

Acquired in a trade with the Carolina Hurricanes in 2019, crafty young defenseman Adam Fox emerged as one of the NHL's best all-around defensemen in just his second season in 2020-21 as he led all NHL d-men with career highs in points (47) and assists (42). A Hobey Baker Award finalist in 2018-19 out of Harvard, Fox led the NCAA in assists (39) and ranked fourth in points (48), while also setting school single season records for assists and points by a defenseman. Fox was named a first team All American in each of his three seasons in Harvard, and registered 116 points (21 goals, 95 assists) in 97 career games. The Jericho, New York, native was originally a third round selection of the Calgary Flames in 2016.

The award is presented annually to the Ranger who, as chosen by the fans, "goes above and beyond the call of duty." Also won the Rangers MVP award in 2020-21

IN THE FOXHOLE

Since 12/31/19, Fox leads all NHL defensemen in points (72) and assists (64), and ranks 4th in PPP (28).

He is 1 of 2 NHL defensemen to record at least 85 points and at least a +40 rating since the start of 2019-20 (Shea Theodore).



OUT-FOXED

Fox was the only NHL player in 2020-21 with at least 100 blocked shots and 35 takeaways.

He was the only player to average at least 3:45 of PP ice time and 2:35 of SH ice time per game.

Fox finished 11th in the NHL in average time on ice (24:42).

MAKING HIS MARK

Fox is t-3rd in Rangers history among defensemen in assists per game (0.61), and ranks 5th in points per game (0.71).

He became just the second defenseman in franchise history in 2020-21 to tally 40-plus points in each of his first two NHL seasons (Reijo Ruotsalainen).

BLEEDING BLUE

Growing up in Jericho, New York, Fox was a huge Rangers fan as a kid and attended many games at Madison Square Garden. "My dad is a huge fan and passed it down to me," said Fox. "My first jersey was Brian Leetch, which he gave to me. Any opportunity to play in the NHL is special, but it definitely has more meaning doing it here with my connection to New York."
