Minutes of Annual Meeting

HELD AT PARIS

IN THE OFFICE OF THE FÉDÉRATION FRANÇAISE DE FOOTBALL ASSOCIATION (22 RUE DE LONDRES),

ON SATURDAY, 8th JUNE 1929.

Present: Messrs. C. A. W. Hirschman (in the Chair) and Dr. P. Bauwens (Fédération Internationale de Football Association); W. Pickford and A. Kingscott (The Football Association); J. Fleming and W. Mc. Intosh (Scottish Football Association); Lieut. Col. J. L. Williams and B. Watts Jones (Football Association of Wales); J. Mc. Bride and J. Ferguson (Irish Football Association).

Also present: Messrs. H. Delaunay, Secretary of the delegation of the F. I. F. A. who acted as Secretary to the meeting; F. J. Wall, Secretary The Football Association; G. G. Graham, Secretary Scottish Football Association and Ch. Watson, Secretary Irish Football Association.

Mr. J. Rimet, President of la Fédération Internationale de Football Association, welcomed the members of the Board to Paris, and retired.

Upon the proposal of the Chairman it was decided to record an expression of sincere sympathy and regret at the death of Mr. J. K. Mc. Dowall, one of the oldest representatives to the Board.

Minutes of Meeting at Newcastle, Co. Down on 9th June 1928 were confirmed.

PROPOSALS BY THE FOOTBALL ASSOCIATION.

The following proposal was upon a division declared to be lost.

Law 6. Second sentence delete the word "or".

Add at end of this Law.— "or from a free-kick awarded for any offence under Law 9".

The following proposal for alteration of Law 12 of the game was adopted:
Law 12. For the fifth sentence substitute the following:—
"Any player whose boots are found not conforming with this Law shall be sent off the field of play and not allowed to return without first reporting to the Referee, who will satisfy himself that the boots are satisfactory. A player may only return to the field and report to the Referee at a time when the ball has ceased to be in play".

The following proposal for alteration of Law 17 of the game was adopted:

Law 17. Third and fourth paragraphs. Substitute the following:—

"In the event of any intentional infringement of Law 9 by the defending side within the penalty area, the Referee shall award the opponents a penalty kick which shall be taken from the penalty kick mark under the following conditions:—All players with the exception of the player taking the penalty kick and the opponents' goalkeeper shall be within the field of play but outside the penalty area, and at least 10 yards from where the kick is being taken. The opponents' goalkeeper must stand on his own goal line until the ball is kicked".

PROPOSALS BY THE SCOTTISH FOOTBALL ASSOCIATION.

1°) Proposals regarding Laws 1, 8, 8a, 9, 17, 17a, re Penalty kick were lost.

2°) Proposals concerning Laws 12, 13 and 13a were by leave withdrawn:
