The semi – wild horses in Greece

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The semi-wild horses in Greece belong to Pindos breed (1.25-1.35m height). There is a slight difference in the size of these horses. Horses which live near rivers where there is plenty of food all around the year, are a little bit taller than the horses living on the mountains.

Most of these horses come from the abandoned ones during the civil war 1944-49 and some other from the immigration of people to foreign countries. On the other hand tractors and new methods in agriculture made their presence in the villagers useless. Town councils as well as individuals who adore horses take care of them.

Green arrow indicates location of Ainos pony



Yellow arrow indicates location of Axios and Aliakmon rivers near Thessaloniki Black arrow indicates location of Delta of Evros river


- Mountain Ainos (1628m) in island of Cephalonia, about 25 horses (7 mares and 18 stallions).
- Delta of Acheloos river, about 40 horses.
- Mountainous region between cities of Amphilochia and Agrinio, about 200 horses.
- Pagaio mountain near city of Drama, about 400 horses.
- Delta of Kalama river near Igoumenitsa city, about 30 horses.
- Delta Axios and Aliakmon rivers near Thessaloniki, about 30 horses
- Delta Evros river, about 30 horses.


