Dear San Bernardino County Voter:

This Voter Information Guide explains how, when and where to vote for the 2021 California Gubernatorial Recall Election.

As your Registrar of Voters, it is my commitment to ensure the election is accessible, secure, and safe for all voters in San Bernardino County and that the counting of votes is transparent and accurate.

What does this mean for San Bernardino County voters?

- Every active registered voter will receive a mail ballot, which will be delivered to the United States Postal Service beginning August 16.
- You have four ways to cast a voted ballot this election.
 1. Vote-by-Mail
 2. Ballot Drop-box Locations
 3. Early Vote Sites
 4. Polling Place

Please be sure to check the back cover of this guide to find your assigned polling place. You may have a new location.

In addition to voting by mail or at a drop-box location, the Registrar of Voters office will open for early voting on Monday, August 16. Early voting at additional locations will be available Tuesday, September 7 through Saturday, September 11 and Monday, September 13. Polling places will be open on Election Day Tuesday, September 14. I encourage you to vote before Election Day as polling places may have significant lines on September 14.

If you prefer to vote in person, I want you to know that we will follow state and local guidelines to create a safe environment for voters and poll workers alike.

The Secretary of State is again offering voters the "Where's My Ballot?" tracking tool to keep you notified when your ballot is mailed, received, and accepted for counting. I encourage you to sign up today at **WheresMyBallot.sos.ca.gov**.

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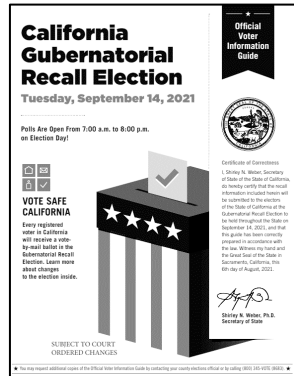
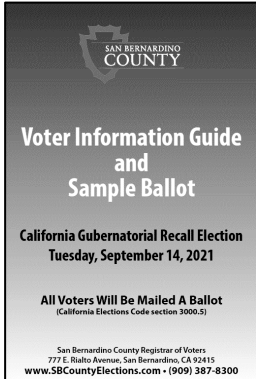

You received this Voter Information Guide because you are a registered voter in San Bernardino County.

Submit a Change of Address form if you move within the county or change your mailing address. To submit an in-county change of address:

- In Person - Pick up a voter registration application at locations throughout the County. Visit **SBCountyElections.com**.

- The voter registration deadline for this election is Monday, August 30.

Missed the August 30 voter registration deadline?

Tuesday, September 7	Last day to request a replacement ballot to be mailed to a voter
Tuesday, September 14	Election Day, voting at polling places takes place from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.
Tuesday, September 14	All ballots returned by mail must be postmarked on or before this date
Wednesday, September 15	Canvass of the Election begins
Tuesday, September 21	Last day for Registrar of Voters to receive mail ballots from U.S. Postal Service or any bona fide delivery service
Thursday, October 14	Deadline to complete the canvass and certify the county results of the Election

Voting Information

Four Ways To Receive Your Ballot

1) A ballot will be mailed to you

- All active registered voters must be mailed a ballot for this election. (*California Elections Code section 3000.5*)
- Mail ballots will be delivered to the U.S. Postal Service on Monday, August 16.
- Mail ballots for new voters who register by Monday, August 30 will be delivered to the U.S. Postal Service within five days.

2) Request a replacement mail ballot

- If you do not receive your ballot, your ballot is damaged, or you mismatch your ballot, you may request a replacement ballot.
- To request a replacement ballot:
 - Contact the Registrar of Voters office from Monday, August 16 through Tuesday, September 7 to request one be mailed to you
 - Visit the Registrar of Voters office starting Monday, August 16 through Tuesday, September 14.
 - Visit an early vote site from Tuesday, September 7 through Saturday, September 11 or on Monday, September 13, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.
- If you request a replacement mail ballot, the prior ballot mailed to you will be suspended so that you can only cast one voted ballot.

3) Access a Remote Accessible Vote By Mail ballot

- All voters may use their computer to access and mark an accessible ballot that was designed for voters with disabilities, overseas voters, and military voters. Once marked, voters print their ballot and return it to the Registrar of Voters office.

4) Visit your polling place

- Polling places will be open on Election Day, September 14, 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.
- At a polling place, you may register to vote to receive a ballot, request a replacement ballot, and receive accessibility and language assistance.

Four Ways To Cast Your Voted Ballot

Whichever way you choose to cast your voted ballot, you may track your ballot using California Secretary of State's "Where's My Ballot" tool. Sign up to receive email, text, or voice call notifications at WheresMyBallot.sos.ca.gov.

1) By Mail

- Mark your ballot safely at home and then place it in the mail ballot return envelope we provide. Sign and seal the envelope.
- Postage is already paid; you do not need to add stamps.
- Mail your voted ballot via U.S. Postal Service. As long as your return envelope is postmarked on or before September 14, and received at the Registrar of Voters no later than September 21, your ballot will be eligible to be counted.

2) At a Ballot Drop-off Location

- Mark your ballot safely at home and then place it in the mail ballot return envelope we provide. Sign and seal the envelope.
- Drop off your voted ballot at any ballot drop-off location.
- Visit SBCountyElections.com/Voting/MailBallotDropOff.aspx to find a location nearest to you, using the Mail Ballot Drop-off Map.

3) At an Early Vote Site

- Mark your ballot safely at home and then place it in the mail ballot return envelope we provide. Sign and seal the envelope.
- Drop off your voted ballot at any early vote site.
- Vote as early as August 16 at the Registrar of Voters office.
- Vote at five additional early vote sites from September 7 to September 11 and on September 13.
- At any early vote site, you may register to vote to receive a ballot, request a replacement ballot, and receive accessibility and language assistance.

4) At a Polling Place

- Mark your ballot safely at home and then place it in the mail ballot return envelope we provide. Sign and seal the envelope.
- Drop off your voted ballot at any polling place.
- Vote at your polling place on Election Day, September 14 from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.
- At your polling place, you may register to vote to receive a ballot, request a replacement ballot, and receive accessibility and language assistance.

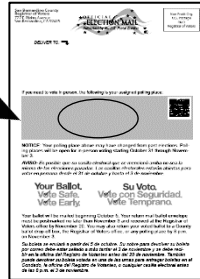

Voting Instructions

Marking your official ballot

1. Use only a **Blue** or **Black** pen or a marker to completely fill in the oval voting target to the left of your choice like this:

2. To vote on the recall question, mark the voting target to the left of the word "**YES**" or "**NO**".
3. You may vote on the recall question regardless of whether you vote for a successor candidate.
4. To vote for a candidate whose name appears on the ballot, mark the voting target next to the candidate's name.
5. To vote for a qualified write-in candidate, write the person's name in the blank space provided for that purpose after the names of the other candidates for the same office.
6. You may vote for a successor candidate regardless of whether or how you vote on the recall question.
7. Marking the ballot outside of the designated space to vote for a candidate or measure may compromise the secrecy of the ballot.
8. If you make a mistake or damage your ballot, request a replacement ballot.

Marking your sample ballot

2. For your convenience, you may pre-mark your sample ballot to assist you with marking your official ballot at home, or at your polling place.

Instructions To Voters:

3. To vote on the recall question, mark the voting target to the left of the word "YES" or "NO".
4. You may vote on the recall question regardless of whether you vote for a successor candidate.
5. To vote for a candidate whose name appears on the ballot, mark the voting target next to the candidate's name.
6. To vote for a qualified write-in candidate, write the person's name in the blank space provided for that purpose after the names of the other candidates for the same office.
7. You may vote for a successor candidate regardless of whether or how you vote on the recall question.
8. Marking the ballot outside of the designated space to vote for a candidate or measure may compromise the secrecy of the ballot.
9. If you make a mistake or damage your ballot, request a replacement ballot.

Voter-Nominated Office:

All voters, regardless of the party preference they disclosed upon registration, or refusal to disclose a party preference, may vote for any candidate for a voter-nominated office. The party preference, if any, designated by a candidate for a voter-nominated office is selected by the candidate and is shown for the information of the voters only. It does not imply that the candidate is nominated or endorsed by the party or that the party approves of the candidate.

Instrucciones Para Los Votantes:

1. **CÓMO VOTAR:**
2. Use únicamente una pluma o un marcador de color **Azul** o **Negro** para llenar por completo el área ovalada para marcar su voto a la izquierda de su elección de la siguiente manera:
3. Para votar ante la pregunta de destitución, marque su preferencia de votación a la izquierda de la palabra "SI" o "NO".
4. Usted puede votar en la pregunta de remoción sin importar si vota por un candidato sucesor.
5. Para votar por un candidato cuyo nombre aparece en la boleta electoral, marque su preferencia de votación junto al nombre del candidato.
6. Para votar por un candidato calificado de nominación directa, escriba el nombre de la persona en el espacio en blanco previsto para ese propósito después de los nombres de los otros candidatos para el mismo cargo.
7. Usted puede votar por un candidato sucesor sin importar si vota, o cómo vota, en la pregunta de remoción.
8. Marcar la boleta fuera del espacio designado para votar por un candidato o por una medida, puede comprometer el secreto de la boleta.
9. Si comete un error o daña su boleta, solicite una boleta de reemplazo.

Cargo Nominado por los Votantes:

Todos los votantes, independientemente de la preferencia de partido que revelaron al registrarse, o de la negativa a revelar la preferencia de partido, pueden votar por cualquier candidato para un cargo nominado por los votantes. La preferencia de partido, si la hubiera, designada por un candidato para un cargo nominado por los votantes es seleccionada por el candidato y se muestra solo para información de los votantes. No implica que el candidato ha sido nominado o está respaldado por el partido o que el partido aprueba al candidato.

Recall Election Information

How Recall Elections Work

On your ballot you will find:

- A question asking whether Governor Gavin Newsom should be recalled (removed) from office.
 - You may vote on the recall question regardless of how you vote, or if you vote, for a successor candidate.
- A contest to choose a successor candidate for that office in the event Governor Gavin Newsom is recalled.
 - You may vote for a successor candidate regardless of how you vote, or if you vote, on the recall question.

After the votes are tallied:

- If there are more "Yes" votes than "No" votes on a recall question, Governor Gavin Newsom will be recalled (removed) from office.
- If Governor Gavin Newsom is recalled, the successor candidate that receives the highest number of votes shall be declared elected for the remainder of Governor Gavin Newsom's term which expires on January 2, 2023
- If there are more "No" votes than "Yes" votes on the recall question, or if there is a tie vote, Governor Gavin Newsom shall remain in office.

Estimated Costs to Administer the California Gubernatorial Recall Election

Pursuant to Elections Code section 11108(d), the Department of Finance, in consultation with the Secretary of State and county elections officials, has estimated the costs to administer the recall election of Governor Gavin Newsom to be \$276 million.

Proponents' Statement of Reasons for the Recall and the Governor's Answer

The recall petition circulated throughout the state included a Statement of Reasons for a recall and the Governor's Answer to the Statement, which are provided below pursuant to Elections Code section 11325.

Proponents' Statement of Reasons

TO THE HONORABLE GAVIN NEWSOM: Pursuant to section 11020, California Elections Code, the undersigned registered qualified voters of the State of California, hereby give notice, we are the proponents of a recall petition and we intend to seek your recall and removal from the office of Governor in the State of California and to demand election of a successor in that office.

The grounds for this recall are as Follows: Governor Newsom has implemented laws which are detrimental to the citizens of this state and our way of life. Laws he endorsed favor foreign nationals, in our country illegally, over that of our own citizens. People in this state suffer the highest taxes in the nation, the highest homelessness rates, and the lowest quality of life as a result. He has imposed sanctuary state status and fails to enforce immigration laws. He unilaterally over-ruled the will of the people regarding the death penalty. He seeks to impose additional burdens on our state by the following; removing the protections of Proposition 13, rationing our water use, increasing taxes and restricting parental rights. Having no other recourse, we the people have come together to take this action, remedy these misdeeds and prevent further injustices.

Voter Bill of Rights

You have the following rights:

- 1. The right to vote if you are a registered voter.** You are eligible to vote if you are:
 - a U.S. citizen living in California
 - at least 18 years old
 - registered where you currently live
 - not currently in state or federal prison or on parole for the conviction of a felony
 - not currently found mentally incompetent to vote by a court
- 2. The right to vote if you are a registered voter even if your name is not on the list.** You will vote using a provisional ballot. Your vote will be counted if elections officials determine that you are eligible to vote.
- 3. The right to vote if you are still in line when the polls close.**
- 4. The right to cast a secret ballot** without anyone bothering you or telling you how to vote.
- 5. The right to get a new ballot if you have made a mistake,** if you have not already cast your ballot. You can:
 - **Ask an elections official at a polling place** for a new ballot,
 - **Exchange your vote-by-mail ballot** for a new one at an elections office, or at your polling place, or
 - **Vote using a provisional ballot.**
- 6. The right to get help casting your ballot** from anyone you choose, except from your employer or union representative.
- 7. The right to drop off your completed vote-by-mail ballot at any polling place** in California.
- 8. The right to get election materials in a language other than English** if enough people in your voting precinct speak that language.
- 9. The right to ask questions to elections officials about election procedures** and watch the election process. If the person you ask cannot answer your questions, they must send you to the right person for an answer. If you are disruptive, they can stop answering you.
- 10. The right to report any illegal or fraudulent election activity** to an elections official or the Secretary of State's office.

Your ballot will be mailed beginning August 16. Your return mail ballot envelope must be postmarked no later than September 14 and received at the Registrar of Voters office by September 21. You may also return your voted ballot to a County ballot drop-off box, the Registrar of Voters office, or any polling place by 8 p.m. on September 14.

Su sobre para devolver su boleta por correo debe estar sellado a más tardar el 14 de septiembre y se debe recibir en la oficina del Registro de Votantes antes del 21 de septiembre. También puede devolver su boleta votada en una de las urnas para entregar boletas en el Condado, la oficina del Registro de Votantes, o cualquier casilla electoral antes de las 8 p.m. el 14 de septiembre.
