the others that brought New Zealand its world-breaking first in women's universal suffrage.

Ann Wilson and her eldest daughter Annie were the first to sign. Two other daughters also signed – the youngest couldn't as she was not yet 21. Ann's daughter-in-law's name is also there. The petition sheet survives in good condition, so it was probably kept at the Wilson home. There are neighbour and family clusters of signatures, from Ness Valley, from Skyhigh... we can imagine groups of women coming by buggy to the Wilsons' central home to add their name. In 2018 we are celebrating 125 years since they went down that driveway, into history.

Ann Wilson died in 1905, aged 72. James lived on until the age of 88, dying in 1921.

#### **Kokako Recovery Project**

Fantastic News from the kokako population census – an astonishing **106 pairs** within the 2,000 hectares of the Hunua Ranges receiving intensive pest control. This is an increase from 55 pairs over the same area in 2014, and 25 pairs in 2010. There will also be juvenile birds, not yet paired up. At least one pair has got an early start and is nesting already this season. This is now the fifth largest kōkako population in the country, certainly something to sing about!

At the inception of the Hunua Kokako Recovery Project in 1994, there was just **one breeding pair** of kōkako in the Hunuas, due to unchecked predation by introduced mammals. Although there were approximately 26 kōkako at the time, only one was female, due to the increased likelihood of females being preyed upon by possums and stoats, as they alone do all the incubating and brooding duties!

Thanks to the hard work of countless individuals over the past 24 years, and a noticeable increase in birds after the last 1080 drop in 2014, the Hunua kōkako population is well on it's way to recovery.

Predator control has also seen an increase in other species such as hochstetter frogs, tomtits and bats and the understorey bush is much thicker.

#### A LIFE WITH MUSIC

#### Betty Leslie Black (nee Stewart) 15 August 1935- 12th September 2018

Betty was the much loved wife of Jim, loving mother and mother-in-law of Andrew and Amanda, Peter & Louise. Cherished grandmother, of Robert & Emma.

Betty Stewart gained her teaching registration at the Royal College of Music in London. During her time there in the 50s and 60s, she performed a range of concerts, including a performance arranged by the NZ Music Society (UK) of Handel's Organ Concerto No 2 in B flat and Poulenc's Organ Concerto in G minor accompanied by the Riddick Orchestra with NZ conductor, Ashley Lawrence. She lived in Christchurch, Wellington and spent her later years in Auckland & Papakura, playing the organ for choirs and church services.

Until the last Betty was the person she had always been: this intelligent, insightful, gifted talented woman. Looking at Betty's hands you thought of the instruments she played, the delight she gained and gave from music. Betty was a significant figure in New Zealand music, advocating for harpsichord and organ, doing solo performances and accompanying some of the country's top choirs, including Wellington's Orpheus Choir and South Auckland Choral Society.

She performed across the country, including at St James' Anglican Church Lower Hutt, in Christchurch with Wallace Woodley at Durham Street Methodist Church or in the Town Hall or Christchurch Cathedral, in performances with the Royal Christchurch Music Society and later at Auckland's Clevedon Presbyterian Church where despite her failing health, she would not miss to support one morning service or choral rehearsal.

Betty also recorded several times for the New Zealand Broadcasting Corporation (now RNZ), including the complete keyboard works of J.S. Bach. A memorial service was held 19<sup>th</sup> September 2018 to celebrate a gifted life lived well.

# CLEVEDON SCHOOL Clevedon kids living and learning with PRIDE



Term four is upon us and traditionally in schools, this is a hectic time as we close off the current school year while simultaneously preparing for the opening of the next. This year is no exception and the staff are gearing up for the last 8 weeks of the year.

#### Perimeter Fencing Around School

If you have been past school or in to school over the past two weeks, you will have noticed that there is some significant interim fencing at key locations both at the front and the back entrances of the school.

As part of our ongoing health and safety review, we work collaboratively with the Ministry of Education to ensure that our school environment is a safe place both environmentally and physically for each and every one of our students. Recently, the Ministry of Education has collaboratively identified, with the senior staff, that our lack of perimeter fencing is presenting as a significant hazard for our students and has agreed to support the school to build new permanent fencing around the school.

As you all know, we have main roads on either side of the school. Both staff and students have been involved in significant programmes with Auckland Transport and our local police over the past three years, to educate our community on slowing down around the school. Added to this, we are always dealing with the possible scenarios of students running out of the grounds and putting themselves and staff at significant risk where traffic is concerned.

The temporary fencing has been erected until the permanent fencing project has been completed which will take approximately 3-4 months. We will have an architect and project manager working alongside myself and the property committee of the board to design and erect fencing right around our school and we will have as top priority that it sits well with our local rural environment and allows for the continued use of the school grounds by our community while keeping all of our children safe within the school boundaries during school hours.

The fencing will also go a long way in assisting us minimise the members of the public who enter our grounds during the day both during school hours and in the weekends. It will help with minimizing the vandalism which seems to occur on a weekly basis in the school with teenagers who use the school as an entertainment area often late at night.

#### Garden Sculpture Trail

2018 sees a major arts event happening at school. We are working to beautify our school and the wider community by adding some home made sculptures to the school environment.

All the teachers and students have been working hard on their sculptures and we have booked our launch in for Wednesday 7th November at 4.30pm. We will have an official launch with speeches etc at 4.30pm and then from 4.30pm - 7.00pm you are free to walk the trail and enjoy the work of each and every class.

This has been financially supported by a grant from our local Franklin board and we are excited to have this as a legacy for the wider community over the coming years.

It will be great for others to be able to come and share in the environment here at school. *Our school will be open for you all to come and wander - hopefully on a warm spring evening...*
