WHEREAS it is provided in Section 64(3) of the Constitution of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, 1999, that the person elected as President shall have power to issue a proclamation for the holding of the First Session of the National Assembly immediately after his being sworn in.

Now THEREFORE, 1, Umaru Musa Yar'Adua, President and Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, in exercise of the powers bestowed upon me by Section 64(3) aforesaid, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf hereby proclaim that the First Session of the National Assembly shall hold at 10:00 a.m. on Tuesday, 5th June, 2007 in the National Assembly, Abuja.

Given under my hand and the public seal of the Federal Republic of Nigeria at Abuja, this day 30^h of May, 2007.

We have to put our house in order first before we can carry out the necessary responsibilities reposed on us by the Constitution. Please be assured that with your support and cooperation and by the grace of God Almighty, I shall not disappoint this Senate and the Nation. We have collective responsibilities. You all know that the easiest thing people do is to criticize but the most challenging thing is to come out with ideas that can move the nation from one point to the next.

I want to assure you and the entire country that my tenure will provide a focused and purposeful leadership that will invigorate the Senate and build bridges of understanding amongst the diverse segments of the Nigerian society.
