## Media Policy and Procedures

The athletics communications office is located in the press box on west side of the Walkup Skydome. The phone number is (928) 523-6792 while the fax number is 523-6793.

### MEDIA OPPORTUNITY

Head coach Jerome Souers is available every day after practice. Individual players may be requested at this time also. Special requests for availability may be made to the athletics communications office.

### INTERVIEW POLICY

All player interviews must be coordinated through the athletics communications office at least one day in advance. No interviews or photo shoots will be conducted on Friday. Out-of-town media should contact the athletics communications office to make arrangements for phone interviews. Players are also available for interviews after practice, and, if prior arrangements have been made, before practice. The NAU locker room and training room are closed.

### SOUERS' INTERVIEWS

Jerome Souers and his staff are generally available for interviews after each practice. Contact Denise Thompson in the athletics communications office to coordinate all interviews with head coach Jerome Souers.

### PRACTICE

Daily workouts are open to both the public and the media unless otherwise noted. Media planning to attend practice should notify the athletics communications office in advance to confirm start times and to arrange interviews. The Lumberjacks are tentatively planning to practice at 3 p.m. on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday of each game week.

### CREDENTIALS

The football press box, located on the west side of the Skydome, has a limited capacity. Credentials will be issued only to working media on a first-come, first-serve basis, with priority given to daily newspapers and originating radio and television crews. The press box is closed to those not involved in game coverage.

Credentials may be requested for the season or on a per-game basis. All requests should be submitted to the athletics communications office no later than Thursday at noon for each home game. Requests on official letterhead may be faxed to (928) 523-6793. Credentials may be picked up at Will Call. No credentials will be mailed unless the request is made at least two weeks in advance.

### PHOTOGRAPHERS

Photographers and videographers are not permitted between the 25-yard lines. All media on the sidelines must wear their credentials at all times. Due to space limits, credentials will be issued only to photographers on assignment.

Packets including game notes, flip cards and game programs will be issued before each game. Late roster changes will also be available.

### PRESS BOX SERVICES

Regular services on game day include play-by-play, quarterly and final statistics, as well as defensive statistics. A light pregame meal will be available one hour prior to kickoff.

The NAU locker room is closed to all media. At home, postgame interviews will be held in the media room at field level on the east side of the Skydome. NAU head coach Jerome Souers will begin the session followed by requested Lumberjack players. Interview requests will be collected midway through the fourth quarter by a member of the athletics communications staff. Visiting coaches and players will be invited to the interview room as deadlines allow.

### TELEPHONES

Two courtesy phone lines are available for the originating station of each visiting team at no charge. The visiting radio booth is located on the north end of the press box. An outside line may be reached by dialing 8. A credit card must be used for long-distance calls.

A limited number of telephones are available in the press box. Dial 8 to reach an outside line. A credit card is required for long-distance calls. Athletics communications office personnel will provide fax services if requested in advance.

### MOUNTAIN STANDARD TIME

Arizona does not move its clock ahead in the spring or back in the fall. As a result, Flagstaff time coincides with the Pacific time zone through Nov. 4. The rest of the season, NAU is compatible with the Mountain time zone.

### LUMBERJACKS ONLINE

Releases, statistics, rosters and breaking news are available at the athletics web site, located at [www.nauathletics.com](http://www.nauathletics.com). The Big Sky Conference web site is located at [www.bigskyconf.com](http://www.bigskyconf.com). Big Sky TV will webcast all NAU home games and all conference games during the season.

### THE SCORE

The Score is a monthly show produced by NAU Television Services that highlights Lumberjack athletics and recreational activities on the Mountain campus. It airs weekly on FSN Arizona, Fox College Sports and Flagstaff cable channels 4 and 104 in HD.



Grenax Broadcasting II, LLC and Northern Arizona University signed a three-year extension in 2011 for 105.1 FM The Big Talker (KBTk) to carry all NAU football and men's basketball game broadcasts for the 2011-2014 academic years. Selected women's basketball games will also be aired on the station.

NAU fans can listen to the games online at BigTalkerradio.com or on their iPhone, Blackberry, or Android smartphone via our free mobile application. The mobile applications extend the worldwide reach of the broadcasts that already blanket northern Arizona. The flagship station of the Lumberjack Radio Network allows listeners in Flagstaff, Prescott, Camp Verde, Williams, Winslow and Sedona to tune into 105.1 The Big Talker to hear Mitch Strohmman's colorful play-by-play.

In addition to 105.1 The Big Talker Grenax Broadcasting II LLC owns and operates four FM radio stations in the Flagstaff-Prescott markets: 105.1 The Big Talker (KBTk), the NAU Athletics Flagship and home to Glenn Beck, Rush Limbaugh and Sean Hannity; The Big 107.5 KOLT Country 107.5 (KSED), featuring Big D and Bubba in the morning and 20 songs in a row all day; 96.7 The Wolf (KWMX), home of Bob and Tom in the morning and 92.5 The Canyon (KFLX) with Dan Kennedy in the morning and Ryan Seacrest's "On-Air" weekday mornings at 10:00 a.m.



## Mitch Strohmman

*Voice of the Lumberjacks*

Veteran announcer Mitch Strohmman returns for his ninth consecutive season and 14th overall as the "Voice of the Lumberjacks" for football and men's basketball on the Lumberjack Television/Radio Network. Strohmman also handles play-by-play duties for selected women's basketball, soccer and volleyball games.

More than 30 radio games during the season are simulcast by NAU-TV, who distributes the games in full HD to Suddenlink Flagstaff Cable channels 4 and 104, Fox Sports Arizona, Fox College Sports (FCS) and the live, online channel: <http://www.nau-tv.com/watchlive/>. Strohmman is also the host of the monthly show produced by NAU-TV, "The Score". "The Score" airs on Fox Sports Arizona and Fox College Sports, as well as Suddenlink Flagstaff Cable channels 4 and 104.



## Kevin Stephens

*Football Color Commentator*

Kevin Stephens begins his ninth season as the color commentator for the Sodexo Lumberjack Radio Network.

Stephens played quarterback at Northern Arizona in 1995-96 after a standout career at Cactus High School in Glendale, AZ where he was named All-Arizona his senior year, and a stint

at BYU-Idaho (formerly Ricks College). He helped the Vikings to their first undefeated season in school history and a second-place national finish in the NJCAA in 1992.



The Northern Arizona football program will have seven of its 11 regular season games televised during the 2013 season, highlighted by four games by NAU-TV and distributed to Fox Sports Arizona Plus and Fox College Sports. The Lumberjacks opener at the University of Arizona will air on the Pac-12 Network, while ROOT Sports has picked up NAU's game vs. Montana. The NAU game at Montana State will be shown on Max Media.

### NAU-TV

NAU-TV will again partner with NAU Athletics and televise almost 30 events from the Northern Arizona University campus in 2013-14. NAU-TV will show all its coverage to full high definition for the second season, while broadcasting all their events online and distributing to Fox Sports Arizona, Fox College Sports (available to 54 million cable subscribers in the United States) and local Flagstaff cable.

The first of four NAU-TV football broadcasts will be the NAU-South Dakota football game on Saturday, Sept. 21. All four games will be picked up nationally by Fox Sports Arizona Plus and shown online on the NAU-TV and Big Sky TV web streams. It will also be shown locally on Suddenlink cable on CH. 4.

Mitch Strohmman and Kevin Stephens will call all the football action with Reggie Eccleston providing sideline updates.

### ROOT SPORTS

DIRECTV Sports Networks will telecast 10 Big Sky Conference games during the 2013 football season on the ROOT SPORTS branded regional sports networks. The three ROOT SPORTS networks reach more than 8.7 million viewers across 18 states, including Oregon, Washington, Montana, Idaho, Utah and Colorado that are home to most Big Sky institutions.

DIRECTV Sports Networks will produce and televise all 10 Big Sky Conference football games in high-definition. DIRECTV Sports Networks will also introduce new on-air graphics customized for the Big Sky Conference and each of its individual teams. ROOT SPORTS will televise 8 of the 13 Big Sky Conference football teams at least once, and air contests from nine Big Sky stadiums.

# Season Outlook

*The Lumberjacks will be an experience loaded team at every position...*

The 2013 season is all about unfinished business for the Northern Arizona football team. Under the guidance of head coach Jerome Souers, Northern Arizona finished the 2012 season with an 8-3 overall record – the best finish by a Souers team in over a decade. The Lumberjacks finished with the school's highest final ranking (20th The Sports Network/20th FCS Coaches) since 2003. NAU lost their final two games of the season, and along with it a chance at the Big Sky regular season title and a bid to the playoffs. Despite an unfavorable end to last season, the Lumberjacks have a lot to look forward to in 2013, as they will return nine players on offense, and nine players on defense. NAU will have one of the most experienced teams in the Big Sky.

The Lumberjacks return 14 Big Sky All-Conference performers, and have signed 19 players in the offseason. The mix of returners and newcomers will provide for a very competitive season for Northern Arizona.

"We're excited that we have guys at every position that come back with experience, including the young guys that we project to be starters next year," said Souers. "We have a very balanced team."

## The Offense

The Lumberjacks will look to find a new leader for their offense after the graduation of quarterback Cary Grossart. He finished his career with the second-best completion percentage by an NAU quarterback in school history, but Northern Arizona has a few options to replace Grossart.

"We believe that we have narrowed it down to two players for the quarterback spot," said Souers. "Due to Chase's (Cartwright) surgery he was unable to compete in scrimmages in the spring. We were however able to evaluate some younger guys and Kyren Poe stood out to us. He showed some tremendous poise in the pocket, and he got better with each practice. We will extend the competition to the end of the fall so that we have enough live competition to truly measure Chase against the progress that Kyren has made. We're excited that we have two guys that can play."

Running back Zach Bauman – a 2013 College Football Performance Awards FCS Running Back Watch List honoree – returns for his senior season. Bauman has rushed for 1,000-plus yards each of his previous three seasons and is only 119 yards shy of breaking the Lumberjack career rushing record. He should undoubtedly finish as one of the Top 10 rushers in Big Sky history.

"Zach is a fierce competitor and a tremendous leader by example," said Souers. "His tenacity as a ball carrier is evident every time he touches the ball."

A returner to watch out for at the running back position is Casey Jahn. He finished third on the team in rushing in 2012 with 306 yards in eight games.

An up-and-coming player that can provide more depth at the running back position is freshman Corbin Jountti. The Bakersfield, Calif. native was a 2013 U.S. Army Arena Bowl participant and a two-time first-team all-league choice.

“Corbin is likely to contribute,” Souers said. “He’s very athletic and physical. I don’t see the college game being as big a step for him as it is for some young men at that age.”

The wide receivers will be led by seniors Dejzon Walker and Ify Umodu. Walker led the Lumberjacks with 505 yards on 36 catches, while Umodu had 35 catches for a total of 481 yards.

Tight ends R.J. Rickert and Drew Emanuel will be another asset to the throwing game. Rickert tallied 272 yards on 27 receptions, while Emanuel tallied 140 yards on eight catches.

“It’s extremely important to have returners back at the receiving position,” said Souers. “Not just because of their experience, but also cause of their depth.”

Another solid spot for the Lumberjacks will be at the line. NAU has four starters from a year ago - Shane Moniz, Roy Garcia, Joe Gurski and Kyle Walker - who will all return in 2013.

With a plethora of returners on offense, the Lumberjacks will have an outstanding run game, and a lot of quality offensive linemen. The Lumberjack backfield will be loaded, but it will also be essential for Northern Arizona to throw the ball, because defenses will play the Lumberjacks heavy against the run.

## The Defense

Nine of the Lumberjacks’ 14 all-conference selections come on

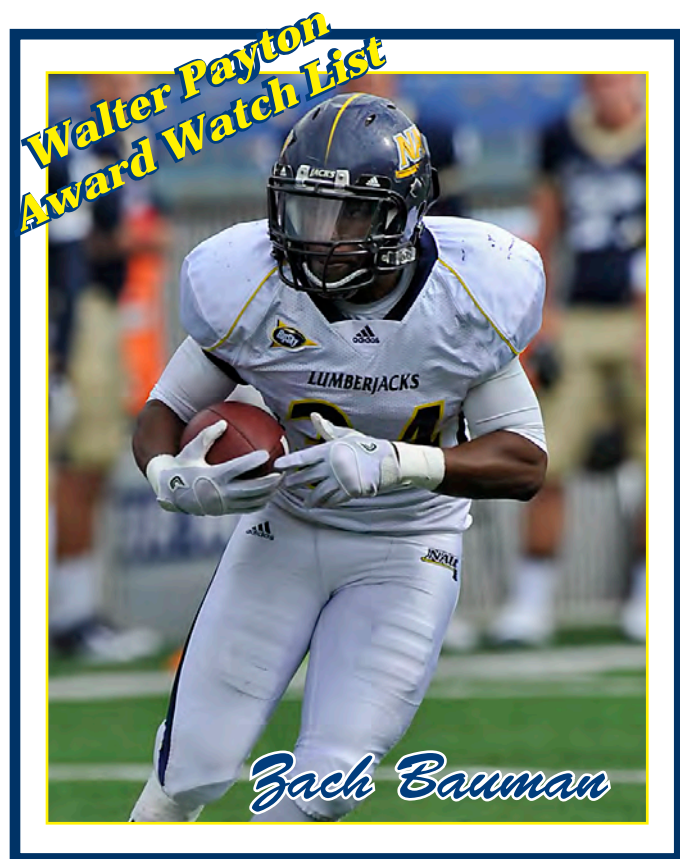
the defensive side of the ball. The deep and experienced unit finished second in the Big Sky last season in total defense.

“We had a lot of young guys that had emerged throughout the years where their development and reputation in practice finally caught up to them,” said Souers. “Now that all of those guys will be seniors in the fall, we will be loaded with veterans. I believe they will be the cornerstone for our football team.”

Earning preseason recognition is Tim Wilkinson, an All-Big Sky second team honoree last season. He was second on the team in 2012 with 6.5 sacks. Wilkinson played in all but one game last year, but the senior from Las Vegas looks to lead a group of linemen that are known for their size and capabilities. Others to watch are Chima Ike, Steven Garcia and Marc Thompson.

Anders Battle, an all-conference first team honoree, is set to return at the cornerback position for the Lumberjacks. Battle registered 64 tackles and was credited with six pass breakups last year. Another player who has stepped up at the field corner position is Marcus Alfred. His speed will be a valuable asset to the defense which gives NAU added depth in all the right places.

Lucky Dozier is another bright spot for the NAU defense. A preseason All-American safety, Dozier recorded 57 tackles and a team-high four interceptions. Joining Dozier at the safety position will be Mike Dosen and Blair Wishom.

“Dozier, Dosen and Wishom are probably three of the best safeties I have ever coached,” said Souers. “We’ve had some guys be very successful at those positions, and I believe our secondary is as talented as we’ve ever had.”

Linebackers Austin Hasquet and Ryan Reardon are both returning starters who tallied 61 and 41 tackles, respectively.

## The Special Teams

All-American Andy Wilder will kick off his senior year with a heap of awards under his belt. The Scottsdale native led the nation in punting with 46.3 yards per punt with 25 punts of 50 yards or more last season. He was connected on 10-of-14 field goal attempts. In 2013, Wilder will handle two of the three kicking duties – field goals and punts.

Austin Shanks was a valuable return specialist for NAU last season, as he was named the 2012 CFPA Punt Returner of the Year. Shanks completed his eligibility in 2012 leaving the Lumberjacks with a spot to fill. NAU has yet to assign a replacement for Shanks, as it will use all of preseason to determine who will get the role.

## The Schedule

“It’s a unique schedule. We come into camp, and within the first few weeks we have a game,” said Souers. “The following week we have a bye, so we have to do a lot with our team to keep them competitive and sharp without wearing them down.”

Northern Arizona will play a total of 11 games – five at home in the Walkup Skydome and six on the road. The Lumberjacks open the season at the University of Arizona on August 30. Other road games include, UC Davis (Sept. 14), Montana State (Oct. 5), Sacramento State (Oct. 12), Cal Poly (Oct. 26), and Southern Utah (Nov. 23). Northern Arizona will host South Dakota (Sept. 21), Montana (Sept. 28), Idaho State (Oct. 19), North Dakota (Nov. 2), and Northern Colorado (Nov. 16).

## Season Notes

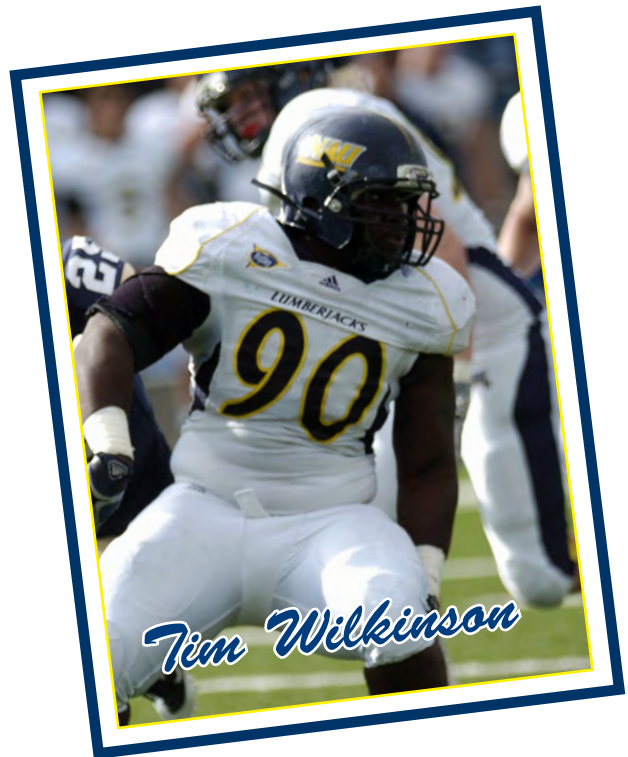
### *Sweet 16*

With nine winning seasons under his belt, the Dean of the Big Sky coaches looks to take the Lumberjacks to new heights.

### *Familiar Coaching Staff*

The Lumberjacks have 10 out of 11 coaches returning for the 2013 season. The newest guy to the crew is wide receivers coach Tim Plough who was hired in February of 2013. Plough (pronounced 'PLOW') joins the Lumberjack staff after a 10-year playing and coaching career at UC Davis under head coach Bob Biggs. # Head Coach Jerome Souers

**16th Season • Oregon '83**

Head coach Jerome Souers is entering his 16th season at the helm of the Northern Arizona football program. Souers, the longest tenured football coach in the history of the program, ranks third all-time in Big Sky history with 84 career victories.

Souers and his team posted an 8-3 overall record in 2012, the best performance since the 2003 season. The record includes tying a school record eight consecutive wins which was sparked by a 17-14 win at UNLV. Included in the win streak was a 28-24 defeat over No. 14 Montana. The win snapped a 14-game losing streak to the Grizzlies and propelled NAU into the top 25 poll. The Lumberjacks had 22 players earn All-Big Sky honors, and three receive All-American accolades. Senior Austin Shank was named the College Football Performance Awards FCS Punt Returner of the Year.

While at NAU, Souers has led the Lumberjacks to a record-breaking NCAA I-AA Quarterfinal appearance in 2003, and its first Big Sky Conference title since 1978. The Lumberjacks have also recorded two playoff berths and posted nine winning seasons. During his 15-year tenure, Souers has coached 141 student-athletes to all-conference honors a combined 218 times with 48 first-team selections and 48 All-Americans accolades.

Souers, who was named the 1999 Big Sky Conference Coach of the Year, also has the Lumberjacks posting impressive results in the classroom. The football program has produced the Golden Eagle Scholar Athlete of the Year seven times (Blair Boynton, Eric Damko, Steve Gomez, Mark Gould, Paul Ernster, Jeff Wheeler and Jake Hess) and had 11 student-athletes named to the 2012 Big Sky Fall All-Academic team. Overall, the program has earned 133 Big Sky academic honors over the last 15 seasons. There have also been six Academic All-Americans, as well.

Souers increased the program's Academic Progress Rate, a real-time measure of eligibility, retention and graduation of student-athletes, five straight academic years (872 to 953) and had the highest multi-year rate in the Big Sky Conference in 2011, earning the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Athletics Directors Association APR Award. The award is given to the highest APR score in each of the 14 FCS conferences.

The 2003 season saw Souers become a finalist for the

Eddie Robinson Award, an award presented by The Sports Network to the top head coach in I-AA football.

Behind the play of true freshman Big Sky Offensive Player of the Year Jason Murrietta, the Lumberjacks upset top-seeded McNeese State on the road and played host to the first home playoff game since 1996 with a quarterfinal appearance against Florida Atlantic. NAU finished ranked 10th in the national polls as Souers' players were honored on and off the field for their performances. Eighteen players were recognized with All-Big Sky honors highlighted by first-team All-America accolades for punter

Mark Gould, who was recognized by five different organizations. Gould led the accolades off the field, too. He was a CoSIDA Academic All-America selection for the second consecutive season as NAU led the nation with five CoSIDA academic all-district selections.

In 2006, Murrietta led a reemergence that produced significant improvements in the offensive production, resulting in a winning season with six wins and ranking among the top turnarounds in the country. Murrietta had a stellar senior season highlighted by a runner-up finish for the Walter Payton Award, All-America honors and his second Big Sky Conference Offensive Player of the Year award. He threw for 2,827 yards with a 65.0 completion percentage and a school-record 34 touchdowns, leading the Big Sky in passing efficiency (168.2) and total offense (243.1), while ranking fifth and 11th nationally.

Souers arrived in Flagstaff after spending 12 years at Montana with a proven track record. His last eight seasons in Missoula he served as defensive coordinator. During his stay with the Grizzlies, Montana was transformed from a Big Sky also-ran into a perennial league and national title contender. Souers' tenure in Missoula produced 12 straight winning seasons, seven playoff berths, four appearances in the national semifinals, a national runner-up finish (1996) and a national title (1995). Montana won three Big Sky titles during that span.

Souers showed his winning touch from the start in January 1998 when he took over a program in limbo, becoming the first NAU coach since Dwain Painter in 1979 to begin his career with a winning record.

Despite dressing only 44 players for his first spring practice, including walk-ons, Souers led the Lumberjacks to a winning season. Highlights from Souers' first season at NAU included the Lumberjacks' first shutout of a Division I opponent (NAU 9, Cal Poly 0) in 31 games, two near road victories against league title contenders Eastern Washington and Montana State and a season-ending two-game winning streak.

In 2001, the Lumberjacks posted one of the nation's most improved records, recording an 8-4 mark to tie for second place in the Big Sky Conference. NAU earned a berth in the I-AA playoffs for the second time in school history before dropping a 34-31 decision at Sam Houston State in the first round.

The success of the NAU football team in 2001 was evident in the accolades bestowed on the program. Fifteen student-athletes were recognized with All-Big Sky Conference honors. All-Big Sky first-team selections linebacker Keith O'Neil signed as a free agent with the Dallas Cowboys and won a Super Bowl title with the Indianapolis Colts in his fourth year in the NFL. Senior tackle Eric Damko was named to the Verizon Academic All-America squad for the second consecutive season.

Jerome Souers was born May 20, 1958, in Oregon. He attended North Eugene High School, along with another future coach, Danny Ainge of the Phoenix Suns.

He began his coaching career while still attending Oregon. Souers spent time on the staff at North Eugene High School and Willamette, working in the same area of the state where his father, Dwight, was a successful prep coach. Souers earned his degree in physical education in 1983 and upon graduation returned to the high-school ranks. He spent eight years coaching in Oregon high schools before making the move into college football.

In 1984 he made his foray into the collegiate ranks, joining the staff at Western Washington where he coordinated the defense and coached the defensive backs.

A year later, Souers joined Don Read's staff at then-Division II Portland State. After one year serving as the Viking's running backs coach, Souers followed Read to Montana.

With Souers coaching the secondary, the new staff in Missoula produced records of 6-4 and 6-5 during its first two years. A hint of things to come came in 1988 when the Grizzlies went 8-4 and led the Big Sky Conference in all defensive categories.

In 1989, Souers added defensive coordinator to his duties and the Grizzlies posted an 11-2 record with an appearance in the national semifinals. Montana also tied a national interception record in one game with 10 picks vs. Boise State. A year later, the Grizzlies opened the 1990 campaign with a 22-15 road win at Oregon State.

During Souers' nine years as defensive coordinator at Montana, the Grizzlies twice ranked among the nation's top-10 in rushing defense, finishing third in the country in that category in 1992. His last unit in Missoula led the Big Sky Conference in

scoring defense.

The peak years during Souers' stay at Montana came from 1993 to 1996. During that period, the Grizzlies made four straight playoff appearances, played in three semifinals and two national title games. The 1995 squad won the national title and the 1996 team was the NCAA runner-up. The four-year record for Montana during that time was 48-8.

During the national title run, Souers' defense became the first in NCAA history to post consecutive playoff shutouts (Eastern Kentucky and Georgia Southern).

He coached six All-America defensive backs at Montana, including future NFL stars Tim Hauck of the Seattle Seahawks and Blaine McElmurry of the Green Bay Packers.

In 1996, when head coach Mick Dennehy was sidelined after undergoing major surgery, Souers stepped in as head coach and led the Grizzlies to victories over Cal State Northridge and Portland State.

Souers and his wife, Paula, have two daughters, Anna and Alaina.

# Defensive Coordinator/Linebackers Coach Andy Thompson

## Ninth Season • Montana '04

Andy Thompson begins his fifth season as the defensive coordinator and seventh overall as the linebackers coach at Northern Arizona University. He is entering his ninth season overall on the staff after spending his first two seasons across the line of scrimmage directing the running backs.

Thompson, who has coached 27 student-athletes to 36 All-Big Sky honors at NAU, produced his best unit in 2010 with one of the top defenses in the Big Sky. The Lumberjacks led the league in scoring defense (19.8), rushing defense (93.5) and sacks (33), while ranking second overall in total defense (306.6) and pass defense (213.1). The Lumberjacks ranked fifth nationally in rush defense and among the FCS Top 25 in sacks (10th), total defense (14th) and pass defense (22nd).

Linebacker Reid Worthington and defensive lineman Isaac Bond were both named to the All-Big Sky first team. NAU upset previously ninth-ranked Montana State, which led the Big Sky and ranked second in the FCS in total offense at 516.2 yards per game. The Bobcats were held to just 19 yards in the first half and 123 yards for the game.

The 2012 season turned out to be another solid year for the Lumberjack defense. They finished the year first in the Big Sky in pass defense (203.7), and ranked second in scoring defense (23.6) and total defense (342.5). NAU finished 37th in total defense and 38th in rushing defense.

Cornerback Anders Battle and safety Lucky Dozier earned All-Big Sky first team honors, while defensive tackle Tim Wilkinson was voted to the second team.

In 2011, NAU was third in rushing defense (35th in the FCS) and scoring defense in the conference and ranked fifth overall in the Big Sky in total defense. Bond was named to the All-Big Sky first team for the second consecutive season after recording a team-best 7.5 tackles for loss (third in the Big Sky). Linebacker Scott McKeever closed out his career with his second all-conference honor.

Thompson was promoted to defensive coordinator prior to the 2009 season, replacing longtime coordinator Corey Batoon. The Lumberjacks played hard throughout the season despite dealing with 14 student-athletes missing games during the season due to injury. The Lumberjacks ranked third in the Big Sky and 35th in the nation in rushing defense, holding opponents to less than 100 yards rushing five times. NAU was at its best in conference games, ranking second overall allowing 352.9 yards per game against the Big Sky.

Returning senior Matt Estrada led six defensive players on the All-Big Sky team, including linebackers Stevon Thomas (second), who ranked second on the team in tackles with 75, and Reid

Worthington (HM).

Thompson helped tutor a defense that led the FCS and ranked second in Division I overall in rushing defense allowing just 59.8 yards per game in 2008. NAU held four opponents to negative yards rushing and a fifth to just 21 on the game. For the season, NAU allowed 658 yards on 307 carries (2.1 yards per carry) with 99 plays for zero or negative yardage on the season, including 72 for a loss on the season. It reset the NAU and Big Sky Conference records for rushing defense and yards allowed in a season.

Thompson's linebackers were among the tackle leaders on the squad, producing four of the top 10 tacklers led by Anthony Llanos. Cody Dowd earned All-Big Sky second team honors, while Stevon Thomas was an honorable mention selection.

He helped coach the special teams in 2007-08. The Lumberjacks ranked fourth in the nation in net punting and led the Big Sky Conference in kickoff coverage in 2007.

In his first season on the defensive staff, the linebackers were led by the 55 tackles by Joe Lyman. Sophomore Cody Dowd earned All-Big Sky honorable mention accolades, recording four tackles for loss among 35 tackles.

Thompson led a solid backfield group in 2006 that played a vital role in the offensive success of the squad. The Lumberjacks ranked second in the Big Sky in rushing per game at 137.9 with a league-best 3.9 yards per carry. NAU ranked first in scoring offense (34.4 points per game) and total offense (405.1), listed fifth and sixth respectively on the national charts.

Redshirt freshman Alex Henderson was a standout under Thompson's tutelage in 2006, earning Big Sky Conference Newcomer of the Year accolades. He was the first Lumberjack to capture the honor since former Payton Award winner Archie Amerson garnered the distinction in 1995.

Henderson, who became the first freshman in school history to rush for 1,000 yards in a season, led the team in rushing with 1,016 rushing yards on 189 carries with five touchdowns. He led the conference in all-purpose yards with a 126.3 per game average, the 30th-best total in the nation, and posted four 100-yard rushing games on the season highlighted by his 265-yard, two-touchdown performance at Eastern Washington, ranking as the seventh-best single-game rushing total in school history.

Thompson joined the NAU staff in 2005 as a graduate assistant, assisting with the running backs and other program related duties before being promoted to full-time status in 2006.

In his first season, senior Philo Sanchez led the team in rushing with 579 yards and two touchdowns. Classmate Ryan Williams led the team with three rushing touchdowns.

He coached at Eastern Oregon in 2004 under current assistant Travis Baker. At Eastern Oregon he tutored Nick Hannaw, a linebacker who signed as a free agent with the Indianapolis Colts. His special team punt and kickoff return units both ranked among the NAIA Top 10.

A native of Walla Walla, Wash., Thompson played for Montana for four seasons (1999, 2001-03). He helped the Grizzlies to five Big Sky Championships and one national championship (2001) during his five-year career in Missoula. He played in 44 career games with 103 total tackles, including 8.5 tackles for loss.

Thompson graduated with a degree in health enhancement from Montana in May 2004. He married the former Mikal Mickleson of Missoula, Mont., in the summer of 2008. They have a son, Mac.

## Offensive Coordinator/Quarterbacks Coach **Richard Scangarello**

**Second Season • Sacramento State '96**

Rich Scangarello enters his second season as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach after joining the Northern Arizona University staff in March of 2012.

In his first season with NAU, Scangarello helped mentor Cary Grossart who went on to finish his career with the top completion percentage in NAU history at 66.3. He also posted the second-best completion percentage in a season with 66.7. Overall, the Lumberjacks finished tied for 27th in the nation in scoring offense with an average of 31.6 points per game.

Scangarello served as the co-offensive coordinator at UC Davis for the 2008 season, leading an offense that ranked 11th in the Football Championship Subdivision in total offense at 426.5 yards per game, while scoring 28.5 points per game. He originally joined the Davis staff in 2005 as passing game coordinator and wide receivers coach, serving in that role from 2005-2007.

In 2005, he coached the most prolific wide receiver in UC Davis history in All-American Tony Kays, who led the NCAA in receptions with 93 while setting school marks for receptions and yards.

Scangarello was on the Oakland Raiders staff as the assistant quarterbacks coach and offensive quality control assistant for the 2009 season. He most recently served as the offensive coordinator, assistant head coach and quarterbacks coach at Millsaps College in Jackson, Miss. At Millsaps, he coached quarterback Garrett Pinciotti to All-SCAC second team honors after throwing for 2,200 yards and 23 touchdowns.

He also served on the Idaho staff for two stints in 2000

as offensive graduate assistant and 2002-03 as quarterbacks coach, coaching former NAU assistant Brian Lindgren during his collegiate career. Lindgren ranked among the top 20 passers in Division I in both 2002 and 2003 under his tutelage.

He began his coaching career in the UC Davis program in 1998 and 1999, working with two eventual NFL draft picks and consecutive consensus Division II All-Americans Kevin Daft and J.T. O'Sullivan.

A native of Roseville, Calif. and a 1990 graduate of Oakmont High School, Scangarello graduated from Sacramento State in 1996 with a degree in business administration.

## Defensive Line Coach Travis Baker

**Third Season • Suny College at Brockport '96**

Travis Baker enters his third season with Northern Arizona University as the defensive line coach. He joined the Lumberjack program in the spring of 2011.

The defensive line did not disappoint in 2012, as it ranked in the top five in the league in rushing defense. Leading the way were all-conference honorees Jarret Bilbrey and Tim Wilkinson for the second year in a row. Bilbrey tallied 61 tackles and seven sacks for a total of 41 yards. Wilkinson added 37 tackles and 6.5 sacks for 26 yards. Both Bilbrey and Wilkinson ranked in the top five in the Big Sky in sacks during conference play.

In 2011, the defensive front combined for 30 tackles for loss and 20 quarterback sacks while helping the team rank 35th in the Football Championship Subdivision against the rush in his first season. Senior Isaac Bond earned All-Big Sky first team honors after recording a team-best 7.5 tackles for loss (third in the Big Sky) with 4.0 sacks. Senior Blayne Anderson had a career-best year, ranking fifth on the team in tackles with seven tackles for loss. Senior Dan Pela was a CoSIDA Academic All-District choice. Returnees Tim Wilkinson and Jarrett Bilbrey both return after combining for over 60 tackles last season.

Baker was the defensive coordinator at Montana Western for the 2010 season. He served on the coaching staff at Eastern Oregon University from 2002-05, in La Grande, Ore. He was the defensive coordinator, working with the defensive line, safeties and special teams during his tenure. He was also the interim head coach during the 2004 season, hiring current NAU defensive coordinator Andy Thompson. Eastern's special team punt and kickoff

return units both ranked among the NAIA top 10.

Baker began his collegiate coaching career at Utah State under Head Coach Dave Arslanian (1999) and Mike Dennehy (2000-01) and coached with current NAU assistant David Reeves, working with the defensive line from 1999-01. Overall, he coached five student-athletes who earned all-conference honors with the Aggies. In 1999, two Aggie defensive linemen earned All-Big West accolades, including Vaea Fiefia, who was a second-team pick, and Doug Madoski, an honorable mention choice. In 2000, Nate Larsen earned honorable mention All-Big West honors and Nate Putnam was the only league freshman to earn All-Big West first-team conference honors. In 2001, DE Nick Onaindia signed with the Oakland Raiders after leading the team in tackles for loss.

Prior to coming to USU, Baker spent three years as an assistant coach at Lake Havasu (Ariz.) High School. In 1997 he coached the secondary, wide receivers and special teams and in 1998 he was the defensive coordinator, linebacker, special teams and receivers coach.

Baker was an all-county quarterback at Brockport (N.Y.) High School, while also playing basketball. Baker has also coached basketball and baseball at the high school level.

He earned a degree in physical education from Suny College at Brockport in 1996 and a master's of education in secondary education from Utah State in 2001.

# Defensive Backs Coach **Charles Huff**

**Third Season • Presbyterian '85**

Charles Huff enters his third season as defensive backs coach at Northern Arizona University.

In his first-two seasons, Huff has helped mold Anders Battle into a two-time All-Big Sky honoree. Battle led the Lumberjacks with 52 unassisted tackles for a total of 64. He ranked 38th in the league amongst all positions in the category.

In addition to mentoring Battle, Huff coached Lucky Dozier into an all-conference honoree as well. He ranked fourth on the team in tackles with 57 and tied for the Big Sky Conference lead with four interceptions. Dozier was also named the Most Valuable Player at the team's end of the year banquet.

In 2011, he coached Anders Battle to All-Big Sky honorable mention honors, as he was named the Most Improved Player on defense after recording 35 tackles with two forced fumbles and a 60-yard interception return for a touchdown.

The former NFL player with the San Francisco 49ers and Atlanta Falcons brings a wealth of experience to the Lumberjack program with a collegiate coaching career dating back to 1989.

Huff joins Souers' staff after recent positions at Florida A&M University as defensive coordinator (2005-07) and defensive ends and special teams coordinator at Central Florida from 1997-03. He most recently coached at Miles College in Fairfield, Ala.

Huff began his coaching career at his alma mater Presbyterian College in 1989 before moving on to assistant positions at Murray State (1991-93), West Alabama (1993-94) and Austin Peay State (1994-97). In 1990, Presbyterian finished second in the nation in pass defense. He helped MSU rank second in the Ohio Valley Conference in pass defense in both of his seasons on the staff. He was also the defensive coordinator at Austin Peay State while coaching the linebackers, secondary and special teams units. The

Governors led the Ohio Valley Conference and finished fourth nationally in run defense and ranked 19th nationally in total defense in 1994. Huff's 1999 special teams unit at UCF was responsible for a total of eight blocked kicks (five punts, two field goals, one PAT).

During his career, he recruited and coached defensive back and future NFL star Asante Samuel at Central Florida, as well as ends Elton Patterson (UCF), Reshard Jentry (UCF) and Anthony Hutch (Murray State) to All-America honors. Samuel and Patterson were both selected in the NFL Draft in 2003 in the fourth and seventh rounds, respectively. Samuel has been a three-time Pro Bowler and two-time Super Bowl champion during his career and currently plays for the Philadelphia Eagles.

Huff also tutored SBN Black College Defensive Player of the Year Kevin Talley at Norfolk State. Talley was a consensus All-America first-team selection by Walter Camp, Associated Press and The Sports Network.

Huff was a three-time All-American and all-conference selection at Presbyterian College before his four-year career in the NFL. He holds school records for punt and kick return average and career interceptions (20). He played with the 49ers from 1985-86 and the Falcons from 1987-88.

He became a 49er the same season as All-Pro receiver Jerry Rice. After head coach Bill Walsh and defensive back coach Ray Rhodes moved Ronnie Lott to safety in 1986, Huff moved into the starting lineup at left corner. He later suffered a severe knee injury and was released, but played parts of two more seasons with the Falcons.

He graduated with a degree in history and education from Presbyterian in 1985.

# Tight Ends/Fullbacks Coach/Recruiting Craig Knoth

**Eighth Season • Truman State '04**

Craig Knoth (pronounced Kuh – NO – th) begins his eighth season as an assistant coach at Northern Arizona University. Knoth works with the tight ends and fullbacks, while coordinating the recruiting efforts for the football program.

In 2012, Knoth helped guide Jake Hess to All-Big Sky First Team honors while also being named to the Sports Network third team. He was also a College Sports Journal honorable mention All-American. Hess received the David Couture Award as the Most Inspirational Player on the offensive unit at the team's banquet. Hess was also a semifinalist for the 2012 William V. Campbell Trophy, an award that recognizes an individual as the best football scholar-athlete in the nation.

Knoth coached starters Hess and Brian Riley for an offensive unit that ranked 14th in the nation and produced the Big Sky leaders in both rushing and passing efficiency in 2011. Riley earned All-Big Sky honorable mention honors and played in the Casino del Sol All-Star game to cap his career, while Hess was an All-Big Sky second-team pick at fullback.

In 2010, Knoth helped develop two-sport standout Nick Larson in his only season on the gridiron. Larson, a former basketball player, produced 14 catches for 117 and three touchdowns, the second-best total on the team, and earned All-Big Sky honorable mention accolades. True freshman Drew Emanuel also saw significant action when junior Riley was lost to injury early in the season, seeing action in 10 games. Knoth also worked with Vinnie Paciulli, who earned the All-Big Sky second-team selection at fullback in 2010.

Knoth mentored Shaun Fitzpatrick to three All-Big Sky honors, including first-team accolades in 2006. He finished his career with 77 catches for 920 yards and four touchdowns and was named to the prestigious 2009 Football Championship Subdivision Athletics Directors Association Academic All-Star Team.

Fitzpatrick ranked second on the team with 28 catches for 360 yards in 2007, earning honorable mention All-America honors from the Sports Network. In 2008, redshirt freshman Brian Riley filled in for the injured Fitzpatrick and earned All-Big Sky honorable mention accolades.

Prior to NAU, Knoth worked two seasons at Missouri Southern State University where he worked as a graduate assistant. At Missouri South-

ern, Knoth worked with the tight ends and assisted with the offensive line for Head Coach John Ware. He handled the offensive line position group for the final five games of the 2006 season at Missouri Southern after the passing of Head Coach and Offensive Line coach John Ware.

At Missouri Southern, Knoth was part of a staff that broke or tied more than 30 school offensive records. In 2004, Missouri Southern set the school season record for passing yards (3,575 yards) and ranked second on the all-time list for total offense (4,983 yards) and scoring (342 points). They became the first team in MIAA conference history to record a 3,000-yard passer, 1,000-yard receiver and 1,000-yard rusher during the regular season. Knoth helped mentor two Honorable Mention All-MIAA offensive linemen in sophomore Allen Barbre and freshman Matt Stout. In 2005, Knoth mentored two All-MIAA selections on the Offensive Line at Missouri Southern in Allen Barbre and Matt Stout. Allen Barbre was a First-Team All-MIAA, First-Team All-Southwest Region, and Honorable Mention All-America as a junior. Barbre was a fourth round selection (119th overall) of the Green Bay Packers in the 2007 NFL Draft. Matt Stout was an honorable mention selection as a sophomore.

Knoth was a four-year letter winner and a three-year starter at Truman State University for Head Coach John Ware. He played on the offensive line as a guard starting every game, 33 consecutive, beginning in the 2001 season thru the 2003 season at Truman State. At Truman State, Knoth played on some of the most prolific offenses in the over 100 years of football at the institution.

Knoth, a native of Cape Girardeau, Mo., graduated with a bachelor's degree in business administration with concentrations in management and marketing as well as a minor in Public Administration from Truman State University in 2004. He earned his master's degree in business administration from Missouri State University in 2006. He was married in June, 2007 to the former Nikki Riess. They have two daughters, Zoie and Claire.

# Wide Receivers Coach **Tim Plough**

**First Season • UC Davis '08**

Tim Plough begins his first season as the wide receivers coach at Northern Arizona University in 2013 after being hired in February of 2013.

Plough (pronounced 'PLOW') joins the Lumberjack staff after a 10-year playing and coaching career at UC Davis under head coach Bob Biggs. He was the starting quarterback for the Aggies in 2007 under current NAU offensive coordinator Rich Scangarello and was also the backup for three seasons (2004-06). In his senior season, he completed better than 64 percent of his passes for 1,355 yards and 11 touchdowns.

He began his coaching career as a volunteer assistant on the Aggie staff for the 2008 season before earning a full-time role as quarterbacks coach in 2009.

Plough added responsibilities each season of his four-year stint, finishing as co-offensive coordinator and play caller for the 2012 season in the school's first season in the Big Sky Conference. He started calling plays for the Aggies in 2011 and was also the pass-game coordinator for each of the last three seasons (2010-12).

In his first season as coordinator, the Aggies scoring rose 42 percent from 19 to 27 points per game behind a passing offense ranked 38th in the FCS. He coached quarterback Randy Wright to Great West Conference Rookie of the Year honors in 2010. Wright went on to be the first player in school history to earn Big Sky Player of the Week honors in 2012.

Before arriving at UC Davis, Plough was a two-sport standout at Ramona High School, earning All-Valley League honors

in both football and baseball as a senior. He added second-team All-San Diego Section distinction in 2002 while setting school records for completions (312) and passing yards (5,005).

Plough graduated from UC Davis in 2008 with a degree in history and earned in Master's of Science in coaching education from Ohio University in 2012.

## Safeties/Special Teams Coach David Reeves

### Fifth Season • Montana '91

David Reeves enters his fifth season as the safeties coach and special teams coordinator. He joined the staff after five seasons as the head coach at Rocky Mountain College in Billings, Mont., and has 17 years of experience overall in the FCS and FBS levels.

Reeves coached safety Lucky Dozier to All-Big Sky first-team honors. Dozier ranked fourth on the team in tackles with 57 and tied for the Big Sky Conference lead with four interceptions. He also added five passes deflections, the second-best total on the team. For his stellar play, Dozier was named the Most Valuable Player on defense at the team banquet.

Reeves coached junior Matt Estrada to a breakout season in 2009 in his initial season. Estrada was named the most valuable defensive player, defensive backfield player of the year and outstanding junior after leading the team with 78 tackles and a team-best 47 solo tackles. He culminated his junior season with All-Big Sky first-team honors.

Estrada also anchored one of the best defensive units in school history in 2010, signing as a free agent with the Jacksonville Jaguars in July 2011. The Lumberjacks led the league in scoring defense (19.8), rushing defense (93.5) and sacks (33), while ranking second overall in total defense (306.6) and pass defense (213.1). NAU was fifth nationally in rush defense and among the FCS Top 25 in sacks (10th), total defense (14th) and pass defense (22nd).

Estrada, who made the Jacksonville Jaguars practice squad as an undrafted free agent, earned All-Big Sky second team honors in 2010, bringing home Big Sky Player of the Week honors on both defense and special teams. He is currently playing in the CFL.

Reeves has helped produced some of the nation's top special teams units during his time at NAU. The Lumberjacks ranked in the Top 16 in the country in both punting and field goals in 2010 behind the play punter Drew Zamora and kicker Matt Myers. Zamora ranked third in the Big Sky and 19th nationally in 2011, while kick return-

ers led the league and ranked sixth overall in the FCS at 24.3 yards per return. Taylor Malenfant was among the top punt returners in the country.

During Reeves' tenure with the Rocky Mountain Bears he tutored a defense that steadily improved each season and produced numerous all-conference players each season.

RMC defeated Montana Tech for the first time since 1999 - ending a 16-game losing streak to the Orediggers - and wrapped up the season with back-to-back victories over Eastern Oregon and Montana Western. The Bears ranked No. 2 in the NAIA in passing offense (323.0 per game), No. 4 in sacks per game (3.5) and No. 9 in field goals made (.769).

Prior to arriving at Rocky, Reeves spent 15 years coaching at the Division I level. He started his coaching career at his alma mater, the University of Montana, after he finished his playing career in 1987 under then defensive coordinator Jerome Souers. As the linebacker coached for the Griz, Reeves coached 10 All-Big Sky first-team performers, including 1996 Big Sky Defensive MVP Jason Crebo. He was also a member of the Grizzly coaching staff that guided the 1995 team to the I-AA National Championship.

In 2000, Reeves followed Mick Dennehy from Montana to Utah State University, where he became the assistant head coach and linebacker coach for the Aggies. While at USU, Reeves' linebackers earned All-Big West first-team honors three times. Two of his linebackers, Jesse Busta and Brent Passey, ended their careers as the schools' third and fourth all-time leading tacklers.

As a player at Montana, Reeves was a four-year letter winner and was two-year starter as a strong safety. He earned the team's Most Inspirational award as a senior in 1987. In 1991, Reeves earned a BA in history from Montana.

Reeves is married to the former Sara Mates and they have two children, Matt and Sam.

## Offensive Line Coach/Running Game Coordinator Eric Reid

**Seventh Season • Oregon '96**

Eric Reid begins his seventh season as the offensive line coach while serving as the running game coordinator for the program that has molded a unit that has performed among the best in the league. The Lumberjacks have had a 1,000-yard rusher in each of the last four seasons. Overall, he has developed 24 all-conference players to 33 honors and three All-Americans during his career.

Reid continues to help prepare his players for the next level, as Trey Gilleo, an offensive lineman at Northern Arizona from 2009-12, signed a free agent contract with the New York Jets in 2013.

The offensive line continues to move in a positive direction as the Lumberjack offense finished tied for 27th in the nation in 2012 amongst Football Championship Subdivision schools. Offensive lineman Roy Garcia was named honorable mention Big Sky after starting all 11 games for NAU. Zach Bauman finished the season with 1,182 rushing yards en route to All-American honors.

In 2011, the Lumberjack offense ranked 14th in the FCS producing the Big Sky's top rusher and pass efficiency leader. Bauman ranked fourth in the country in rushing with over 1,400 yards with seven games over 100 yards on the season. Senior Alex Mott moved to center in 2011 and the leadership role on the line, earning All-Big Sky second team honors under Reid's mentorship. Senior Dwight Boyd and sophomore Kyle Walker both took honorable mention accolades.

Senior Kris Poindexter led Reid's offensive line in 2010, earning selection to the Sports Network All-America third team

and All-Big Sky first team. Joining Poindexter on the Big Sky team were honorable mention selections Trey Gilleo and Alex Mott, who both return in 2011.

The Lumberjacks rushed for more than 1,500 yards with the duo of Bauman and Giovannie Dixon. Bauman was among the top freshmen in the country in rushing yards per game, one of four freshmen in Division I to average more than 94 yards. He became the second freshman in school history to reach 1,000 yards in a season and surpassed Alex Henderson's freshman record of 1,014 yards set in 2006.

The 2009 Lumberjack offense flourished behind his line group with a breakout season. Overall, NAU ranked fifth in the country in passing offense (308.6) and total offense (439.5) and ninth in passing efficiency (147.8), helping nine players garner all-conference accolades. Running back Alex Henderson eclipsed the 1,000-yard mark while scoring 12 times en route to All-Big Sky first-team honors.

In 2007, NAU led the league in rushing by more than 50 yards per game, producing a rushing attack that was one of the most productive units in the Big Sky Conference, ranking 13th in the nation overall. NAU had three players who ranked among the top 100 rushers in the FCS, the only school to accomplish the feat. Both Alex Henderson (82.5 yards per game) and Lionel Scott (74.7) earned All-Big Sky honors.

Tackles Nick Posey and Ryne Holstrom, guard Tim Reader and center Jon Toailoa all earned All-Big Sky Honorable Mention honors. The Lumberjacks started the season by losing two

returning starters on the line during the preseason.

In 2008, three players earned honorable mention All-Big Sky accolades while helping the offense rank 23rd in the nation in total offense. The line helped produce the Big Sky Newcomer of the Year in running back Deonte Williams, who rushed for 950 yards while scoring 12 times. He ranked second among freshmen in FCS in rushing yards per game (86.4) and fifth in Division I overall among freshmen. His 12 touchdowns ranks tied for third on school single-season charts and were the most by a running back since 2000.

NAU gained 772 yards of total offense against the New Mexico Highlands, shattering the school record set in 1989 against Nevada of 674. It was the highest single-game total in the FCS and second overall in all Division I last season.

Reid joined the NAU staff after developing a reputation as one of the top line coaches in the league while serving in previous positions at Portland State and Eastern Washington.

Reid coached some of the most talented offensive lines in the Big Sky Conference prior to coming to Flagstaff. In 2004 and 2005, the Vikings led the Big Sky Conference in rushing yards and fewest sacks allowed, totaling an average of 200 yards per game on the ground and just 20 sacks over 22 games.

The Big Sky postseason award ledger confirmed Reid's influence at Portland State. In his five seasons, nine Vikings earned All-Big Sky honors a total of 13 times, highlighted by Brennan Carvalho, who was a first-team All-America selection by The Walter Camp Foundation and the Associated Press in 2006.

Reid, who was hired at PSU in 2002, had to build his line over the course of a few seasons. His first two years on the job, the Vikings' were beset with a multitude of injuries. In fact, in the only game in 2003 that PSU's preseason projected starting lineup was able to go as a unit - against Division I-A Fresno State - the Vikings ran for a season-high 257 yards, and gained 486 overall. It was a testament to the Vikings' talent and Reid's coaching ability.

Reid was hired as the Vikings' offensive line coach in January of 2002. He joined the Vikings after spending the previous two seasons as offensive line coach at Eastern Washington University.

At Eastern Washington, Reid's 2001 offensive line had three first-team All-Big Sky performers and one All-American, Chris Polinder.

Reid is a 1996 graduate of the University of Oregon with a degree in sociology. A starter at offensive guard, Reid played for the Ducks from 1991 to 1995, starting in the 1995 Rose Bowl and 1996 Cotton Bowl.

A native of Poway, Calif., Reid returned to his home state following graduation. He coached the offensive line at San Diego Mesa Junior College and at San Diego's Bishop High School for one year each. Reid went back to Oregon to be a graduate assistant coach on the offensive line in both 1998 and 1999.

Reid, 39, and his wife Dyanne, have twin daughters, Allyson and Elizabeth.

## Running Backs Coach Jimmy Beal

**Fourth Season • Montana State '07**

Jimmy Beal enters his fourth season on the Northern Arizona University football staff as the running backs coach after joining the staff in the fall of 2010.

Beal has developed Walter Payton Award candidate running back Zach Bauman into one of the top rushers in the nation. Bauman is the first NAU running back to rush for 1,000 yards in each of his first-three seasons after setting the freshman rushing mark in 2010.

Bauman enters his senior season with the Lumberjacks with only 119 rushing yards needed to break the school record. The All-American running back ran for 1,182 yards in his junior season to finish 17th overall in the race for the Walter Payton Award.

Bauman led the Big Sky Conference in rushing as a sophomore, ranking fourth overall in the FCS in yards per game. He was named an All-American second team selection by Beyond College Sports Network and All-Big Sky first-team honors.

Beal tutored Bauman into one of the top freshmen in the country in rushing yards per game in his first season in Flagstaff. He was one of four freshmen in Division I to average more than 94 yards per game, ranked 25th overall in the FCS in rushing per game and was the top freshman in the FCS. Bauman, who was an All-Big Sky second-team selection, became the second freshman in school history to reach 1,000 yards in a season and surpassed Alex Henderson's freshman record of 1,014 yards set in 2006. He recorded the 14th 1,000-yard season by a running back in school history.

Beal joined the program from the University of Redlands, where he worked with the defensive backs in the spring of 2010. Prior to Redlands, he was a graduate assistant at Texas State University in San Marcos, Texas in 2009 and worked as the running backs coach at Rocky Mountain College in Billings under current NAU assistant David Reeves in 2008.

Beal began his football coaching career at Rocky Mountain coaching the receivers from 2005-07. He also coached the sprints at Montana State-Billings from 2006-09.

Beal played collegiately at Montana State from 2002-04 before joining Reeves' team at Rocky Mountain College. He was named the most valuable player and most valuable running back in 2006.

The Los Angeles, Calif., native also worked for Yellowstone Youth Services in Billings from 2005-08 and Skyhawks Sports Camps from 2006-07, as well as a coach at the YMCA in Billings from 2005-06.

He graduated from Montana State with a degree in art education and minor in coaching in 2006. He received his master's degree in sport management from Montana State-Billings in 2009.

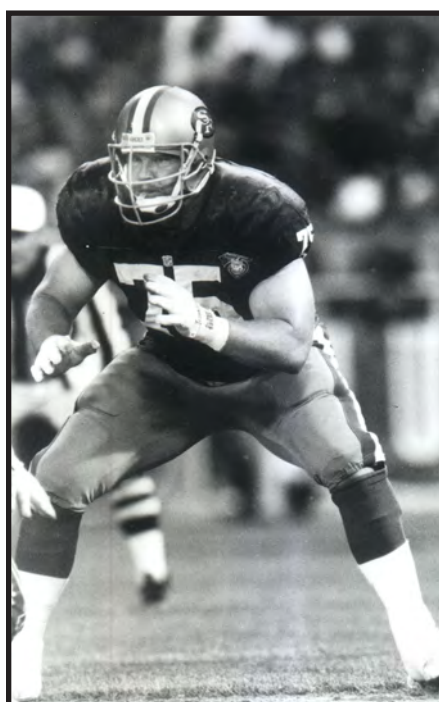

## 1958 NAIA Playoffs Gustavus Adolphus 41, NAU 12 Tucson, Ariz.

## 1958 - NAIA Championship Northeastern Oklahoma 19, NAU 13 1958 NAIA Holiday Bowl St. Petersburg, Fla.



After beating Gustavus Adolphus in the first round of postseason play, NAU met Northeastern Oklahoma in the NAIA championship Holiday Bowl.

The Lumberjacks and Oakies battled it out all game up and down the field, but the most exciting play came in the fourth quarter when the Lumberjacks tried to mount a comeback in front of an 8,500-plus crowd and about 15 million more watching the game on CBS. With time running out and the Lumberjacks down 19-7, NAU drove downfield 92-yards powered by the arm of quarterback Ted Sorich to score a touchdown, but the extra point was missed. With only minutes left and the Jacks down six points, NAU's defense did everything in its power to get the ball back. But the Oakie offense was strong, and as time ran out, NAU had to settle for NAIA national runner-up.

## 1977 - NCAA Division II First Round Jacksonville State 35, NAU 0 Flagstaff, Ariz.

In its first postseason game in 19 years the Lumberjacks were blanked at home 35-0 in front of a crowd of 7,584 by Jacksonville State. The Jacks, who never managed to get any points on the board, were beaten in almost every aspect of the game. Jacksonville St. more than doubled the rushing production of the Jacks and came up with 19 first downs while NAU only had 12.

After scoring two touchdowns in the last four minutes of the first quarter, Jacksonville St. hit the locker room at halftime with a 21-0 lead. After scoring two more touchdowns in the third, Jacksonville St. was finally quieted in the fourth quarter with the game ending at 35-0.

## 1996 - NCAA Division I-AA First Round Furman 42, Northern Arizona 31 Flagstaff, Ariz.

The record-setting Lumberjack football team returned to the postseason for the first time in almost 20 years and the first time as a I-AA program, dropping a 42-31 game to Furman in the first round of the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs. Although the Jacks statistically outscored Furman in first downs, rushing yards, passing yards and possession time, they could not manage to put enough points on the board. Northern Arizona failed to advance as the Paladins

scored 21 unanswered points in the last 6:19 of the game.

NAU started quickly, scoring 21 straight points to take a 21-7 halftime lead. Furman tied the game after three periods, but NAU assumed a 31-21 lead with 6:19 left. The Paladins rallied, taking the lead with 31 seconds left then sealing the win with an interception return for a TD.

In his final game as a Lumberjack, Archie Amerson rushed for 206 yards and a touchdown on 30 carries, while Travis Brown threw for 260 yards.

## 2001 - NCAA Division I-AA First Round Sam Houston State 34, NAU 31 Huntsville, Texas



Alex St. Peter's 20-yard field goal as time expired ended Northern Arizona's season as Sam Houston State posted a 34-31 victory in the first round of the NCAA I-AA playoffs. Sam Houston State (10-2)

advances to face top-seeded Montana, while the Lumberjacks complete the 2001 campaign at 8-4.

St. Peter's game-winning kick was setup by a 58-yard completion from Josh McCown to Matt Buss that put the Bearkats in scoring position. SHSU had taken possession of the ball on the 32-yard line with just 24 seconds on the clock after a NAU touchdown.

NAU had tied the game on a four-yard pass play from Preston Parsons to Clarence Moore. It completed a 12-play, 73-yard drive to tie the game.

Parsons finished with a career-high 338 yards and four touchdowns. Wide receivers Clarence Moore and Johnny Marshall both had career afternoons. Moore had eight catches for 153 yards with two touchdowns, while Marshall had 149 yards on six catches with a touchdown.

The Bearkats led 24-14 at the half behind three rushing touchdowns in the opening 20 minutes. Sam Houston scored the opening touchdown on a two-yard run by Joe Rauls. The extra-point attempt failed. NAU then rebounded two plays later when Parsons hit Marshall on a 75-yard bomb for a 7-6 lead.

The Bearkats then got a 42-field goal from Joey Price and a one-yard run by McCown to build a 17-7 lead. NAU responded with a 10-play drive to pull within three at 17-14 when Tom Winn caught a 12-yard pass from Parsons.

## 2003 - NCAA Division I-AA First Round Northern Arizona 35, McNeese State 3 Lake Charles, La.



Northern Arizona (9-3) upset top-ranked and top-seeded McNeese State behind freshman quarterback Jason Murrietta's five touchdown passes and a strong defensive effort en route to

a 35-3 win in Lake Charles.

Murrietta completed 24-for-35 passes for 285 yards and five touchdowns, hitting nine different receivers on the night. Four different receivers caught touchdowns, including two by senior Chris Nash, who had a game-high seven receptions.

Murrietta and Nash started the scoring with a nine-yard touchdown in the first quarter. The Lumberjacks added a second score on an 11-yard pass to Ramen Green for his first career touchdown and a 14-0 lead. McNeese managed its only points of the night on a 27-yard field goal from John Marino with 8:23 left in the second quarter. NAU built its lead to 21-3 on a 7-yard pass from Murrietta to Clarence Moore.

The Lumberjacks held McNeese State scoreless in the second half, adding touchdowns in each quarter to complete one of the biggest first-round upsets in NCAA I-AA playoff history. It was the worst loss at home for the Cowboys since 1990.

McNeese, which had been ranked No. 1 in the nation for most of the year and had appeared in last year's I-AA championship game, completed its season at 10-2.

## 2003 - NCAA Division I-AA Quarters Florida Atlantic 48, Northern Arizona 25 Flagstaff, Ariz.



Jared Allen passed for 228 yards and three touchdowns and the Florida Atlantic defense - led by sophomore cornerback Willie Hughley's two big plays that led to 14 points - stymied the Northern Arizona offense through the first half as FAU, a third-year member of the Division I-AA football ranks, posted a 48-25 win over the host Lumberjacks in a quarter-final matchup before 9,134 fans in the J. Lawrence Walkup Skydome.

The Owls' speed proved to be a daunting factor in the contest on the Walkup Skydome turf, both offensively and defensively. FAU forced three turnovers, including a 47-yard interception return for a touchdown by Hughley in the third quarter to make the score 27-3, then a 25-yard fumble return by Hughley that set up a three-yard TD pass from Allen to Doug Parker to make it 41-3.

In the first half, the Lumberjacks' offense had a difficult time getting any momentum on any drives, as NAU was held to 127 yards and just three points at halftime as the Owls vaulted to a 24-3 lead. The Lumberjacks got offense rolling in the second half, but it was too late. NAU rolled up 267 yards of offense after halftime and scored 22 points in the fourth quarter thanks to recovering an onside kick and a 57-yard pass from receiver Clarence Moore to fellow receiver Chris Nash - off a lateral from freshman QB Jason Murrietta - that closed the scoring.





## Walkup Skydome

In 2012, the J. Lawrence Walkup Skydome, one of the most unique venues in all of college athletics, celebrates its 36th year as the entertainment center for northern Arizona.

The building underwent a major renovation from Dec. 2010-Sept. 9, 2011, at a cost of \$26 million. The scope of the project included bringing the fire, life and safety up to code while remodeling the bathrooms, concourse, offices, suites, locker rooms and press box. The athletic training and equipment on the main floor were also remodeled and three elevators were added to the complex. Fans now enter the building to a panoramic view of the field on the East and west concourses. Capacity was reduced to 10,000 but now feature 21-inch wide chair back seating.

The Skydome has been the home of NAU football, basketball and indoor track and field since 1977. Construction began in the fall of 1975, and the facility was completed in September 1977. Seating capacity for football originally was 15,000 and 7,000 for basketball.

Once the largest wood-span structure of its kind in the world, the Skydome was built at a cost of more than \$8 million. It covers an area of 6.2 acres, with the roof spanning more than 500 feet and rising 142 feet above the playing surface.

The Skydome showcases the REALGRASS™ surface installed in the spring of 2008 by the Hellas Construction firm of Austin, Texas. The carpet, the Matrix version of the brand REALGRASS™ cost close to \$1 million. The REALGRASS™ Matrix system is comprised of a monofilament spinneret yarn in two different sizes and colors. It is the same installed for the Dallas Cowboys' stadium.

With the 2001 renovation to the Skydome floor, the 96,000-square foot surface was covered with Mondo. The track contains a six-lane, 300-meter non-banked loop (eight sprinting lanes) with the infield containing enough area for six NCAA-standard basketball and volleyball courts, as well as two regulation tennis courts. Track and field specific, the facility now has 12-month training capabilities. When covered for football with artificial turf, the Skydome supports a practice pole vault pit and a long/triple jump runway, as well as a lane for sprinting and hur-

dles. When the turf is up, the facility can be used for intramural and camp sports, and has enough room for a varsity soccer practice.

The roof was also resurfaced during the summer of 2000 and the astroturf was replaced in 2002 from a surface that was in the Tropicana Dome, the home of the Tampa Bay Devil Rays, in St. Petersburg, Fla.

The concourse contains offices, meeting rooms, restrooms and concession stands. Located on the dome's floor level are fully equipped locker rooms and state-of-the-art athletic training and weight rooms.

During the summer of 1997, the dome underwent a \$1 million lighting renovation that further enhanced the Skydome's lure for television cameras. Fresh air and heat come through 19 large ducts, maintaining a constant temperature of 72 degrees.

The first NAU sporting event held in the Skydome was a Lumberjack win over Montana in football on a last-second field goal, 25-24. The first NAU basketball game was a 101-76 triumph over Alaska Anchorage.

Special athletics events held in the Skydome include a Division II football playoff game in 1977, a Division I-AA football playoff games in 1996 and 2003, a first-round National Invitation Tournament basketball game in 1986 and 2006, the 1987, 1997, 1998 and 2006 Big Sky Conference men's basketball tournaments, and the 1984, 1990,

1993, 1997, 2000, 2003, 2006, 2009 and 2012 Big Sky Conference indoor track and field championship meets. In 2003, comedian Jay Leno appeared at the Skydome in a special Family Weekend event.

Many special events, including concerts, trade shows and high-school state tournaments are held in the Skydome each year. It also serves as training camp home of the Arizona Cardinals and Phoenix Suns. In May of 2000, the facility hosted a WNBA exhibition game between the Phoenix Mercury and the Detroit Shock.

NAU is one of 11 universities to own its own domed facility. The others are Idaho, Idaho State, Minnesota, North Dakota, Northern Iowa, Northern Michigan, North Dakota State, South Dakota, East Tennessee State and Syracuse.

John D. Haeger leads Northern Arizona University in its commitment to undergraduate education—a commitment enhanced by the university’s ongoing efforts in research, graduate education and distance learning.

Dr. Haeger has been NAU president since November 2001

after joining the university to serve as NAU provost in June 2000.

During his term as president, Dr. Haeger has guided the university to new heights in student enrollment. He also has ushered the university into its largest building boom since the 22-year term of former NAU President J. Lawrence Walkup.

Further, he has fully endorsed a national effort to increase institutional accountability, explaining that NAU must perform on a level that demonstrates its significance to students and to society.

Among university achievements under his leadership:

- Tuition guarantee. Dr. Haeger instituted a “block tuition” plan that guarantees first-time, full-time freshmen and transfer students the same tuition rate for eight semesters.
- Access and affordability. NAU has partnership with 15 community colleges throughout the state. The initiative streamlines the credit transfer process, allowing students enrolled at partnering community colleges to save time and money by being admitted to NAU while they are earning an associate degree.
- Innovation. NAU-Yavapai opened its Prescott Valley doors last fall, allowing students to earn bachelor’s degrees at about one-third the cost of a traditional, residential college experience. The savings comes from offering a limited number of degree options and using existing resources through NAU’s Flagstaff campus. The cost-saving model garnered the attention of Gov. Jan Brewer, who called it “visionary” and “an example for the entire state and the nation.”
- Expansion of nursing and the health professions. The university has placed emphasis on graduating more students in nursing and developing or expanding programs in occupational therapy, athletic training and physicians assistant.
- Commitment to research. President Haeger

has instituted NAU’s first office of Vice President for Research. In Yuma, a 12,225-square-foot building that will provide research four-year degree opportunities.

- High Country Conference Center. Dr. Haeger initiated a joint partnership between the city of Flagstaff, Drury Hotels and Sodexo to build a 42,000-square-foot conference center and an adjoining hotel and parking structure. Consultants have estimated the economic benefit to northern Arizona to be about \$7 million annually.

- 1899 Bar & Grill. The university has opened an upscale steakhouse in the old north union that is open to the public and complements the conference center

- Largest gift in university history. The College of Business Administration was able to acquire the largest gift in university history, a \$25 million donation from prominent business leader William Franke. The college was renamed The W.A. Franke College of Business.

Dr. Haeger is a member Arizona Board of Education, the Governor’s P-20 Council, the board of directors of the Translational Genomics Research Institute, is former chair of the United Way of Northern Arizona board, serves as commissioner for the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education, and is past chair of the Council of Presidents of the Big Sky Conference.



## Vice President for Intercollegiate Athletics • Dr. Lisa Campos



Lisa Campos was named the Vice President for Intercollegiate Athletics at Northern Arizona University on March 30, 2012.

Campos took over the leadership of the Lumberjack Athletics department after serving as the Senior Associate Athletic Director at the University of Texas at El Paso since August of 2006.

With her hiring at NAU, Campos, 35, became one of 26 females and the youngest in the country to lead a Division I program, including 13 head athletic administrators at the Football Championship Subdivision level.

Campos served as the sport administrator for the Miner men's and women's cross country, women's soccer, women's volleyball, women's basketball, and men's and women's track and field programs at UTEP. Campos also was the primary administrator for compliance, CHAMPS/Life Skills, strength and conditioning, sports medicine, and cheerleading. She was the advisor for the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee and served as the liaison to the Intercollegiate Athletic Council, Office of Student Life, Miner Village, and the UTEP Police Department.

In her tenure at UTEP, she also had oversight of the women's golf, rifle, and softball programs, served as championship director for numerous conference championships, and co-hosted a weekly television show, Miner Sports Weekly. Dr. Campos also assisted with athletic facility enhancements and co-directed the planning and design of the \$2.6 million Helen of Troy Softball Complex, which opened in September 2005.

In 2006, Campos served as the NCAA liaison for the Self Study Report for NCAA Certification and continued to oversee all gender, minority equity, and student welfare strategic plans. She was responsible for Title IX staff education and staff diversity training. In 2005, she created the Athletics Diversity Graduate Assistantship Program and served on the UTEP Women's Resource Advisory Board.

She was promoted to the Senior Associate position after serving as the Associate Athletic Director and Senior Woman Administrator since August of 2003. She also served two years as the Assistant Dean of Students within the UTEP Division of Student Affairs.

Dr. Campos had the opportunity to serve on a number of NCAA Committees, including the NCAA Division I Championships/Competition Cabinet, the NCAA Rifle Committee, and chaired the NCAA Women's Soccer Committee.

She was a member of the Conference USA Joint Group and served on the Senior Woman Admin-

istrator administrative group. In 2005-2006, when UTEP joined Conference USA, she served on the Conference USA Strategic Planning Committee and assisted in the development of the realigned Conference USA's vision, core values, mission, and strategic objectives. She also represented UTEP on conference committees, including the budget subcommittee, legislative committee, championships selection committee, and various sport committees.

Dr. Campos previously served as the Assistant Dean of Students at UTEP from 2001-03. Campos coordinated and administered the university's student discipline system, interpreted the University of Texas System Regents' Rules and Regulations governing the student academic honesty and conduct code, and provided information to the university community on discipline policies, rules, regulations, and procedures. She served as a mentor to an undergraduate student participating in the NASPA Minority Undergraduate Fellows Program and served on a variety of campus committees including the UTEP President's Advisory Committee on Women, Student Affairs Staff Development Committee, Faculty Senate Student Conduct Committee, and the University Health Awareness Committee.

In the El Paso community, Campos was a member of the Girl Scouts of the Rio Grande board and the Junior League of El Paso.

Dr. Campos holds a doctorate degree in Educational Leadership from the University of Texas at El Paso. She graduated from Colorado State University where she earned a bachelor's of science degree in Business Administration and a master's of science degree in Student Affairs in Higher Education.

A native of Las Animas, Colo., Campos is married to Darren D'Attilio.
