KSL Free To Resume Promotions

KSL/Salt Lake City, which voluntarily discontinued two on-air promotions rather than risk possible violation of Utah's anti-lottery regulations, as reported in *R&R* (5/20), has received an all-clear from the Attorney General's office and has resumed the contests. General Manager **Dean Lindsay** told *R&R*: "As you recall, we voluntarily discontinued our 'Blue Chip' and 'Disneyland' promotions a couple of weeks ago because of a possible problem with...the office of the Utah Attorney General on the subject of lotteries. We are now pleased to report that because of questions raised and input provided by our Washington legal counsel **Bob Barker**, the people at the Attorney General's office have changed their position and we are now free to continue our on-air promotions."

Industry Mourns Goddard Lieberman

Goddard Lieberman, longtime President of **Columbia Records**, died of cancer Sunday (29) at the age of 66. During his Columbia career, Lieberman was responsible for introducing the long-play (LP) record and for popularizing musical comedy original cast albums (among them such best sellers as "My Fair Lady," "South Pacific," "Sound of Music" and "West Side Story"). In 1975, Lieberman returned to the show album area by producing the cast LP for "A Chorus Line." During his presidency, Columbia also moved into Rock and assumed its pre-eminently successful position in the record marketplace.

Green Payola Testimony Clarified

In response to *R&R*'s story last week regarding recording star **Al Green's** FCC payola hearings directed against a concert promotion firm formed by **WOL/Washington** air personalities, *R&R* received a letter clarifying certain aspects of our story from **Egmont Sonderling**, Chairman of the Board of **Sonderling Broadcasting Corp.**, owners of **WOL**.

R&R's original story stated that "members of former **WOL** air

personality **Mel Edwards' D.J. Productions** concert promotion firm pressured" Green to accept "substantially less than his \$35,000 fee just before Green was to go on-stage in front of a restless audience. Green said the firm promised to make up the rest of the fee in subsequent airplay on **WOL**." **Sonderling** sent *R&R* a copy of the transcript of Green's testimony and raised the following points:

"Your article says that a fee was accepted by Mr. Green which

was lower than originally agreed upon, referring to the concert of June 19, 1975, and that the lower fee was in exchange for a promise of increased air plays.

"...The transcript...states specifically that according to Mr. Green, he dealt only with Mr. Washington" (**BW Washington**, listed on Green's contract as promoter for **Dimensions Unlimited**) "and did not even know that 'DJ Productions or Mel Edwards existed.' This being the case, how could

New Mexico Station Destroyed By Fire

Fire completely destroyed the studios and offices of **KBIM-AM-FM-TV/Roswell, New Mexico** at 3am Tuesday (31). The AM facility went back on the air from the transmitter site, untouched by the blaze, the following day, but the FM and TV stations remained off the air, and according to **KBIM's J. David Stone**, would remain that way for an indefinite period.

The fire's cause was not known. The entire record libraries of the stations were destroyed, and record companies have been asked for help in restocking them. Mailing address is P.O. NBC Victorious In Legal Battle, Shuts Down NIS

The \$5 million suit by **WNUSWest Springfield, Massachusetts** against the **NBC** network was dismissed in court, allowing **NBC** to shut down its **NIS** (news and information service) operation Sunday (29). The **WNUS** suit, as reported in *R&R*, sought to force **NBC** to continue its **NIS** service beyond the announced May 29 cut-off date.

The all-news outlet had hoped to bind **NBC** to a January 1, 1978 expiration date specified in a contract prior to **NBC's** **NIS** termination announcement. The court, however, dismissed all counts in the suit, freeing the network to bring **NIS** to a close after two years.

he have been promised additional play if he was not even aware of the existence of **DJ Productions** and the various **WOL** disc jockeys.

"If you read the testimony...you will discover that Mr. Green accepted a reduction in fee from \$35,000 to \$13,500 after having consulted with his producer and the executives of the booking agency. It is therefore obvious and quite clearly shown by testimony that Mr. Green accepted the reduction fee following the suggestions of

his own advisers, managing and booking agents and not as a result of any inducements handed out to him by anybody on the premises. (The transcript) mention(s) the fact that Mr. Green would have things 'made up to him,' but that is all it said. There is nothing said about extra air play."

During the course of his testimony, Green does mention that he was told of the reduction in

Stock Market Blues For Broadcast Industry

On the heels of a general down trend in the New York stock exchange, the broadcast industry took a beating, with most major companies taking a dip. **ABC** dropped 3 1/2, **Metromedia** 2 1/2, **Taft Broadcasting** down 1, and **CBS** also down 2 1/2. Net change for the entire industry was minus 2.38. Broadcasters were the biggest losers among all show business stocks.

Eastman Analyzes Arbitron Markets

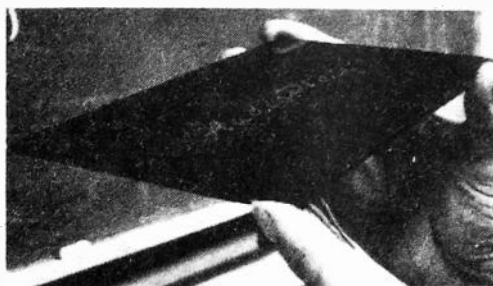
A study by New York's **Eastman Radio** has turned up some interesting day-part trends in 69 Arbitron-measured markets. The survey found that AM shares are larger in 50 of the markets during 10am-3pm, and are also the leaders in 3-7pm in 53 markets. However, FM takes over at night; 7pm-midnight FM holds the lead in 42 of the 69 markets studied.

Eyeglass Price Ads OK'd By FTC

The **Federal Trade Commission** staff has recommended that eye doctors, optometrists and eyeglass makers be able to advertise prices. The recommendation covers current different state regulations. States would be allowed to have limited powers on the pricing ads, including a requirement that commercials say whether the advertised prices also cover eye examination and what type of lenses are offered. The FTC has held lengthy hearings on the subject, and a public comment period and full Commission approval must be obtained before the new rules go into effect.

Amazing New Speaker Unveiled

Two acoustical equipment plant owners have stumbled onto the newest innovation in sound speakers in recent history. The "AudioPlate" measures only 5 x 7 inches, and is nearly flat, but many experts who have heard it in action swear that it has a quality and fidelity that matches the best speakers around. The electronic team that developed it maintains that they themselves are not really sure why or how it works, but are moving ahead to distribute AudioPlate. By the end of 1977, consumers will be able to buy the speaker for around \$300.



Cocaine: How Safe Is It?

In a forthcoming publication from the **National Institute of Drug Abuse**, the agency has drawn the conclusion that although cocaine isn't perfectly safe and sane, it may very well be not nearly as strong a "narcotic" as has been commonly believed. It is a known fact that cocaine is not physically addictive, but most doctors studying the drug say that it can produce a psychological dependence in many people. Many studies show that regular users of cocaine may have psychological problems anyway, and the drug use is an attempt to cover up the problems. Massive doses have been shown to paralyze the respiratory centers of the brain, in some cases causing death.

Video: Pain In The Neck For Networks?

Video games, video tape recorders and the upcoming video records may take a "drastic" bite out of the networks' primetime programming ratings, according to a study done by the **Integrated Circuit Engineering Corp.** Even the **A.C. Nielsen TV** rating company has suggested that once a "few million" video sets are installed in homes nationwide, they would become a "definite rating factor." Nielsen sets 10% saturation level of the video systems as the point where primetime programming would be affected. Estimates are that there will be 50 million video games in use by 1981. Arbitron Television has already come up with some results on video game use, noting the heaviest usage in New York and Los Angeles occurs during primetime hours.

White Collar Workers Move To Unions

Well over 1000 more American white collar workers are now being represented by unions, for a total in 1976 of 24,450. Unions won 648 of 1,187 elections involving private white collar employees. Among some of the more active organizing unions are the **Teamsters**, **The American Nurses Association**, **The Communications Workers**, and the **Retail, Wholesale and Department Store Union**.

Ads Spell Profits For General Mills

Heavier spending in advertising is the plan for **General Mills Inc.** to increase their profits, according to company chairman **Donald Swanson**. Ad spending in fiscal 1977 rose more than 20% to \$135 million, and although no specific figures for ad buys in 1978 have been announced, it is expected that the dollar amount will be raised again. Foods account for nearly two thirds of General Mills' sales, including a rapidly growing restaurant operation. Continued growth in both food and non-food businesses, plus the added advertising spending are making the company expect increases in sales and profits next year.

GM To Phase In Anti-Smog Devices

In order to meet stringent antipollution laws and keep fuel economy high, **General Motors** has announced that they will start gradually phasing in "three-way" catalysts on all its cars by 1982. The statement by GM made them the first Detroit auto maker to make a public commitment to install

such a device on a specific timetable. The company had earlier announced that the catalysts would be installed in California-sold cars next year. The device cleans all three of the pollutants now regulated by government standards.

Ford Pits Fiesta Against Rabbit

Ford Motor Co. is making a full attack on the small car market with their new import Fiesta four-seater. The company, while trying to take up some of the market now owned by such models as Datsun and Toyota, are leveling their attack directly at the popular VW Rabbit. Both cars are powered by four cylinder engines, Fiesta is slightly smaller than Rabbit. Ford will stress the fact that Fiesta is an import in their ads. The other main key point in advertising for the model is to get potential buyers into the showrooms for a test drive.

Senior Buying Power

One of the fastest growing purchasing demographics is the retired set, which now holds an estimated \$200 billion in purchasing power. Within the next 25 years, the 50 and over age group will become the single largest population class in the country, according to the **National Retirement Council**. By that time, 70 million Americans will reach that age group.

McDonald's "Hospitalized"

Philadelphia residents with serious cases of "Big Mac Attack" are now able to check into Philadelphia Children's Hospital and eat at a **McDonald's** at the same time. McDonald Corp. has installed one of its "outdoor" mall-style restaurants at the hospital after the facility's coffee shop was constantly overcrowded. The hospital felt that a fast-food service was the best route to solve the problem. McDonald's reports that the outlet is even pulling outside customers into the hospital to cure their burger habits.

ABC Wins The "Fight" Of The Week

ABC's boxing special "Ali vs. Evangelista" helped move that network back into the top Nielsen rating position for the week ending May 22. **CBS** came in second, and **NBC** third, with their highest rated show coming in a poor 15th. Top 10 shows for the week were: Ali fight, "MASH," "ABC Sunday Movies Lucian and Good Against Evil," "Charlie's Angels," "Laverne & Shirley," "One Day At A Time," "Happy Days," "Barney Miller," **CBS** "Cold Turkey," and **CBS** movie "Ben Hur."

The top ten programs in New York for the week of May 14-20, according to Arbitron TV meter service: 1) "Heavyweight Boxing Special," 2) **NBC's** "Big Event," 3) "Welcome Back Kotter" and "What's Happening," 5) "Charlie's Angels" and "Laverne & Shirley," 7) four way tie with "Barney Miller," "Happy Days," "MASH" and "Miss U.S.A. Pageant." In Los Angeles the top ten were: 1) "Happy Days," "Heavyweight Boxing Championship" and "Laverne & Shirley" tied, 5) "Big Event," "NBC Saturday Movie" and "What's Happening," 7) "Barney Miller," 8) "Harvey Korman Show" pilot, and "Welcome Back Kotter," 10) "ABC Sunday Night Movie" "Charlie's Angels" and "MASH."

Hollywood's Substitute Emmy Show To Air

NBC-TV has reached an agreement to present the **Hollywood Academy of TV Arts & Sciences'** version of television awards, after cancelling the National Association's Emmys due to the two organizations' split. Many of the leading contenders for Emmy awards have withdrawn their nominations so they can take part in the Hollywood version...**Elvis Presley** will return to TV with a **CBS** special set to be broadcast this fall. The show will be taped during the King's summer tour...**Marilyn McCoo** and **Billy Davis'** summer replacement variety series kicks off June 15 on **CBS**...**NBC** has announced a new format for their "NBC Nightly News." **John Chancellor** will continue to be co-anchor from the network's New York studios, but **David Brinkley** will move to the Washington D.C. base. New format for the news will include a mini-documentary feature each night, "fast paced" treatment of secondary news stories and a summary of news events at the end. The new look of the news starts in August.

CHUM Celebrates Their 20th

Last Friday (27) CHUM/Toronto celebrated their 20th anniversary as a contemporary music radio station. The staff at CHUM relayed some interesting historical moments in their history to R&R. In the late 50's, it became a common practice for the air staff to coin CHUM words and phrases. A thermometer became a CHUMometer, the humidity, CHUMidity, an umbrella a CHUMBrella, and a very hot day was referred to as a CHUMdinger. The CHUM Chopper was airborne for traffic coverage, jocks reported CHUM time and gave away CHUM bucks and CHUM checks. CHUM Chicks were in attendance at station promotions. Back in those days as well, CHUM personalities formed the musical group the CHUMingbirds. In 1960, CHUM introduced Toronto's first talk show, "Speak Your Mind," which continues today on the John Gilbert show. Three years later the Beatles were brought to the city by the station, and the CHUM staff was dispatched to distribute coffee and hot dogs to listeners waiting in the rain at the box office. Dick Clark's radio show was introduced to Canada the same year. Also in '63, "Mable Leaf," the CHUM Witch cast

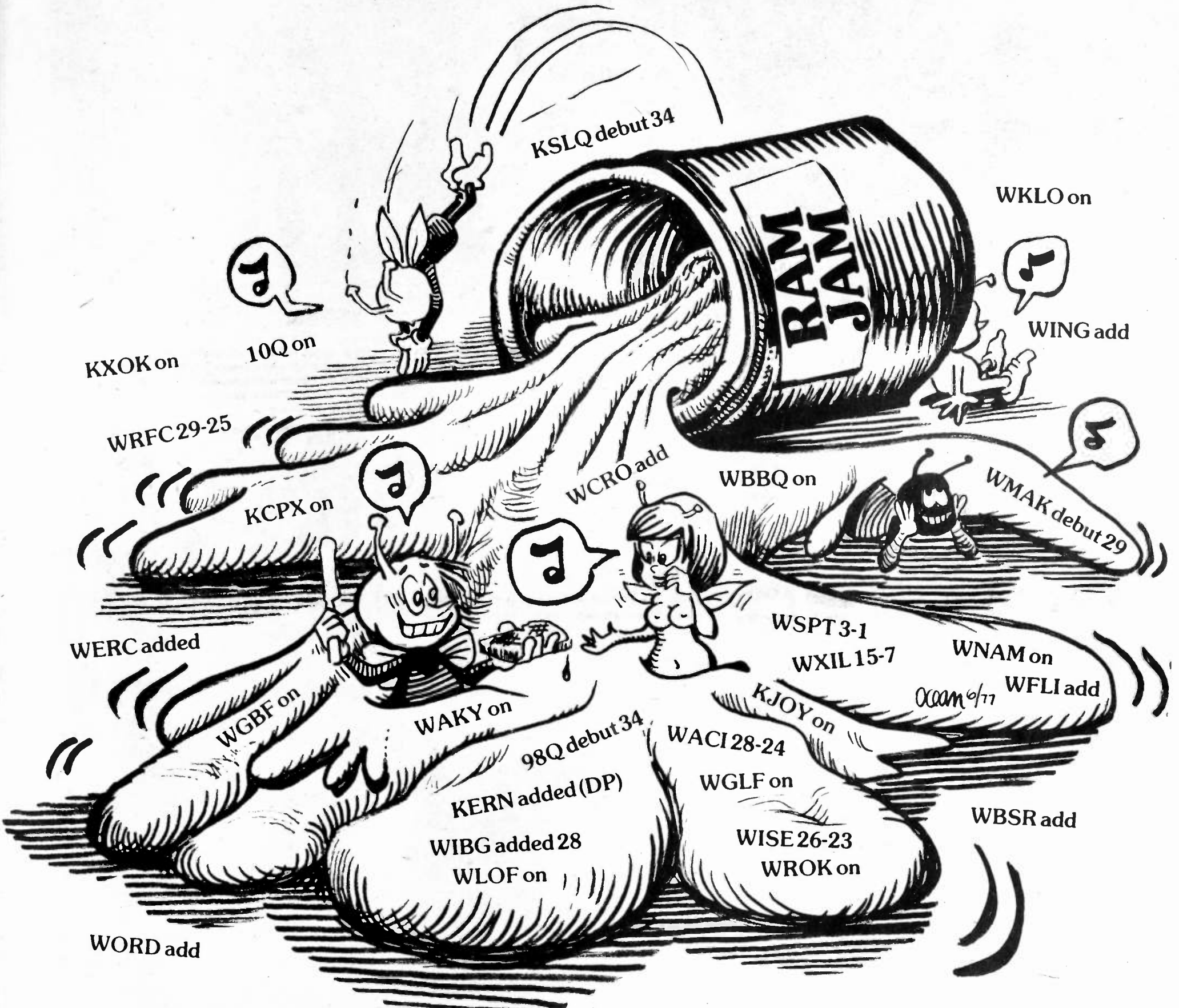

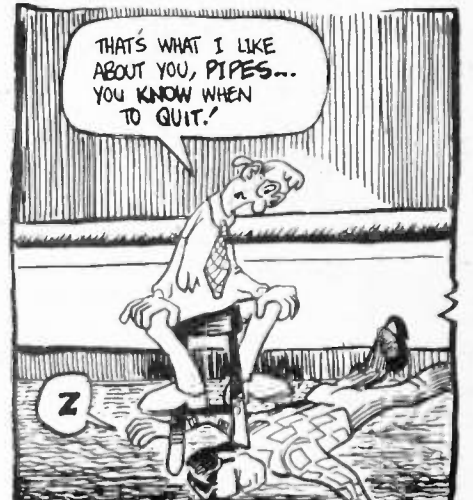

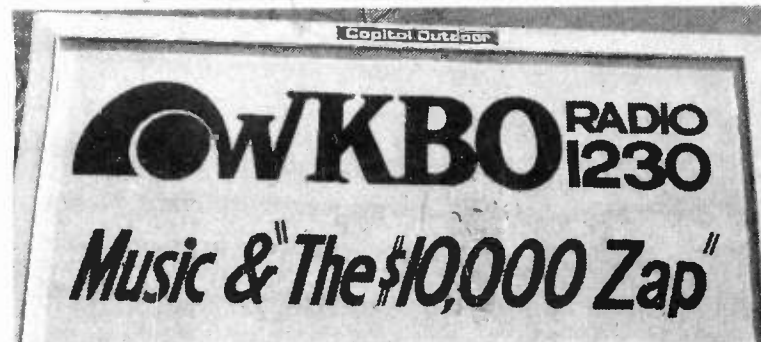

Call For Quality Promo Records

R&R:

May of us who have the responsibility of determining what a radio station sounds like are very concerned with the technical quality as well as the content of the product. Therefore, we strongly endorse Christy Wright of RKO for her expression of dissatisfaction with the quality level of current records. Here at WCLR (Pop/Adult-Chicago), we have gone to fantastic lengths to compensate for bad pressings, bad mastering, etc. Although we, of course, have never not played a hit because of poor quality, we have many times decided not to add LP cuts due to lack of fidelity. And probably more important to the record companies, one of our considerations in selecting new records to add is definitely the quality of the recording—mastering—pressing process. We would like to offer what we consider to be a more reasonable approach to a solution than supplying promo copies on tape at 15 ips. (The tape approach, especially for stereo FM's holds many more potential dangers than exist now with the record system). Such labels as A&M, Warner Bros. and Elektra/Asylum more often than not release product that accurately demonstrates the capabilities of the state of the art. The point here being that records can certainly be relied upon to deliver high fidelity if it is important to the record company. We would like the record companies to understand that every major radio station, almost regardless of format, utilizes a high degree of audio processing. If 0 db is referenced against 100% modulation, a signal at a -6 db represents a 50% decrease in modulation. It of course, behooves the radio station to maintain the highest average level of modulation, because the higher the modulation—the louder the radio station. The dynamic range can be extended downward only so far before it approaches (or gets lost in) the noise level of the record. The simple fact is, a dynamic range of 30 db or greater is unusable. A reduced dynamic range for promo copies of records seems to us to be the most reasonable answer to what we believe is a serious issue.

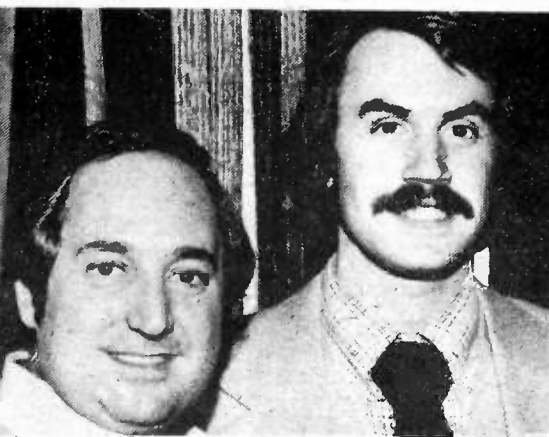

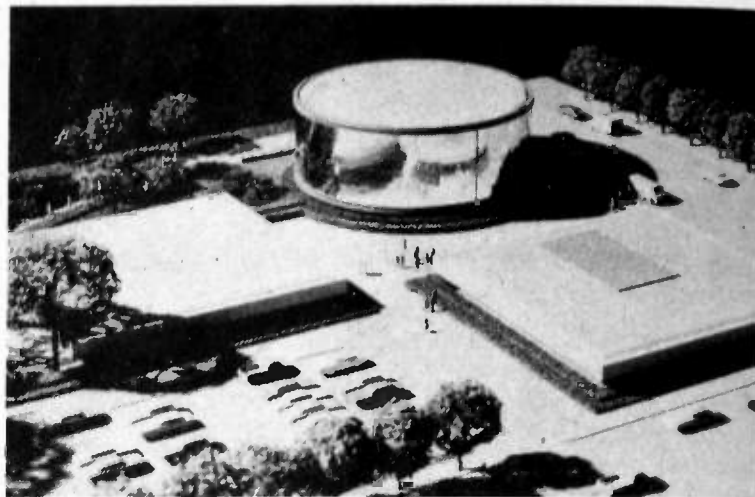

I hope you all had a pleasant three day holiday last weekend (that is, if you were able to get away from the station/office). Shortened weeks and Arbitrons that have yet-to-come-out sort of create a calm in radio marked by a twinge of anxiety and a breath of disciplined optimism. It won't be long until everything returns to its usual state of unpredictable normalcy.

WBCN In Changes

The new 1977 version of WBCN/Boston, one of the nation's top profile AOR radio stations, is near completion. Leading names of the station's rich history are comfortably re-rooted in other markets, former PD Norm Winer as an air personality on KSAN/San Francisco and former MD Bob Slavik as Music Director and air personality on the new WIYY/Baltimore. Air personality Maxanne Sartori has entered the record business and is largely responsible for the turntable success thus far chalked up by Capitol recording artists Mink DeVille.

This week saw two more familiar names join the ranks of "former WBCN'ers." Music Director Ellen Darst has resigned her position with the station. She'll be announcing her plans for the future within the next 10 days. Also, Steven Clean, one of the legendary air personality figures of Progressive/AOR radio resigned his afternoon drive airshift on the station.

John Brodey, WBCN's 7-midnight personality has been upped to Music Director. He'll temporarily maintain the airshift.

Matt Siegel has joined the station to do morning drive. He was most recently doing freelance voice work in Los Angeles. Before that he was with KWFM/Tucson.

Tommy Hedges moves from mornings to afternoons on the air.

After initially being beset by union labor difficulties, which have since been untangled, WBCN Program Director Bob Shannon claims to be satisfied with the progress made by the station thus far under his relatively new administration.

Shannon told R&R, "What I'm trying to do is eliminate the abrasive elements on the station. Each show is no longer a separate entity, but part of the station whole. We're making such adjustments as moving specials to more conducive time slots. I've trimmed the record library down from about 25,000 albums to a more workable number...approximately 7,000 to 8,000." Shannon went on to explain, "I have total respect for the image and character of WBCN. Our job now is to make it reflect 1977 as accurately as it once reflected 1968. In the past 2 months the station has become intensely more listenable."

Too Old To Rock & Roll... Too Young To Leave

TRIAD (WXFM)/Chicago General Manager Rob Gillis informed us that after 8 years, Program Director Saul Smalzys is hanging up his headphones and leaving the PD position of the station. His last program (5/31) was on his 30th birthday. Saul, who "can't talk to the kids no more," will remain with the organization, devoting his full time efforts to the TRIAD monthly magazine. Sounds a bit like "Logan's Run."

Rick Brown, formerly with Peaches Records in Dallas and one time music researcher for KSLQ/St. Louis has been appointed the new Program Director/air personality of TRIAD.

Gillis told R&R, "TRIAD will remain basically the same, however, the station's music will become a bit harder. We are going to be more of a Rock and Roll station than we've been."

Evolution

According to KLUC-AM-FM/Las Vegas Program Director Dave Van Stone, the Top 40 facility will be "splitting" come November with the FM going AOR. That'll make it two AOR's for Las Vegas. Ken Rundle, a former KZEW/Dallas PD has joined KFWD/Dallas to do 7-midnight. CORRECTION: Steve Sutton will be doing noon-3pm on KFWD and not "afternoon drive" as reported last week. Century Broadcasting National PD Bob Burch has appointed Charlie Kendall Music Director of KWST/Los Angeles. Tawnya Townsend is the new Programming Assistant at WYDD/Pittsburgh. Nick Owens has moved from the Program Directorship of WYXE/Madison to Operations Manager of WJKL/Elgin. Alan Young has been upped from MD to PD of WYXE. Jon Scott has been upped from MD to Program Director of KATT (FM100)/Oklahoma City. CASEY STANGL has resigned the Program Directorship of KZOZ/San Luis Obispo to join KSJO/San Jose where he will do weekends and production. Bob B. Blue has joined the airstaff of KMET/Los Angeles. Carpha Colwell exits the 5-9pm shift on WHFS/Washington D.C. after 7 1/2 years.

Color

Undeafed: That's the record thus far for the WOUR/Utica softball team, "The Celler Dwellers."

Weather Contest: KZOK/Seattle asked listeners to guess the average temperature of the day preceding the Weather Report concert. Prizes included albums, T-shirts, and, of course, concert tickets.

Friday The 13th: KGOT/Anchorage gave away albums all day to show people how lucky they can be.

Charles River Festival: WCAS/Cambridge broadcast the event from the river's side.

55,000 Tickets were sold to WDAI/Chicago's forthcoming "Superbowl of Rock" at Soldiers Field. The station, which is "officially" presenting the event (starring ELP, J. Geils, Foghat, and the Climax Blues Band) will be providing shuttle busses between the parking lot and the stadium.

Another Homegrown Album coming from WEBN/Cincinnati. This one will be called "The 2nd WEBN Album Project." Music for the project is currently being collected. The first one raised \$5,000 for the United Appeal.

DC101/Washington D.C. handed out Led Zeppelin concert tickets around town to people spotted wearing the station's official T-shirts.

KRST/Albuquerque is planning to distribute "KRST Baseball Caps." According to Program Director Bill Stambaugh, "Baseball caps are going to soon be very 'in' in AOR."

WGVL/Gainesville (the home of Lee Arnold) has set up a 24 hour a day telephone information line. It runs the gamut from concert info to rape victim help. The station is also running a Cat Stevens promotion. The jocks go on the air and make certain statements. Listeners then call and tell IZ IT SO (T or F). If they are right they win Cat's album.

Y93/San Francisco presented Chilliwack for a buck in their "Rising Star" concert series.

Works: WKDF/Nashville tied in with the ELP concert there by giving away albums, T-shirts, concert tickets, and a grand prize of limo, dinner, tickets, and an ELP library.

Dr. Demento presented an entire hour of his Memorial Day program on KMET/Los Angeles to the comedy of Christmas.

Bluegrass: WKQQ/Lexington kicked off their series of free outdoor Sunday concerts featuring local talent. The first one drew some 8,000 Rock and Bluegrass fans from across the state. We asked Program Director Dick Hungate if the grass is really blue in Kentucky. His reply: "Kentucky is the nation's largest producer of limestone. It's all that lime in the soil that does, indeed, turn the grass blue."

Lee Masters, Station Manager of WLRS/Louisville, is looking for any AOR radio station top album and album cut lists. He's already got KLOS/Los Angeles' "Top 200" and WKDF/Nashville's "Top 300." A&M recording artists Supertramp seem to have a tremendous following in that city, which goes back to the days when Ray was at KFIG and was one of the first PD's in the country to give them a real shot. At the group's recent sell-out concert at Sellard Arena (2 shows, 8,000 each), where Ray just happened to be in the audience, Supertramp's sax player John Helliwell took the microphone and did a whole bit about how if it weren't for Ray Appleton, the group wouldn't be where they are today. Then Helliwell asked the crowd, "You do remember him, don't you?" The crowd responded with a resounding positive. Ray, who had no idea that this was going to happen, was moved to the verge of tears. Then Supertramp member Roger Hodgson dedicated the song "Babaji" to Ray and the tribute was complete.

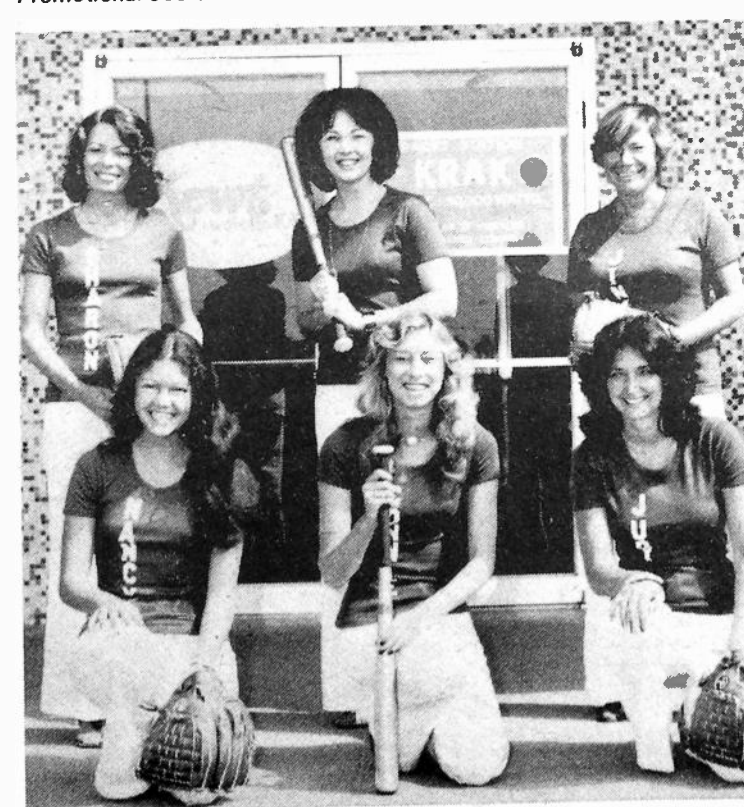
